

BRAVE WORDS FROM OUR GREAT PRESIDENT
RICHARD NIXON TAKES A STRONG STAND

On Negotiation with the enemy..."To negotiate with the enemy before we have driven him out of South Vietnam would be like negotiating with Hitler before the German armies had been driven from France" (Readers Digest, Dec. 1965.)

If Southeast Asia is lost..."...If Vietnam is lost, Red China would gain vast new power. North Vietnam must stop its aggression against South Vietnam; South Vietnam's independence and freedom from communist control must be guaranteed; there must be no reward for the aggressors." (Reader's Digest, Dec. 1965.)

Neutralizing Southeast Asia..."Neutrality, where communists are concerned, means three things: We get out; they stay in; they take over. We should use American manpower only in the air and on the sea. The South Vietnamese can handle the ground fighting... A U. S. defeat in Vietnam means a Chinese communist victory which could decide the fate of Asia for generations to come." (Vital Speeches, March, 15 1965.)

Blunting the Communist Offensive... "To the Communists who say that their goal is a Communist America, we must answer our goal is nothing less than a free Russia, a free China, a free Eastern Europe, and a free Cuba. Only such a goal will blunt the Communist ideological offensive and regain the initiative for the cause of freedom." (Vital Speeches, June 1, 1963.)

Removing the Communists From Cuba... "We must no longer postpone making a command decision to do whatever is necessary to force the removal of the Soviet beachhead. The United States cannot tolerate the continued existence of a Soviet military and subversive base 90 miles from our shore." (Vital Speeches, June 1, 1963).



MORE SERIOUS THAN THE EAGLETON STORY

Gen. Edwin A. Walker, 4011 Turtle Creek Blvd., Dallas, Texas 75219 recently sent out the following release over his signature: "World War II, fighting with the Russians against Germans in Europe: George S. McGovern, a US pilot, landed his plane on the island of Vis in the Adriatic and refused to complete his mission. He was relieved of his command and sent home for cowardice. The co-pilot flew the plane back to its base." This report is far more ominous for America than disclosure of any psychiatric and intoxication reports that may be true. This should be investigated completely. If this is Presidential-aspirant George McGovern, it becomes important to all the churches, since he is the acknowledged ecumenical candidate for this high office.

FORMER MISSIONARY PEARL BUCK VERY ILL

Five days after celebrating her 80th birthday the prize-winning author and former liberal missionary was in the hospital in Rutland, Vermont. This reminds us of the part she had in the theological wars of the Presbyterian modernist in China. The following paragraph shows how she hated the preaching of the Gospel, found on page 473 of Ned Stonehouse's biography of J. Gresham Machen: "Let the sole question about that missionary be whether or not he is beloved in the community, whether the people see any use in his being among them, whether or not the way he has lived there has conveyed anything to the people about Christ- not kind you, whether or not he has preached, for that is of no value, but whether by the way he has lived he has conveyed anything. If he has not, then let him be returned to his own country . . . But above all, let the spread of the spirit of Christ be rather by mode of life than preaching. I am weary into death with this incessant preaching. It deadens all though, it confuses all issues, it is producing in our Chinese church a horde of hypocrites and in our theological seminaries a body of Chinese ministers which makes one despair for the future."

PENTECOSTAL MOVEMENT IN CATHOLICISM

..Pentecostal Catholics Are More Faithful than ever, according to a remarkable article by noted Romanist Dale Francis in the Catholic Voice for July 20, 1972, who noted that some Catholic Pentecostals are leaving the church: "I know, too, that the general experience had been quite different from this. From places all over the country I hear reports that the Catholic Pentecostals become more faithful than ever to the Church, that they become the leaders of parishes, the core of Catholic orthodoxy."

..Catholic Sriter Dale Francis continues on Pentecostalism; "We are Catholics, we have been Catholics since we were children we have kept the rules of the Church, gone to Mass, made our Easter duty, but somewhere along the way if we are really to live as Catholics we must come to an adult realization of the startling meaning of being Catholic. If the Pentecostal Movement is bringing people to a conversion, bringing them to a full commitment to Christ in His Church, then the work is good. And whether it comes suddenly like a light, as it did for Paul on the road to Damascus, or as it sometimes comes at Catholic Pentecostal meetings or through slow realization-it must come." (Catholic Voice. July 20, 1972. P. 8).

..Catholic-Pentecostal Dialogue Goes On.. The Catholic Voice for July 20, 1972, had a dispatch from Rome: "A member of the Vatican Secretariat for Promoting Christian Unity, who declined to be named, said a recent meeting in Switzerland with leaders of the Pentecostal Churches revealed that "Catholicism and the Pentecostal movement have far more in common than was originally thought". Formal conferences will be scheduled for a five year period.

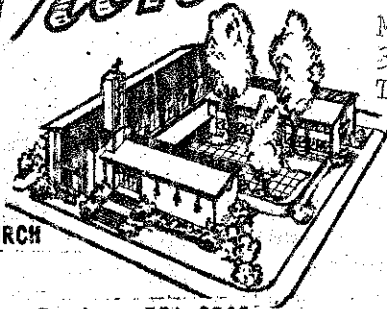

MORE ON ROMAN CATHOLIC PENTECOSTALISM

Catholic Priest Lauds Pentecostalism...
Richard Schiblin wrote in Catholic Voice, July 27, 1972, p.8, about the new joy in Pentecostalist experience: "There is a new power also in my sacramental ministry. The first time I made communion calls after receiving the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, I prayed spontaneously with each sick person, and looked up from prayer to find them genuinely moved. Several have remarked since: 'Father, that's just what I needed to hear.' ...In short, I've found a center for my life as a priest and as a Christian. Theological terms have been translated into reality...So that's where I am. It's like a new beginning after 11 years of priesthood. And I consider myself just that-a beginner. But it's great to be young in the Lord." The charismatic movement is making firm, loyal, dedicated Catholics than ever.

Lutherans Going For Pentecostalism....
"Among the speakers scheduled at a first-of-its-kind, unofficial Lutheran Conference on the Holy Spirit to be held in Minneapolis Aug. 8-12, will be Dr. David du Plessis, of Oakland, a founder of the World Pentecostal Council, and Father Edward D. O'Conner, a Catholic theologian from Notre Dame." (The Catholic Voice, July 27, 1972).

A Former Critic Of Pentecostalism...
Jamie Buckingham, wrote in the Jan-Feb., 1972, "Logos Journal" which calls itself "An international Charismatic Journal" finally experienced what he called the "baptism of the Holy Spirit." He wrote: "I have a letter in my files from Ruth (Mrs. Billy) Graham. She had read the first draft of one of my books which has a chapter exposing the fallacies of a certain Pentecostal organization. She wrote: 'There are enough worldlings shooting holes in the church without us joining the firing squad. Remember David's disagreement with Saul: yet he said, 'Tell it not in Gath, publish it not in the streets of Askelon; lest the daughters of the Philistines rejoice.' (II Sam. 1:20).'"

A NEW EVANGELICALIST EVENING SERVICE

The Southern Baptist pastor from Albuquerque, New Mexico attended a church in Palo Alto, whose pastor is a trustee of Fuller Seminary. In his church paper for June 14, 1972, he reported: "While Mrs. Connor and I were in the San Francisco area last week, we attended a most unusual evening service at Peninsula Bible Church in Palo Alto. There were about eight hundred present, filling the church. Fully two-thirds of these were young people in jeans, sweat shirts, long hair, sandals, and one or two that I saw were bare-foot. There was a low buzzing as friends greeted one another and visited before the service began. A rock music record was playing softly in the background. The service consisted of a dialogue on "The Song of Solomon" by the assistant pastor and a young man, presumably a member of the church.

The assistant pastor was middle-aged, wore his hair long, had a mustache, wore no coat or tie and sat on a high stool before the congregation. The young man also sat on a high stool and had a thick, black beard. Their manner was informal, open, friendly, warm, and loving.

Most of the congregation had Bibles which they opened and followed as the Scripture was read and discussed by the two leaders. At one point a person in the congregation stood up to make a comment. The spirit of the meeting was subdued, reverent, accepting. The emotion seemed intense like something great was taking place.

There were no loud "Jesus yells" or any other theatrics. Everyone seemed intent on getting the meaning of the Scripture. The offering was taken last because as the assistant pastor explained, he forgot to take it in the regular place. You may put money into the offering plate, or if you have a need, you may take out up to ten dollars. Greater needs should be arranged for at the church office. Pastor Ray C. Steadman was present but did not participate in this service.

The service lasted about an hour and a half and was dismissed without prayer. Clusters of people gathered around the auditorium to continue their sharing and discussion. The service as a whole was elevating and inspiring.

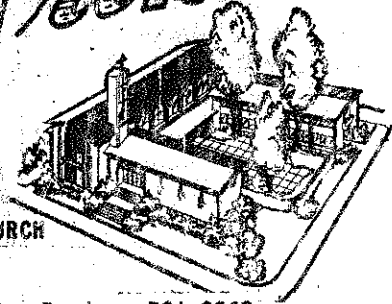

..When Geo. McGovern Was A Pastor...Ac -
cording to a Houston dispatch in the S.F.
Chronicle of Aug. 11, 1972, George Mc-
Govern was a student pastor while attend-
ing the liberal Garrett Theological Sem-
inary. Between July 1946 and November 1947
he baptized twelve people at the Diamond
Lake Methodist Church in Mundelein, Ill.
A newspaper traced these twelve to find
that seven of them plan to vote against
McGovern for President. McGovern will get
only three votes, with two undecided. Mr.
McGovern is not only the sole PhD who ran
for President in this century, but the
only outstanding apostate as well. His
father raised him in a fundamentalist
faith.

..He Made This Pledge On Cuba...according
to the Communist Daily Worker of June 15,
1972, to put "an end to the economic and
diplomatic isolation of Cuba...We will
put an end to the instinctive or spontan-
eous reactions to supporting any dictator-
ship which raises the banner of anti-com-
munism."

..Evidence Of His Apostasy..The Catholic
Voice for Aug. 17, 1972: "Sen. McGovern,
according to the Henderson analysis, was
converted from the Protestant fundamen-
talism of his preacher father to the Social
Gospel, but without giving up the funda-
mental conviction that all institutions
'have elements of injustice.'" Rev. Chas.
P. Henderson, Jr, 31, is author of the
new book "The Nixon Theology", Harper and
Row.

..Further Evidence Of His Departure...
Christianity Today of August 11, 1972, re-
ported: "Earlier, as a seminarian, McGov-
ern said he embraced 'the social gospel'.
Although he holds no strong ties to any
particular congregation today and doesn't
espouse his father's evangelical Christ-
ianity, he is still active in United Meth-
odist circles. The senator in 1968 was a
United Methodist delegate to the Fourth
Assembly of the World Council of Churches
(Uppsala, Sweden)."

..Far More Radical Than Roosevelt.. Ex-
pastor McGovern is judged generally by
conservative leaders as the most radically
left-wing candidate for President in U.S.
history. Three of the late F.D.R.'s sons
have now come out for Mr. Nixon: Elliott,
James, and John, according to an AP dis-
patch from Miami Beach on Aug. 22, 1972,
in the S.F. Chronicle.

THE INSANITY OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CHURCHES MEETING NEXT WEEK IN DALLAS

ALL-DAY BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP DEC. 4

One of the announced speakers, in addition to Margaret Mead and Roman Catholic Bishop Patrick Flores, is Black poet Leroi Jones. He has no use for the Christian Faith. The Congressional Record of Sept. 29, 1966 quoted Leroi Jones: "The force we want is of 20 million spooks (Negroes) storming American cities with furious cries and unstoppable weapons. We want actual explosions and actual brutality." Nathaniel Weyl writes in an Arlington House book of 1968: "Leroi Jones, a black writer with a repertoire of four-letter words, told the primarily Jewish audience that 'our enemies' included most of those who were listening. Previously, Jones had been noted chiefly for a dirty, but dull, play called THE TOILET. In the January 1966 issue of THE LIBERATOR, a little magazine of Negro extremists, Jones blossomed out as the leading Negro anti-Semite. His poem BLACK ART referred to 'the slimy bellies of the owner-jews' and 'cracking steel knuckles in a jewlady's mouth.' Jones' hatred was not however confined to such a limited object as Jewry. He called for 'poems that wrestle cops into alleys and take their weapons leaving them dead with tongues pulled out and sent to Ireland.' There are also lines about 'dope selling wops' and 'mulatto bitches whose brains are red jelly stuck between Elizabeth Taylor's toes.' Much of the blank verse is too obscene to be reproduced here; all of it show an almost total dearth of talent, and the poem as a whole merely reveals the volcanic power of self-hatred and self-contempt when it is externalized and directed at all those who are more successful and more constructive than its author."

CATHOLICS ARE DEAD SERIOUS ABOUT KEY '73

CHOICE YOUNG SCHOLAR JOINS FACULTY

Nine Roman Catholic Bishops of Missouri signed a long document about their joyful participation in Key '73, which was published in the St. Louis Review of November 24, 1972. It stated in part: "We, the Catholic Bishops of Missouri, are happy to announce to you, that on behalf of our Catholic people we have accepted an invitation to join in the program, known as Key '73, the motto of which is 'Calling our Continent to Christ'...The Catholic Church in Missouri and other states is joining these other Christian churches in this challenging undertaking. We note, however, that our activity will have as its primary goal an intensive spiritual renewal within our church in accordance with Catholic teachings and traditions. At the same time, it will be pervaded with a spirit of genuine ecumenism when we join with other Christian churches in certain undertakings in support of beliefs we share in common...Among the means of fostering our personal renewal with Christ are a whole-hearted participation of Christ's offering of Himself in the Mass, deep devotion to Christ present in the Eucharist, personal meeting with Christ the Healer and Reconciler in the Sacrament of Penance, frequent reading of God's Word in Holy Scripture, fidelity in personal prayer, use of the rosary to meditate on the mysteries of Christ, communal prayer as a family group, serious study of our faith both privately and in groups, spiritual renewal experience such as retreats, days of recollection, parish missions, and the like. We shall also seek to grow in the love of our church, the Mystical Body of Christ. We shall endeavor to deepen our love and loyalty to our Most Holy Father, Pope Paul VI, remembering him in our prayers daily and recalling our duty of filial obedience...In union with Mary, who first brought Christ to the world, and whom He has given to us as our spiritual Mother, and with the saints who have witnessed to Him through the ages, we beg the blessing of God upon this unique effort to bring Christ, Our Lord and Savior, to our land, to those entrusted to our care as well as others who have forgotten Him or who have never heard of the Lord Jesus." Cardinal Garberry (Con't bottom of next column)

In addition to his native English, he has a familiarity with French and speaks the tribal language of Central African Republic, where he spent most of his life, before studying in America. He was saved as a child, grew up in a Christian home, and is committed to the Great Commission. His father has served for 36 years as a veteran missionary in Africa, where two of his brothers now serve, and where his sister has served as a nurse. He has traveled extensively throughout the world. He has deep Baptist convictions, a burning missionary passion, and has a strong commitment to the local church. His wife, Joan, is a college graduate in English literature, plays the piano, and with all the graduate study she has pursued she is not unfamiliar with theology herself. Mr. Teachout hopes to have his ThD degree following acceptance of his dissertation.

"In fact, the conversion rate in the Pentecostal movement, in Latin America and Italy specifically, has surpassed the population growth rate, making it the fastest growing movement within the Christian tradition. Even from behind the Iron Curtain where Spirit-filled Christians are most feared and oppressed, the movement is spreading."

BILLY GRAHAM IDENTIFIES WITH ORAL ROBERTS

For the first time on national television Dr. Billy Graham identified himself wholeheartedly and enthusiastically with the faith healing ministry of Oral Roberts in the recent "Oral Roberts On Campus" TV special. It appeared in the S.F. Bay Area in December 11, 1972, on Channel 2. The first thing one noticed was long hair on the males all over the place. Oral Roberts' hair was big and bulky down below his collars, as was true with Dr. Graham. The college young people who sang presented a sort of dance routine which was like a Lawrence Welk presentation. The rhythm and gyrations of the Roberts singing group was not much different from those on a Dean Martin show. The orchestra leader was Ralph Carmichael. In their dialogue Oral remarked how he has enjoyed the platform with Billy at his Denver Crusade. Billy reminisced about his visit to Oral Roberts University in 1967 when he dedicated the campus. It was perfectly evident from this TV show that Billy doesn't mind the country knowing that Pentecostalism and the tongues movement is a perfectly valid option, if not a normally expected experience for Christian people. Oral Roberts gave a sermon on faith healing, in which he gave his own testimony of being healed, and then told of God's special revelation in which God said, "I want you to take my healing power to your generation." He scrambled several experiences together including the baptism of the Holy Spirit, the gift of the Spirit, and the matter of salvation. His invitation was for people to be healed. This appearance was really nothing new since Billy had appeared with him and H.M.S. Richards (The Adventist) in Washington, then again Oral and Billy were on the platform in an affectionate meeting at the Berlin Congress of Evangelism, as well as at the Denver Crusade, and then at the ORU dedication.
