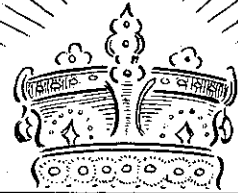

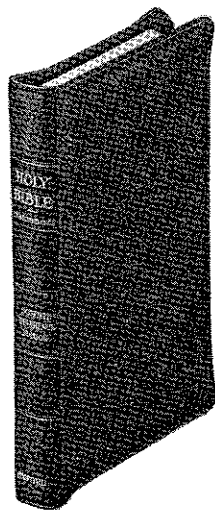

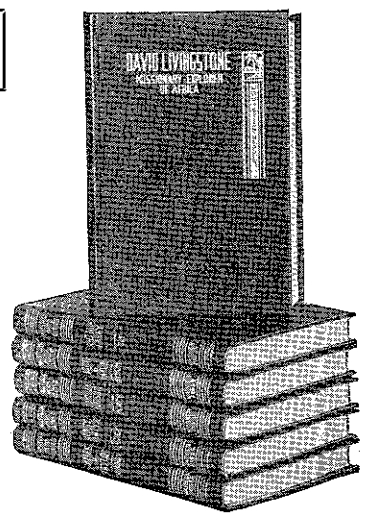

TURMOIL! CONFUSION! CHAOS!

THESE ARE THE TERMS NEEDED TO DESCRIBE CONDITIONS NOW EXISTING IN THE N. Y. STATE BAPTIST CONVENTION

INTRODUCTION

It is impossible in one brief article to cover the history & the inside workings of the New York State Baptist Convention, during the past fifteen years. It would take a series of such articles over a period of months. The writer was associated with the New York State Baptist Convention for twelve years, in its evangelistic department, during the days of Dr. Space, & Dr. H. Wyse Jones, who were directors in the department.

Following the death of Dr. Granger, the State Secretary, a committee was appointed to look for his successor. The issues of Fundamentalism & Modernism were not as sharply drawn then as they are today, but a quiet maneuvering on the part of liberal leaders was going on, under cover, to control the churches & discriminate against Fundamentalists. The shrewd politicians thought it would be wise to throw up a smoke-screen & camouflage the true plans of the liberals who were in control of the Convention. So, they decided to put in, as Executive Secretary of the Convention, a Fundamentalist, believing that would quiet the rumblings that were being heard over the State, from the lips of a few fundamentalists. This committee, of which Dr. Albert W. Beaven was a member, approached the Rev. H. Clarke Colebrook, D. D., then pastor of the First Baptist Church, of Gloversville, New York, & used their persuasive powers to get him to resign the successful pastorate of that church, to become secretary of the Convention.

If ever a child of God desired to know the will of the father, Dr. Colebrook did, when he was approached about this new responsibility. Many of his close friends in the First Baptist Church of Gloversville, to this day will testify how they entered into the fellowship of prayer with him for guidance. He kept the Committee waiting several months before he gave

his answer, & believing it to be the will of the Lord, he became Secretary of the Convention, & it stands as a matter of record that the Baptists of the Great Empire State had as their Executive Secretary a real, 100%, Bible-believing Baptist. This man of God had a most successful pastorate in the city of Albany, & he left the First Baptist Church of Gloversville, at its spiritual peak.

His First Years of Service

Dr. Colebrook began to re-organize the Convention as soon as he took office. His plan called for establishing it upon a firm, spiritual foundation. "Revival" was his motto. It stands as a record that he was not in sympathy with Christ-denying, Bible-rejecting Baptist preachers in the pulpits. He realized that a revival would never come to a Baptist Church with a pastor denying the Fundamental Truths of the Faith. Therefore, when churches approached him for recommendations, he favored men who were true to the Lord, & true to the Book, and, in a few months he demonstrated once & for all that an out & out, true, 100% Fundamentalist could not be a secretary of a Convention, that is controlled by liberal politicians.

Whispering Campaign

After his first year in office, a clever whispering campaign was started which swept the State, like a forest-fire. It was all a part of the scheme of the liberal politicians, to oust this man of God because he stood for his convictions. First, an anonymous letter was sent through the State. Second a whispering campaign was then taken up from mouth to mouth. The writer of this article was approached in the First Baptist Church of Syracuse, New York, by the Rev. Fred Tomlinson, who was then Director of Religious Education in the New York State Baptist Convention, and is now, Director of Religious Education in the Pennsylvania Bap-

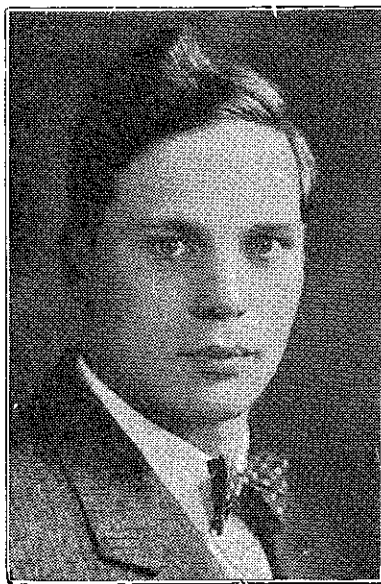
STARTLING DEVELOPMENTS IN THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF ELKHART, INDIANA

We have been asked to report briefly concerning the situation which exists in our present pastorate, & are only too glad to do so, for if there is any praise or glory it should be given to Him alone.

In January of 1935 Dr Ketcham was invited by the pastor of the First Baptist Church of Elkhart, my predecessor, to conduct an evangelistic campaign in Elkhart, which resulted in a time of refreshing to both church & community. At the request of the then pastor, Dr Ketcham one night in the parsonage brought to the attention of certain officials of the church, the increasing trend toward Modernism in Convention circles with the accompanying popishness of a spiritually lascivious Ecclesiastical Hierarchy which was seeking, & with great success, to dominate & control Baptist men and means, & to determine Baptist cooperative effort through the Northern Baptist Convention & through the various State Conventions. Great sympathy for the protest position of Dr Ketcham was expressed by the then pastor of the church & official family, such that the church later took action to fellowship with the G. A. R. B. sending its pastor to the convention at Grand Rapids held in April, 1935.

However, a few months later internal difficulty developed in the church, the focal point of which seemed to be the pastor & which had no relation whatsoever to any issue regarding relationship with the NBC and the State Convention. In August the pastor's resignation was requested on the basis of incompatibility with the best interests of the church and its people, but the motion was defeated. Shortly after this the pastor declared himself as opposed to the G. A. R. B. & declared his adherence to the NBC and the local State Convention.

In late September the pastor's resignation was again requested & was secured.

Convention Officials Back "Split-Off Group"

On the first Sunday in 1936, he organized in the city of Elkhart, in a hall about two blocks away from his former pastorate, another so-called Baptist Church, known as the Berean Baptist Church of Elkhart, beginning with 17 members who had asked for their names to be dropped from the roll of the First Baptist Church.

The Berean group formed their constitution and by-laws & adopted a confession of faith and allied themselves 100% with the modernist machine of the NBC, the local State Convention, & the local association, & in April invited ministers & messengers from various churches to meet with them in council to consider the propriety of recognizing them as a Baptist Church. The two leading Convention leaders in the State of Indiana, Dr Parsons and Dr. Huntington, & also the leading Convention light in Michigan, Rev ADEM, participated. Thus the Convention officials have completely backed this "split-off group" who have lined up 100% behind their program, & have in the Indiana Baptist Observer & otherwise, by inference through the public press, in-

ferred that the First Baptist Church is no longer worthy of the confidence of loyal Baptist people.

First Baptist Church of Elkhart, Ind Severs all Connections With the NBC

Three weeks after I became pastor of the First Baptist Church, we withdrew lock, stock, & barrel from the NBC & all Convention affiliations. My board of Deacons & Trustees unanimously requested me to take action which I did with them, & as a result the church voted with only two dissenting votes to withdraw completely from all Convention fellowship & support.

Has God Blessed Us?

We can answer strongly in the affirmative & give Him all the glory. We have deliberately sought to avoid trouble with our friends in the Berean work. Needless to say this has not been easy, & our church property being valuable under the covetous eyes of the Convention, it may not continue to be easy, as we believe that the Convention officials will go to almost any lengths to bring us under their sway; but God is our helper & we will not fear what man shall do unto us. Souls have been saved, many believers have been brought into a new life of victory. Baptisms have been blessed of God, & our attendance & interest has steadily grown. We were able to make our payments at the Bank on our mortgage in May complete, & have increased our missionary giving in 6 months already over 500% of what was given in the previous year. Though we have had to reorganize Sunday School, Choir, Young People's, & Women's work from the ground up—though we have had to look to God for the establishment of a men's brotherhood—yet in spite of all these difficulties & obstacles & the revising of the Church by-laws, & the forming of a proper Church Charter, the Lord has been with us. In May a Missionary Convention was held, & in the latter part of May a Young Men's Conference at which many young people volunteered for the Lord's service. While our problems are still great, & our finances are small, & we need much in the way of wisdom & grace, the attacks of the enemy & the darts of men have only made us realize to a greater degree His faithfulness & sufficiency, & we give all glory to Him.

The offerings for that month amounted to over \$1,200, all bills paid, the speakers reimbursed & a balance in the treasury! One unique feature of the conference was the after-church service in the famed "Viking Room" of Haddon-Hall, one of the finest hotels on the boardwalk. People from all over the country were reached who had never been contacted with the Gospel before.

They have the radio every morning, WPG which has been heard in California. Get it if you can; it comes on every morning at 9:15 A. M. Next year plans are already under way for a greater conference than ever before. Pray for this work that if the Lord tarry heaven may be opened next summer, or even before, in that world famous summer resort & where "sin abounds" the Grace of God may much more abound to the salvation of hundreds of precious souls for all Eternity.

WONDERFUL PROGRESS IN THE NEW WHOLE BIBLE LESSONS

Dr. Ketcham, carrying out the recommendations of the resolution on Sunday School Literature adopted by the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches at the annual meeting in Chicago, appointed a council to begin work on the "New Whole Bible Lesson Course." The council met in July & after a thorough discussion, agreed upon the following principles:

1. Believing such a course is eminently worth while, we will sponsor a whole Bible course for the whole Bible School.

2. Rev. Louis Entzinger is to proceed with the development of a competent staff of writers to assist him in preparing & adapting the lessons to various departments.

3. The lessons when finally presented are to be uniform & dated.

4. The course shall begin officially with the issuance of a New Testament course by April 1937.

5. Rev. Louis Entzinger shall submit all materials to this council for final examination & approval before publishing.

6. This committee shall confer & have an understanding with the Interstate Evangelistic Association, who shall hold the copyrights on these

publications, relative to the continuance of this work in any exigency or emergency both as to editorial staff & publication.

Outstanding Advantages!

This plan is to provide the finest possible helps for pastors, teachers & officers, but to use no quarterly or leaflet in the Sunday School itself. All pupils are to study their lessons from the Bible only. This course is to be a Whole Bible Course, that is, as far as practicable to cover the whole Bible, and it is to be for the whole Bible School, lessons being adapted to the various ages of the children. A general view of the teaching of the whole Bible can be completed in approximately eight years. There will be a spirit of unity & fellowship in the consciousness that hundreds of fundamentalists are studying the same Bible lesson each Lord's Day. Permanent arrangements are being perfected so as to perpetuate this work & to give assurance to all who contemplate using it that it is permanent & will be perpetuated.

Helps in the Meantime

The work that is ready at the present time & which is being used by many is still available & we are glad to note that a number of schools will begin to use it this fall. Volume 1, covering Genesis, Exodus, & Leviticus, can be ordered from the Interstate Evangelical Association, Temple Building, Rochester, N. Y., at \$1.00 per individual copy or at 75c per copy in orders of 1/2 dozen or more. Volume 2 can be secured from the same publishers at \$1.25 per individual copy or \$1.00 per copy in orders of 1/2 dozen or more. This work, besides being an exposition of these books in the Old Testament, gives simple and brief suggestions for the Beginners, Primaries, Juniors & Intermediates.

Bible School Conferences & Conventions

We will all admit that the Sunday School training Schools & Sunday School conventions in the past have inspired progress and enthused Sunday School workers, but we will also have to admit that they have spent the larger portion of their time studying methods. In other words, they have given their time to machinery, to psychology, to philosophy, to

methods of teaching to Bible history & to programs & plans instead of actually studying the Word of God & planning & studying together to do more proficient and effective teaching. The Bible itself & the work of the Holy Spirit has been practically a silent note.

With the plan we contemplate, city, district, state, & nation-wide conferences & training schools can be conducted. We do, however, contemplate producing for our Bible believing people helps along the line of methods that will be simple & practical, but our major emphasis will be on the study & the teaching of the Book itself under the leadership of the Holy Spirit, who is the Author of it.

The council has a deep conviction that Bible believing Baptists need to stir themselves and to set forth in a clear way the building of larger & better Bible Schools in all of our churches, & to lead all of our people to the study of the Bible itself. The council believes that we should & can & will do a constructive piece of work that will be an inspiration & blessing to all Bible believing Christians in this land.

EYES OF MANY BEING OPENED TO INROADS OF SIAMESE TWINS—MODERNISM & COMMUNISM

READ OF MERRIMAC ALIVE TO ISSUES

But that isn't all. One Sunday we drove to Merrimac, Mass. & spoke in the First Baptist Church at the kind invitation of the Rev. Otis B. Read the consecrated and out-spoken pastor.

At the height of the summer season yet we had a splendid congregation & response. We learned that Brother Read's church has the largest audiences of any church in Merrimac & other surrounding communities also. He has the radio to broadcast the Gospel through New England & God is blessing it in a unique way.

While being entertained in Brother Read's home we learned much of the situation Massachusetts—& indeed the whole of New England—has been ridden & blighted with Unitarianism. Oh, that God might raise up another Finney to shake like an earth-quake the sinners of this section of America!

But "the dry bones are coming to life." We have just as dry bones in

CAUSE FOR REJOICING

Praise God for reports of this kind. We reprint the following from the "Weekly Messenger" of the First Baptist Church, Butler, Pa., of which **Dr. Jno. J. VanGorder** is the Pastor.

The Annual meeting of the Church was held August 5th. The reports should cause rejoicing in the heart of every member of the church. The pastor reported 77 to have followed the Lord in baptism during the year. So far as we have been able to ascertain this has been the banner year in the church's history for baptisms. The treasurer reported all current expenses fully met, a payment of \$900 on the parsonage debt, & "love offerings" of approximately \$1,100 in the two evangelistic campaigns, besides the payment of the incidentals of the campaigns. The missionary treasurer reported over \$3,500 to have been given to missionary work, an increase of about \$400 over the previous year.

Another cause for rejoicing is the large amount of evangelistic & Bible teaching work carried on outside the church. A Sunday School & mid-week prayer meeting is carried on in a village twelve miles out; a Sunday School & mid-week prayer meeting in a community five miles out; a Sunday School in another community four miles out; a Bible Class in a community nine miles out; another class in a village seven miles out; a class in the south-side of the city; a regular Friday night open-air service on the court-house steps, & a Sunday evening open-air service in Alameda Park. Much of this outside work is being carried on by the young people. A number of these young people have caught the vision for more effective service & are planning to enter Bible Schools & seminaries in early autumn. We praise God for His manifold blessings.

NYGREN & BUNDY CONTINUE FOR CHRIST

Mr. Nygren & Mr. Bundy have been used of the Lord in mighty revival services in the last few months, many times being crowded out of the regular places of meeting and having to resort to such places as a hayloft or a skating rink for the service. They have been working in Wisconsin,

North Dakota, & in Canada, & in each place many souls have been brought to a saving knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. Their fall work will take them into Stanley, N. D., on Sept. 22; Strandberg, S. D., Oct. 6; Summit, S. D., Oct. 20, Detroit Lakes, Minn., Nov. 3; Toronto, Ont., Canada, Nov. 22. May the Lord continue to bless them in their fall work even as He has done in the past.

tist Convention; in which he was making derogatory remarks about **Dr. Colebrook**, which was a part of the whispering campaign. Believing that Christians should be frank, open, and above board, I immediately took issue with him, after which I walked into **Dr. Colebrook's** office & acquainted him with the facts.

The Trail of the Serpent

This undercover method of attack, & campaign of lies, scandal, slander, & filth was spread over all the State. The poisonous gas which was discharged, began to take effect. It gained in momentum. The ecclesiastical politicians were now rejoicing & the whispering campaign had reached such heights that when the Convention was held in the Baptist Temple, at Rochester, N. Y., delegates to that Convention were heard to remark to the other; "Have you seen all the dump wagons lined up outside the church?" When the question was asked further, "What for?" the reply was; "To cart all the dirt away from this convention." What a tribute to a great gathering of Baptists! It was at this convention that the master-mind politician, **Dr. Albert W. Beaven**, played his cards, in laying the ground-work to get rid of **Colebrook**, by political manipulations. The reader should keep in mind that **Dr. Beaven** had pledged a loyal support to **Dr. Colebrook**, if only he would resign his church & become Executive secretary, & the man he pledged to support, he forsook in just a few months, because **Dr. Colebrook** would not be a party to their scheme.

The writer, with a few friends, waited in the lobby of the Seneca Hotel until 1:30 A. M., for **Dr. Colebrook** to return from the strenuous session of a Committee Meeting which had been planned to embarrass his whole organization, & work. Never shall we forget the expression on **Dr. Colebrook's** face when he walked into the lobby of the hotel. His face told the strain of the few years of trying to spiritualize the New York State Baptist Convention, which was fully controlled by Modernists.

The slogan from this point on was "Get rid of **Colebrook**." Ethics were forgotten, charity and brotherliness were not known. By fair or foul means "Get rid of **Colebrook**."

We have never been able to appreciate why Modernists should make any claim to possessing a sweet Christian spirit or tolerance, for when they are out to eliminate a Fundamentalist, they are as intolerant as the loyalists in Spain.

The spy in the camp, through whom the conspirators worked was one by the name of **Charles H. Bechter**, office secretary. I well remember the day **Dr. Colebrook** followed me from his office to the elevator in the Mac Arthur Building, Syracuse, New York, & said, "Brother **Strathearn**, it is a painful experience to be disappointed in one you have trusted. When you come to this office, tell **Mr. Bechter** nothing. He has proven untrue to me. He is the conspirator's representative in this office."

Climax!

The climax of these few years of torment, for a man of God who was caught in a chain of circumstances with a group of ecclesiastical, Modernistic politicians came on Saturday night, December, 1927, at about 9:30 when **Dr. Colebrook** walked into the home of his sister, who lived in Syracuse, and showed signs of a serious mental collapse. He walked all through the house, from one room to another, holding his head, sighing deeply, and suddenly he rushed upstairs into the bathroom, locked the door, & fired the contents of a small revolver into his brain, and went hurling into Eternity. He was rushed to the hospital & a boyhood friend worked desperately to save him, but it was too late. A bunch of Modernistic politicians, over a period of six years, had done their work. Their lying, gossiping campaign had registered, & as a result had broken this man, physically and mentally.

The funeral was a sad one: it was a pathetic picture, & one which those who witnessed will not soon forget. To see **Dona Colebrook**, 16 years of age, who loved her father dearly, trying to be brave; this lonely girl, robbed of her mother & father, within a year, was heart-breaking.

Another Storm Breaks

Following the death of **Dr. Cole-**

brook, the ecclesiastical politicians said, "We must profit by our mistake." They made a mold, and then spent several months looking for the man who would fit into that mold, & they went into the State of Michigan, & the announcement was made that the new State Secretary would be the **Rev. John E. Smith**.

When **Dr. Smith** came into the State of New York, that grand old man, the late **Dr. Oliver W. Van Osdel**, wrote in reply to letters of inquiry, the following statement: "Under no circumstances will **Dr. Smith** recommend a true Fundamentalist to a Baptist Church if he knows it."

Dr. Smith has lived up to this reputation. He has been aggressive for the past eight years in doing his best to keep Fundamentalists out of Baptist pulpits. He will deny this, but the records speak for themselves. If certain men whom he has recommended are Fundamentalists, then we shall have to re-define FUNDAMENTALISM. Dr. Smith has been a tool for Colgate Rochester Divinity School & Crozier Theological Seminary. He has been more anxious to be in the good will of Dr. Albert W. Beaven & a few other liberal leaders than he has the will of the Lord Jesus Christ. From the beginning he began to write letters to pastors & churches, misrepresenting the work of the Interstate Evangelistic Association, Inc., & its Director, Dr. Harold Strathearn. All these charges have been ignored. Truth always prevails, & we have been too busy doing constructive work to waste valuable time trying to off-set Dr. Smith's propaganda.

It is a well known fact that Dr. Smith did not want to resign. The new president of the New York State Baptist Convention, an attorney, has been after Dr. Smith's scalp, & it would need volumes to give all the details of the wire-pulling, & charges that have been passed from one to the other, & which have led up to the present state of Turmoil, Confusion, & Chaos. A desperate attempt is being made to white-wash the whole thing & make everything look rosy, on the surface.

The Real Cause—The I. E. A.

Now, the real cause of the trouble is that the Interstate Evangelistic Association, Inc., has been making too much progress. The constructive activities of this Association are being felt, by these politicians, and so some have said: "We must get rid of Smith & get a stronger personality who can offset the work that Strathearn is doing. Too many churches are leaving the Convention, & if this continues, at the present rate, we shall have no convention left."

It is well for our reader to remember that a Convention may die; but a Baptist Church will live, & the Baptist Church can succeed & grow in spite of a Convention, & the responsibility of the revolt that has set in against the Convention, lies at the door not of the Fundamentalists, or

radicals, come-outers, separationists, or whatever term you may wish to use, but it lies at the door of Bible-rejecting, Christ-denying, liberal, Communist-minded preachers from our Modernistic Theological Seminaries, & Colleges who have gained control of the machinery of the Convention. Reader, settle this firmly in your mind; this is the cause of the revolt!

Face the Facts!—and Pray!

The present situation calls for frankness & dealing honestly with all men. Why should these Modernists plead for tolerance, from the Fundamentalists, when they have persecuted to the limit those who have refused to be a party to their programs of unbelief? There will appear in the next issue of this paper, the story and photograph of a Baptist minister & his family who were robbed of a Baptist pulpit because this pastor dared to speak out against the Modernism & Socialistic tendencies of certain Baptist leaders, as a further proof of the reason for the revolt!

This is the hour to pray! This is the hour to advance by Faith! This is the hour to plead with God for revival! This is the hour for men to stand with firmness, courage, & daring against the hosts of the enemy within the camp, & in the light of what is happening, in other parts of the world, we need to pray with burdened hearts the essence of a sermon recently delivered by Dr. Fuller, in Wealthy Street Baptist Church.
