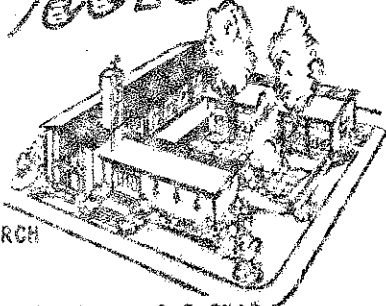

CBHMS MISSIONARY LEE IRONS RESIGNS

Conservative Baptists will regret hearing this news from one of the top CBHMS missionaries, Lee Irons (Box 1857, Nogales, Arizona), whose good offices enabled the CBHMS to open a field in Honduras some years ago. In a letter of Dec. 31, "After serving the Lord for ten years under the CBHMS we have been led of God after much prayer to sever our connections with this board. Two weeks ago we appeared before a committee who suggested that I, Lee, resign as director of the Mexican Bible Institute which I had founded six years ago and that we move to Tucson, Arizona, immediately. We do not believe that it is God's Will that we leave this field in which God has placed us as there still is so much that needs to be done."

INTERFAITH ACTIVITY OF THE FELLOWSHIP
OF CHRISTIAN ATHLETES EXPLAINED

Tribune Religion Editor Bill Rose widely distributed a printed letter to ministers on Jan. 3 absolving Dr. Woodrow Rood from all blame in his recent endorsement of the FCA Rally on Jan. 10 with Giant's Alvin Dark and Army's Paul Dietzel at the Mormon Center in Oakland. The meeting could not be held at Stanford. Bill Rose, noted church reporter, said: "We're most thankful for the way in which our Mormon friends responded to our urgent plea for a site. I did not dream the site would make a difference so I did not advise Dr. Rood of the change. We who are working with FCA chose the Mormon Center because it was the largest facility immediately available. The Mormons are a most gracious and cooperative people. Though they differ from us in theology and belief, they have never once asked FCA to temper or modify its program. We do not have to compromise the evangelical Christian witness of FCA. In fact, they so respect what we're seeking to do thru FCA that they provide the funds to send three of their athletes to an FCA conference each summer. They have never asked for the privilege of promoting their beliefs. Two years ago I was the youth banquet speaker at the center and was free to say whatever I wanted and you can rest assured I did."

"RED DEAN" RESIGNS AT CANTERBURY

The Very Rev. Dr. Hewlett Johnson, 89, was widely reported in the press on Jan. 5, 1963 to have handed in his resignation to the British Crown as Dean of the Cathedral and close associate of WCC president Archbishop A.M. Ramsey. Let FBI counterspy Herbert Philbrick speak from his vantage point in the Communist Party in his book "I Led Three Lives" — "When the Dean finally arrived in Boston, I was 'privileged' to meet him under special circumstances — in a closed, secret meeting of highly placed comrades under conditions that could mean only one thing: that Hewlett Johnson was himself not only a secret, trusted member of the Communist International, but a person of extreme importance and value to the Soviet conspiracy." Occupying one of the highest posts in the Anglican Church, this frequently identified Communist is quoted by Jerome Davis in his book "Behind Soviet Power" in the chapter "The Future of Religion in Russia", as follows: "Bolshevism is commonly pictured as the antithesis of Christianity. Yet Hewlett Johnson, Dean of Canterbury declares, 'The communist puts the Christian to shame in the thoroughness of his quest for a harmonious society. Here he proves himself to be the heir of the Christian intention — the communist struggle for community, contains an element of true religion, and as such demands Christian recognition'."

..Dr. Donald Soper, the PSR Earl Lecturer in Berkeley Feb. 19-21, will speak on "The Ideology of Jesus". He is quoted in Toronto Daily Star of May 21, 1960: "Even if the Russians come over, what of it? I would infinitely rather have to face Communists in this country or in Britain than face a third world war."

..Khrushchev-First World president.. Dr. Soper, who will be guest of the Pacific School of Religion next month is quoted in Toronto Daily Star of May 21, 1960: "We must search for world government and we must face the fact that Khrushchev will be the first president."

..The Methodist Federation for Social Action was given extensive treatment in the Jan. 9 issue of "Tocsin", which every thinking American Christian leader should have. It is a weekly paper worth every bit of the \$5 for a year. (2490 Channing, Berkeley 4).

..Dr. Leslie Weatherhead, who will probably be speaking in Berkeley soon, stated in his book "Key Next Door", in a sermon - "Is Christianity the Only Way to God?" on p. 152: "Let me this morning be, at any rate, entirely honest. To my mind Christianity is certainly not the only way to God. Who can suppose that Billy Graham's latest convert, a youngster with an imperfect knowledge of, and an untested faith in, Christianity, is in any sense 'saved', to use the old-fashioned phrase, while a devout Buddhist or Hindu, who through a lifetime has meditated on truth and reality and practices the highest way of life he knows, is, by a just, loving and holy God, excluded, or in any sense finally shut out from the fellowship of the saints?" It is tragic that this British Methodist is on the loose with such wickedness.

..Oxnam's 'Dirty Bully' comes to mind when we read Dr. Weatherhead on p. 154: "The Old Testament had often likened God to a father, but had likened Him also to a tyrant and a despot and a jealous tribal God."

..Low opinion of backsliding Baptists .. Dr. Weatherhead says on p. 156, "Yes, we could put that more popularly by saying that there is more likelihood of revealing the nature of Christianity by being a good Buddhist than by being a bad Baptist, though some narrow-minded people would exclude the former from the kingdom of Christ and include the latter in it." (This is a 1960 book).

..Communists in ABC colleges? In a letter of Jan. 3, 1963 from Dr. Benjamin E. Mays, "Doctor Harry C. Steinmetz is professor of psychology here at Morehouse." Morehouse College is an approved, related, and supported college of the American Baptist Convention. "Timber" publication (317 First West, Seattle 99, Wash.) for December 1962 states: "Dr. Steinmetz has been named as a Communist by a witness under oath and was fired from San Diego college. His two-page documentation is 25¢."

..Rev. Edward L. Peet, who was reportedly excused from his job as Senate Chaplain of the Legislature by Sen. Hugh Burns, was recently transferred by Bishop Donald Tippett to Wesley Church in Hayward. He is the northern California chairman of the Methodist Federation for Social Action. The US Gov't, "Guide to Subversive Organizations" on p. 107: "With an eye to religious groups, the Communists have formed religious fronts, such as the Methodist Federation for Social Action."

..Bishop Arthur Lichtenberger stated in "The Living Church", 7-29-62, "The distinction between Christians and sinners doesn't hold water. It is a mythical distinction. We are all sinners and we are all Christians...". He is the presiding Bishop for Episcopalians in the US.



CRUCIAL SEMINARY LECTURES ON GENESIS

The Christian public will be allowed to audit an important series of lectures on the book of Genesis by Dr. John C. Whitcomb, one of the Nation's leading authorities, on Feb. 5,6,7 from 10 a.m. until 12 noon in the Memorial Chapel of the San Francisco Conservative Baptist Theological Seminary, at Geary and Franklin Streets. Two different lectures will be delivered each day as follows: Tuesday - "The Flood and the Final Judgment" and "The Bible and Evolution". Wednesday - "The Flood and Biblical Miracles" and "The Creation of Adam and Eve". Thursday - "The Flood and Modern Geology" and "Original Perfection and Edenic Curse". Dr. Whitcomb is the author, with a scientist, of the current "best seller" among serious evangelical books - "The Genesis Flood". This book is causing a storm of interest in the early chapters of Genesis. Dr. Whitcomb is an acknowledged authority on "Creationism". He is professor of Old Testament and Director of Post-graduate Studies at Grace Theological Seminary of Winona Lake, Indiana. The Pastor is expecting to drive each day across the Bay. This is a golden opportunity for pastors and laymen alike.

A SHOCKING MOCKERY OF PRAYER

About the same time that the CBHMS vice-president was engineering an interfaith prayer meeting in Denver, another incident took place sponsored by the Arkansas Baptist Convention. The Watchman-Examiner of Dec. 27, 1962 stated, "More than 80 college students of five major religions from 25 countries prayed for world peace at the 5th international retreat at Camp Aldersgate near Little Rock, Ark. Included in the group were Christians, Hindus, Moslems, Buddhists and Confucianists. The retreat was sponsored by the Arkansas Baptist Convention's Student Union under the supervision of Dr. Tom Logue of Little Rock, the Union's secretary. Following the retreat the students were unanimous in praising it as a step toward better mutual understanding of the world's people." It might be good for Baptists to read their Bible: John 14:6, Matt. 11:27, I Tim. 2:5, Acts 4:12.

IT'S OFFICIAL NOW - JEWS, UNITARIANS, EVEN ATHEISTS TEACH IN SBC INSTITUTIONS

It is hard to believe, but the official weekly of the Southern Baptists of Texas the "Baptist Standard" for Dec. 12, 1962 has this incredible paragraph about the spread of apostasy in Southern Baptist seminaries and colleges: "In some of these schools there are Unitarian teachers. Is it all right for them to teach Baptist students that Jesus is not God? There are some Roman Catholic teachers in some Baptist schools. They believe in sacerdotalism and sacramentalism, and we presume they really believe these heresies. Do the Virginia brethren feel they should be paid with Baptist money to express these beliefs in a Baptist classroom? There are some Jews teaching in Baptist institutions. We take it that they are perfectly sincere when they reject the New Testament as Scripture. Shall they be told they are at liberty to use a Baptist laboratory, chapel, or classroom to explain why they do not regard Jesus as the Christ? It is possible that there might be found an atheist on some Baptist school faculty. Shall we tell him he is free to use a Christian institution to destroy the faith of our youth just because he doesn't believe in God?"

INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES

..World Council of Churches President Charles C. Parlin of New York will be the main speaker next Monday at the Golden anniversary celebration of the Northern California Council of Churches in Oakland next Monday. Mr. Parlin was the lawyer who represented Bishop G. Bromley Oxnam at a 10-hour session before the House Committee on Un-American Activities on July 21, 1953 in Washington, D.C. in which Oxnam admitted affiliation with several Communist front activities.

..Berkeley Baptist Divinity School lecturer on Jan. 15 - 17 was Dr. James D. Smart of N. Y. Union Seminary. His rejection of the Bible as the Word of God is seen in his book "What a Man Can Believe" on p. 81 - "The Scriptures are the field in which the light of revelation shines forth. But the Scriptures and revelation are not to be identified as though they were letter by letter the same. Most of those who in recent years have stood out for the primacy of the Scriptures have made the mistake of this literal identification. They have tried to maintain the infallibility of the Bible as a whole, instead of the infallibility of the message God speaks to us in the Bible."

..Dr. James B. Smart, ABC Seminary lecturer at Berkeley, states further on p. 136: "Already in his baptism he was at work of bearing men's sins in the sense of taking them upon himself and bearing them away." p. 140 - "Judas was a Christian preacher and missionary." On the Bible, p. 65, "It does not owe its title, 'The Book' to a superiority over all literature which can be made evident by comparison."

..The President of the CBHMS, Dr. Charles Anderson is quoted as saying in Windom, Minn. on one of the "Go" tours that "Minnesota stinks", according to the North Star Baptist for Jan. 1963. It is regrettable that such statements should be made by the mission society president about one of the most vigorous, best organized, most evangelistic and knowledgeable states of the CBA.

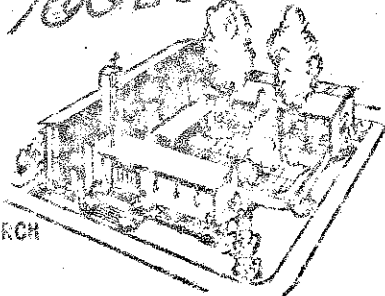

PSR SEMINARY LECTURER SAYS RELIGION MUST RID ITSELF OF A JESUS THEOLOGY

On Feb. 19-21 the Pacific School of Religion will feature as its Earl Lecturers two brilliant deniers of the gospel: Dr. Donald Soper, radical Methodist socialist, and Dr. Paul Tillich, who is not sure whether he is an atheist or not. If anyone has any doubts about whether this is still the day of the rejection of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, should read carefully what Dr. Tillich wrote in the Christian Century of Dec. 7, 1960. Dr. Tillich was writing about his experiences in the Far East and these had "confirmed my theological conviction that one cannot divide the religions of mankind into one true and many false religions. Rather, one must subject all religions, including Christianity, to the ultimate criteria of religion: the criterion of the faith which transcends every finite symbol of faith and the criterion of a love which unconditionally affirms, judges and receives the other person. In the light of these criteria two realities of the religious situation were confirmed in each of the many discussions I had not only with Christian ministers and missionaries, but with Buddhist scholars and priests. The first: Christianity, in encounter with the East, must rid itself of all elements of a Jesological (as opposed to a Christ-ological) theology. It must understand that it cannot appear in Asia as one religion among the many others already there, but as the bearer of a judgment and a promise that transcends religion and non-religion."

Feb. 6 for a message on "Creationism or Evolutionism" The meeting will begin at 7 p.m. in the Main Auditorium. Dr. Whitcomb is co-author of the most discussed book in the evangelical world today - "The Genesis Flood". We want every one of our young people to be sure to attend that they may hear the case for creationism. What a thrill this will be. Dr. Whitcomb is lecturing at the Seminary Feb. 5, 6 and 7 in San Francisco.

A HORRIFYING VIEW OF SALVATION OF ATHEISTS

The Berkeley Baptist Divinity School honored a Union Seminary professor, a brilliant Presbyterian scholar who was the special lecturer for Jan. 15-17, Dr. James B. Smart. This seminary is related to and supported by the American Baptist Convention. In his book "What A Man Can Believe", Dr. Smart says this on p. 243: "It is not for us to say who can be saved, or who shall go down to perdition. To make a statement either way concerning those who have died in ignorance of the gospel leads inevitably into error. On the one hand, we find ourselves saying that there can be a Christian salvation without Christ, or, on the other hand, that men are damned by God without ever being given a chance. Judgment belongs to God, and we can surely trust his mercy and his justice and his wisdom more than we would trust our own. The man who asserts that God cannot say to a Buddhist or a Confucianist, or even for that matter to a professing atheist, 'Well done, thou good and faithful servant', denies to God the freedom which is his. He can save whom he will, and we know from the mind of Jesus that God's condemnation falls often where we praise and his mercy and favor may be poured out upon one whom we would condemn." Read John 3:18.

THE PRESENT HOT ISSUE OF THE DEATH PENALTY IN CALIFORNIA LEGISLATURE

The Hon. Joseph C. Shell was interviewed on the moratorium bill on capital punishment proposed by Gov. "Pat" Brown and reported in the Jan. 15 issue of "The California Spokesman" (Box 1326, Los Altos, Calif.). "Q. Gov. Brown asked for a four-year moratorium on capital punishment. Assemblyman McMillan (D-L.A.) has already introduced this bill for him. Would you support it? SHELL: 'No. If you read what Pat said, you'll see that his proposal is utterly ridiculous. He would reserve the death penalty for those who kill more than one person. This, in effect, gives the felon one 'free' murder. And, he says he would inflict the death penalty when necessary to protect the inmates of our penal institutions. I think the public - our wives and children, etc. - are entitled to (Cont'd p.2)

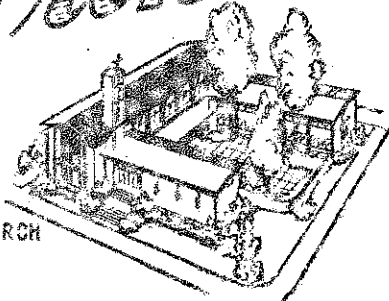

RADICAL METHODIST SOCIALIST TO LECTURE THIS MONTH IN BERKELEY PSR SEMINARY

Dr. Donald Soper, who was president of the British Methodist Conference in 1953 will be featured on Feb. 19-21 in Berkeley as an Earl Lecturer at the Pacific School of Religion. His series of addresses are entitled, "The Ideology of Jesus". Unless Dr. Soper has been converted since his Yale Lectures in 1960 and contained in the recent Hodder and Stoughton book, "The Advocacy of the Gospel", we can well imagine that they will leave the Gospel of Christ in a shambles. He boldly states his apostate position on the Bible on p. 105: "In generosity of spirit we must resolutely declare that Biblical infallibility is not a part of the deposit of the Eternal Faith. It is incompatible with honesty and must be rejected." On the same page he states, "Sooner or later this totalitarian view of the Bible will impair, if not completely destroy in intelligent minds, the relationship between truth and faith." On p. 104, Dr. Soper is horrified at the idea of the sole authority of the Bible, "There can be little doubt that the transfer of the sense of absolute authority from a papacy to a book has been intellectually calamitous. If today any kind of totalitarianism in religion is to succeed, it will be more likely grounded in a papal theory of infallibility than in a sense of the indefectible quality of Scripture." He moves on with relentless logic on p. 106, "For once you deny the infallibility of the Bible, any other concept of its inspiration is theologically worthless." The absolute authority of the Bible as the Word of God is one of the main tenets of fundamentalism, but Dr. Soper says on p. 106, "This is no easy matter upon which even to speak. But, sooner or later, we must say of fundamentalist authoritarianism that it is unchristian and cannot be reconciled with the spirit of Jesus." He might check a few passages such as Matthew 5:18, 19; John 10:35. From Matt. 7:15-21 it appears that the spirit of Jesus requires that such as Dr. Soper be exposed. He identifies fundamentalism as heresy on p. 107, "Whatever the sincerity with which it is advocated, totalitarianism is rooted in error, is ultimately heresy, and must so be regarded and dismissed." (More on Dr. Soper next week)

APOSTASY IN THE ADVANCED STAGES AT THE GREEN LAKE ASSEMBLY GROUNDS OF THE ABC

We have just received a folder of the American Baptist Assembly in Green Lake, Wisconsin, advertising their "Open Theological Conference", July 6-13, 1963. Dr. C. Adrian Heaton, president of California Baptist Seminary in Covina, will be one of the speakers on the grounds at this time. "Each day, four speakers will stimulate thinking with addresses on the doctrine of salvation." Interestingly, one of the speakers is Dr. Earl Averill, professor of Religion at ABC Kalamazoo College in Michigan. In the Christian Century for Jan. 24, 1962 p. 103-105 he has a three-page article which is devastating to the Christian Faith. We quote from the last paragraph, "Is God at work in religions other than the Christian? I believe he is. And if you ask what his work is in those other faiths, I can only reply that whatever it is, I believe it will be a work consistent with the work he has revealed in Jesus Christ. Are there other incarnations in history other Christs? I don't know. I should welcome them if there were; but I should recognize them only by reference to the Christ who has already spoken to me. Are men outside the Christian faith lost to the purpose of God, facing a destiny that is uncertain? I think not, but more than that I cannot say. Knowing my own condition, I cannot even speak with assurance about my own destiny. I can only rest my destiny and theirs in the hands of God whose love was made known in Jesus Christ."

SPIRITUAL DETERIORATION ON FOREIGN FIELDS

Dr. C. Adrian Heaton is the president of the California Baptist Seminary in Covina, which recently received accreditation from the American Association of Theological Schools. This seminary is related to and supported by the American Baptist Convention and therefore an integral part of the National Council of Churches network. Dr. Heaton, who teams up with Dr. Earl Averill at Green Lake next summer in a conference, wrote in Eternity magazine: "Having just completed a world tour of mission fields, I became more aware than ever of the tragedy of our divided Christianity. If we divide and refuse to cooperate every time we have doctrinal (Cont'd on p. 2)

INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES

..Ecumenical developments recently have included "new and unprecedented contacts ...between the Protestant Episcopal Church and the Assemblies of God, the nation's large Pentecostal body, it was disclosed Saturday", so says the Denver Post of Jan. 19, 1963. Gen. Supt. Thos. F. Zimmerman and presiding Bishop Arthur Lichtenberger have supervised the official talks. "In a move kept private until now, officials of the two denominations have held two conferences in the past year to 'learn from each other about Christian life and faith'". Already three Pentecostal groups have joined the World Council of Churches.

..Pastor Ralph Wilson will conduct a series of special meetings at Niles First Baptist Church in Fremont, 280 Peralta Blvd., beginning Sunday, March 17, according to Pastor Noel Glover.

..Dr. Monroe Parker, president of Pillsbury Baptist College in Owatonna, Minn., is holding a week of meetings at Central Baptist Church in Sacramento this week through Sunday. The following week he will be in Salinas Calvary Baptist Church. Since this is our largest institution of higher learning in the CBA movement, pastors are urged to load up cars and show their appreciation for these meetings.

..We extend sympathy to Mr. and Mrs. Bob Jones III in the loss of their little baby boy, who died a few hours after birth on Jan. 14, despite efforts of three attending physicians in Greenville.

..More on Rev. Dr. Buell Gallagher, who used to be Chancellor of State Colleges in California. In addition to appointing identified Reds Roscoe Q. Proctor and Ralph Johnsen as his 1948 "Verification Deputies" in his campaign for Congress, we now read this on p. 29 of Karl Prussion's book "California Dynasty of Communism" - "Recent investigation not yet published reveals that Buell Gallagher was at one time one of the sponsors of the Communist candidate for Lt. 

BERKELEY'S PSR EARL LECTURER NEXT WEEK IS ENAMORED OF COMMUNIST MORALS

The noted British Methodist socialist, Dr. Donald Soper, will lecture February 19 - 21 at Berkeley's First Congregational Church under sponsorship of Pacific School of Religion. His series should be revealing: "The Ideology of Jesus". He is scheduled to address the annual supper of the Methodist Federation for Social Action in Berkeley, according to a letter to MFSA members from Pres. Edward L. Peet of Hayward's Wesley Methodist Church. Dr. Soper is quoted in the Toronto Daily Star of May 21, 1960: "Even if the Russians come over, what of it? I would infinitely rather have to face the Communists in this country or Britain than face a third world war . . . We must search for world government and we must face the fact that Khrushchev will be the first president . . . Collapse of the summit talks means Canada and Britain must disarm unilaterally." The Christian Century for June 29, 1960 reported: "He expressed preference for Soviet rule to obliteration by nuclear warfare, on the ground that communism might eventually be conquered peacefully." His 1961 book (Hodder and Stoughton, London) entitled "The Advocacy of the Gospel", presents his frank views. On p. 48, "I think the evidence, and I say this with due care, as far as it is available to me, is that in many respects there is a higher sense of community morals in the Communist areas than there is in some of the non-Communist areas." On p. 52: "It is this concept of the Kingdom of God which has been so neglected as to permit the Communist to arrogate to himself the powers which once belonged to the Christian church. Had such powers been properly exercised the Communist case would have nothing like the appeal it now has . . ." Not only does he think Communism's appeal is due to the Christian elements in it, but Khrushchev's insistence on co-existence is heart-warming. On p. 46: "His assertion of the necessity of competitive co-existence has no place in the Communist canon and is directly and absolutely contrary to the Marxist principle. It is important that those of us who are attempting to say that Christianity is superior to Communism ideologically should be in possession of these enheartening facts." His concept of Christianity is a socialist state which is much akin to the Communist state and a perversion of Biblical Christianity. Jesus taught world-government, says Dr. Soper on p. 115: "The lack of that kind of good will in our public affairs today is destroying the possibility of establishing world government, the commonwealth of the people, that one community of which Jesus speaks in the Sermon on the Mount." He confesses on p. 61 that he became a Pacifist first and then "It turned me into a Socialist because there is nothing so nakedly violent as a system based on what we describe as enlightened self-interest. This is only a baptismal name for selfishness." Evidence of his spiritual blindness is found in his belief that the high moral character of the Soviet constitution reflects the influence of Christ. On p. 57: "Yet you will find today, that the standards by which public morality is judged in the Soviet Union would have been impossible had it not been for One who walked the land of Galilee and hung upon a cross and rose from the grave on Easter Day."

DR. PAUL TILLICH COMES TO TOWN

Another Earl Lecturer of the Pacific School of Religion Feb. 19-21 is Dr. Paul Tillich, whom the liberals contend is the great religious thinker of our times. He is scheduled to preach in Bishop Pike's Grace Cathedral on Feb. 24. Tillich leaves us confused whether he is an atheist or not. Time Magazine for March 16, 1959 had his picture on the front page with an extensive article: "Faith, according to Tillich is not belief in God but 'ultimate concern'. Hence an atheist is a believer, too, unless he is wholly indifferent to the ultimate questions. Doubt is an inevitable part of faith. Sin is not something one commits, but a state of 'estrangement' from one's true self. 'The importance of being a Christian is that we can stand the insight that it is of no importance', says Tillich; the religious man can 'fearlessly look at the vanity of religion'. Tillich can rejoice with Nietzsche that 'God is dead' - the God of theism - and write of looking beyond him to 'the God above God.' The traditional question of theology, such as the existence or nonexistence of God, take on a bafflingly unfamiliar quality in Tillich's thought. (Cont'd page 2)

To Tillich, symbols (as opposed to signs, which merely point to something) are living, growing and sometimes dying things, which participate in the power of what they symbolize. But they are not to be mistaken for the real and unknowable thing behind them. God, therefore, cannot be spoken of as 'existing' or 'not existing'. for this would imply the limiting of the unlimitable, the conditioning of the unconditional."

INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES

..Dr. Lee Long of Denver was engaged on Feb. 1 as Field Director of the newly formed fundamental group of Conservative Baptists known as "Mountain States Baptist Fellowship".

..The John C. Whitcomb lectures which were delivered last week before a well-attended and enthusiastic chapel audience at the San Francisco Baptist Seminary will be broadcast over KEAR-FM at 7 p.m. weekly, beginning on Friday, Mar. 1, and thereafter each Friday for six weeks. The interest was enormous.

.."The Confusion of Tongues", a message by Dean Wm. G. Bellshaw of the San Francisco Baptist Seminary, has been enjoying a terrific demand from all over the nation by Christian leaders of many denominations. We understand that Dallas Seminary is going to publish it in "Bib. Sac." in due course. Available from the Seminary, 1225 Franklin, S.F. 9.

..Russian church agents are coming for a month tour of the United States. The party includes several church leaders who have been identified as Communist agents. They are being feted in this country by the National Council of Churches. Two of them are to arrive in San Francisco for Bay Area appearances.

..Dr. Paul Shelford, executive secretary for the Northern California Council of Churches, will be host to these Russian church agents, while in this area. He is very evasive about the exact time, to guard against any public outcry against this cultural exchange betrayal. Dr. Shelford was on the executive committee of the 1958 ecumenical crusade at the Cow Palace. Denver pastors are arranging a huge protest rally on Feb. 27 when the Russians arrive in that city.

..Administrative and promotion expenses of the CBFMS, including publishing of the CBFMS paper in the 1961 budget was: nearly \$300,000. Income for year ending Jan. 1 dropped \$62,000 over last year, for the first time.

..CBFMS approves cooperation in ecumenical evangelism by missionaries. The official "Chit-Chat" from the Wheaton Office to missionaries for Feb. 1963 states: "With but two negative votes, the board declared itself satisfied that the cooperation of our Philippine missionaries in the Graham crusade is in accord with our recently defined policy."

..A real expression of love (New Evangelicalist style) was reflected in CBFMS board action this January as given in the "Chit-Chat" - "It was agreed with four dissenting votes not to cooperate in regional or national meetings where the new mission society or CBF is represented." What childish and arrogant disregard for the autonomous wishes of local churches. It is indeed strange that the CBFMS, which will tolerate cooperation with National Council leaders and modernists of every shade and description in ecumenical evangelism, will refuse to cooperate with Fundamentalists within their own movement. This is a clear-cut example of the exclusiveness that always follows when inclusiveness is espoused.

CHAIN LETTER BOND FRAUD CONTINUES TO SWEEP THROUGH CHURCHES OF THE AREA

Promoted by ministers in some cases and advertised as having approval of local district attorney's offices, an illegal fraud game continues to mushroom in churches, involving \$37 worth of bonds for each victim. Sacramento, San Jose, and the East Bay have been the happy hunting grounds for this operation. Law enforcement officials wouldn't know how to stall this crime wave since so many ministers are involved. The Palo Alto Times for Feb. 13, 1963 had this AP dispatch from WASHINGTON- "Postal officials say that the old savings bond chain letter scheme has cropped up again, this time from coast to coast. It's still illegal, they added. A post office department spokesman said today the chain letter operation, using U.S. savings bonds as the lure, has been reported in California, Colorado, Texas and Virginia. Similar to a scheme investigated 22 months ago in Puerto Rico, the chain letter operation involves the transfer of a list of names. The recipient is supposed to send a savings bond to the person whose name tops the list, strike that name from the list, add his own to the bottom, make two copies and pass these along to new participants, who are supposed to do the same. In theory, the person at the top of the list should be flooded with savings bonds from those who joined the scheme after him. But in practice, postal officials said, the chain breaks down and many participants are victimized. They said use of the mails to further the scheme is a violation of mail fraud and lottery statutes."

FULLER SEMINARY NAMES NEW PRESIDENT

An Oakland boy has gravitated to an enviable position in the theological world with the Feb. 7 announcement in Pasadena that Dr. David A. Hubbard had been appointed as president of Fuller Theological Seminary. Dr. Hubbard's highly respected parents were both pastors of the Pentecostal Elim Chapel on 8th Avenue for years. Dr. Hubbard graduated in 1952 at Fuller and holds both the BD and ThM degrees, as well as the PhD from St. Andrews University in Scotland. He is presently chairman of division of Biblical studies at Westmont College.

DENVER SEMINARY PRESIDENT MEETS SELECT GROUP OF PRO-DENVER MINISTERS HERE

CBFMS Missionary Wm. F. Hunter sent out a letter on Feb. 5 as follows: "Dr. Vernon Grounds is considered by some to be an extremely controversial figure in the Conservative Baptist movement. The Denver Seminary, of which he is the capable president, has been maligned and yet continues to grow and to produce missionary-minded and godly Bible-ministering students. Many have wished for an opportunity to meet Dr. Grounds personally and to make the measure of the man. This opportunity is now possible ... May I, therefore, issue a personal invitation for you to meet with a select group of other ministers at an informal luncheon 12:15 p.m., February 14 ... Dr. Grounds will be present at my invitation." The letter was initialed WFH/bd. We presume this means "Bertha Dorchester", who is the CBHMS area representative. Twenty Pro-Denver ministers from throughout Northern California attended.

CBFMS APPROVAL OF ECUMENICAL EVANGELISM INVOLVES A RECENT CHANGE OF POSITION

The Fundamentalists who have poured thousands of dollars into the CBFMS are alarmed at the recent action of the CBFMS at their January Board meeting in Wheaton, as reported in the CBFMS "Chit Chat" for February 1963 which is mailed to missionaries: "With but two negative votes, the board declared itself satisfied that the cooperation of our Philippine missionaries in the Graham crusade is in accord with our recently defined policy". This is in sharp disagreement with the statement of CBFMS representative Fricke, assistant to Dr. Vincent Brushwyler, at a panel discussion at Beth Eden Baptist Church in Denver on Sunday evening, June 29, 1958. The chairman of the panel posed this question to the representatives of the mission societies: "Do the CBFMS and CBHMS favor their missionaries cooperating in evangelistic programs on the field with liberals and modernists?" Answer by Dr. Fricke for the CBFMS: "In principle, we, the CBFMS, would not want to compromise our spiritual and doctrinal convictions in a cooperation with liberalism in evangelism or in any kind of basic work on our mission fields ..." 

PROTEST RALLY HERE NEXT TUESDAY TO
PROTEST NCC SOVIET CHURCH AGENTS

Dr. Carl McIntire of Collingswood, N. J. who is daily broadcasting on 410 radio stations throughout the USA, will address a large protest rally on Tuesday, Feb. 5 at 8 p.m. in the Oakland Auditorium Theatre on Lake Merritt. The meeting is open to the public, according to Pastor George Moore of Walnut Creek, who will be presiding. The meeting is to protest the coming of 16 Soviet churchmen who are touring the US under sponsorship of the National Council of Churches. The party will break up into sections of four each, so that protest rallies will be difficult to cover them all. Freedom-loving Fundamentalists are holding a great rally this Thursday in Denver, with another one on Friday in Chicago, and one in Austin, Texas on Monday. The Russian delegation allegedly includes several Soviet police agents disguised as clergymen, and are expected to propagandize the official Communist peace line among the churches. Dr. Paul Shelford, executive of the Northern California Council of Churches, has the responsibilities of sponsoring the group locally. The NCC has refused to publicly announce the meeting, and may hold closed meetings with local NCC clergymen. The leaders of the Russian Orthodox Church in Exile plan to picket them in the East. Protesters are meeting them at various US airports with signs reading: "Soviets, Get Out" - (COBeT4 NK N BOH OTCHOAa) and "Communists, Go Away" - (KOMMYHNCTb1 BOH OTCHOAa).

The college choir of the Western Baptist Bible College will provide music next Tuesday under direction of Richard Caulkins.

The University Young Men's CHRISTIAN Association is known as Stiles Hall, located across the street from Trinity Methodist and across Bancroft Avenue from the University of California in Berkeley, had Herbert Aptheker, editor of "Political Affairs" as speaker before a crowded house of 170 on Feb. 20, 1963. Stiles Hall, regarded by many of the center of leftwing activity on the Campus, is supported by more than \$20,000 each year from United Crusade.

DIVISIVE STATE PASTOR'S ORGANIZATION
PROMISED BY DENVER SEMINARY SUPPORTERS

The deep division which split the churches of Colorado by the pro-Denver supporters may have been averted in Northern California when a largely attended state pastor's meeting on Monday was informed that the State Board disassociated itself from the proposed new pastor's fellowship being formed by ten men of the pro-Denver persuasion. It is expected that this bloc of ministers who have financially boycotted the work of the state CBA will move to take control of the CBA at Fresno at its Mar. 11, 12 meeting. We regret to note that these brethren wish to blacklist four of the educational institutions in the CBA in one stroke: Pillsbury College, Central Seminary, Denver Baptist Bible College, and San Francisco Seminary. They want a state board which would condemn schools, mission societies, and institutions not of their endorsement. It proposes to set up a "prudential committee" which characterized Convention days, which is designed to recommend pastors to local churches to the advantage of their ecclesiastical machine, with its consequent black-listing of uncooperative pastors before the churches. It appears to bring in national problems into an otherwise happy state fellowship. It is an endeavor to impose control on this state by the national mission boards. It hardly breathes the spirit of the newly appointed "Committee of Reconciliation" recently set up nationally to reach unity in the movement. Instead of such rigid controls, the pastors of this state deserve a better deal and a more intelligent and Baptistic approach than through an organization purporting to be statewide but forced upon them by a small group meeting behind closed doors. Most of the pastors appeared to see in it an exclusive, divisive and competitive group which would usurp many of the functions of the state CBA office including such activities of a state paper, pastoral placement and pastoral retreats. The pastors seemed to back the state work of Warren Conrad wholeheartedly.

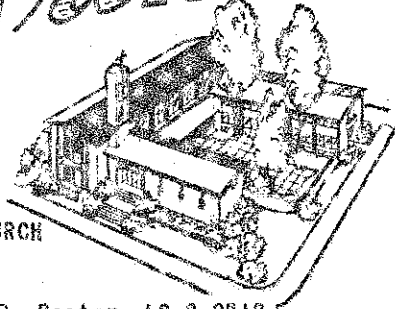

ALLEGED SOVIET CHURCH SPIES ARE GUESTS OF BISHOPS PIKE, TIPPETT AND DR. GILL

Sheriff's cars were used to carry the three Soviet churchmen from Moscow thru a back route at the San Francisco Airport to elude 60 pickets waiting Sunday morning to demonstrate at the landing of the alleged Soviet agents coming from Denver. They were greeted with 30 or more pickets when the Red churchmen entered the St. Nicholas Russian orthodox Cathedral in San Francisco. The signs read: "Bearded wolves in cheep's clothing" and "Communists Go Home". They held a press conference at Bishop Pike's Cathedral house on Sunday. The Tribune for Mar. 1 said, "In the Bay Area the Russians will be the guests of the Episcopal Church Divinity School of the Pacific Seminary at 7 p.m. Sunday. The Rev. Dr. Donald Tippett, bishop of the Northern California-Nevada Conference of the Methodist Church, will preside. On Monday the visitors will go to the Presbyterian San Francisco Theological Seminary at San Anselmo and to Fort Ross, once a Russian settlement." Dr. Theo. Gill, former managing editor of the Christian Century, is the president of the Presbyterian Seminary. The massive publicity in the metropolitan press guarantees a huge audience on Tuesday evening when Dr. Carl McIntire was scheduled to address a protest rally at the Oakland city auditorium.

PEACEFUL CO-EXISTENCE DOES WORK — IF YOU HAVE ENOUGH LAMBS TO SPARE

Here is a story which should be read by every apostle of neutralism, whether in the political or religious world, and which is especially applicable in the spiritual realm to those who delude themselves into thinking they can continue to manage co-existence with spiritual opposites. This was found in Dr. Willard Aaldirch's "Doorstep Evangel" for Jan. 1963: "The story is told of a Russian named Ivanovich who visited the Moscow zoo for the first time. To his amazement, he found a little lamb sharing the cage that held a big fierce bear. Ivanovich expressed his surprise to his Communist guide. The guide smiled, "That is peaceful coexistence". When Ivanovich doubtfully shook his head, the guide explained, "Of course, we have to put in a fresh lamb every (Cont'd 2.)

DEVELOPMENTS IN THE STATE CBA

..Pastor Harold Thomas, Denver Seminary trustee, was elected president of the new Pastors' Fellowship of the pro-Denver faction in the state. This group conceived this new organization in a secret meeting on Jan. 3 with about ten men present. The new group is driving for a split among the churches. Brother Thomas has been a long time friend of the Pastor, having been invited to California by the Pastor to found the Calvary Baptist Church of Alameda under sponsorship of Foothill Blvd. Church and supported by mission funds from the church.

..A multimillionaire representative of the Denver Seminary is now journeying through the state by the name of Mr. Duggan. He comes from the East and is contacting the pastors about supporting the Denver institution. He recently sold his business in the East for an enormous sum. Pastors might consider contacting him for a loan for new churches.

..We defend the right of Pastor Harold Thomas to conduct a missionary conference this week in San Leandro with a community church and a former Pentecostal church in conjunction with ten different mission boards, all but one of which are non-Conservative Baptist. We are pleading that local churches be allowed to exercise their exclusive right to choose what mission boards and objectives they shall support.

..Brother Warren Conrad, state missionary-director, had endeavored to be fair in his administration in this state. We regret that ten ministers, who have as a whole financially boycotted the state work for more than four years, now are moving to control the state work with their attempt next week in Fresno through elections to the State Board. It was reportedly decided at the secret meeting in Jan. 3 that Brother Conrad was the first of several to be retired from leadership if this faction controls.

..The basic problem is ideological and is a part of the general drift away from the historic Christian Faith as held by old-fashioned Fundamentalists, involving an antagonism toward fundamentalism, a love for ecumenical endeavor, a disparagement of the Scofield Bible position, a benevolence toward post-tribulationism, a toleration of forms of theistic evolution, a favoring of (Cont'd p. 2)

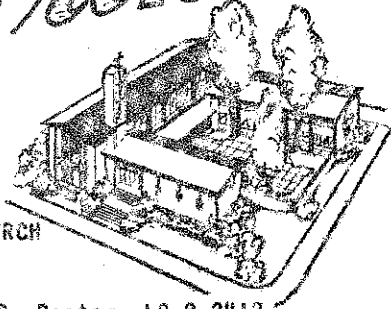

WHEN ONE TAKES AN UNCOMPROMISING STAND ON THE LORDSHIP OF CHRIST

These pungent words by Editor A. W. Tozer of the Alliance Witness are good: "Let a man rise to declare the unique Lordship of Jesus Christ and the absolute necessity of obedience to Him and he is at once branded as a hatemonger and a divider of men. The Devil has brainwashed large numbers of religious leaders so successfully that they are now too timid to resist him. And he, being the kind of Devil he is, takes swift advantage of their cowardice to erect altars to Baal everywhere. The Bible is a book of controversy. The Old Testament prophets were men of contention. Our Lord Jesus while on earth was in deadly conflict with the Devil. The Apostles, the Church Fathers, and the Reformers were men of controversy. They fought the Devil to the death and kept the torch of truth burning for all succeeding generations. Is our contribution to history to be the ignoble one of letting the torch go out?"

WHAT MODERN PREACHERS BELIEVE ABOUT THE DOCTRINE OF THE TRINITY OF GOD

The theological views of Robert Moon of the Fresno First Methodist Church are fearful indeed. Since he is the minister upon whom the National Council of Churches is depending to lead the campaign to destroy the House Committee and Un-American Activities and the HCUA film "Operation Abolition", his doctrines are important to a wide segment. On Jan. 28, 1962 he preached a sermon which is mimeographed form on "What Can We Believe about the Trinity". He said: "It is helpful to remember that the doctrine of the trinity is never mentioned in the Bible. In the Bible we discover a multi-arian God ... a God with many ways of revealing himself. So the trinity is not New Testament doctrine. The idea developed during the third and fourth and fifth centuries. Jesus and Paul and the apostles never heard about it. No one in the New Testament or in the early church ever said that a belief in it is essential to the Christ-like life ... It shows God in 3 D ... The three dimensions say to us that God is great, God is good and God is near ... These then are three dimensions or faces of (Cont'd p. 2)

DEVELOPMENTS IN THE STATE C.B.A.

The pro-Denver Pastor's Fellowship which was repudiated by the State CBA Board on Feb. 25 in Hayward, quietly organized itself with less than twenty present, on Feb. 26 with Harold Thomas as president, Blaine Bishop as vice-president, and William F. Hunter, CBFMS missionary on leave for two years, as secretary-treasurer. The editorial committee for their new paper is composed of Pastor David Dodd, of Oakland, a Fuller graduate, and Pastor Arthur Van De Zande of Alameda, who came from Oregon a year or more ago. The group had its initial beginning in a secret meeting of about ten ministers in Los Gatos on Jan. 3 when plans to purge the state of undesireables were laid. The state pastors were refused any opportunity to vote on whether this organization was wanted. By its own vote of a small minority of pastors, they chose this name: "The Conservative Baptist Fellowship of Northern California". They selected the name of "Pastor's Report" for their newspaper, evidently not realizing that there is such a publication already issued periodically in this area. Even though they represent strictly one faction of the state pastors, the pro-Denver seminary element, we defend their right to organize. We would think it better grace for them to grant the same rights to others in bringing new institutions into being. Since this group has deliberately boycotted the state work for more than four years, their primary objective of taking over control of the state CBA board is somewhat embarrassed.



APPROACHING GOD IN PRAYER THROUGH BUDDHA

The Baptist Bible Tribune (Box 106, Springfield, Mo.) in its Mar. 8, 1963 issue had a report on "Billy Graham in Montivedio" by Missionary F. V. Dabold of the Los Gatos Calvary Baptist Church: "Something has happened here that is tragic beyond expression, which will make it more difficult for us to reach men for Christ for all time to come. It centers around the man who was pastor of the First Methodist church. He is a graduate of Union Theological Seminary, New York City. He studied under Karl Barth in Switzerland. The first Billy Graham bulletin announced this man's name as the vice-president of the Graham Crusade Committee. In a television broadcast featuring this pastor, the director of the program asked various questions of him. When he was asked what he thought about the theory of evolution, he answered by saying that it made no difference to him what the truth might be; but as he saw it, it was highly possible that man came from a monkey. When he was asked why in his pulpit on Sunday morning, he offered a prayer for U Thant that his God would help him solve the Cuban crisis, inasmuch as U Thant is a Buddhist, he replied that the God of U Thant was the same as our God; and that whereas we approach God through Jesus, the secretary of the United Nations approached the same God through Buddah. When asked about the Cuban blockade (Cont'd on p.2)

ATHEISTS OF HIGH INTELLECTUAL QUALITY?

Dr. Paul Tillich preached for Bishop James A. Pike last Sunday morning at San Francisco's Grace Cathedral. Both have a unique type of atheism in common. TIME magazine (3-16-59) had a feature article: "Tillich can rejoice with Nietzsche that 'God is dead' - the God of theism - and write of looking beyond him to 'the God above God' ... For he sees such terms as 'God', 'the Christ', and 'the Resurrection' as symbols ... God, therefore, cannot be spoken of as 'existing' or 'not existing', for this would imply the limiting of the illimitable ...". Bishop Pike warms the heart of the old line atheist with these words in the Christian Century (12-21-60), "I have preached more and more in the past decade on the values of atheism and agnosticism ... I have found that in almost every case the atheist is opposing a concept of God which I myself disbelieve". In the same article: "But the kind of a God which I first believed in, who would limit salvation to a select group of people who happen to have heard the news and heard it well ... is an impossible God. As to this God I am now an atheist".

..When is a man a modernist?..That giant Presbyterian champion of the truth, Dr. J. Gresham Machen, stated in the Independent Board Bulletin, Feb. 1935 and reprinted in the Christian Beacon of Nov. 28, 1957: "Dr. Machen stated the position of sham orthodoxy and contrasted it with real orthodoxy. Regarding a sham position he said, 'We hold that whether a man is a Modernist or not is determined simply by the kind of sermons he preaches; he is orthodox if he preaches orthodox sermons'. Of real orthodoxy he declared, 'We hold that whether a man is a modernist or not is determined by the way he votes in Presbytery and at the General Assembly; he is a modernist, no matter what kind of sermons he preaches, if he votes with the Auburn Affirmationists and other modernists in the great issues of the day.'" An Auburn Affirmationist is now the head of the Mt. Hermon Conference Board.

..The late Donald Grey Barnhouse wrote in Eternity magazine for Feb. 1959, p.5: "But despite his greatness in the eyes of the world, Albert Schweitzer is possibly the foremost anti-Christian figure in the world today ... In his student days Schweitzer showed his antagonism for Jesus Christ. He wrote a thesis setting forth that Jesus Christ must be explained as an epileptic. He has never withdrawn that thesis."

..A correction..The Blu-Print last week had this unfortunate statement: "The Pro Denver Pastor's Fellowship which was repudiated by the State CBA Board on Feb. 25 in Hayward ..." State CBA president Lee Toms wrote: "... it was never in the thinking of the board to repudiate this group in any way, nor did we seek to convey such an impression." 

BISHOP KENNEDY GLOWINGLY PRAISES ACLU

Since the American Civil Liberties Union has pressured officials at Alameda High School to investigate the appearance last Thursday of All-American Football star, Rev. Don Moomaw, representing the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, it might be interesting to read what Bishop Gerald Kennedy said about ACLU. Kennedy, the chairman of the General Crusade Committee for the Ecumenical Crusade beginning in August in Los Angeles, said on p. 94 of his book "Who Speaks for God" - "The history of the American Civil Liberties Union has been a very interesting one, as well as a very confusing one to some people. That such an organization should be concerned about liberty for certain groups is clear enough; that it should be concerned about liberty for all groups is very hard to comprehend. Thus if you read the history of this amazing organization, you discover that it has fought for the rights of racial minorities, religious minorities, and political minorities of all kinds. It has sometimes championed the liberties of communists and sometimes the liberties of Fascists. It has even provided legal aid for people whose professed philosophy has been a denial of the rights of all individuals. From this we can learn a much-needed lesson, which is that we must champion freedom of 'expression of opinions that we loathe', as Justice Holmes put it." A Congressional report of Jan. 17, 1931 states, "The ACLU is closely affiliated with the communist movement in the US, and fully 90% of its efforts are on behalf of communists who come into difficulty with the law."

The Christian Century for March 27 says on p 392: "American Baptist Convention public relations director Dean Goodwin, who accompanied the four Russian churchmen, reported that Atlanta produced the largest protest demonstration the group has encountered - far greater than those in Austin, Dallas, Houston, Indianapolis, Denver and New Orleans."



METHODIST CHURCH SPONSORS "DEEPER LIFE" CONFERENCE BY IDENTIFIED COMMUNIST

One of the most amazing developments in this area is the week-long series of meetings now being conducted at the San Leandro First Methodist Church by one who has been named by several people on different occasions under oath as a member of the Communist Party. Dr. Howard Busching is the pastor. The Morning News of San Leandro for March 28 had this story: "A guest speaker, Rev. J. R. McMichael, of Grace Methodist Church, Stockton, will conduct a series of inspirational meetings Sunday, and each night through April 4. The purpose of the Faith and Life Mission is to call its members to a deeper commitment to Christ . . .". This move is being countered by a wide protest. Jack McMichael has been identified as a Communist Party member before responsible government investigation groups under oath by such high-ranking former Party members as Manning Johnson, Leonard Patterson, Benjamin Gitlow, and Herbert Philbrick. When Mr. McMichael appeared before the House Un-American Activities on July 30 and 31, 1953, his attorney supplied by the Methodist Federation for Social Action was Frank J. Donner, an identified communist. Since Mr. McMichael has enjoyed continued support from Bishop Donald Tippet for years, and since the Bishop appointed him as pastor in Stockton in June 1960, the Christian public might consider making their protest to the Bishop, 83 McAllister Street, San Francisco 2, California.

ON THE PROBLEM OF VISITATION

How often should a prospect be visited? The National Retail Dry Goods Association conducted a survey that throws light upon this, according to the "Mile-Hi Evangelist" of the Denver South Sheridan Baptist Church. 48% of the salesmen make one call and quit. 25% make two calls and quit. 15% make three calls and quit. 88% quit after one, two or three calls. The 12% who keep calling do 80% of the business. The 88% who quit by the third call do only 20% of the business. "Should not the technique followed in the winning of souls and the building of the church go even beyond the business world?" Let's think this over, Sunday School teachers.

NEW CHURCH TO HAVE ITS FIRST MEETING SUNDAY SPONSORED BY THIS CHURCH

A great amount of prayer is requested this week for the initial service this coming Lord's Day morning at 11 a.m. for the San Ramon-Pleasanton area, to be held at the Cafeteria of the Fairgrounds on this side of Pleasanton. Brother Walter Lindquist, choice young Christian leader, will be the founding pastor. This will be known as the First Baptist Church of Dublin, with permission from the Secretary of State already secured to use this name. Incorporation proceedings are taking place now to make this city of 9,000 acres one of the most delightful in California. Property will probably be secured in the San Ramon section. A report will be given at our church next Sunday evening on the results of the first service.

THE BOOK - "CONSERVATIVE BAPTIST DISTINCTIVES"

Dr. William F. Kerr (520 No. Legion Dr., Buffalo, N. Y.) states in his book, "Conservative Baptist Distinctives" (containing six chapters, totalling 96 pages), the following in chapter six, "The Separation from Liberalism" on p. 82: "For the Conservative Baptists one of the distinguishing distinctives is that of separation from liberalism . . . To him it is the practical application of a doctrine that is unequivocally and dogmatically taught in the Scriptures. In fact, it is one of the basic reasons for the existence of the group of which his church is a member - the Conservative Baptist Association of America . . . It was obedience to the command: 'Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you . . .' (II Corinthians 6:17) that originated the Conservative Baptist Movement. It will be only by strict adherence to this Biblical injunction that the distinctive reason for the existence of the Conservative Baptists can be justified."

INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES

..Cited 23 times..The NAE paper "Action" for Mar. 1, 1952 had an article "The Hammer and Sickle Over the Churches" by George W. Robnett. The opening sentence: "The present secretary of the MFSA (successor to Ward) is Jack McMichael, who has been cited twenty-three times by the House Committee on Un-American Activities". McMichael, who is conducting a deeper life conference this week at San Leandro First Methodist, holds a graduate degree from the Pacific School of Religion.

..The Pastor and Gov. Brown are in agreement on one issue - the move to ban boxing in California. The Governor should be encouraged with a few letters supporting his effort to eliminate this degrading sport.

..Vern Law, Pittsburgh Pirate Pitcher, has his testimony included among the athletes in the new book "The Goal and the Glory" published in the interests of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. Law is an Idaho Mormon who is an aggressive speaker and soul-winner for Mormonism. In their forthcoming Oregon conference the FCA is making provisions for mass for the Roman Catholics attending. This activity is being strongly pushed by New Evangelicals.

..Bishop Donald H. Tippet wrote an open letter on Feb. 27, 1961 to Grace Methodist Church in Stockton where Jack McMichael is pastor: "I have been delighted with the reports of the progress you are making as a church under his leadership, in which I continue to have full confidence." He also said: "Jack did a great deal of work with the personnel of the Castle Air Base. When word was noised about that Jack was going to leave Atwater, the commanding officer of the Air Base wrote me a letter asking me to exert every influence to keep Jack at the Atwater Church. He went on to say that in his military experience he had never found a man who ministered to his troops with quite the same effectiveness that Jack demonstrated." It should be remembered that this was the strategic Air Command base for huge jet bombers for the entire West.

..Trinity Baptist Church of Castro Valley launched their \$50,000 bond program a week ago with which to build their new church on new property on Somerset Ave. By Friday they had sold \$38,000. Pastor Peterson said that ground breaking ceremonies may come within 30 days. Valuable counsel was given by Warren Conrad and Harold V. Nickel. We rejoice with them.

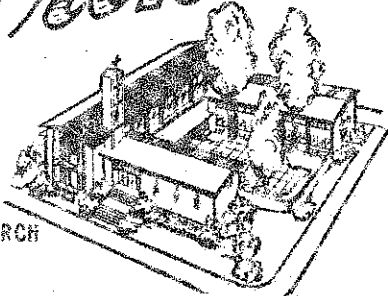

A "Conciliation Committee of Fifteen", which was appointed by the Boards of the CBA, CBHMS and CBFMS at their recent January meetings was stacked at the beginning with closed minds who refuse to allow local churches in our movement to enjoy complete autonomy in choosing mission societies and mission objectives to support. Instead of choosing men whose minds were open and desirous of conciliating the problems in our movement, the committee was made up largely of men whose adamant spirit had already been shown against any society not controlled by the Wheaton mission machine. It was obvious at the appointment of the Committee that the mission societies, who outnumber the CBA two-to-one, were appointing individuals who were known to be violently anti-WCBM. The Committee met recently in Chicago and split down the center, with a minority and majority report being drawn up for consideration at Atlantic City. The messengers in the churches will have to consider the dispute. The voices of moderation were not heard and the pro-Denver elements were in control. Many have suggested that the hour has come for the leaders with an adamant spirit to resign from the boards and allow leaders of Baptist objectivity and moderation to prevail.

METHODIST BOB SHULER REFLECTS UPON CHANGES SINCE 1949 GRAHAM CRUSADE IN L.A.

Dr. Bob Shuler was one of the great figures in the 1949 Crusade in Los Angeles, sponsored wholly by evangelical elements which skyrocketed the evangelist to national prominence. "The Methodist Challenge" of August 1959 had a significant article "The Sin of Tolerance" in which the noted pastor of Trinity Methodist said in part: "I pray daily that the Christian church may come again to where men will stand as witnesses and cry out, 'My heart is fixed, Oh God, my heart is fixed'. But believe me, there is a great gulf fixed between the Billy Graham I saw and knew and loved and trusted in the Los Angeles revival, as he stood without a thread of compromise and declared that he would not associate either in his personal testimony or his gospel ministry with the liberals and modernists of that great city - I say, there is an impassible barrier between that position of separation and the attitude of this great evangelist in New York and San Francisco. In Los Angeles, his intolerance of liberalism and modernism was open and bold like a young David, fresh from the sheep pastures. But now we read and hear explanations, not so much from Billy as from his apologists, that seem to seek to enlighten the world as to why he has sought 'another way'."

METHODIST WORLD COUNCIL OF BISHOPS MEETS IN SAN FRANCISCO THIS WEEK

The 60 Methodist Bishops in their World Council will convene from Tuesday to Thursday "concerned with internal administrative matters of the church". All sessions are closed to the public and the press. Bishop Donald Tippett will preside. In the event their agenda is not filled up they might consider the infiltration of the Methodist church. Let Benjamin Gitlow, onetime candidate for the vice-presidency under Communist Party, tell the story in the HCUA book, "Communist Activities in the New York Area - Part 6", p. 2092 (July 7, 1953). Under oath this former Party leader was quoted: "Mr. Kunzig. Did the communists infiltrate the Methodist church? Mr. Gitlow. Theology is considered the heart of the curriculum in a standard seminary training.



READ THIS SHUDDERING DENIAL OF MORALITY

Dr. G. B. Chisholm is quoted approvingly as "a psychiatrist of wide recognition" in the modernist's commentary "The Interpreter's Bible" (p. 502). This Dr. Chisholm was director-general of World Health Organization of the United Nations from 1948-53 and is presently the president of World Federation for Mental Health and vp of World Association for World Federalists. In the William Alanson White lectures in Washington, DC in 1946 he stated: "What basic distortion can be found in every civilization? ... There is - just one. The only ... psychological force capable of producing these perversions is morality, the concept of right and wrong, the poison long ago described and warned against as 'The fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil'... For many generations we have bowed our necks to the yoke of the conviction of sin. We have swallowed all manner of poisonous certainties fed us by our parents, our Sunday and day school teachers, our priests, and others with a vested interest in controlling us ... The reinterpretation and eventual eradication of the concept of right and wrong which has been the basis of child training, the substitution of intelligent and rational thinking for faith in the certainties of the old people, these are the belated objectives of practically all effective psychotherapy. Would they not be legitimate objectives of original education? ... With the other human sciences, psychiatry must now decide what is to be the immediate future of the human race. No one else can."

PAPAL AGREEMENT WITH ATHEISTIC COMMUNISM

Roman Catholic patriots are watching with great concern for the emergence of an accord between the Vatican and the Kremlin as a result of "the Pope himself hobnobbing with Khrushchev's daughter and son-in-law". The National Review, whose editor (Buckley) is a Catholic, carried an article by E. V. Kuehnelt-Leddihn in the April 23, 1963 issue entitled, "The Great Confusion". The opening paragraph: "It seems likely that a modus vivendi will be found between the Vatican and the Soviet Union. Editors of European Catholic papers who have resigned themselves to this agreement (p.2)

OFFICIAL CBFMS TIE-IN WITH NEW EVANGELICALIST INSTITUTION GIVES CONCERN

Reaction among Fundamentalists was swift across the country to the first note in the CBFMS "Chit-Chat" for April 1963 : "The Winona Lake School of Theology has become the Summer School Division of Fuller Theological Seminary, its summer courses providing the equivalent of an academic half-year. We have been offered a limited number of tuition scholarships for furloughing missionaries registering for June 17 through August 24. For the descriptive bulletin or application form, address the foreign secretary". Dr. Charles E. Fuller, founder, in a form letter of Sept. 17, 1958 said: "The aim of Fuller Seminary is to join scholarship with evangelism ... to produce a 'new evangelicalism'." The president of Fuller Seminary said in a public letter of Sept. 29, 1958: "Our stated purpose is ... to join biblical theology with social compassion ... to produce a 'new evangelicalism'." Dr. Charles J. Woodbridge, PhD, who taught for seven years on the Fuller faculty before resigning, is quoted in the Fellowship News for June 3, 1961 after a lecture on this subject before 3500 at Bob Jones University: "In conclusion, Dr. Woodbridge said that Neo-Evangelicalism is the worst menace that has confronted the church since the time of Luther." Dr. Harold P. Warren of Oak Park, Michigan is quoted in the Fellowship News for April 21, 1962, "Satan is the master counterfeiter of the ages ... His most recent masterpiece is the New Evangelicalism". IFCA leader Wm. E. Ashbrook states: "Evangelicalism is in reality a New Neutralism leading straight to a deadly compromise and inevitable judgment."



NEW EVANGELICALIST SUPPORTERS NOW ASKING LOYALTY WHICH WAS ONCE BITTERLY REJECTED

In a document sent to CBA leaders prior to the 1954 annual meeting in Detroit, Dr. Gabriel R. Guedj who since left the CBA to take a church into the Southern Baptist Convention, said this: "To expect loyalty to all Conservative organizations including CBFMS, CBHMS, CBF and CBA as the price of non-discrimination and non-recrimination is foreign to the true CB spirit in our ranks at the time when the blessing of God has been literally heaped upon us as long as we have adhered to the principles of voluntariness, the autonomy of the local church, and the absolute liberty to join or not to join as the Holy Spirit has led. Let us beware lest having separated ourselves from inclusivism, we now should trip into the pitfall of pharisaic exclusivism." In 1954 these leaders resented being pressured into a loyalty to the CBA in order to hold high office in the mission societies. In 1963 they insist upon complete support for the Wheaton mission societies in order to hold office in the CBA. Those who have been sympathetic toward inclusivism (giving equal recognition to believers and unbelievers, as in a Graham crusade) are now trying to drive out of the CBA those who reject the principle of inclusivism.

THE CLASSIC EXAMPLE OF MASS EVANGELISM CONVERSION EDITS NEW BOOK ON LIBERALISM

In an exclusive interview with "U.S. News and World Report", reported in the Sept. 27, 1957 issue (p. 72), Dr. Billy Graham said, "In New York City, I have met many people who are now religious leaders in the religious life of New York who were converted by Billy Sunday 40 years ago. One of the most classic examples is Dr. Henry Van Dusen, president of Union Theological Seminary". Some people might dispute this statement, since Dr. Van Dusen denies the Deity of the Saviour in a clear and forthright manner in his book "Liberal Theology" on pp. 2, 5, 218, and 220. The very latest Christian Century (May 1, 1963) comes out with a Charles Scribner's Sons advertisement on p. 588 which announces a new book by Dr. Van Dusen: "The Vindication of Liberal Theology". We'll give the whole paragraph concerning this book from the pen of the president of Union Theological Seminary: "For two decades, Liberal Theology has been held in disrepute by man ... Dr. Van Dusen believes that in its origin Liberal Theology represented something new in the pilgrimage of faith and that it remains the most credible, adequate and cogent interpretation of Christian Faith in the nineteen centuries of the latter's history. He points out that it is both a spirit and a body of conviction, and that it has offered deliverance and a corrective from the distortions of history. In simple but forceful language, this much-needed book sets forth the basic and regnant principles of Liberal Theology, and finds that it is still a strong foundation for any working faith." Dr. Van Dusen was a member of an important committee in the New York Crusade of 1957.

SOUTHERN BAPTIST NEO-ORTHODOX FAITH

Next week Southern Baptists will vote in annual session in Kansas City to strengthen their 1925 statement of faith, but instead they are opening the door wide to neo-orthodox unbelief. In their effort to stem apostasy in their seminaries they are suggesting this: "The Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is the record of God's revelation of Himself to man." 

The Watchman-Examiner of May 2, 1963 carried on the front page the picture of Dr. Eric C. Rust, professor at Southern Baptist Seminary in Louisville. Only last week editor John W. Bradbury had made an editorial attack upon the Fundamentalists. 

PURE, UNADULTERATED MARXISM TAUGHT IN
BERKELEY BY PRINCETON SEMINARY PROF.

One of the most incredible series of lectures ever delivered under religious auspices in this area was given recently by Princeton Seminary professor Richard Shaull, a former Presbyterian missionary to Brazil. In his University campus series he said, according to the Daily Californian of April 25, "Leftist forces which are influenced by Marxist ideas but are not linked with international communism and are mildly anti-U.S. offer the best hope for the United States in Latin American countries, Shaull said. "For sheer deception or else inexcusable ignorance, these words would be hard to match. Dr. Shaull preached from the First Presbyterian pulpit of Dr. Harold Englund in Berkeley when he was here. He also spoke at Dr. Robert Munger's pulpit at University Presbyterian Church in Seattle, according to the Seattle Times of April 27, 1963. The Daily Californian of April 25 quoted him: "The problem is that in the United States, we've not been able to make the distinction between Marxism and Communism." His series of lectures were entitled, "The New Revolutionary Mood in Latin America." The paper continued: "Marxist ideas will become increasingly important on the Latin American scene, and United States thinking must make the distinction between them and the conspiracy of international communism, a Princeton theologian said yesterday." Marxism's appeal in Latin America today is "due to its deep humanistic concern." Continuing this straight-line Red propaganda, the Daily California of April 30 stated: "Youthful Latin American students in their revolutionary quest today look to Marxism as paralleling the Christian-Judaic tradition of history moving toward a humanitarian goal, Princeton theologian Richard Shaull said Friday." The sad, apostate character of Presbyterianism (USA) is seen in such statements. Dr. Shaull will continue his Marxist lectures under auspices of the American Baptist Convention at Green Lake July 27 - Aug. 3 in an ecumenical evangelism conference with this title: "The Gospel and the World in Revolution". ..God commendeth His love toward us in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. — Rom. 5:8.

NEW EVANGELICALIST'S DIALOGUE WITH JEWS

One of the most fantastic developments of our times in the evangelical world is the push of the Neo-Evangelicalists toward a "dialogue" with religious Jews. The latest in a long series of such developments was at the recent NAE convention in Buffalo. The cry is "Not Separation, but Penetration" with the culture of our times. The NAE general secretary, Geo. L. Ford attacked "ultra-fundamentalism" as placing "an unnecessary and unscriptural handicap on the church in its efforts to penetrate our culture for Christ". The Christian Century for May 8, 1963 said: "For the first time in its 21 years the National Association of Evangelicals invited a rabbi to address its annual meeting. Rabbi Marc H. Tanenbaum of the American Jewish Committee, New York, said: 'Far too many Jews and other Americans think of evangelicals as 'wild-eyed', hair-shirted fanatics' and far too many evangelicals think of Jews as disinherited by God and living barren unredeemed existences'. The rabbi pleaded for mutual understanding and more dialogue between the two groups." The vice-president of the CBHMS is trying to do his part by encouraging interfaith religious worship services, which have been defended ardently by the NAE leadership across the country.

SOPER SAYS: TEST-TUBE BABIES NO SIN

We found this in the Methodist magazine "New Christian Advocate" for April 1958, (114-5). "Is it 'sinful' for 'lonely spinsters' to have children by artificial insemination? An outspoken British Methodist ... Dr. Donald Soper, thinks not... Other clergymen also disagree with Soper, who says it would not be 'sinful to give certain spinsters who would otherwise be lonely and who would make good mothers' the opportunity of motherhood. Further, he thought it 'unwise for churches to rush in and condemn out of hand artificial insemination in a happy marriage where the husband is sterile'. He scored the church for 'wanting to make a sin or a crime' of another instrument 'science has put into our hands to use wisely'." 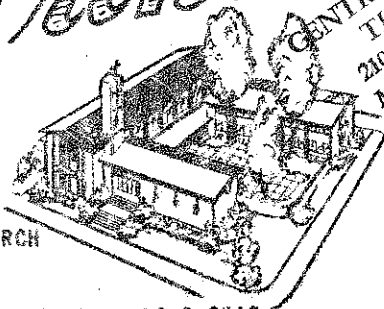

THE DESTRUCTIVE BELIEFS OF KIERKEGAARD

Dr. Bernard Ramm, a Neo-Evangelicalist, in Henry's "Revelation and the Bible" (Baker's - \$6) said, "Finally, theologians under the influence of Kierkegaard have urged that any obvious supernatural act of God would be destructive for faith, or inconsequential to it". (pp 253-54). R. A. Finlayson of Scotland in the same volume said, "Several streams of philosophical and theological thought rising in the early nineteenth century, from Schleiermacher to Kierkegaard, have given thrust and direction to present-day opposition to the evangelical doctrine of inspiration ... this movement away from the Reformed tradition (on inspiration) gathered momentum in Kierkegaard's teaching ..." Dr. Bernard Ramm in "Eternity" magazine for July 1958 stated: "In discussing Adam, and original sin, Kierkegaard says that it is immaterial to him whether Genesis 3 be interpreted literally or mythologically. .. He rejects the traditional doctrines of original sin ..." Dr. Paul K. Jewett of Fuller denounced Kierkegaard in the book "Revelation and the Bible" by Henry as a serious danger with a completely inadequate gospel (p. 50). Dr. Carnell of Fuller denounced him in 1952 in his book "A Philosophy of the Christian Religion" as follows: "Kierkegaard says that a heathen who passionately worships an idol has more truth than the Christian who is complacent. This is a questionable statement - very questionable, indeed. If the name of God means anything, God must be jealous that worship be given to him alone. Feeble worship directed to him is far preferable to strong worship of a false god, therefore." (p. 479). Carnell continued: "Some have sought to rescue Kierkegaard from this slippery road to skepticism and nihilism, but all in vain." (p. 487). "Whatever guidance we may glean from Kierkegaard, we must draw the line at that point where reason is betrayed." (p. 489). "Kierkegaard, like Rebekah, gave birth to two struggling children: Theistic theology and atheistic philosophy." (p. 495). Didn't Jesus say when He denounced false prophets, "By their fruits ye shall know them?" Dr. Carnell says further: "When one cries, What must I do to be saved? the existentialist replies (even as Kierkegaard did when men asked for a proof of God's existence) (Cont'd p. 2)

FULLER HONORS 19th CENTURY HERETIC

The Los Angeles Times of May 5, 1963 (p. 6 - Sec. F) carried the astounding news that shows the extent of neo-orthodox penetration into New Evangelicalist institutions. Kierkegaard is known as the father of existential philosophy and the "grandfather" of neo-orthodox theology. The caption - "Tribute Paid to Kierkegaard on 150th anniversary of Birth". The story by Dan L. Thrapp - "Soren Kierkegaard; a difficult Danish theologian of the 19th Century, was at heart an evangelical and it's time evangelicals honored him as one of their own according to Dr. Vernon C. Grounds ... in commemoration of it, Dr. Grounds delivered an address recently on the theologian and philosopher at Fuller Theological Seminary ... Many faculty members were enthusiastic in their praise of the Danish Biblical thinker ... Yet evangelicals, Dr. Grounds continued, can be grateful for many things he did and wrote." "It is high time today for us as Evangelicals to acknowledge Soren Kierkegaard fraternally as a confessor of our faith", said Dr. Grounds. "It is high time for us to claim him gratefully as a champion of our faith, and we should heed him as a critic of it." The Times continued, "Many of today's greatest Biblical students are, in a sense, his disciples." Who are these great students? A Fuller professor tells us. "Kierkegaard is responsible for helping clarify the vision of such theological giants as Barth, Brunner, Tillish, and the Niebuhr brothers", said Dr. Edward John Carnell, professor of ethics and the philosophy of religion. It can be easily demonstrated from the writings of the New Evangelicalists that they once denounced as a dangerous influence less than a decade ago, the very one whom they now proclaim as a champion of the Faith. It shows how far these capable scholars have led God's people down the path of apostasy in less than ten years.

..Dean Wm. G. Bellshaw's excellent address on "Premillennialism: Primary or Peripheral" is to be given this week in Atlantic City at the San Francisco Seminary banquet. This six-page document is free to all who write in to the Seminary. Since summer is a lean time for seminary finances, it might be a good idea to think of the professor's salaries, when writing in.

Dr. Carnell lowered the boom on Kierkegaard in 1952 in this way, "If perchance Kierkegaard IS correct in saying that truth as inwardness increases in proportion to the absurdity of the objective, then at least let all universities and churches close their doors; for in their enthusiasm to make stable individuals out of those who come to them for learning they are in effect killing of individuality itself." (p 507). The quotes are endless.

INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES

..A spiritual epidemic among Episcopalian churches. A National officer of this church group was quoted in the S.F. Examiner of May 16: "The Rev. (James) Morton said that pietism, 'a kind of vertical line between the individual and God' has almost reached epidemic proportions within the Episcopal Church." May God grant that something like this might get under way. He thought more concern should be expressed over bond issues, housing, unemployment, segregation, rather than getting straightened out vertically with God.

..The Bishop and Billy" - Another Kennedy in the News, is the title of an extensive ten-page document on Gerald H. Kennedy who was named to lead the Los Angeles Graham Crusade this August. This document is 25¢ each or \$20 per 100.

Dr. W. Theo Taylor was a co-author of a folder entitled "The Answer", along with Clarence Roddy and E.M. Harrison. It stated a principle which should be acceptable to everyone: "We will never surrender our right to criticize our societies and their work. If we must abandon our conscience and yield to the status quo to be cooperative, then the price is too high." This was right and proper in 1943. Some of these now want us to "abandon our conscience" in 1963.

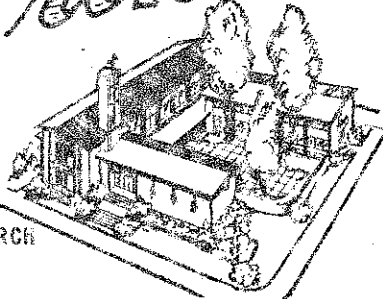
..New Evangelicalists are going Left .. In a left-of-center article in "The Standard" of the Baptist General Conference of April 30, 1962 (p. 258-59) by Prof. David O. TO BE A TRUE MINISTER OF THE GOSPEL

In his earlier book "Calling Youth to Christ", Dr. Billy Graham had this significant statement which is as true as it can possibly be: "Many consider the ministry an easy and lazy profession and many have said, 'If you cannot be anything else, be a preacher'. But a preacher who is true to the Word of God must not only preach the Word (II Tim. 4:2) but must expose false teaching (I Tim. 1:3). A minister who is true to his calling must warn people against the danger of heresy and false doctrine. Many times he is tempted to soft-pedal because people may misunderstand and he may make enemies. That is why Paul said, 'I am praying for you day and night, Timothy'. Your pastor needs prayer that God will give him courage to stand true."

ANOTHER GEM OF WISDOM FROM CHURCHILL

The new honorary citizen of the U.S.A, Winston Churchill said this: "Still, if you will not fight for the right when you can easily win without bloodshed; if you will not fight when your victory will be sure and not too costly; you may come to the moment when you will have to fight with all the odds against you and only a precarious chance of survival. There may even be a worse case. You may have to fight when there is no hope of victory, because it is better to perish than live as slaves."

MONTANA CBA POSITIONIZES ON EVOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Montana Association of Conservative Baptist Churches are meeting in Havre, Montana, Calvary Baptist Church in annual session, WHEREAS, in these days of spiritual confusion among so-called evangelical leaders, WHEREAS, there have been attacks made upon the book of Genesis, especially concerning creation BE IT RESOLVED that we go on record as believing the Genesis account of creation, and that it is to be accepted literally, and not allegorically or figuratively; that man was created directly in God's own image and after His own likeness; that man's creation was not a matter of evolution or evolutionary change of species, or development through interminable periods of time from lower to higher forms; (See p. 2)

DR. LA VERN SCHAFFER TO PREACH SUNDAY

Next Lord's Day our preacher at both the 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. services will be Dr. La Vern Schafer, chairman of the department of Theology at the San Francisco Baptist Seminary. Brother Schafer was awarded the "Doctor of Theology" degree this past month at commencement exercises in Dallas Theological Seminary. He is considered by many as one of the coming theologians of our movement. We are pleased that not only do young candidates for the ministry have an opportunity to sit under his instruction but the churches as well from time to time. We welcome him warmly to our pulpit.

THE PERVERSION OF THE GOSPEL CONTINUES

Dr. Jitsuo Morikawa, ABC director of evangelism, writing in "Missions" magazine for May 1963 defends his five-year program of "evangelism" on pp. 21-22, known as "Baptist Jubilee Advance" in which seven Baptist groups are participating. He states: "The assumptions on which the B.J.A. is based present a radical departure from those of former national programs ... The study of Scripture drives home the conviction that in the cross and resurrection Christ became Lord over the whole world ... Many pastors and laymen, whether by accepted heritage or by independently formed conviction, continue to believe that evangelism is by definition confined to confronting individuals in a one-to-one relation to Christ, believing that our task is to draw men out of the world into the life of the church as an end in itself. The B.J.A. has disappointed all these expectations ... This conflicts with the widely held assumption that if men will accept Christ, he will be their Saviour. The distinction is a crucial one." Evangelism, which is bringing the Gospel to men, is twisted: "The B.J.A. has, therefore, emphasized evangelism as the witness of the church in public life of the world. This means the active witness of its members in the structures of business and government, in education, housing, health, and general welfare, where the decisions are made which largely determine the character of the individual and family life." This is a clear statement of the "social gospel" which has supplanted (See p. 2)



AUTO ACCIDENT HOSPITALIZES OUR PASTOR

Since readers of the Blu-Print will be wondering why they did not receive their weekly copy of this church paper, we are giving the following detailed report concerning the auto accident, which hospitalized our Pastor, one youth, and injured two others.

Following the annual C.B.A. meetings which were held in Atlantic City, our Pastor went to Detroit where he picked up a new car, driving it to Owatonna, Minnesota. There he met his son, Dwight, and two other boys, George Samaduroff of Los Altos, California and Ron Moffatt of Fremont, California, students at Pillsbury Baptist Bible College. They proceeded to Casper, Wyoming and after preaching at the morning service in Riverside Baptist Church on June 2, began their journey homeward. A severe thunderstorm and slippery highway made driving hazardous. They were not yet outside of the city limits nor able to increase to full speed, when the accident occurred. Rounding what is called a "goose neck turn", their car, heavily loaded with the boys' equipment, began to swerve back and forth across the slippery pavement until it careened off the road and struck a steel pole. Our Pastor was thrown forward so that his head was projecting through the windshield. Ron suffered severe chest injuries caused by hitting the pole, and en route to the hospital stopped breathing several times.

After two days in the hospital, Dwight and George were released - Dwight having four stitches in his head and George with a back injury. Both have arrived home. Our Pastor suffered a slight concussion, had twelve stitches in his head, three broken ribs, a broken right hand and internal injuries but is progressing slowly and expects to be released from the hospital sometime this week.

Ron, as well as having chest injuries, had two operations on his back, but his lower extremities are still in a serious, paralyzed condition. The date of his release is still not known.

Ron attends the Irvington Baptist Church of Irvington, California.

We would ask you to pray for our Pastor and for Ron who have suffered much and for their families, too, as they endure these severe trials.

We would request also that telephone calls not be made to the Weniger residence, but direct any calls to the church office - at least for the next week or two.

Just suppose the Lord would have everyone stoned to death for covetousness as was Achan;


Just suppose all who lie about their giving or paying tithes should be stricken dead as were Ananias and Sapphira for lying about money matters;

PASTOR RETURNS HOME FROM CASPER HOSPITAL

After twelve days in the hospital following a grinding auto crash near Casper, Wyoming on Sunday, June 2, the Pastor was given medical clearance to fly to San Francisco on Thursday, June 13. Pastor John Weidenaar took him from the hospital directly to the airport for the flight to Salt Lake City, where after a three-hour wait in the new terminal, he boarded a Western jet from Denver for the hour flight home. He was met at the airport by Richard Butler, chairman of the Deacons, and his wife; Dean Wm. G. Bellshaw of the Seminary; Dr. and Mrs. Roy Austin and son Roger of San Francisco; Dr. and Mrs. Bernard Northrup and daughter, of the Seminary; Dr. Arno Q. Weniger of San Francisco, and daughter Sonja. It was a thrill to get home and look into the face of the grandest girl God ever gave anyone. Muscles are relaxing and becoming strengthened. On Monday he walked around a whole block with his daughter. Recovery should come slowly but surely.

SIDELIGHTS ON THE RECENT ACCIDENT

..Ron Moffatt, pre-ministerial student at Pillsbury College, from Fremont, is still in the hospital at Casper, hoping for a military mercy flight home possibly this week-end. His spinal cord was severed making for paralysis from the waist down. This gives the Pastor a heavy heart. We ask for prayer for sustaining grace as adjustments are made in this home and in this life. Mr. and Mrs. Bud Moffatt flew to his bedside almost at once. Several churches are considering taking a fellowship offering for this sterling young man's enormous expenses.

..The accident took place at a point 10 miles west of Casper on Highway # 220, where the super highway ended because of lack of funds, where four lanes narrow to two lanes and where the speed limit drops from 70 mph to 50 mph, and where the road goes into a curve which banks to the outside instead of the inside. Add to this, the fact that the blacktop became slick in the wet weather. When the Pastor applied the brakes at the curve he was already in the trap.

..This was the first time the Pastor had been a patient in a hospital in his life and the first accident in more than 33 years of driving. He had a new appreciation of the nurses and their aids.

..It couldn't have happened in a nicer place. Casper has always had a certain fascination for us. The Christian people of this area were grand, with more visitors than we deserved by a good deal. The pastors were all magnanimous. The hospital was the best. This is probably the largest city in Wyoming, the oil capitol of the mountain west.

..We have three strong churches in this city with three splendid pastors, all of whom were as helpful, encouraging and friendly as we could wish: Richard W. Peterson, Edward Watke, and John Weidenaar. Several other pastors visited us likewise. Nothing was left undone by these unselfish brethren. We cherish their friendship.

..The city became aroused as a result of this accident, which was the 19th at the very same spot - "Goose Egg Curve", since Jan. 1 of this year. In addition to the first picture and news story on June 4, the Casper Tribune carried a five-column news story on June 9 entitled - "Goose Egg Corner - A Motorist's Nightmare". The lead editorial of June 14 was devoted to this death trap. Letters to the editor began to appear calling for the elimination of this peril.

..U.S. Senator Gale McGee showed up in the Pastor's hospital room for a visit and wanted to know the details of the accident. He was speaking at a stockmen's convention that day before flying back to Washington.

..It will be impossible for the Pastor to answer the scores of greetings, letters, and expressions of concern. A score of telegrams came from all over the nation. At least that many long distance calls came to the hospital. The flowers were beautiful.

THE FASCINATING WORLD OF CARL MCINTIRE

The Pastor has always admired success in every realm of human endeavor. It has long been his desire to see with his own eyes the operations of one of the most "cussed and discussed" men of America - Dr. Carl McIntire. On Saturday May 25, two carloads of preachers left Atlantic City for a pleasant trip down the turnpikes to the very tip of south Jersey - Cape May. Long before we arrived we could see the dominating figure of the "Christian Admiral", a majestic hotel on the Atlantic sea-shore at this lovely resort. We were fortunate to have arrived at the exact moment when Dr. McIntire came. We were given the royal tour by the noted crusader. This vast set-up, is one of those things - something like Bob Jones University - it can't be described by human language. It must be seen. With obvious pleasure Dr. McIntire showed us the huge lounge and lobby, beautifully carpeted dining room, glistening kitchen, spacious auditorium, delightful bowling alleys, swimming pool, library, snack bars, and other attractions. Several acres of expensive carpets have been laid in the bedrooms and hallways. This hotel can accommodate more than 1000 people in twin bedrooms in near-luxury. We were amazed at the price of the first week - board and room in comfort and splendor for \$29.00. The building, which can be seen 25 miles at sea, was constructed at a cost of more than a million, but could not be duplicated today for anything less than five million. What a place to spend a pleasant vacation. Taxi cabs will pick up Alleghany Airlines passengers at nearby Cape May Airport - five minutes away.

THE PERSONALLY CONDUCTED TOUR CONTINUES

On Sunday, May 26, three carloads of preachers from Atlantic City visited the Bible Presbyterian Church of Collingswood in suburban Philadelphia. The church is a majestic colonial structure, which had a huge auditorium filled with worshippers. The Pastor and Dr. Arno Weniger were invited to bring greetings over the radio from the platform. Following the service we toured the entire church plant worth probably a million dollars - all comparatively new. Then Dr. McIntire took us through the headquarters building of the Christian Beacon and the 20th Century Reformation Hour broadcast center. Though the afternoon was late our esteemed host took us on a tour of Faith Theological Seminary in Elkins Park. This 35-acre campus with the main building of 110 rooms simply left us speechless. This famous estate which cost eight million to construct, but could not be duplicated now for \$25 million, houses this Bible Presbyterian Seminary which has had such an influence in this nation. We came away definitely feeling that we have cited our vision on goals which may be beneath the dignity of our God. It is no wonder that this fearless leader is hated so by the enemies of the cross of Christ, but loved by people who hold the Bible dear to their hearts. Dr. McIntire is heard locally over KFAX every morning at 6 a.m. and over KSAN at 10 a.m. We are glad that our mind is not so prejudiced by lying propaganda from hateful ecclesiastical leaders that we cannot enjoy the fellowship and friendship of this godly Christian leader.



STEAM BUILDING UP FOR GRAHAM CRUSADE 1966

A "Second Billy Graham Crusade" survey committee sent out a letter this past week from San Francisco to build up pressure for another crusade in 1966 or thereafter. The Pastor has not sent in his reply yet but expects to let it be known that he would be happy to participate in a campaign which was conducted exclusively within the limits of the New Testament Gospel. He will not only refuse to cooperate but will promise to expose any evangelistic fraud which would be sponsored by men who do not believe the gospel which the evangelist preaches, or which gives Christian recognition to apostates from the historic Christian faith, or which is bound by a perverted system of ethics which gives converts to churches which not only reject the gospel by which they are saved, but also repudiates the Bible by which alone a convert is nourished in the faith. The Graham crusades are the most alluring program which the liberal forces have for building up the ecumenical church. Bible-believing laymen are beginning to see that there is something fundamentally deceptive about an evangelistic program that requires acceptance of the gospel by the sinner before he can get into the inquiry room, but which will allow ministers who reject that gospel to sit on the platform and control the meeting. WHAT THE SUNDAY SCHOOL MEANS TO ME

Given by a High School graduate, Richard Hallert, at the graduation last Sunday evening at the church, Richard was in the upper quarter of his class at Arroyo High in San Lorenzo and plans on majoring in architectural engineering at California State Polytechnical College in San Luis Obispo. "As a great building rests upon the structure of its foundation, so the Christian life of an individual must be established upon a firm foundation of faith in the Bible truth". Sunday School, like a massive sky-scraper, establishes a firm foundation for the building of the rest of the Christian's life; it provides the 'structural materials' for the building and moulding of his spiritual personality. It was in Sunday School that I accepted Jesus Christ as my personal Saviour. 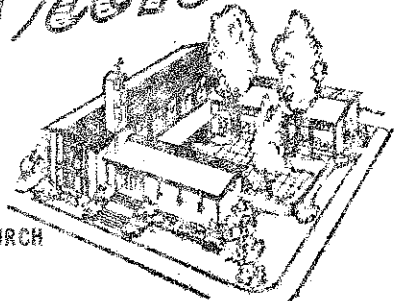

CONFLICT OF THE GOSPEL IN THE MINISTRY

Read these good words of rugged character from Dr. J. Greshman Machen, noted Presbyterian defender of the Faith, found in D. O. Fuller's "Valiant for the Truth", p. 450: "If you decide to stand for Christ, you will not have an easy life in the ministry. Of course, you may try to evade the conflict. All men will speak well of you if, after preaching no matter how unpopular a Gospel on Sunday, you will only vote against that Gospel in the councils of the church the next day; you will graciously be permitted to believe in supernatural Christianity all you please if you will only act as though you did not believe in it, if you will only make common cause with its opponents. Such is the program that will win the favor of the church. A man may believe what he pleases, provided he does not believe anything strongly enough to risk his life on it and fight for it. 'Tolerance' is the great word. Men even ask for tolerance when they look to God in prayer. But how can any Christian possibly pray such a prayer as that? What a terrible prayer it is, how full of disloyalty to the Lord Jesus Christ!"

SOME OF THE MOST SOLEMN AND SERIOUS WORDS MR. CHURCHILL EVER WROTE

"Still if you will not fight for the right when you can easily win without bloodshed; if you will not fight when your victory can be sure and not too costly; you may come to the moment when you will have to fight with all the odds against you and only a precarious chance to survive. There may even be a worse case: You may have to fight when there is no hope of victory and it will be better to perish than to live in slavery."

ECUMENICAL LEADER ARRESTED IN EAST

Presbyterians must have been real proud as they gathered for worship last Lord's Day in the knowledge that their chief executive officer, Dr. Eugene Carson Blake, celebrated the Fourth of July by deliberately breaking the law in Baltimore and was arrested. The Chronicle for July 5, 1963 carried a front page picture with this line underneath. "Dr. Eugene Blake in Paddy Wagon". Twenty-two clergymen were among those arrested for breaking what they called unjust laws. Dr. Blake is a former president of the National Council of Churches. The Apostle Paul was in jail several times, but this was always for daring to preach the Gospel of the Grace of God directed at individual sinners. There is a vast difference between this and the promotion of the "social gospel". The Apostle Paul was never arrested for leading a movement to abolish slavery, segregation, unjust minority conditions, but for preaching the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. Rome had plenty of unjust laws in Paul's time. However, the verdict of a king and a governor in Acts 26:31 was this: "This man doeth nothing worthy of death or of bonds." He was careful to keep himself blameless before the law.

ARE NEW EVANGELICALS TURNING LEFT?

On the program of the 18th annual convention of the American Scientific Affiliation, which is composed of "evangelical" scientists, are men who are sure to color the organization with a deep pink. On the theme of "Communism and World Revolution", the scientists have scheduled Charles Malamuth, Prof. of International Relations, University of Southern California. Upon checking we find that a Charles E. Malamuth used to teach here at Berkeley's UC campus, lectured frequently on Soviet Russia, spoke at Mooney and Billings meetings, was jailed for pro-communist activity, and was suspected of being under discipline of the Communist Party. His wife, Joan London, was involved in Trotskyite connections. Among other speakers, is Paul Peachey, exec. sec. of the Church Peace Mission, which is widely regarded as doing magnificent service for the Soviet cause. A. J. 

GRAHAM CHAIRMAN BISHOP KENNEDY ATTACKS ANTI-FILTH CRUSADERS

THE ULTIMATE IN ECUMENICAL ACTIVITY

Methodist Bishop Gerald Kennedy, general chairman of the Graham Ecumenical Crusade which opens in Los Angeles next month, issued a bitter attack on anti-filth crusaders who are distributing information condemning an obscene book — "Dictionary of American Slang" which is found on library shelves of many California schools. Dr. Max Rafferty has labeled the book as a "handbook of sexual perversion". Bishop Kennedy is a member of Thomas Braden's State Board of Education which refuses to censor and ban the book. The San Diego Union of June 20, 1963 reported the Bishop's address before his annual conference meeting in Redlands. Instead of asking his board of social concern to condemn the book, he condemned the courageous crusaders who have documented the filth in the book and are seeking legislative action to ban it. "Claiming that they do not want children to read this material, they now scatter it without discrimination so that any child of any age may read the filth they have extracted . . . These people have now revealed that they are dirty minded. They have no sense of responsibility to young people, and no respect for the truth." The Union continued, "Veteran church statesmen said the bishop's statement was the strongest he ever has issued." It was the strangest disillusionment for us when we realized that some of the strongest opposition to cleaning up the filth literature of the day comes from within the ecumenical movement, from the liberal "social action" experts, who would rather spend their time in condemnation of capitalism and the anti-communist forces and committees.

The First Community Church of Columbus, Ohio shows what the truly ecumenical church does in a summer youth camp, according to the five column article in the Columbus Dispatch of June 28, 1963: "Each day two cabins of teenagers combine to present a full day's activities centering around the beliefs and practices of one of the religions of the world. A worship service in the manner of that religion closes each day . . . 'First, we want to show how difficult it is at ecumenical councils to reconcile the beliefs of various religions. Secondly, we are trying to show how each religion has the same general basis — a belief in a higher power'. The Islamic faith was studied and practiced first, including the five-times-a-day call to prayer facing the holy city of Mecca. The teenagers spent considerable time studying the Koran, the Islamic holy book, and learning the first chapter, or sura, Mr. Campbell said. 'The words of that first chapter of the Koran roughly correspond to the Lord's Prayer,' he mentioned. The second day of camp was devoted to the study of Buddhism, with emphasis on the eight-fold path of the religion's founder, Gautama Buddha . . . During the fourth day, devoted to the Hindu religion, the teenagers observed these highlights of the Hindu faith: They were vegetarians, and were forbidden to kill insects . . . The camp will close Saturday with a Christian communion service . . . 'We want them to understand that we are dealing with different responses of an individual to what he feels is a higher force. Differences in religion arose as man developed doctrines. We are not talking about different gods, but different response to one God, one universe', he explained. "How shocking and abominable.

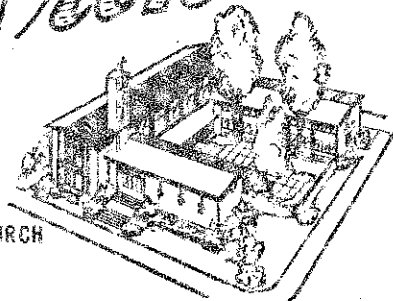

GETTING THE CHURCHES READY FOR STREET FIGHTING IN THE REVOLUTION COMING UP

We are appalled at the number of ministers involved in the mob demonstrations against existing laws, unjust or not. The picture of Presbyterian Dr. Eugene Carson Blake escorted into a police "paddy wagon" after his arrest in Baltimore for leading a street demonstration is a horrible indictment upon the apostasy of the ministry. His action is right in line with liberal church theology. The twisted logic of the social gospel adherents is seen in the quarterly review of the World Student Christian Federation in Geneva, "The Student World", where a statement on civil disobedience is given on p. 426: "Civil disobedience is within the legal pale - within the Canons of Ethics of our profession, I would say - because it involves the highest possible respect for the law ... But when we openly disobey a law that we hold to be unjust and ask for the penalty, we are saying that we so respect the law that we belong in jail until it is changed." Such lawlessness. A twice-adopted resolution of the North American section of the World Presbyterian Alliance in January 1961, and again in 1962, states: "There may come a time in spite of efforts to correct it, when a law prevails that keeps people from receiving justice and thus conflicts with the purpose of God as they are revealed in the Christian gospel. At such a time it is our opinion, that a Christian, after serious and careful consideration, and after sharing his concern with other members of the household of faith may engage alone, or with others in an act of civil disobedience ... (if) ... his actions are taken first in the spirit of a faithful servant of his faithful Lord, and in the sight and knowledge of the authorities, and with a full willingness to accept the consequences imposed upon him by society under existing law." It is this logic that impelled Canon Darby Betts, close associate of Bishop Pike, to march down Market Street in the front line with identified Communist Harry Bridges in a street demonstration recently.

.. It is high time for us to claim him gratefully as a champion of our faith, and we should heed him as a critic of it."

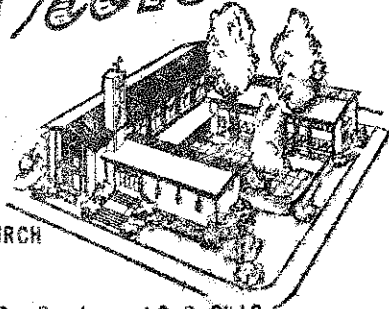

Multitudes of California citizens were shocked to read in the press last week of the Governor's appointment to high state office of John A. O'Connell, one of the two San Francisco assemblymen who addressed the Communist-led student rioters in Union Square on May 12, 1960. 

THE WORD OF GOD IS THE GREAT DIVIDE

Truer words were never spoken than the editorial of the liberal Christian Century of May 21, 1958 (p. 611). Study these words carefully: "The base question, the theological Great Divide, is still the question about the Word of God and the words of the Bible. How is the Word of God related to the Bible? Is the Bible the Word, or is the Word in the Bible? Every agreement elsewhere in theological discussion means nothing unless the approaches to consensus have begun on the same side of the divide. No development yet in sight suggests any will or way to tunnel through, either... What real difference does it make whether right moves left and left moves right if, when they get to easier hailing distance, the gulf or ridge between is impassable, if there is no footing in the middle, if a clear and decisive choice still has to be made? Today, Protestant theology everywhere outside the self-consciously conservative wing has chosen for the side which says with Fosdick that the Bible 'contains the word of God but not that it is the word of God'." We recognize that great unbridgable chasm and with deep conviction we say that we are on the opposite side of the Divide from the modernists. We agree that the gap cannot be denied. This is one of the crimes of ecumenical evangelism - to gloss over this fundamental difference that can never be reconciled.

..Dr. Franklin C. Fry, noted Lutheran ecumenical modernist, was quoted in the Examiner of Aug. 3, "I regret to say we know nothing about our church members in China today." What a sad statement after so many years of compromise and appeasement of the communists in the World Council of Churches, of which he is a leading spokesman.

WILL THE CBHMS EXPLAIN THIS APPARENT TREACHERY IN DEALING WITH DOCUMENTS?

On the front page of the "Challenge" for November 1961 was this astonishing statement concerning a meeting of officers of the three societies on Sept. 12, 1961 in Wheaton: "The doctrine of separation was presented as a problem also, and after much discussion, we were unanimously agreed on the following statement: 'It is our conviction regarding separation that the Declaration of Purpose of the CBA of A has been, and continues to be, the policy of all three of our Conservative Baptist organizations. The General Director, Dr. Rufus Jones, said not a word in defense of the document which was supposedly the basis of the CBHMS stand on separation. At Atlantic City the CBHMS again failed to affirm its agreement with this document, and again it was betrayed. Neither the Board or the General Director said a word in its defense. The height of hypocrisy was reached when Dr. Robt. Carlberg, the avowed opponent of this separatistic document, was elected President of the CBA of A.

SAN FRANCISCO BAPTIST SEMINARY COMMENCEMENT

The Fifth Commencement exercises of the San Francisco Conservative Baptist Theological Seminary were held in the main auditorium of the Hamilton Square Baptist Church in San Francisco on Monday, May 6, 1963 at 8 p.m. with President Arno Q. Weniger presiding. The address of the evening was given by Dr. Richard V. Clearwaters, president of Central Conservative Baptist Theological Seminary of Minneapolis.

The second honorary "Doctor of Divinity" degree in the Seminary's history was bestowed upon Pastor Ralph L. Mr. Jones has been called to the pastorate of the First Baptist Church of Adin, California. Mr. Currier plans to take further work at the Seminary toward a Master's program, as is Mr. Rozman. Mr. Piastrelli is planning to return to Italy to do Christian work.

The Baccalaureate service was held on Sunday afternoon, May 5 at the Foothill Boulevard Baptist Church in Oakland, with Dr. H. O. Van Gilder of the Western Baptist Bible College bringing the address.

The Seminary is pleased to announce that Prof. La Vern Schafer, chairman of the Department of Theology, was granted the degree of "Doctor of Theology" in absentia at the Dallas Theological Seminary at its commencement on May 14. His doctoral thesis was upon the theology of Albertus Peters.

In recognition of distinguished service, the Board of Trustees advanced Dr. La Vern Schafer from assistant professor to Associate Professor of Theology, to share equal rank with Dr. Bernard Northrop of the Old Testament department. Dr. Charles A. Hauser, Jr. was advanced from instructor to Assistant Professor of English Bible, while Dean William G. Bellshaw was advanced from assistant professor to Associate Professor of New Testament.

Ashbrook of the Calvary Bible Church of Columbus, Ohio, states in his 48-page booklet on "The New Neutralism" (p. 28) - "It is with malice toward none, but because we believe with all our heart that New Evangelicalism poses the greatest of all current threats to New Testament Christianity that we have written as we have. This new 'ISM' is far more dangerous than the old Modernism and much more subtle than the Neo-Orthodoxy of Barth and Brunner, though we believe it will ultimately lead into the latter." 

DR. BILLY GRAHAM ADVISES SEPARATION FROM DENIERS OF THE DEITY OF CHRIST

In an article on "Separation" in the November 1958 issue of Eternity magazine p. 18, the evangelist cited II John 10-11 and Romans 16:17-18 as his basis for some strong remarks on separation. "Here we have the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ involved. If a man blatantly denied the deity of Christ or that Christ has come in the flesh, we are not even to bid him God speed ... Thus the Scriptures teach that we are to be separated from those who deny the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ." On p. 19 Dr. Graham stated, "No doubt there are some men in the church today who deny the deity of the Lord Jesus Christ. If I knew that a man denies His deity, I am not to commend him or to have spiritual fellowship with him, but I am to treat him as an anti-christ and an enemy of the cross." What will Dr. Graham now do in the face of his strong statement on separation from the deniers of the deity, and in the light of Bishop Kennedy's blatant rejection of the essential deity of our Saviour? His only course, it would seem, would be to withdraw from the Los Angeles ecumenical evangelistic crusade.

TACTICS EMPLOYED BY AN ECCLESIASTICAL MACHINE WHEN RESISTING REFORM MEASURES

In a reprint of a pamphlet "Tests for Christian Fellowship" in the Christian Beacon of Feb. 11, 1960, we find this interesting paragraph: "No sooner are facts brought to light with a plea for action, than the dominant power begins to defend itself with all the arts of ecclesiastical politics, which are many. The first thing they always do, is to distort the issue. Instead of meeting the issue of the truth or falsity of specific doctrinal departures, they try to change the issue to that of confidence in leaders. The 'tear bottle' is brought out. The actual charges are ignored, drowned in a river of irrelevant weeping. 'Dear brethren!' (and the voice will tremble) 'think of the long and devoted careers of these noble servants of the Church. Think of how they have labored so sacrificially for Christ! And now come these personal attacks upon them. Let us not inquire too closely into the evident malice that lies behind them. FULL STATEMENT OF DENIAL OF DEITY OF CHRIST BY GRAHAM CRUSADE OFFICIAL

One of the main criticisms of ecumenical evangelism by those who are determined to remain loyal to the Word of God is that it is sponsored by religious leaders who deny the Gospel which the evangelist preaches. Bishop Gerald Kennedy, chairman of the Crusade, states in his book "God's Good News" on p. 125: "The World Council of Churches has reached a formula which seems to be satisfactory to the vast majority of Protestantism. Its statement is that we must think of Jesus as God. I am glad that so many Christians have come together in a great unity and I would not for one moment make it more difficult by raising stumbling blocks for this unity. I shall continue to urge further cooperation by my own denomination in this Council rather than less, but I am frank to confess that the statement does not please me and it seems far from satisfactory. I would much prefer to have it say that God was in Christ, for I believe the testimony of the New Testament taken as a whole is against the doctrine of the deity of Jesus, although I think it bears overwhelming witness to the divinity of Jesus. I think it is time that we faced the truth that Christians are not going to get together in terms of precise formulation of theological propositions and that the World Council had better put more stress on common practice rather than common creedal statements. Now if someone insists that the divinity of Jesus must be defined exactly, I would have to confess that I cannot do it for myself and it does not seem to me to be possible for others to do it... All these and a hundred other questions could be asked and I do not think they can be answered with any exactness."

..How many ministers are communists? .. Let's not take the word of any "right-wing crackpot" on this question, but ask "Christianity Today", the world's largest serious theological news magazine. At a cost of \$20,000, the Opinion Research Corp. conducted a survey, according to Oct. 10, 1960 issue. In a two-page article, it concluded, "Of these, the pollsters designated two per cent of the minister as communists, 10 per cent as socialist, and 15 per cent as fellow-travellers in their economic outlook, these being predominately liberal and neo-orthodox in theological stance."

..Ponder this closely.. Suppose there are 300,000 ministers in the USA today, and this is not far off, that would mean a total of 6,000 communists; 30,000 socialists, and 45,000 fellow-travellers. That would make a total of 81,000 ministers with a decided Marxist sympathy. Remember, this is a scientific survey. This should be enough to frighten even Senator Thomas Kuchel, since ministers wield such a strategic influence in the USA.

This was the proper attitude for then and now.

A significant paragraph in the San Francisco Examiner for Aug. 10, 1963 about the Montreal World Council meetings in July reveals the first step in ecumenical unity toward the One World Church: "For the first time since the Protestant Reformation there is emerging a general recognition that historical Christian tradition is an accepted basis for the definition of Christian doctrine. This is a view long held in the Roman Catholic Church, that it has now become accepted so widely in the rest of Christendom is due primarily to the influence, here in Montreal, of the theologians of the Eastern Orthodox Churches."

Donner, Clark Foreman, Corliss Lamont, Harvey O'Conner and Rev. William Howard Melish." Dryden Phelps is also listed. 

THE PASTOR GETS SOME STRANGE LETTERS

From San Francisco comes this letter that nearly knocked my hat off: "First, let me explain that this letter is being written to you by an oldtime Baptist, raised by a Baptist mother who knew what it was to be a Baptist and at the same time, a Christian. At one time, many years ago, and I am sure, long before there was any growing movement known as 'Communism', she told her Baptist Bible class that Jesus was a Communist, and she fully supported her views by the teachings of the New Testament. She had sent this writer to a Baptist college in the mid-west where I was pretty thoroughly grounded in religious history and the part Baptists played in that history. Now, I submit that having been brought up on the social teachings of Jesus, I find there is simply no grounds for equating them with anti-communism. Indeed, the teachings of Jesus are Communist in their very essence... I submit that Bishop Pike is more Baptist than you are."

COUNCIL OF CHURCHES OFFICIAL INVOLVED IN PROMOTING RACIAL DEMONSTRATIONS

The mask is coming off from the Oakland Council of Churches with the news that one of their leaders is deeply involved in promoting the upcoming racial demonstrations. It is the contention of a growing host of ministerial leaders that if the radical white liberals among the ministry and the Communist conspirators would "lay off", that these racial demonstrations would collapse abruptly. The Oakland Tribune for Aug. 8, 1963 stated: "Fifty carefully selected adults are being trained to take part in possible civil rights demonstrations in Oakland. This was announced by the Rev. WHAT ATTITUDE SHOULD BIBLE CHRISTIANS HAVE TOWARD THE ECUMENICAL MOVEMENT?

Let's listen to the answer of that theological giant, Dr. John F. Walvoord, president of the world's largest evangelical seminary, Dallas Theological Seminary. In an article in "Moody Monthly" in Sept. 1961 entitled "The Trend Toward a Superchurch", he stated at the end: "What is our conclusion, then? It is this: In view of the character of the ecumenical movement and its ultimate end as revealed in the Word, evangelical Christians should have nothing to do with it... Two things seem to be clear: First, any compromise with the ecumenical movement by evangelicals will ultimately destroy their own testimony. Second, the body of evangelical believers engaged in proclaiming the gospel to every creature must accomplish this work, both now and in the future, outside the ecumenical movement. To remain separate will no doubt be difficult and increasingly so with the passing of time. But may God give us grace to do his will in the matter, and the wisdom to stand without compromise in these difficult days."

..SBC Heretic considered too conservative..Dr. Ralph Elliott, 37, young heretic of the Southern Baptist Convention who was fired from his seminary teaching post at Midwestern Seminary because of unorthodox views of Genesis, was hired by Crozer Seminary of the American Baptist Convention. This Seminary, which produced such leaders as Martin Luther King, stated thru its president, Ronald V. Wells, as reported in the Philadelphia Bulletin of May 26, 1963 that his faculty considered Elliott's book and said: "Some, in fact, said it was too conservative, if anything."

..When you rely on prayer.. Dr. A. C. Dixon said: "When you rely on organization, you get what organization can do; when you rely on eloquence, you can get what eloquence can do; when you rely on money, you get what money can do; and I am not discounting these when properly understood and used, but when you rely on prayer, you get what God can do."

..Dr. David Hubbard, new president of Fuller Seminary whose book on the Old Testament was censored by Westmont College trustees for its higher critical views, was a special lecturer at the Denver Seminary last November 15 - 20, 1962.

..One prominent CBA leader wrote to the Pastor: "I knew Hubbard was off, but I did not realize he had gone so far. He totally rejects all of the Old Testament as God's Word. He is fully as bad as the 19th Century German rationalists." "We have not read the book, but we think it deserves investigation.

..Campus appearances of communists.. J. Edgar Hoover said last February: "I think it is wrong to bring on the campuses of this country individuals who themselves are prisoners to a line of propaganda, and have them expound it to the youth of our country. A communist is not free. He is under the strict discipline of the Communist Party in Moscow."

..COUNCIL OF CHURCHES CONT'D.. Eugene R. Wolfe, chairman of the Citizens Committee for Fair Housing here... The Rev. Mr. Wolfe told about the training class for demonstrators as his own citizens committee voted to throw its support behind the coordinating committee and become a full participating member."

..Dr. Robert Torbet, who delivered the annual fall lectures to students at Bethel College and Seminary said: "Jesus Christ ... gives meaning and often correction to penultimate authorities such as the Bible and the Church." (Bethel Quarterly, May 1961, p. 56). Jesus Christ NEVER gives correction to the Bible.

..Dr. Carl Lundquist, president of Bethel, wrote a minister friend: "However, the authority of the Bible is a derived authority. It is authoratative because it is the Word of God; therefore, God Himself, including Jesus Christ as a part of the Triune Godhead, is our final authority. Thus, it seems to me, Dr. Torbet rightfully says that 'authority is to be found in Jesus Christ. Our ultimate authority is not a book, or an institution, or a creed, but a Living Person, the incarnate Son of God'. It is in this sense that he refers to the Bible as 'penultimate' authority and God himself as the 'ultimate' authority."

..This is New Evangelicalist love.. The Wilbur Sanfords of the WCBM are now serving in Argentina. He has offered to run errands for the CBFMS in the Federal Capital, such as picking up the documents for the entrance of the new missionaries of the Baptist General Conference. The CBFMS refused to allow the Sanford children to attend the missionary school for children even though he helped set up the legal matters relating to the school. While the Sanford children have been refused, the CBFMS have allowed the Jeff Fields' children (Plymouth Brethren), and the Thompson children (Church of England).

..Two Graham officials were among the state leaders who brought about the defeat of Prop. # 24, the initiative which would have outlawed the Communist Party in California. The four Southern California leaders who led the battle were: Bishop Gerald Kennedy, Dr. Forrest C. Weir, Dr. John N. Burt and Dr. Carroll L. Shuster. Both Kennedy and Weir are on the executive committee for the L. A. ecumenical crusade along with Dr. Vernon McGee.

..The Communist program for the Negro .. "We must realize that our party's most powerful weapon is racial tension. By pounding the consciences of the dark races that for centuries they have been oppressed by the whites we can hold them to the program of the Communist Party. In America we will aim for a subtle victory. While inflaming the negro minority against the whites, we will endeavor to instill in the whites a guilt complex for their exploitation of the negroes. We will aid the negroes to rise to prominence in every walk of life in the professions, in the world of sports and entertainment. With this prestige, the negroes will be able to inter-marry with whites and begin a process which will deliver America to our cause." ABC LEADERS AND THE WCC STATEMENT

The latest Watchman-Examiner announces that the new Program Committee for the 1964 ABC Convention in Atlantic City includes Dr. L. D. McBain of Phoenix, formerly of Covina and a member of the board of the Covina Seminary. We are reminded of an incident which took place in New Delhi when the World Council adopted their new "Basis" - "The World Council of Churches is a fellowship of churches which confess the Lord Jesus Christ as God and Saviour according to the Scriptures . . .". Now let the Christian Century of Jan. 10, 1962 tell about the debate on this, in which certain Protestants opposed the addition, "'According to what Scriptures', asked Dr. Leroy D. McBain of the American Baptist Convention, do we find Jesus Christ designated as God and Saviour?' Dr. McBain and others who took this position were quite willing to let the phrasing of the original Basis, 'Jesus Christ as God', stand; but they were not willing to attribute to Scripture what Scripture does not say. They hold that except for a flexible phrase in Titus 2:13, 'the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ' - which can mean two persons or one - there is no direct New Testament designation of Jesus as God." This is absolutely appalling and is difficult to dismiss as nothing but guilty twisting of the Scriptures or else ignorance. Any Bible institute student could point one to John 1:1, Heb. 1:8, John 20:28, Rom. 9:5, Isa. 9:6, etc.

"JACK, WHAT ABOUT GOING TO DANCES?"

Jack Wyrzten answers this way in Moody Monthly for April 1961, "It is not a simple matter of should we do this or do that, but of following the principle, 'Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God' (I Cor. 10:31). When young people come to me and say, 'We have student council dances and I wonder if I should go to them', I tell them, 'If you are in the habit of going to dances, the next time you go, start talking to your partner about the Lord Jesus Christ. Ask your partner if he or she is saved, loves the Lord, has been born again and has the assurance that if he or she were to drop dead on the dance floor, heaven would be his or her eternal (Cont'd p.2)

METHODIST BISHOP DONALD TIPPETT DEFENDS IDENTIFIED COMMUNIST MCMICHAEL THIS WAY

In a letter to a certain lady in Northern California, the Bishop wrote: "You ask for my defense. My defense is that those who have accused Jack McMichael have done so falsely and dishonestly, knowing that in every hearing both before the government and before the church he has been found innocent of the charges of being a communist. He has never been one and is not now. I hope that you will not listen to the voices of those who have nothing in mind but the destruction of the Methodist Church and similar denominational bodies like the Presbyterians and the Episcopalians and all who belong to the NCC." McMichael has never been tried before church or state yet. He has been identified as a Communist by several competent witnesses under oath.

THE SMOLDERING DENVER SEMINARY ATTITUDE TOWARD THE G. B. "MANIFESTO"

In a letter sent to CBA leaders prior to the 1954 Detroit meetings, Dr. G. R. Guedj, a Denver trustee, stated: "As we warned in Chicago in May 1952 and at Portland in June 1953, we have put in their hands a weapon which is both counter to our constitution and to the very spirit which has made our movement grow phenomenally - THE MANIFESTO. If not speedily repealed this divisive instrument will tear the Conservative Baptist movement apart, sending the pieces flying to the G.A.R.B.'s, whose ruthless separatism it endorses and to an independency which is alien to the Baptist genius, as both of our mission societies come under the control of its proponents."

..Bethel College and Seminary is trying hard to forget that they gave an invitation to Martin Luther King to address their student body, in face of strong opposition, in spite of King's having two close associates who have been identified communists, (Jack O'Dell and Bayard Rustin). INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES

..Identified Communist heads racial demonstration march in Washington on Aug. 28. The Oakland Tribune for Aug. 16 had an Allen-Scott column about Bayard Rustin, former secretary to Martin Luther King, and deputy director of the Washington March. "As a student at the College of the City of New York in 1936, Rustin joined the Young Communist League and was active in its operations on the campus and elsewhere. In World War II, he was arrested several times ... As a professed conscientious objector, served 26 months in the federal prisons at Ashland, Ky., and Lewisburg, Pa. With two other men, Rustin was convicted in 1953 in Pasadena, Calif. on a morals charge and served 60 days." (See L. A. Mirror, Jan. 23, 1953 and Pasadena Independent of same date).

..Graham official in racial demonstration..The Los Angeles Times of Aug. 10, 1963 (p. 15, part 1) carried this story of the Public Affairs Commission of the Church Federation concerning a member of the executive committee of the Graham Crusade: "The assembly also voted to send the Rev. Harry A. McKnight Jr., the federation executive director, to Washington, D. C., for the Aug. 28 inter-racial 'march' for jobs and freedom. 'The Washington Assembly of the churches is to demonstrate the church's solidarity in support of racial justice implemented through civil right's legislation and to witness to the fact that this is a national moral issue and not a regional problem', said a statement."


..Milton Mayer, who is suing the State Department for refusal of a passport without a loyalty oath signed (according to Examiner of Aug. 14), is remembered for his famous statement in the Syracuse Post-Standard, Feb. 17, 1947: "We must haul down the American flag. And if I wanted to be vulgar and shocking, I would go even farther and say haul it down, stomp on it and spit on it."

..At the Regional Methodist Youth Convention at U.O.P., Dec. 27-30, 1961, according to Logan Schnoor, chairman of the Chowcilla First Methodist Board, Dr. Milton Mayer said that "there is a tendency for us to think that Christianity flourishes only under one social-economic-political system. We must realize that one can advocate another system of community organization and still profess Christianity. A Communist State Farm Manager may be a member of the Communist Party and advocate their economic system while on the other hand he may also be a Christian, though Marxist and Christian doctrine are fundamentally irreconcilable." Dr. Mayer has been a seminary professor in Prague.

..Dr. Helmut Thielicke, a noted modernist from Germany, is speaking at Mt. Herman this summer. The Los Angeles Times of Aug. 11, stated: "In spite of my disagreement with Bultmann, I cannot regard him as a heretic, but as a source and an important and stimulating force in theological discourse." Bultmann is a noted unbeliever in relation to the inspired Scriptures.

THE LOS ANGELES ECUMENICAL CRUSADE

..Modernist participation..Rev. Robert J. Arnott, pastor of the First Baptist Church of Los Angeles, was honored on the program of Aug. 23, 1963 according to the front page of the Los Angeles Times of that date. Also participating was Albert W. Lau of the Chinese First Presbyterian Church.

..Bishop Gerald Kennedy's picture appeared in the Graham "Crusade News" front page for Aug. 21: "Bishop Kennedy has made many contributions in the field of religion, with his combination of talents as preacher, administrator, and writer. Many tributes have been paid to him." ... There is not the slightest indication that he denies the Deity of Christ, scoffs at the Coming of the Lord, and thinks the Virgin Birth inconsequential.

..The front page photo of the Herald-Examiner for Aug. 14, 1963 showed Dr. Graham and Bishop Kennedy side-by-side at breakfast with their committee. Kennedy states on p. 125 of his book "God's Good News", "...I believe the testimony of the New Testament taken as a whole is against the doctrine of the deity of Jesus ..." Of the phrase "Jesus as God", he says on the same page, "... I am frank to confess that the statement does not please me and it seems far from satisfactory."

..Bishop Kennedy was honored on the platform of the Crusade on Aug. 16, according to the Times of that date. The following Sunday he preached at Westwood Methodist on the subject, "Help My Unbelief". He needs plenty of help.

..Dr. E. Stanley Jones was honored on the platform. The Los Angeles Times for Aug. 19 stated, "Dr. E. Stanley Jones, Methodist writer, evangelist and preacher, also was recognized. He mentioned that in his world travels he often had been asked what he thought of Billy Graham. 'I have nothing but gratitude and thanksgiving to God to have known this modern-day prophet', he said."

..In the liberal "Christian Century" of Aug. 14, 1957 (p. 970), Dr. Jones wrote: "Billy Graham's Crusade, while having things here and there which may not be wholly acceptable, nevertheless is a very healthy meeting place for conservative and liberal, and in the contact each may gain something from the other and then something beyond each may emerge - the Christian." The dialectical influence of Hegel is seen right here. We wonder if this religious hy-brid would correspond to Dr. Tillich's "New Being".

..Billy and modernism..In Graham's book "America's Hour of Decision" (1951 - Van Kampen), we have a glowing account of Graham's position on p. 35 written by an associate: "He has no traffic with modernism, higher criticism, social gospel or broad Bible interpretations."

..Billy was a literalist..The same book states, "His is a literal interpretation of the Bible as the inspired Word of God written centuries ago but as up-to-date as this morning's newspaper." But a decade later in the Saturday evening Post for April 13, 1963, "I am not a literalist ... If you try to accept the literal meaning of every word in the Bible, you get into all sorts of trouble."

ECUMENICAL CRUSADE CHAIRMAN SCOFFS AT EVANGELIST'S VIEWS OF SECOND COMING

The Los Angeles Times for Aug. 31, 1963 said, "World events are moving swiftly toward the climax of history, which can only mean a second coming of Jesus Christ, evangelist Billy Graham said ..." Directly quoting him, "Christ is coming. I do not know the time ... but the Bible says He is coming back, and He alone is the hope of the world". The Crusade General Chairman, Bishop Gerald Kennedy in the "Christian Advocate" for Mar. 25, 1954 complains: "Stripped of their sophisticated jargon, they appear to be talking about the Second Coming... as if it were a crucial issue facing Christendom. With the exception of a very few narrow sects, this has not been a relevant issue in American Christianity for 25 years ... But it does not seem to us that the Christian hope is a mere waiting for a return of our Lord... God forbid... I shudder to contemplate the effect on the intelligent laymen of the American churches of a great world-wide conference of Christians discussing the Christian hope as if it were dependent on a Second Coming." More and more Bible Christians are seeing the fatal weaknesses of this gigantic hypocrisy of a crusade being sponsored by men who do not believe the Gospel the evangelist preaches, and honoring men who are apostate to the Christian faith."

NEW EVANGELICALISM ON THE MISSION FIELD

A deadly compromise is ahead for the mission fields if the advice of a new evangelicalist leader is followed. The Oakland Tribune for Sept. 11, 1963 gives a report of Bay Area remarks by Dr. Arthur Glasser, an official of the China Inland Mission, who also spoke to the CBFMS national meeting in Boston in 1960 and who is a close advisor of CBFMS leaders. "Dr. Glasser warned, 'Groups that strive to stay out of touch with other Christian groups with whom they disagree suffer impoverishment. We cannot hide behind self-imposed walls created by placing people in categories or we'll find ourselves up some eddy in the stream of life with God passing us by'. He explained that while he has some reservations about the ecumenical movement that has captured the imagination of most of the Christian world, he does not believe any church or group of churches can afford to stand aloof from it or neglect to discover there are fellow-believers in other groups". In the same article he is reported: "God is saying My Church is worldwide. Don't keep fostering divisions by petty arguments and narrow judgments which weaken, not help Christian growth". The CBFMS is committed to the NAE ideology which is committed to cooperation with the ecumenical movement. Dr. Glasser needs to go back to the Word of God and read Eph. 5:11, II Cor. 6:14-18, Deut. 22:9-11, II John 9-11, Psa. 1,2, Gal. 1:6-9, as a starter.

CBHMS TREASURER FORMS NEW SOCIETY

Rather astounding news comes out of Illinois with the news that around the middle of August the Rockford paper had the following notice: "CORPORATE ACTION . . . Not For Profit . . . Baptist mission for Haiti, 1920 Harlem Blvd., Rev. Will H. Bisgaard, Rev. Wayne Kemp and Mrs. Roberta A. Bisgaard, Charitable and Religious". The address given is the home address of Pastor Bisgaard, treasurer of CBHMS. Mr. Kemp is his assistant pastor, according to the latest CBA annual. The new Bisgaard home mission society is unusual since the CBHMS closed up the entire field in Haiti at Atlantic City and "fired the Turnbells" as one board member's (p. 2)

NATIONAL CBA OFFICER URGED TO RESIGN

The suggestion of resignation is beginning to be raised all over the country as a result of the incredible ecumenical development pictured on the front page of the Roman Catholic "St. Cloud Visitor" for Aug. 21, 1963. A front page, four-column article was accompanied by a large photo of National CBA Treasurer Donald O. Bjork of the St. Cloud First Baptist Church. The picture shows Mr. Bjork with the Lutheran and Presbyterian pastors along with Roman Catholic Gustave Weigel, the noted Jesuit, who is described: "Father Weigel serves as a consultant to the Secretariat for the Promotion of Christian Unity. He is known throughout the country as America's leading ecumenicist". Messengers at nearby Lake Koronis for the Minnesota Baptist Convention were stunned with this news when copies of the Roman Catholic paper were widely distributed. It stated: "Following his lecture the St. Cloud Visitor hosted a reception in his honor. Present at the reception were a score of clergymen of all faiths from the area". The article continues: "He paid tribute to the Protestant leaders who reversed the trend of separatism by advocating the cause of Christianity during the past five decades of this century... He also recalled the hesitancy on the part of many Catholics to become involved in the ecumenical movement. 'With the election of John XXIII', he said, 'all that had changed. Catholics found that they were urged by their head to engage in ecumenical dialogue. By his very person Pope John succeeded in breaking the ice that had sheltered the Catholic community from ecumenical endeavors'. This Jesuit priest's address was of three 'c's' that face the ecumenical movement. The first was "compromise" then "comprehension". "The third 'C' he said was one advocated largely by Catholics and Orthodox. They felt the easiest solution to the problem of disunity was conversion. 'Convert the others', he said, 'and all problems are solved. So we think, but others do not think that way'. Conversion, Father Weigel said, was not the immediate object of the ecumenical dialogue". Because of the far-reaching character of this betrayal of the CBA, we think it absolutely urgent that Pastor Don (p.2)

BISHOP KENNEDY'S BLASPHEMY ON THE BIBLE

The Bible-believing public is beginning to slowly wake up to the incredible apostasy of the General Chairman of the L. A. Ecumenical Crusade, whose picture appears in "Decision" for July 1963. Think through carefully this attack on the Bible in "His Word Through Preaching", pp. 96,97: "We have been through a critical and destructive period in the study of the Bible. It has been a time of controversy and bitter feeling in some quarters ... For the most part, the controversy is now ended and Biblical criticism has won its right to recognition. Most of us will not have to pay much heed to heresy hunters or to self-appointed champions of the inerrancy of the Bible ... No man who has passed from the position of the extreme Biblical literalist to that of the man who now accepts the main conclusions of the higher criticism can doubt but that the Book has gained much ... Now we are in a position to use the Bible and preach the Bible more effectively than either our narrow fundamentalists or our radical modernists ... Ours is not a religion based on a book, it is true, for the center of Christianity is the personality of Jesus."

STARTLING WORDS IN THE LIGHT OF PROPHECY

World-famous historian, Arnold Toynbee is quoted in a remarkable statement in "Liberty" for the third quarter of 1959: "We can, however, foresee that, when world-government does come, the need for it will have become so desperate that Mankind will not only be ready to accept it even at the most exorbitantly high price in terms of loss of liberty, but will deify it and its human embodiments, as an excruciated Graeco-Roman World once deified Rome and Augustus. The virtual worship that has already been paid to Napoleon, Mussolini, Stalin, Hitler, and Mao indicates the degree of the idolization that would be the reward of an American or a Russian Caesar who did succeed in giving the World a stable peace at any price; and in this baleful light it looks as if the ecumenical welfare state may be the next idol that will be erected in a still discarded Christianity's place."

"BILLY GRAHAM VIEWS MOVIES AND SEX"

This is the title of an extensive article in the St. Paul Dispatch for Sept. 10, 1963. "Some 13 years ago, Billy Graham was ripping into movies in his stirring speeches at his many rallies and religious crusades. Today, Hollywood looks upon the evangelist as a friend. Graham had modified his stand on the motion picture since 1950, and these days ... recognizes that movies ... can not only entertain but inspire ... and that many of Hollywood's films do exactly that ... He flatly does not subscribe to the traditional view of blanket condemnation of screen product which espouses a general boycott of movies because none of them is any good. Instead, the silver-tongued evangelist backs the idea of picking and choosing - so that proper and deserving films get public support and those which are shoddy or objectionable get box office condemnation ... Graham cites films like A Man Called Peter and The Ten Commandments and The Robe and says they can promote Christianity in a manner that missionaries never can do ... He admitted that his work keeps him from seeing too many movies but that he does catch Hollywood's more outstanding films ..." Graham appears this week, Sept. 24, on the Jack Benny show.

.. Bishop Kennedy and Brotherhood of Man. The Chairman of the L. A. ecumenical crusade rejects the necessity of the Gospel and regeneration to become a son of God. In his book "I Believe" we find on p. 17 these words: "Without God we cannot have human brotherhood, which is the recognition of each man's worth. If you can rob men of their belief that they are the sons of God, you pave the way for tyranny ... We have only one bulwark against the cheapening of human life. It is to maintain at all costs the Christian belief that God created each man and made him a son of God." This is one of modernism's first doctrines.

.. Charles Fox's "Tocsin", by all odds the West's leading anti-communist weekly, is moving their office to 5765 Claremont Ave., Oakland 94618 on Oct. 1. Geo. H. Even after 6 months a total of 47,000 died from all causes, with only 18% from radiation effects. 80 % of the deaths could have been saved if they had had proper medical attention. Three out of four residents survived.

Leaders of New Evangelicalism as it relates to missions are now advising new converts to retain heathen customs as much as possible and to give them some new Christian meanings. J. H. Bavinck in his "An Introduction to the Science of Missions" states: "... in some instances newly converted Christians are extremely anxious to adopt the customs of the missionary and to break all contact with the customs of their ancestors ... Such a practice is too quick and too drastic in severing the traditional bonds, and it creates the illusion that to become a Christian is identical with the acceptance of Western culture. Such an impression can place very serious obstacles in the way of the gospel." I John 2:15-17.

..Rev. Martin Luther King's two communist secretaries were given extensive treatment on the floor of the U.S. Senate by Sen. Strom Thurmond (a trustee of Bob Jones University) and reported in "Counterattack" for Sept. 3, 1963. After giving the communist record of Bayard Rustin: "Mr. Rustin was secretary to Dr. Martin Luther King from 1955 to 1960. Mr. President, I have previously placed in the Congressional Record on August 2 and 7 articles which show that Dr. King had another secretary who goes by the names of Jack O'Dell and Hunter Pitts O'Dell, an admitted communist. These articles show that Dr. King supposedly fired Mr. O'Dell at one time, but these articles report further that as of last month Mr. O'Dell was still reported by Dr. King's New York office as being an employee of Dr. King."

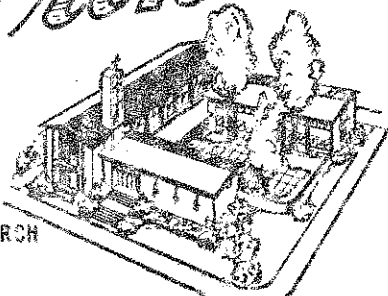

WESTERN SEMINARY DEAN WITH THE LORD

Conservative Baptists on the West Coast were shocked to hear of the sudden passing of Dr. Arthur Whiting, Dean of the Western Baptist Seminary in Portland on Sunday, Sept. 22 because of a heart condition. Funeral services were held on Friday at Evangel Baptist Church with his pastor, Monteith Whitwell, in charge, assisted by Dr. Ralph Keiper and Dr. Albert G. Johnson. Burial was in Portland. We extend sympathy from our Church and the Seminary to the Whiting family. In the Pastor's phone call on Saturday to Dr. Johnson, he indicated a desire for much prayer as they seek a successor. Dr. Whiting was an exceptional Bible scholar and was scheduled to have part in the forthcoming Western Regional Conference at Salem First Baptist Church at the end of this month.

THE CBFMS AND "FALSE TESTS OF ORTHODOXY"

The October CBFMS paper carried an article by this title, a reprint from the S. S. Times of Mar. 24, 1962 which constitutes a slanderous attack upon the fundamentalists in the CBA who are endeavoring to earnestly contend for the Faith. The article stated: "... the heart and life of that remnant of the church which is still evangelical, conservative and fundamental is being ravaged by foul debates and slanderous attacks justified in the name of preserving orthodoxy." It asks: "But have we who profess to love and serve the Lord Jesus Christ not gone too far in our eagerness to preserve and defend orthodoxy?" The article pleads for liberty on "such matters as baptism, the Lord's Supper, eternal security, election and church government". An "Open Letter" dated Sept. 23, 1963 was signed by Pastor Vernon C. Lyons and sent out widely which pointed to a course of action which many others are likely to take: "This article printed with editorial approval represents a doctrinal statement significantly different from the one officially voted by the constituency of our Society. I am asking Ashburn Baptist to withhold all funds pledged to our missionaries until the columns of our periodical contain a retraction of this article and a reaffirmation of the official doctrinal statement as it appears in our Society's constitution."

BILLY GRAHAM AND KARL BARTH

..From the L. A. Crusade platform.. The Los Angeles Times of Aug. 26, 1963 stated: "Dr. Graham noted that two years ago he took a brief vacation with Karl Barth, the great theologian of Switzerland, and asked him, 'What is the hope of the world?' Dr. Barth replied, without hesitation, 'The second coming of Jesus Christ'."

..Last year in San Francisco.. In the Chronicle of May 16, 1962, Dr. Barth was quoted: "I know Billy Graham. He is a good man. But the word 'evangelical' doesn't mean to me what it means to him." The S. F. Examiner for May 16, 1962, "'But I can't hopefully accept his work', he said. 'I don't think that the Christian doctrine should be held like a pistol at man's breast. Christian faith begins with joy and not with fear. Mr. Graham begins by making people afraid'."

..On vital doctrines.. Dr. Barth says in "Romans" p. 36, "The assumption that Jesus is the Christ is, in the strictest sense of the word, an assumption, void of any content that can be comprehended by us." Jesus blessed Peter in Matt. 16:17 for declaring unequivocally, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the Living God". In the "Resurrection of the Dead" on p. 135, he says, "This tomb may prove to be definitely closed or any empty tomb; it is really a matter of indifference. What avails the tomb, proved to be this or that, at Jerusalem in the year A.D. 30?" He states in "Romans", p. 30, "...the resurrection is not an event in history at all."

..A destroyer of Christian faith.. Prof. David E. Hedegard PhD of Uppsala, Sweden: "From facts which I have given in this address it will be clear that Karl Barth far from being a reformer, is a destroyer of Christian faith. In reality he denies all fundamental truths."

..Strictly of the devil.. Prof. R. Laird Harris, PhD warned: "Barthianism should first be understood. Then it should be feared... Then it should be opposed as God's Word tells us to oppose all the wiles of the devil." (Sword, Feb. 18, 1955).

..Destructive of the gospel.. Prof. Cornelius Van Til, PhD declared: "No heresy that appeared at any of the great councils ... was so deeply and ultimately destructive of the gospel as is the theology of Barth." (Eternity, July, 57, p.48).



CBFMS BOARD MAKES FAR-REACHING CHANGES

A flurry of reports from knowledgeable CBA pastors, none connected with the board in any way, report: "Dr. Vincent Brushwyler was recently deposed as general director of the CBFMS". He will have no control over any of the missionaries on the field, but will be a sort of fund raiser and spokesman for the CBFMS in this country as home director. "The missionary feeling against him, his dictatorial policies and problems he created on the field have all mitigated against him". Control of the society will rest with staff members Milt Baker, Fay Richardson, Edwin Jacques, along with the home director. "Once Bohanon, Thompson and Carlberg were off the board, the board apparently took some matters into their own hands". Dr. Brushwyler's policies have run him into mountains of trouble. The fundamentalists in the CBA have regretted his unprincipled attack upon the Conservative Baptist Fellowship in the CBFMS paper of November 1961 which contained a series of misrepresentations and errors. This has never been retracted. He has been known as a strong advocate of dividing the Conservative Baptist movement right now and eliminating the "hard core" fundamentalists. He has been a strong opponent of the separatists, of those holding to the pre-tribulational coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, and those who are ardently endeavoring to "contend earnestly for the Faith". He has been using his influence to commit the society to evangelical inclusivism, ecumenical evangelism, and to the support of New Evangelicalism. He was one of the leading figures opposing the efforts to make the CBFMS a premillennial society.

.."The Conservative Baptist Haiti Mission Society, Inc., was organized and incorporated in June in Michigan to sponsor, direct, and support the work of the Wallace Turnbells in Haiti." (North Star Baptist, Oct. 1963).

.."The Haiti Baptist Mission" was formed by CBHMS Treasurer Will Bisgaard, according to a legal notice in the Rockford, Illinois papers of Aug. 20, 1963, with his wife and his assistant as incorporators. On Sept. 13, Dr. Bisgaard and the Aushermans flew down to Haiti for conference with native pastors and leaders, presumably to attract them away from the leadership of the Turnbells. The CBHMS should give a full explanation of the part they have in bringing a new society into being.

UNITED CRUSADE CONFRONTS RESISTANCE

More and more residents of the area are refusing to give to the United Crusade because of a refusal to discontinue support to Stiles Hall, the alleged center of Communist activities on the campus of the University of California. Stiles Hall, the University YMCA on Bancroft Avenue in Berkeley, receives in excess of \$20,000 per year from the United Crusade. Communist Gus Hall spoke at Stiles Hall on Jan. 25, 1962. Communist Herbert Aptheker was invited to speak on April 18, 1962. A steady stream of communist and pro-communist speakers have appeared at Stiles Hall. Extensive protests have been made to Mr. Al Ward and Mr. Allan Jackson, at Crusade (Cont'd 2)

CBFMS GENERAL DIRECTOR RESIGNS OCT. 9
MORE DRASTIC CHANGES LIKELY IN FUTURE

The Conservative movement is still rocking with the astounding news that the 20 year rule of Dr. Vincent Brushwyler as general director of the CBFMS came to an abrupt end in September with his own board taking the decisive action. What the Fundamentalists were unable to do for years, the CBFMS board itself did finally in one week at Wheaton. Not only does this bring the house down in the CBFMS, but the empire the general director was building in the entire CB movement also topples in a pile of ecclesiastical rubble. The explosion did not come so much from outside pressures as from internal tensions which had been built up for some time involving missionaries, staff, and the board. The only solution to the board seemed to be to abolish the position of general director and reduce the authority of the former director to promoting the society in the U.S.A., with no further control over finances, missionaries, or fields. This restricted his activity a great deal since scores of churches had declared that his views favorable to ecumenical evangelism, post tribulationism, and evangelical inclusivism make him persona non grata in their pulpits. The CBFMS executive committee met in Wheaton on Oct. 8-9 to consider problems growing out of their drastic September board meeting. After agreeing to go along with the board on Oct. 8, he suddenly resigned on Oct. 9, leaving the terminal date to be worked out with the executive committee, preferably before July 1, 1964. Delaying the terminal date allows the possibility of the general director retrieving his position by encouraging a "grass roots" demonstration at the Eastern and Western regionals this month. All these developments are staggering in view of the wild ovation he received at the Atlantic City meetings. Dr. Brushwyler's future is not in jeopardy since he is one of the (Cont'd)

MASSIVE ANTI-TITO RALLY THIS SATURDAY

Governor Brown's warm-hearted invitation for Communist Dictator Tito to spend this Thursday through Sunday in the Bay Area has sparked a massive protest rally on Saturday at 10 AM in San Francisco's famous Union Square. At the conclusion of the rally, the entire multitude will walk in a protest march up the hill to the fashionable Fairmont Hotel, near Bishop Pike's Grace Cathedral, where Tito will stay. What a spectacle it will be to see thousands in this protest. The group will then form a continuous picket line completely around the Fairmont Hotel. A second rally at 4 PM on Saturday will be held in Huntington Park close by the Fairmont, after which a picket line will maintain a 24-hour vigil at the Fairmont. Many Christians will use this to silently protest the martyrdom of thousands of Christians at his bloody hands. Tito has been invited to speak at the World Affairs Council, S. F. Commonwealth Club, and in Berkeley.

NATIONAL CBA FACES FINANCIAL CRISIS

As was expected as a result of the unhappy elections in Atlantic City, the CBA of A. office now faces a financial debacle of considerable proportions with only a trickle of money coming in. This is thought due to the election of a president in Atlantic City who had not even led his own church to support the CBA. The first choice of the nominating committee was Dr. Lloyd T. Anderson who had the grace to withdraw his name when it was revealed that he was not in sympathy with the CBA of A. position and program and did not support it. However, when Dr. Carlberg's supporters maneuvered his nomination, he concealed the fact of his non-support from the messengers. Scores of churches who formerly supported the CBA substantially have stoutly refused to send their monies in until the present president resigns or (Cont'd)

INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES


..Theology in Red China..Francis P. Jones Methodist missionary to China until 1951 and former editor of China Bulletin of the NCC had an article in "Religion in Life" magazine, Autumn, 1963. "It is not beyond the realm of possibility that some Marxist insights may be a needed corrective to some of the theological aridities of the West. Y. T. Wu's application of the Marxist (and John Dewey's) theory-and-practice complex to the Christian theological debate over faith and works seems to me to be a fresh and wholesome turn. And finally, the social gospel which we here in America have had with us for over half a century is now being interpreted by Chinese Christians in a way which is in line with some of our most advanced thought on the subject."

..More tragic communist thought.. Francis Jones then quotes from Y. T. Wu's article on "How the Communist Party Has Educated Me". He says: "The Communist Party has shown me the true relation between theory and practice, between faith and deeds. Christianity teaches universal love, and looks for the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven. When I became a Christian I took this high ideal to heart, but as to how it was to be realized I did not concern myself. Now the Communist Party has shattered my empty dreams and made me realize that practice and theory go together. The Communist Party not only enlightened my mind but trained me in action. Their action is always in accordance with a system of severe logic, not a mechanical and outward logic. They use theory to direct practice, and then from the practice get experience by which they improve the theory." Jones called Dr. Wu "one of the most creative Christian thinkers in New China."

..Dr. Vernon Grounds in "Eternity" magazine, August 1963 on p. 20: "St. Augustine argued that toleration of evil within a church is necessary. If a zealous believer attempts to separate the wheat from the chaff, he unlovingly breaks the unity of God's family and arrogantly usurps the prerogative of Jesus Christ, to whom alone the right of judgment belongs. The wheat and tares must grow together until the Lord comes. Meantime the disciple's task is to keep himself pure, not to purify the church; no, the church throughout its history will remain a mixture of good and bad, hypocrisy and genuineness, exactly as the New Testament has foretold. Why, then, sacrifice unity and charity for an impossible purity?"

..This erroneous thinking is common in the religious realm and is completely false. Jesus said the field was the world, and the mixed condition of the tares is something existing out in the world. God does not want us to straighten the world out, but he wants a pure Church. He prescribed discipline to maintain this purity. From divisions - Matt. 18:15-17; from immorality - I Cor. 5; from heresy - Titus 3:10. God drew a line of protection around His Church - the line of the New Birth, and the Church is responsible to maintain this purity.

NEED OF DISCERNMENT FOR APOSTATE DAYS

Dr. Harold L. Proppe wrote one of the sharpest paragraphs we have seen in the Watchman-Examiner for Oct. 17, 1963, which leaves us puzzled why this discernment was not applied in relation to the apostate American Baptist Convention in which he retired. It follows: "When we read our New Testament we are warned of the fact that error will appear as truth, darkness as light and to distinguish between them Paul exhorts the believers in Hebrews 5:14 'to discern both good and evil' and such discernment should be an evidence of spiritual maturity (Hebrews 5:11-14; Ephesians 4:4-6; 6:10-19; Philippians 3:15-19). We are to compare spiritual things with spiritual (I Corinthians 2:12-16). There is a specific gift for 'discerning of spirits'. There is, therefore, a discipline of discernment to differentiate between the spirit of truth and that of error, the will of God and the workings of Satan, the horizon of faith and the hallucination of fanaticism, the promise of the Triune God and the presumption of the tempter. The discipline of discernment requires that we follow the tenets of divine revelation lest we fall before the deceitfulness of the tempter."

GOV. HATFIELD'S ADVICE TO S.S. TEACHERS

"Link" magazine for October 1963 states: "A testimony by Governor Mark Hatfield of Oregon appeared in the fall issue of 1962 "Teach" magazine published by Gospel Light Press. He said that Sunday School teachers and workers need to be 'committed'. Following conversion, prayer and Bible study, and personal meditation on the things of God, Mr. Hatfield gave 5 practical points for Sunday School teachers. They were: 1. Visit your students. 2. Spend time with students. 3. Attend worship regularly. 4. Engage in real service projects with the class. 5. Apply the lessons you teach to your own life."

CHURCH COUNCIL LEFTWING PEACE CONFERENCE

The Northern California Council of Churches sponsors a "Religious Leadership for Peace" Conference at Asilomar, Nov. 11-13. Among the speakers are a collection of liberals and leftwing leaders, with a frightening total of pro-communist connections between: Rev. Robert Moon, Rev. Rodney Shaw, Dr. Robert Bulkley, Rabbi Judah Fish, Ben Seaver, Dr. Robert Ferkiss, and Milton Mayer. According to the Syracuse Post-Standard, Feb. 17, 1947, Milton Mayer told his audience: "We must haul down the American flag. And if I wanted to be vulgar and shocking I would go even farther and say haul it down, stomp on it, and spit on it." Chairman Logan Schnoor of the official board of the Chowchilla First Methodist Church sent out an astonishing letter reporting some of Milton Mayer's statements at a University of Pacific Regional Methodist youth conference on Dec. 27-30, 1961. One Chowchilla delegate said this: "The one thing Mr. Mayer said that impressed me the most was that there is a tendency for us to think that Christianity flourishes only under one social-economic-political system of community organization and still profess Christianity. A Communist State Farm Manager may be a member of the Communist Party and advocate their economic system while on the other hand he may also be a Christian, though Marxist and Christian doctrine are fundamentally irreconcilable."

AMERICA - THIS TIME IS NOW UPON US

With the shackles of the Test Ban Treaty upon us and the Kennedy program of systematic stripping this nation of its military and nuclear might, this oft-quoted statement of communist leader Dimitri A. Manuilsky in a 1930 Moscow speech now becomes a frightening reality: "War to the hilt between Communism and Capitalism is inevitable. Today, of course, we are not strong enough to attack. Our time will come in twenty to thirty years. To win we shall need the element of surprise. The bourgeois will have to be put to sleep, so we shall begin by launching the most spectacular peace movement on record. There will be electrifying overtures and unheard of concessions. The Capitalist countries, stupid and decadent, will rejoice (p. 2)



Eighteen distinguished scientists have taken steps to form a new scientific organization which promises to raise a storm of interest across the nation in opposition to prevailing evolutionary concepts being taught in higher education. It appears to directly confront the evolutionary views being promoted by the neo-evangelical scientists. Membership is limited to scientists having an MS degree, PhD, DSc, EdD, or MD degrees. Some of the founders: Henry M. Morris, PhD; Paul A. Zimmerman, PhD; Archeologist R. Laird Harris, PhD; Edwin Y. Monsma, PhD; John W. Klotz, PhD; Duane T. Gish, PhD; Frank L. Marsh, PhD; and many others. We are thrilled to endorse this new group of scientists. Their first statement of belief reads: "The Bible is the written Word of God, and because it is inspired throughout, all its assertions are historically and scientifically true in all the original autographs. To the student of nature this means that the account of origins in Genesis is a factual presentation of simple historical truths." This group should prove to be a corrective to the speculative drift away from the Book of Genesis sponsored by scientists of the American Scientific Affiliation.

A WARM LETTER FROM THE CHANGING PAST



To the student of nature this means that the account of origins in Genesis is a factual presentation of simple historical truths. 2. All basic types of living things, including man, were made by direct creative acts of God during the Creation Week described in Genesis. Whatever biological changes have occurred since Creation Week have accomplished only changes within the original created kinds. 3. The great Flood described in Genesis, commonly referred to as the Noachian Flood, was an historic event worldwide in its extent and effect. 4. We are an organization of Christian men of science who accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour. The account of the special creation of Adam and Eve as one man and woman and their subsequent fall into sin is the basis for our belief in the necessity of a Saviour for all mankind. Therefore, salvation can come only through accepting Jesus Christ as our Saviour."

PARDON TWINGE OF SHAME OVER THE STATE DEPT.-INSPIRED MURDERS IN SOUTH VIET NAM

You'll have to forgive us for feeling a sense of guilt in respect to a dastardly set of murders in the South Viet Nam. We applaud Senator Wm. F. Knowland's excellent editorial in the Oakland Tribune for Nov. 5, and Wm. F. Buckley's editorial of Nov. 11. The Tribune: "It appears that the reason why they wanted to get Diem was because he was too militantly anti-communist to suit the neutralists in the State Department, and because he was too independent to suit the power-hungry aid-dispensers in Foggy Bottom. And so Diem died." Buckley, after noting Sen. Mansfield's eulogy of Diem - "a courageous man", a "man of integrity", a "great patriot", said, "But that is not enough these days in the court of public opinion. He was something else again quite utterly disqualifying. He was a relentless, fighting anti-communist. That, my children, is the besetting sin of our times, and few can survive it. Anti-communists who unflinchingly support American programs tend to end up with bullets in their head ..." 

THE OFFICIAL CBA STAND ON THE RSV.

It is often healthy to consult the facts of history to help keep us straight. We publish herewith the resolution unanimously adopted at the EASTERN Regional Conference of the CBA at Altoona, Nov. 4-6, 1952, and also passed in practically the same form at the annual CBA meeting in Portland in 1953: "WHEREAS, there has been thrust upon us a new translation of the Holy Scriptures produced and authorized by the National Council of Churches, known as the Revised Standard Version containing the Old and New Testament and, WHEREAS, it is the work of liberal scholarship without consultation with the evangelical scholars of the day and WHEREAS, many passages manifest a reckless handling of the original texts together with an unwarranted questioning of the same, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Conservative Baptist Association of the Eastern Area go on record as rejecting this Version as a true translation of the ancient manuscripts and versions, believing it to contain serious interpretations which subordinate and question the Saviorhood and deity of our Lord. We suggest that it should be given the status of modern-speech translations only." We wonder if this would pass today with the CBA under the control of Carlberg-Peterson-Anderson-Grounds elements. This same RSV Bible was openly sold to messengers in the officially approved exhibits at Atlantic City in May, 1963,

THE CBA SEPARATIST DECLARATION IN 1953

The Conservative Baptist Manifesto, a far-reaching document declaring our basic separatist position, was adopted ten years ago. The National Voice for Aug. 1953 had this paragraph: "Perhaps the greatest evidence of this unity was the adoption by each of the Conservative agencies, CBA, CBHMS and CBFMS, of the now famous 'Conservative Baptist Manifesto'. Brought about originally by the far-sighted statesmanship of Dr. Albert G. Johnson, pastor of the host church, Hinson Memorial Baptist, Portland, the manifesto was first drawn up by a representative group of conservative leaders who met in Chicago at the call of Dr. Johnson in May. The result of their thinking was then presented to the four boards (including the Conservative Baptist Fellowship) meeting in Portland. After board discussion, minor changes and ratification, the manifesto was presented to the constituencies of each of the Conservative Baptist agencies in session. After some discussion, the manifesto was adopted by each society with an overwhelming majority, and thus it now stands as a witness to the world of the continued steadfastness in the faith and unity of Conservative Baptists. For the benefit of all we publish the basic document as it was adopted by each agency of Conservative Baptists." The drift in the CBA is seen in that this document was twice defeated at Atlantic City.



THE PRESIDENT'S LAST SCRIPTURE TEXT

Last Sunday morning the Pastor was moved to preach on the text of Scripture with which President John F. Kennedy used to close the last address which he prepared and distributed but which he never delivered as planned at the Trade Mart in Dallas on Friday, Nov. 22, 1963. Psalm 127:1 says, "Except the Lord build the house, they labor in vain that build it: except the Lord keep the city, the watchman waketh but in vain." In the course of the message he quoted the words of Benjamin Franklin at the Constitutional Convention in 1787: "We have been assured, sir, in the sacred writings, 'Except the Lord build the house, they labor in vain that build it'. I firmly believe this, and I also believe that without this concurring aid we shall proceed in this political building no better than the founders of Babel: we shall be divided by our little, partial, local interests; our prospects will be confounded; and we ourselves shall be a reproach and a byword down to future ages. And what is worse, mankind hereafter from this unfortunate instance, despair of establishing government by human wisdom, and leave it to chance, war or conquest. I therefore beg leave to move that henceforth prayers, imploring the assistance of heaven and its blessings on our deliberations, be held in this assembly every morning before we proceed to business; and that one or more of the clergy of this city be requested to officiate in this service."

The thought occurred to us that it was a good thing that the Supreme Court was not then in being to rule this good exercise out of order as being unconstitutional.

EVOLUTION AT PROFESSING CHRISTIAN SCHOOLS HAS ALARMED BIBLE SCHOLARS

We found a book review in BIOLA's "King's Business" for May 1960 (p 32) by Dr. Arnold D. Ehlert concerning "Evolution and Christian Thought Today" by Wheaton professor Russell L. Mixter. Referring to views of James O. Buswell, III Dr. Ehlert stated: "... This denies authorship by divine inspiration. He then states his acceptance of threshold evolution and affirms that Dr. Russell Mixter, editor of the book and (p. 2)

HAS COMMUNIST THOUGHT PENETRATED THE CHRISTIAN CHURCHES OF THIS LAND?

Communism overlaps Christian goals. Dean of America's most influential seminary (Union), wrote: "Why must they conclude that there is a conflict between Christianity and Communism? ... Certainly we cannot find the difficulty in the Communist economic system or in Communist social goals. There is much overlapping between Communist and Christian goals." Dr. John C. Bennett, "Theology Today", Oct. 1950.

Dr. Curt Akenson, pastor of the First Baptist Church and President of the college, stated in a press release that the college 'comes out of the W.B. Riley fundamentalist era. The orientation today is for those of us who appreciate the heritage to interpret the stable and scientifically defensible parts of this heritage'." Note that the school no longer holds to all that Dr. W.B. Riley taught but only those parts that are "scientifically defensible". Also to be noted is the further statement of Dr. Akenson: "We are the Billy Graham kind of conservatives. Our spirit is as ecumenical as his."



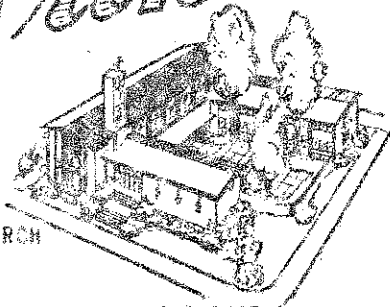

EVERY COMMUNIST A POTENTIAL ASSASSIN

It is slowly filtering through to thinking Americans that we are paying a frightful price for allowing Communists loose in the land. If a common American citizen violates the income tax law he is placed behind bars with speed that is frightening. However, if he be a Communist agent he is free to roam the countryside unrestricted. Strange that the Attorney General is not able to put one of their leaders behind bars, though they have flagrantly and wilfully violated the law. It is a fact that one who is schooled in force, committed to violence, and dedicated to a perverted set of ethics which makes murder a right act if it furthers the conspiracy - is a potential assassin. ALONG THE ROMAN ECUMENICAL FRONT

THE BATTLE IS ON TO SAVE BRUSHWYLER

The latest issue of the CBFMS paper carried not one word about the resignation of the General Director. The President of the CBFMS sent out a letter on Oct. 10 to all the pastors with word about reorganizing the society, eliminating the office of General Director. It contained the letter of resignation of Dr. Brushwyler of October 9, 1963. However, the December issue of the CBFMS paper carried not one word of any of these actions. Very recently all members of the CBFMS board received a letter from eastern pastor Roy Bohannon, a former board member, demanding that the Board reconsider their action changing Dr. Brushwyler's position from general director to home director. Moreover, at the October Eastern Regional in Rochester, N. H., the following resolution was passed proposed by Roy Bohannon, Paul West, Edward Keazirian, and Ralph Patterson: "Inasmuch as it appears to some that the Board of Directors of the CBFMS has exceeded the authority granted to it by the Constitution by putting into effect provisionally its proposed reorganization, we therefore call for a reconsideration of the matter by the Board." There is a violent internal struggle inside of the CBFMS between those forces who are demanding the reorganizing of the CBFMS and those who want to save the Brushwyler ecclesiastical empire. The New Evangelicalist supporters (Carlberg, Bohannon, L. T. Anderson, Cedric Peterson) are determined that the CBFMS board shall not succeed in this endeavor to reorganize the society without a General Director. 

GOD'S HEART MUST BREAK OVER THIS
INFIDELITY IN THE "CHRISTIAN" PULPIT

Dr. John Sutherland Bonnell wrote in LOOK magazine (Mar. 23, 1954) - "Presbyterians do not believe in the literal inerrancy of the Scriptures ... Some find a symbolic, rather than a physical, meaning in the accounts of the birth of Jesus ... Except in minor Presbyterian groups, the doctrine of the virgin birth is not used as a test of orthodoxy."

Dr. H. Richard Niebuhr is quoted in "Decision" for Nov. 1962: "My view is that the virgin birth doesn't make a bit of difference... As far as I am able to figure it out in my own reflections, the virgin birth has nothing to do with the meaning of Jesus Christ ..."

Floyd H. Ross in "The Theology of the Christian Mission", p. 221, "Some believed he had a 'virgin birth'. All of these themes are ancient mythic themes, paralleled over and over again in the religions of mankind." Seminary Professor Floyd Filsen cautions infidels in his book "The Gospel According to St. Matthew" - "Whoever takes the birth story as poetic and figurative must take care not to drain away the vigor and firmness of that affirmation." (p. 56). Dr. Martin Niemoller, one of the WCC presidents, stated in Catholic Digest for Nov. 1962, "I have never preached on the Virgin Birth as it was never important to me... I was indifferent to the doctrine of the Virgin Birth because it was not related to my prayer." Dr. Georgia Harkness of PSR in Berkeley states in her book "Understanding the Christian Faith" "This does not mean that Jesus was God... The question as to whether Jesus was born of a virgin is one on which the opinion of Christians differ, and the biblical accounts do not throw clear light upon it. In any case Jesus' sonship hinges, not on the physical manner of his birth, but on what he was and said he did." Dr. William Lippard stated in LOOK magazine "I know of no Baptist church that requires acceptance of this doctrine as a condition of baptism." Well, here is one. Dr. Leslie D. Weatherhead in his book "Key Next Door", stated about the Virgin Birth, "It is not to be regarded in my opinion - as essential to the faith of a Christian ... The virgin birth does not safeguard the divinity or sinlessness of Jesus ... I do not ask you to accept the virgin birth if it offends your intellect." How tragic.



Some might still claim for the original copies' of the Bible an infallible character, but this view only begs the question and makes such Christian apologetics more ridiculous in the eyes of sincere men." The Pillsbury College Bulletin for Dec. 1963: "Word has reached us that Dr. Robert Carlberg made a public charge at the Western Regional of CBA of America at Salem, Oregon, that Central Conservative Baptist Theological Seminary and Pillsbury College dismissed classes and packed the Central Regional meetings at Rockford, Illinois, and as a result the hard core prevailed in the meetings. This report was altogether erroneous. Pillsbury College did not dismiss a single class; neither did Central Seminary. The only Pillsbury faculty members who attended the Central Regional meetings were Dr. and Mrs. Monroe Parker and Miss Sharon Clark, WCBM appointee. NEO-EVANGELICALIST MISSIONS ARE PLUNGING
INTO THE CATHOLIC DIALOGUE JOYOUSLY

Kenneth Strachan's "Latin America Evangelist" for November-December 1962 carried an article by Prof. John Stam of the Biblical Seminary of San Jose after a visit to Europe: "What impressed me most about the Catholics at Louvain was their obviously deep and very sincere dedication to the ecumenical quest for the unity of the Church. This was clearly not just a device to snare ecumenically-minded Protestants back into the net of the 'One True Church'. It was an honest conviction, honestly held and honestly expressed. Each morning and each evening all of us joined in a 'Prayer for the Unity of the Church of Jesus Christ', written by the Roman Catholic delegation. It omitted all reference to Mary, the Pope, Rome or saints. It spoke not of heretics but of 'separated brethren' and our Lord's 'other sheep'. It confessed our mutual sin and shame for the bitterness, strife and falsehood of our controversy in the past. After praying together in this way it was impossible to doubt the sincerity of this conviction, whatever questions or fears one might have about a rapprochement between Rome and Geneva. . . What shall we evangelicals say of these things? Surely we must honestly recognize the sincerity of motive of those who seek to know us better, and we cannot refuse to 'dialogue' with them openly, courteously and with equal honesty."

Such an investigation committee, headed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, should be composed of citizens and experts who enjoy the confidence of the nation." Warren was appointed on Nov. 29.

..On the assassination..The S.F. Examiner for Dec. 9, 1963 told about a secret communist meeting in New York Nov. 23, which stated: "James Jackson, a member of the Communist Party's ruling executive board, and editor of 'The Worker', official Red mouthpiece, told the meeting: 'The guilt for the slaying (must be laid) at the door of the ultra-right'. He called for a 'mobilization of the American people to meet the pro-fascist challenge ...' Bishop Pike, Eugene Carson Blake, Justice Warren and others have expressed views favorable to this line."

..Dr. Carl McIntire, who now speaks on 546 stations daily has a new packet to send out to listeners: "A Communist Kills our President and the Right Wing is Blamed". Box 36, Collingswood 7, N.J.

..Chief Justice Earl Warren comes to this important task with severe handicaps unfortunately. Multitudes of citizens lack confidence because: 1. He read his verdict the day following the assassination, blaming the radical right, so how could he go back and review the evidence objectively? 2. His decisions from the high court favoring the communists would be expected to color his investigation, since the alleged killer was a communist. Many feel he should disqualify himself.
