

RADICAL MODERNIST TO GIVE LECTURES AT FULLER SEMINARY ON VIOLENCE IN THE USA

FULLER SEMINARY LECTURER OPENLY INVITED ARREST WITH THESE PROVOCATIVE WORDS

The Fuller Theological Seminary Bulletin of Oct.-Nov. 1972, carries the announcement that the Morgan Lectures scheduled at Fuller for January 18-19, 1973, will be given by Dr. Robert McAfee Brown, noted professor of Religion at Stanford University. Dr. Brown, who was one of the architects of the 1967 Presbyterian Confession, will lecture on "Violence in American Society." At an "evangelism" conference in Portland, Dr. Brown said, according to the Presbyterian Journal of June 7, 1967: "There is no possible way to justify the continuation of denominations... Christendom is no more... Not only is Christendom gone, but in its place is revolution... The question is not whether the revolution will succeed, but how much bloodshed there will have to be before a more equitable balance has been reached between rich and poor... The central theological theme for Christians today is a theology of the world." At a national Catholic ecumenical congress in Berkeley, Dr. Brown called for the church to get involved with abolishing capital punishment, with the right of farm workers to bargain collectively, and the guaranteed annual wage. The S.F. Chronicle for April 24, 1967, reported: "Dr. Brown also urged a Christian dialogue with the 'Marxists'. 'Since communism is the world religion, making the most massive impact on the allegiances of men, we had better not pretend it isn't there.'" "The bearded, sandaled, unwashed 'hippies', practicing their concept of love for man in an unorthodox way" was commended by Dr. Brown in an RNS dispatch from Portland in the Baptist Bible Tribune of July 21, 1967: "They represent something a good deal closer to the early Christian movement than the churches. They provide something we have not provided, something we have got to embrace. We can't dismiss them simply because they have got boards and wear sandals. We must listen to the creative ideas they have-something we lack." When Dr. Brown was arrested in Berkeley, along with fifteen others and his own son, at an anti-war protest at the main draft board offices which they blocked, he showed considerable arrogance toward the law. The S.F. Chronicle for April 10, 1971, quoted him: "I chose to preach my Good Friday sermon not in a church (Con't on page 2.)

Some of the most daring statements we have ever seen in print in open defiance of federal law were written by the one who will give the Morgan lectures at Fuller Seminary at the invitation of Dr. David A. Hubbard on Jan. 18-19, 1973. The article in Look magazine, Oct. 31, 1967 was entitled: "In Conscience I Must Break the Law". He said: "For myself it is clear that civil disobedience will involve. I teach. I spend my professional life with American youth of draft age. And while I will not use the classroom for such purposes, I will make clear that from now on my concerns about Vietnam will be explicitly focused on counseling, aiding and abetting all students who declare that out of moral conviction they will not fight in Vietnam. I will counsel, aid and abet such students to find whatever level of protest is consonant with their consciences, and when for them this means refusing service in the armed forces, I will support them in that stand. In doing so, I am committing a Federal offense, for the Military Selective Service Act of 1967 specifically states that anyone who 'knowingly counsels, aids or abets another to refuse or evade registration or service in the armed forces' opens himself to the same penalties as are visited upon the one he so counsels, aids and abets, namely up to five years in jail or up to \$10,000 in fines or both. I will continue to do this until I am arrested. As long as I am not arrested, I will do it with increasing intensity, for I am no longer willing that 18 or 19 year-old boys should pay with their lives for the initially bumbling but now deliberate folly of our national leaders. Nor am I willing to support them in action that may lead them to jail, from a safe preserve of legal inviolability for myself. I must run the same risks as they, and therefore I break the law on their behalf, so that if they are arrested, I too must be arrested. If this means jail, I am willing to go with them, and perhaps we can continue there to think and learn and teach and reflect and emerge with a new set of priorities for American life." Parents of draft-age children as well as young people will be watching to see what U.S. Attorney Cecil Poole of San Francisco will be doing with this (Con't. on page 2.)

A School Got In Financial Trouble.. we noticed this in a Christianity Today issue of Sept. 12, 1969: "Grand Canyon College, a lightly endowed Southern Baptist School in Arizona, has operated in the red fifteen of its twenty years. Now it must raise \$125,000 by November to avert closure." This college, even with its immense SBC backing, was not able to maintain the excellent financial record of the S. F. Baptist Seminary. It was fortunate that this college was not taken into Court by those who had money owed to them. Loyalty is absolutely basic in every Fundamental institution if it is to survive in this hour of treachery.

As the father of a draft age son, I am proud to be here," Dr. Brown was among nine clergymen arrested in Florida as a result of a sit-in demonstration. They were released after serving four days in jail of a 60 day sentence. Dr. Brown was quoted in Christianity Today of Sept. 11, 1964: "We received no preferential treatment, and the other prisoners were very congenial." An idea of his theological insights can be seen in this article in the 1962 winter edition of "Stanford Today": "One need not be a Christian or a Jew or a Hindu to be religious. The Secularist likewise has his object of faith and can live an eminently religious life. The disinterested pursuit of truth by the scientist...is often a higher religious act, a greater demonstration of what faith truly is than the most impeccable orthodox utterances of a Presbyterian divine."

FULLER SEMINARY LECTURER, (con't from col 2) deliberate defiance of the law and the reaction of the U.S. Attorney General in Washington, D.C.

Western Baptist Seminary of Portland announces their Commencement speaker on June 12 to be Dr. W.A. Criswell, noted Southern Baptist Convention leader. Their annual Winter Lectureship is to be by Dr. Emil Gaverluck, a famous American Baptist Convention "evangelist", scheduled for March 6-9. They also have scheduled "Youth for Christ Biblical Studies Institute" for May 21-25. The President, Earl D. Radmacher, in his year-end newsletter to the constituency includes a bearded picture of himself. Western Baptist Seminary is identified with the Conservative Baptist Association of America.

New Evangelicals Are Going Left..The liberal Christian Century of Dec. 27, 1972 had an article by Dr. Richard J. Mouw, of Calvin College, which said: "On October 11, 1972, 50 evangelicals representing many congregations, colleges and seminaries and organizations such as Youth for Christ, Young Life and Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship, held a breakfast meeting with George McGovern in a Chicago suburb. Later in the morning black evangelist Tom Skinner spoke the mind of most of that gathering when he introduced George McGovern at Wheaton (Illinois) College with an enthusiastic endorsement of McGovern's candidacy."


Key '73 Is Coming With A Big Bang... The Catholic Voice for Dec. 21, 1972, had quite an article on Key '73, and it stated: "Father Anthony Harcar, director of the diocesan Christian Unity Committee and a member of the Key 73 committee said that business concerns have been asked to blow plant whistles and churches asked to ring their bells to remind people of the noon prayer." We trust that people will not confuse this big bang with "the sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind," in the second chapter of Acts describing events on the Day of Pentecost.

More Catholic Participation In Key 73..... Christianity Today for Dec. 22, 1972, stated: "Catholic pastors in the archdiocese of Philadelphia have been urged to involve their parishes in Key 73, following the

A LIBERAL LOOKS GLOWINGLY AT KEY '73

NEW EVANGELICAL BIBLE STUDY FELLOWSHIP
EXPANDS INTO THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

The liberal Christian Century for May 31, 1972, had this assessment by Joe Hale, United Methodist official from Nashville. Some significant paragraphs in his article . . . "In My Judgement The Climate for a movement such as Key 73 was made possible by the U.S. Congress on Evangelism. A 'bridge' was structured in Minneapolis, one which united the two concerns that were ever present in the first five Key Bridge meetings. The congress not only showed how those two concerns could be put together but also shattered the rationale that had kept them separate". (Ed.-the two concerns were the social gospel and the N.T.Gospel) . . . "Subsequent Key Bridge Consultations began to reflect the new vision of evangelism. The Pentecostals, who had not been included in the early meetings, brought their insight and sensitivity; churches that had been overlooked because they were thought to be uninterested began to take notice. Those for whom evangelism had gone sour discovered a positive model-one they had been eagerly awaiting. The found that passionate personal evangelism could be geared to a compassionate social response."

.. "These Purposes Have Drawn Together an unlikely and - in the minds of some, a strange - Key 73 central committee. It includes many churches affiliated with the National Council of Churches as well as most of the groups that relate to the National Association of Evangelicals. Also on the roster are many churches that are affiliated with neither."

.. "The Unity Of These Bodies In Key 73 is not one of theological agreement or methodological style. As the official brochure reads: 'Each church or group may choose the precise form of extent of its participation. Differences in doctrine will be recognized and respected. Varieties in evangelistic expression are anticipated'. The bond is a simple desire to proclaim Christ in a united way in North America. Key 73 is one hopeful sign that the battles between a defunct fundamentalism and a lifeless liberalism are now being left behind, to be fought only by those who wish to live in the past."

Another remarkable illustration of the fact that the New Evangelical Bible Study Fellowship makes better Catholics is shown by the announcement in the Catholic Voice for Jan. 4, 1973, telling about one long-time student opening a Bible study series in two Catholic churches in Concord and Lafayette. "The program is modeled on the incredibly successful Bible Study Fellowship founded in Berkeley by Miss A. Wetherell Johnson, a former missionary to China... The new program is being coordinated by Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Roberts of St. Catherine's parish, Martinez, both of whom have extensive backgrounds of study with the Bible Fellowship. It was their experience with the Protestant group that inspired their dream of such an organization for Catholics... 'Ten years ago when I began study with the Fellowship, I was one of the first Catholics to attend the sessions,' reports Mrs. Roberts. 'Now in our area (East Contra Costa County), there are almost as many Catholics as Protestant students.' To her this shows a real need for such a program within the Catholic Church, especially at a time when changes and renewal are having a shattering effect on many Catholics. 'The Scriptures provide a real basis for coping with change and for understanding where our traditions and rituals came from in the first place,' says Mrs. Roberts." The Bible says, "By their fruits, ye shall know them"

.. "Catholics Pushing Key '73.. "Father Anthony Harcar, director of the diocesan Christian Unity Committee and a member of the Oakland Key 73 Committee, said that it is essential that clergy and laity work together in such things as home visitations during Key 73 launch week." Concerning the Key 73 movie shown on Jan. 6, "The TV special focuses in the idea that while people may disagree on doctrine and methodology, they are unified in the call to express God's love as evidenced in Christ to every person." (Catholic Voice, 1-4-73.) The Bible says: "How can two walk together except they be agreed."

Billy Lauds Catholics In Key '73'. The Catholic Voice of May 4, 1972, carried the RNS dispatch from Minneapolis: "Evangelist Billy Graham said here he welcomes Roman Catholic participation in Key '73, the massive interdenominational evangelism effort planned next year. Mr. Graham, who recalled that he was one of the original organizers of Key 73 along with Dr. Carl Henry, said his evangelistic association will cooperate '100 percent' in the effort. 'I think it's wonderful for Catholics to come in and get involved in evangelism,' he said in an interview. He said there are 'thousands of evangelical Catholics.' He noted that each denomination is free to take part in Key 73 as it sees fit."

The First Baptist Church Of Ramallah ten miles north of Jerusalem, recently purchased property for \$24,000. They still owe \$14,000 on this land. This is the only Fundamental Baptist Church property in the whole Jerusalem area. Missionary Jad and Cynthia Mikhail are the Baptist World Missionaries there. A Charismatic Conference In Toronto... The Gospel Witness of July 1, 1971, reported: "A Charismatic teaching was held at Metropolitan United Church in Toronto, May 24 to 29, sponsored and directed by the Outreach for Christ Foundation of Orlando, Florida...The first speaker we heard was 'Father' Edward J. Sweeney, an ordained priest of the Church of Rome...In all this he made it clear that he is still a priest of Rome and sub-servient to the hierarchy. This means he still celebrates the Mass, prays to Mary and the saints and accepts all the traditions of Rome. When Luther found light in the Word of God his eyes were opened to see the errors and unscriptural practices of the Papal system. He protested them, and soon found he had to separate from them. But not so with the charismatic gifted people now within the pale of Rome."

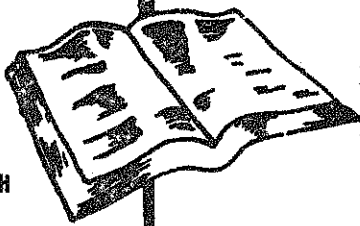

IMPORTANCE OF McGOVERN'S BREAKFAST WITH NEW EVANGELICALS AND WHEATON APPEARANCE

A Methodist modernist by the name of Michael McIntyre, who traveled with the McGovern campaign was put out with the press because they didn't highlight McGovern's "moral" issues more, and he also revealed his joy in new found allies among New Evangelicals. "Let me illustrate more specifically: On October 11, the day McGovern spoke at Wheaton (Illinois) College, he also met with Mayor Daley's precinct workers in downtown Chicago. But that wasn't his only huddle. Before the Wheaton speech, McGovern met at breakfast with a cross-section of the nation's evangelical leadership. This meeting was closed to reporters, but media people waited outside and they knew what was going on during that time. That evening, network television news shows announced that the senator had been to Chicago and had met with Daley's people. Apparently, reporters and editors saw only the political story. But the real point of that day was that Senator McGovern had been an invited guest in an evangelical stronghold, had met with a sizeable group of evangelical leaders, and had made a positive impact on the evangelical community. Here was George McGovern on turf that is generally conceded to be the exclusive property of those of another political viewpoint. That was and is news. Yet network reporters were busy shuffling their feet, staring at the ceiling, and looking at their watches again." (Christian Century, Dec. 27, 1972.)

DR. W.Z. CRISWELL ON DIALOGUE WITH N.C.C.

The big news out of the recent National Council of Churches meeting in Dallas in December 1972, was the story, according to Dan Thrapp of the Los Angeles Times (12-16-72) that Dr. W.A. Criswell of the First Baptist Church "would not be opposed" to dialog with the NCC. He was quoted: "Any man who names the name of Christ in truth and sincerity is my brother in the faith. . .I believe it is possible, if a man is really right with God and has the spirit of Christ, to stay true to any position and yet sit down with his brother whose theology differs." He made a considerable statement when (con't next column.)

HOW MODERN JEWS FEEL ABOUT THE SAVIOR

Rabbi Jacob Rothschild of the Reform Temple of Atlanta is quoted in the Atlanta Constitution of Jan. 7, 1972 (p. 8-A) "As long as Key 73 deals with intensifying the dedication of Christians to Christianity, I have no gripe with it. But if it becomes a project to convert Jews to Christianity, then I am strongly opposed to it and feel they are interfering in the life style of Jewish people...The basic belief of the fundamentalist Christian faith is that only those who accept Jesus as Savior will be saved. Jews and Judaism have survived for 4,000 years and we don't feel that we are either damned or need saving. I consider it the worst possible taste for someone to approach a Jew to seek to adopt some other religious situation. If it happened to me, I would feel offended, and sorry for a person who has such poor taste, and end the conversation. In past years, there were efforts to convert Jews by force. The fact that this is now being done by a more pleasing approach, in the name of love, does not deny it as an affront to all the Jews consider sacred."

(Con't from first column.) he said he believed that "a man can be a sincere Christian and a soul-winner and not be a Fundamentalist...there are more common grounds than we realize, more things that bind us together than separate us. We all too often magnify the differences." The Dallas Morning News of Dec. 7, 1972, stated that "when asked if he would engage in dialogue with the ecumenical body (NCC), Dr. Criswell replied, 'I would not be opposed to it.'" Nine members of the religious press interviewed the renowned Dallas pastor in his office - the largest SBC Church in the world. About ecumenism in general, Dr. Criswell said: "The world is now so non-Christian with Christians so overwhelmingly outnumbered by paganism...I am in sympathy with any man, anywhere who stands up and names the name of Jesus, Glory, look." Dr. Criswell's Church is where Dr. Billy Graham has his membership. Dr. Criswell is scheduled to give the Commencement address at Western Baptist Seminary in Portland, June 12, 1973, at the invitation of Dr. Earl Radmacher, president.

..Pilot Lawrence V. McNutt, 37 was at the controls of a four-place plane that crashed at the 10,000 ft. level near Mt. Lewis in the high Sierra last Wednesday, Jan. 10, 1973, killing all four men from Orinda. They were returning from a ski outing, having taken off from Mammoth Ski resort in Mono County on the Nevada side of the range. Rescue units spotted the wreck a late Friday, with ground searchers reaching the site early Saturday, braving treacherous ice and avalanche dangers. Mr. and Mrs. McNutt came forward at Foothill on Aug. 19, 1964, with our Pastor baptizing her on August 30. That year he made an unsuccessful bid for a seat in Congress. THE DANGEROUS INCLUSIVENESS OF KEY '73

HELPFUL INFORMATION ABOUT KEY '73

History's most broadly inclusive united religious effort is Key '73, a very liberal ecumenical trans-denominational program to prostitute the evangelistic commission of the church. Inclusivism may be defined as "that policy which operates within the religious realm affecting executive appointments, missionary personnel, and general program objectives which gives equal recognition and honor to all shades of belief and unbelief alike without penalty or recognition." This is the reason it has attracted the liberals in great numbers. Listen to a statement by a noted universalist, Dr. Jitsuo Morikawa of the American Baptist Convention evangelism staff. Dr. Morikawa, trained at BIOLA, holds that all men are saved. In the American Baptist Magazine for December 1972, he described the widely inclusivist nature of Key 73: "Key 73 appears to be a decisive event in the religious history of America. In unprecedented degree and scale, religious forces from right and left are reaching out toward each other in a common cooperative evangelistic enterprise...And they are an amazing mixture-fundamentalists, conservatives and liberals, ecumenics and anti-ecumenics, spanning the whole religious spectrum of America-a diversity and division nowhere to be duplicated in the world. And initiative arose from the right, a call to an evangelistic ecumenism by those who consistently frowned upon the ecumenical movement represented in the National and World Council of Churches and now calling for a collaborative enterprise embracing the whole church around its central purpose of evangelism. Equally surprising is the response of the left to the initiative from the right...Thus, it may very well be that we are witnessing within our lifetime, what appeared a remote possibility, a new ecumenism, a wide-ranging one household of faith, the realization of the high priestly prayer 'that they all may be one, so that the world may believe.'...The National Planning Committee of 25 men and women represents a wide diversity and spectrum of ideology, geography and theology, particularly in relation to evangelism."

..An Address Exposing Key '73 by Dr. L. Duane Brown of the Campus Baptist Church, of Ames, Iowa, is now available at 15 copies for \$1 from Pastor E.L. Bynum, Tabernacle Baptist Church, P.O. Box 3327, Lubbock, Texas, 79410. This was published in the October 1972, issue of the Biblical Evangelist.

..More Catholics Endorse Key '73..Christianity Today for Dec. 22, 1972, states on page 38: "Catholic pastors in the archdiocese of Philadelphia have been urged to involve their parishes in Key 73, following the endorsement of Key 73 by John Cardinal Krol."

..Oakland Area Catholics Join Key '73.... The Catholic Voice for Nov. 30, 1972, stated on a big colorful front-page spread about this movement: "Key 73 has been endorsed by most of the U.S. Catholic bishops, including Oakland's Bishop Floyd L. Bergin who named Father Anthony Harcar, director of the diocesan Christian Unity Commission and associate pastor of St. Leo's Church, Oakland, to coordinate the local objectives of Key 73."

..The Statewide Men's Retreat at Lucerne, Feb. 22-24, 1973, will hear Dr. L. Duane Brown give an explanation of Key 73. This noted PhD is being asked to bring some light upon this massive united effort of the enemies of the New Testament Gospel of Christ and the blinded idealists of New Evangelicalism, all operating under the cover of "evangelism".

..Pentecostal Propoganda On Miracles.... The Oakland Tribune for Jan. 18, 1973, interviewed the noted Tongues advocate, Rev. Dennis J. Bennett of St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Seattle. As to miracles, the Bennetts report that "well-documented reports have been coming from Indonesia of miraculous events of the same nature and magnitude as in the Bible. Examiner for Jan. 18, 1973, reported: "There's too much fat in Safeway's ground beef, according to another suit filed here in superior court by the Interfaith Committee to Aid Farm Workers in Northern California."


..A Vicious Denunciation of the USA was made on the platform of the NCC in Dallas recently by LeRoi Jones, a black activist revolutionary who was reportedly paid \$1,500 plus expenses for the anti-US speech. Human Events for Dec. 30, 1972, stated: "It should come as no surprise that while Jones was flaying the United States before the NCC delegates, his own non-Christian Temple Kawaida, a Newark, N.J. 'spiritual' group, was receiving federal funding for a \$6.4 million apartment construction project. Similarly, Jones had obtained some \$40,000 in federal funds back in 1965 for a black theatre group which was staging 'hate-Whitey' plays."

..TV Pastor Rex Humbard of Akron who appears this week in Oakland is pastor of the Cathedral of Tomorrow, which owns several business corporations worth \$45 million, according to the Baptist Bible Tribune of Jan. 12, 1973. One of the firms owned by Humbard's church is the Real Form Girdle Co. "bought in August, 1965, and merged into the Cathedral of Tomorrow, Inc as a division. Located in four-story brick building at 218-226 Bedford Ave., Brooklyn, N.Y. Has more than 200 employees and manufactures girdles sold at retail throughout U.S."

.. "Key '73 - Blessing or Peril for Church" is the title of a 7 - page document by Dr. Horace F. Dean, 11 East Mercer Ave., Havertown, Pa. 19083. Dr. Horace Dean for 17 years directed a continent - wide evangelistic campaign entitled "Chrsit for America", in connection with which 450 crusades were conducted in North America, using 35 evangelists- all within the framework and under sponsorship of Fundamental churches. He has authored six booklets and books on evangelism and soul-winning. He is the author of "Operation Evangelism which contain the Bob Jones University lectures on evangelism for 1957.

.. A Sober Judgement of Key '73. Dr. Horace Dean writes: "Key'73, in the judgement of this writer, is probably the great hoax ever perpetrated against the churches of the U.S.A. and Canada. Though denied by its leaders, it is ecumenical in its drive toward a universal World Church organization... God's own redeemed people should in no wise be caught up in KEY'73. God pleads for separation from apostasy and unbelief. (Rev. 18:4) 'Come out of her my people, that ye be no partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues."

.. "Resolution on Key '73" - is a resolution passed by the Delaware Valley Evangelical Ministerium, meeting at the Maranatha Tabernacle, Darby, Pa. on Dec. 27, 1972 . It is available in quantity from the Conversion Center, 18 W. Eagle Rd., Havertown Pa. 19083. Rev. Alex O. Dunlap, Int'l director.

.. St. Paul Catholics Join Key '73 .. The Luthern News for Jan. 1, 1973 stated: Participation of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of St. Paul-Minneapolis in Key 73 has been approved by the archdiocesan Pastoral Council. Key 73 is a continent-wide evangelistic campaign that will be conducted in 1973 with interdenominational support . Launched by evangelical Protestants, it has won the support of many Catholic dioceses."

.. "Key '73 and the Roman Church" is the title of a reprint from the Gospel Witness for Dec. 28, 1972 which is being distributed by the Conversion Center, Inc. , P.O. Box 742, Havertown, Penn. 19083. We do not know the price, so a gift would be in order.

DR. E. STANLEY JONES DEAD AT 89

.. "The Rev. E. Stanley Jones, a United Methodist missionary from Baltimore who served in India for more than 60 years , died yesterday in Barilly, India. He was 89." AP. S.F. Chronicle Jan, 26, 1973 .

.. In "Christ of the Round Table", he states on pg. 257: "If a verbal infallibility is insisted upon, then the certainty is very presarious: for of the twelve hundred manuscripts at our disposal no two are verbally alike and differing translations add to the insecurity."

.. In "A Song of Accents", Dr. Jones states on Page 377: "We do not believe that the New Testament is the revelation of God--that would be the Word become printer's ink." On pages 148-149 he states : "I had to go outside my native land to make a major discovery--the discovery of the Kingdom of God. I found it, of all places, in Russia."

.. In "The Choice Before Us", he states on pages 133-134: "The fact is, as someone has said, 'Communism is the only political theory that really hold that holds the Christian position of the absolute equality of every individual.'"

.. Dr. Graham Introbuuced Dr, Jones at his Los Angeles Crusade. Dr. Roland Rasmussen, speaking before 4,000 at BJUniversity on Feb. 15, 1966 related this incident of the 1963 L.A. Crusade: "The first Sunday afternoon of the crusade, before ten thousand people, Billy Graham spent ten minutes euologizing a man he called his great friend and advisor. He said to this great throng of people after this long eulogy of near ten mintues, 'I now introduce to you my good friend and my trusted adviser, Dr. E. Stanley Jones.'"

.. Birds of a Feather Flock Together.. Recently in Collingswood, New Jersey, portions of the outlandish "Today's English Version were distributed house to house as a part of the Key 73 program." Accompanying the 166-page paperback book was a flier which included the names of the Old Orchard United Methodist Church, St. Bartholomen's Episcopal Church, St. Thomas More's Roman Catholic Church, St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church, and Cherry Hill Alliance Church (Christian and Missionary Alliance). The flier explains that 'Key 73" is a cop-opeative, nation-wide effort of Protestant denominations, Roman Cath. dioceses, and Christian groups.



NEW LAKESHORE BAPTIST CHURCH OF LUCERNE

BJU DEALT ANOTHER GOVERNMENT BLOW

We are pleased to learn the news that the newly formed Lakeshore Baptist Church of Lucerne, Calif. has voted to apply for affiliation in the Association of Fundamental Baptist Churches of Northern California. The group opened its Charter Membership on Feb. 1, 1973 and expects to have it remain open for 60 days. They have called a veteran missionary to give them leadership in the immediate future, Rev. Allan Crane. They began services in the Lucerne elementary school auditorium about a month ago, with about 40 in attendance. This group represents a large separation from the First Baptist Church in Lucerne, which was affiliated with the American Baptist Convention. These folks had wanted to disaffiliate from the National Council of Churches, and had asked the Convention for their deed. When this was denied by the ABC group, almost the entire membership withdrew to form a new body. This development is a matter of considerable interest to the Lucerne Christian Conference Center since this new church is in the same community. Let us pray for this company of believers.

The Nixon Administration has been on an aggressive attack against the World's largest Fundamental university in an endeavor to take away their tax exemption. A couple months ago a federal judge granted an injunction to Bob Jones University preventing the Internal Revenue Service from taking away this tax exemption until the matter was settled in the courts on its merits. The Government took this to a higher court and have won a decision against B.J.U., by a 2 to 1 vote of the three appellate judges, which was handed down on January 19, 1973. Bob Jones University contends that this violates their Right to Religious Freedom - to operate a private school according to their own religious convictions. The University issued this statement: "If Bob Jones University could be discriminated against because of its religious convictions, then every church in the country stands in danger of having its religious freedoms curtailed. There is too much at stake here for us to let the matter drop. We intend to continue to pursue our fight for religious freedom all the way to the Supreme Court if necessary." Dr. Bob Jones, Chancellor, wrote Dr. Weniger, a trustee: "I want to point out to you that this institution has suffered more persecution, harassment, and discrimination under the first administration of President Nixon than we faced under the avowed 'liberals' who preceded Nixon -- Roosevelt, Truman, Kennedy, and even Lyndon Johnson." Pray for B.J.U.



..The Blessed John NewMann Shrine, prominent Roman Catholic church in Philadelphia, carried a large ad in the Evening Bulletin for Jan. 6, 1973 for Sunday, Jan 7, 1973. Four important lines in the advertisement: "3:00 P.M. FEAST DAY SOLEMN MASS. Launch Sunday- '73; Pontifical Mass with Choir, Carols, & Orchestra; 2:00 P.M. Inaugural: Worldwide Rosary Action." The photocopy of the ad is on the back page of the new folder "Key 73-Blessing or Peril for the Church" by Dr. Horace F. Dean, P. O. Box 600, Havertown, Pa. 19083.

.."Key 73 Is Not Biblical Evangelism" According to Dr. Donald McKnight who submitted the resolution in evangelism adopted by the Bible Believing Methodists today in Springfield (Missouri). These Methodists oppose Key 73 because they say that it is bringing together Bible churches with apostate liberal churches in an ungodly alliance which violates the Law of God in the name of evangelism. The AABEM goes on record with the General Association of Regular Baptists, the American Council of Christian Churches, the Bible Protestant Church and other Bible groups which are stanning Key 73 as being a threat to the Bible-believing Church." (Christian News Feb. 12, 1973).

..The Liberal Idea Of Evangelism...The American Baptist for Feb. 1973 had this paragraph on "Evangelism and Key 73"

"Tim Norris is a third year student at the Seminary of the West's Berkeley campus. He may have a special interest in Key 73 because his home pastor is Dr. L. Howard McBain of Phoenix, national chairman for the ABC, USA...He defined evangelism as 'the freedom to serve others in love' and emphasized that it involves faith and justice and has both individual and social implications...Genuine evangelism is best understood as a life style- 'the whole way you approach life and people.' The Catholic Voice for February 15, 1973 carried this as a headline to a major front-page story in which Roman Catholic Floyd L. Begin threw the entire weight of the Oakland Diocese behind Key 73. The Bishop writes: "As Catholics, we Bishops, preests, religious, parents, men, women, and children are invited to draw closer to our Blessed Lord by the faithful practice of our Catholic religion. We are invited to encourage a simultaneous effort among our non-Catholic Christian brethren to return to the full practice of their faith and regular attendance at the church to which they belong. We are invited, as well, to inspire our Jewish brothers to a faithful observance of the Divine law which was given to them first by God."

..Bishop Floyd Begin continues: "Some Catholic parished in the country are functioning 'separately' in this project, some 'silultaneously' with their non-Catholic neighbors: some are functioning in a copperative plan with those of other faiths. All or any of these methods are acceptable and approved."..May our Blessed Lord who dwells permanently in so many tabernacles throughout this diocese. bless and encourage each individual, team and group as it participates in calling the North American contitnet to Christ." Comment: The Bishop hopes Key 73 will not make better Catholics but better Jews as well. The Bishop, when speaking about the Lord Dwelling in tabernacles in this diocese, is speaking about the Real Presence of Christ in the wafer in the little boxes in the various buildings. The New Testament explicitly teaches that Christ is at the Right Hand of God in His body and spiritually present in the hearts of individual believers here below.

OVERWHELMING CATHOLIC JOY IN KEY 73

Roman Catholic Archbishop Byrne of the Dubuque, Iowa Archdiocese announced to his people: "It is with profound gratitude to God that I inform you that my co-workers the priests of the Archdiocese, have overwhelmingly voted for official participation of the Archdiocese of Dubuque in Key 73, calling our Continent to Christ. I overwhelmingly approve of this participation. My joy over participation in Key 73 is that it offers the opportunity for the laity of the Archdiocese to exercise the priestly character of their Christian birthright as witnesses to Jesus Christ and His Gospel. While the laity have been increasingly involved in the decision-making process of the Archdiocese through the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council, Parish Councils and the Archdiocesan School Board, Key 73 marks another and significant step: Their involvement in decision-making and implementation of the primary goal of the Christian community, evangelization... 'Let all Christ's faithful remember that the more purely we strive to live according to the Gospel, the more they are fostering and even practicing Christian unity. This change of heart and holiness of life, along with public and private prayer for the unity of Christians, should be regarded as the soul of the whole ecumenical movement, and can rightly be called spiritual Ecumenicism' (Decree on Ecumenism No. 7). May our present Marian year be the instrument for bringing forth the rebirth of Jesus Christ in our hearts during Key 73 even as Mary gave birth to the person of Jesus in the flesh!" (The Gospel Witness, February 8, 1973 in a remarkable article by Wilson Erwin of Quebec, entitled "Key 73 and Its Wafer God").

A NOTED NEW EVANGELICAL ON KEY 73

..The Father of New Evangelicalism, by his own admission, is Dr. Harold John Ockenga of Gordon-Conwell Seminary and College of Wenham, Massachusetts. "The Gordon" for January-February 1973 had an editorial on Key 73, by the noted president.

NEW EVANGELICALISM HONORS A LIBERAL

The official paper from Gordon College of Wenham, Massachusetts is "The Gordon", which featured in its January - February 1973 issue a picture and two-column story of the recent visit of a noted radical liberal theologian, Attorney William Stringfellow, prominent Episcopalian. Dr. Harold John Ockenga, first President of the NAE and admitted "father" of New Evangelicalism, is the president of Gordon who honored the Episcopalian. The Reader's Digest for October 1971 quoted Mr. Stringfellow: "According to the gospels, Jesus was not a non-conformist, not just a protester. He was a criminal revolutionary." One of the best-known books of this Episcopalian lay theologian is entitled "Instead of Death" (Seabury Press). An example of his ideas of sin is found on page 9: "For one thing, death is not the consequence of either evil or sin, nor is death some punishment for evil or sin. Nor is there any such thing as objective evil, that is, some knowledge or idea or principle of evil which men can learn or discover or discern and then, by their own will, do evil or good. If men knew or could know what is good and what is evil in that sense, then they would be like God himself." Mr. Stringfellow's moral views come through on this paragraph on page 30: "On the other hand, if two unmarried adults in good health, with sensible precautions, in the privacy of a home, by mutual consent, spend a night together, the consequences of such an encounter that can be foreseen are so personal and private, pertain so exclusively to the two involved, that society's interest in their conduct should not be asserted to invade their privacy or to censor or curtail their conduct or - least of all - to judge or punish it." It is easy to discern from this his attitude toward the Holy Scriptures.

The film will be shown in the mornings and again at the evening hour. Tickets are \$2 for adult at both day and evening showings with youth at \$1 for the morning showing. Everyone must pay \$2 for the evening. Every Christian should see this stirring film with its tremendous evangelistic witness. It was produced by Bob Jones University. We parents should take the children.

..A Church Nominating Committee will be elected by the Advisory Board consisting of all officers, board members, and committee chairmen of the Church on Wednesday, March 14, 1973. This seven-man group will then develop a nominating slate for all officers to be laid before the Church the following month.

..Two Pastorates Become Vacant.. We learned that Pastor Tim Sherman has resigned at Lakewood Baptist Church of Sunnyvale to move to Colorado. Likewise David Drullinger has resigned as Pastor at Galvary Baptist in Pleasanton.

Missionary Miss Sharon Clark, having served two terms in Uruguay under the Baptist World Mission will return to this country from Oct. 21 to Nov. 4, 1973. She has been invited to speak at the State-wide ladies retreat Oct. 25-27. Her Schedule will be under Dr. Roy H. Austin.

..Evangelical Teaches at Notre Dame...

Most people realize that the University of Notre Dame is one of the world's leading Roman Catholic institutions. Three recent appointments to this Catholic faculty include a pagan, a liberal, and a New Evangelical. A promotional folder just received listed them: "(1) J.B. Rishi, director of the International Yoga Center in Paris, giving a lecture-demonstration on Yoga as a way toward religious experience; (2) Robert Wood Lynn, dean of the Auburn program at Union Theological Seminary speaking on trends in Protestant religious education; and (3) Harold Barnes Kuhn of Asbury Theological Seminary who spoke on the topic of a theology of adult education."

..Johnny Cash's New Hollywood Movie.. This week is the big premiere in Atlanta of Johnny Cash's new picture by 20th Century Fox entitled "The Gospel Road". The Atlanta "North Side News" for February 15, 1973 states that this theatre showing is "under the sponsorship of the Christian Council of Metropolitan Atlanta... Proceeds from all these events will go to the community projects of the Christian Council... Johnny Cash and his talented wife, June Carter, will make personal appearances at both premiere showings... 'Gospel Road' is a full-length production (90 minutes) recreating the life and ministry of Jesus Christ." This is the liberal council of churches sponsoring the film.

..Fuller Professor at Bangkok World Council of Churches meeting.. Dr. Marion Reynolds states, after returning from the Far East WCC meeting which closed January 12, 1973 reported 326 participants from 69 countries, including 16 Roman Catholics and several Communists and other revolutionaries who made no profession of Christianity. "Dr. Arthur Glasser of Fuller Seminary was not only a voting delegate, but one of the 'Reflectors' who wrote summary reports of the section meetings. Glasser has completely sold out to the ecumenicists. It was sickening to see him voting with the Communist delegates against upholding the one true gospel and a free America".

..The Disgrace of Long Hair on Men.. We could not believe what we were seeing when we received the Winter 1973 Bulletin of a CBA Seminary with the picture of the president with long hair, long sideburns, and a beard. In his editorial on "Absoluteizing the Relatives" he undertook to level critical remarks at certain Fundamentalists - "and that is the practice of making absolute, eternal principles out of relative, culturally-conditioned practices." He might consider I Corinthians 11:14, "Doth not even nature itself teach you that, if a man have long hair, it is a shame unto him."

..This is the New Liberal Evangelism.. World Vision Magazine for February 1973 had this note from Bombay, India - "A Roman Catholic bishop here recently advised Christians not to be evangelistically-minded, that the 'days of making conversions in India were over'. He suggested that Christians strive instead to become better Hindus, Buddhists better Buddhists."

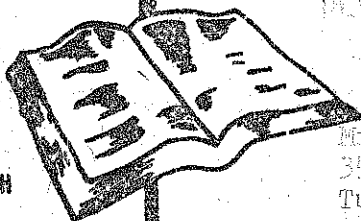

PEARL BUCK, NOTED MISSIONARY, DIES

The 80 year old daughter of Chinese missionaries, who wrote 85 books and won both the Pulitzer and Nobel prizes, died on March 6, 1973 in Vermont and was buried in Pennsylvania. "There was no religious service and no minister, just a brief eulogy centering on Miss Buck's impact on world literature in nearly a half-century of writing." according to the Oakland Tribune of March 10, 1973. The press accounts gave no hint of the fact that she, as a missionary herself, was the storm center of Presbyterian missions in the twenties and was in great part the reason for the huge Presbyterian modernist-fundamentalist split led by the noted Dr. J. Gresham Machen. She had no use for preaching of the Gospel. Ned Stonehouse's biography of Dr. Machen quotes Pearl Buck on page 473: "But above all, let the spread of the spirit of Christ be rather by mode of life than preaching. I am weary unto death with this incessant preaching. It deadens all thought, it confuses all issues, it is producing in our Chinese church a horde of hypocrites and in our theological seminaries a body of Chinese ministers which makes one despair for the future." Her remarks concerning Dr. Machen, her arch-opponent were contained in an article in the New Republic of January 20, 1937: "I admired Dr. Machen very much while I disagreed with him at every point. And we had much the same fate. I was kicked out the back door of the church and he was kicked out the front one. He retaliated by establishing a church of his own . . . One might say death was merciful to him, except I have an idea he enjoyed his wars. The man was admirable. He never gave in one inch to anyone." In Harper's magazine for January 1933 and in the Cosmopolitan magazine for May 1933 she wrote articles in which she expressed serious doubt about Christ's existence, but still confessed that she was enamored of the concept of the life of Christ.

..Roman Catholic Bishop Floyd Begin issued a letter to be read at all masses in the diocese: "Wednesday, March 7, is Ash Wednesday. It inaugurates the holy season of Lent. Christians of the North American continent, responding to the invitation of Key 73, are trying to draw this continent closer to Christ. We in the Diocese of Oakland are participating in this worthwhile program. This lent should be used as an extraordinary opportunity to draw closer to God and His Son." (Catholic Voice, March 1, 1973).

..Christian and Missionary Alliance..The Alliance Witness editor wrote a letter to an eastern inquirer in February: "The 'perplexity' you refer to is due to misinformation. DEVELOPING NEWS OF KEY '73

..The Northern California Ecumenical Council, in the March 1973 "Church at Work" has an editorial by Lynn E. Hodges: "Although Key 73 is largely a Protestant evangelistic crusade, over 40 Catholic dioceses are participating...The flexible procedures and the non-creedal stance of the Crusade are not designed for proselytism. They are designed to encourage the kind of faith and obedience to God that Jews as well as Christians should approve. Hopefully, this will be the end result of the Crusade."

..The Leading Modernist Church in the USA is Riverside Church, New York, made famous by Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick. Dr. Ernest T. Campbell, minister, stated: "Key 73 represents a glittering opportunity for Christians in this country to come to terms with the comprehensiveness of the Gospel. It could well provide the occasion for the closing of ranks and the beginning of a rousing effort to call this nation to unprecedented heights of faith and obedience." (Church at Work, March, 1973).

..Catholic Couple to Join 73 Campaign." A Roman Catholic husband and wife team, Mary Eunice and Joseph Spagnola, will join in the Key 73 campaigns by presenting their programs before a greater number of churches, schools, shrines and monasteries. The couple, who founded Mary productions here in 1947 to distribute royalty-free plays directed to 'the message of Mary', gave an average of three programs per month in 1972..." (Baptist Bible Tribune, February 2, 1973).

..A Sobering Conclusion is Drawn on Key 73 by Dr. Robert P. Lightner in the Baptist Bulletin for March 1973 when he states that Key 73 is "the greatest boost ever given to the goal of the liberal ecumenists" and that Key 73 is "a monstrous milestone toward the one-church goal of ecumenists." He says: "Bible-believing Christians should not cooperate in the Key 73 program because: (1) It will help advance the liberal ecumenical cause; (2) it will encourage those who do not believe in the Christ of Scripture and His Gospel to win more people to their persuasion; and (3) it encourages all participants to do their own thing in their own way and this contradicts the clear command of Scripture to preach the one gospel of Christ."

"Key 73 Compromise and Confusion" is the title of a small 16-page booklet just published by Dr. Jack Wyrzten, director of the far-flung Word of Life Fellowship operations on five continents, with headquarters at Schroon Lake, New York 12870. Copies are available from the author.

..Dr. Loyd T. Anderson of West Covina is reported to have been the speaker at a Key 73 rally in Orange County on Sunday, March 11, 1973 with a Roman Catholic Choir supplying the music, according to a prominent minister in Southern California. Dr. Anderson, a trustee of the CBA Seminary in Denver, is the Bible teacher on the BIOLA Hour.

..Dr. Jack Wyrzten of New York writes in his new booklet on Key 73: "Do you wonder why I say we cannot cooperate with Key 73? We had better heed God's warning as recorded in Amos 3:3, 'Can two walk together, except they be agreed?' It is never right to do wrong in order that good may come of it. God's prophet asked King Jehoshaphat when he was caught in compromise, 'Shouldest thou help the ungodly, and love them that hate the Lord?' (II Chronicles 19:2)."

..A Noted Seminary President was Quoted in Dr. Jack Wyrzten's booklet denouncing Key 73, in which he said: "My personal criticism is simply first of all, it includes all branches of Christendom without respect to their theology, and secondly, they are explicit that each person can preach the Gospel according to his own convictions. The true and false gospel will both be published under the same auspices. I do not see how anyone can defend this from the Scriptures."

..Los Angeles Catholics Join Key 73.. "The Los Angeles Diocese of the Roman Catholic Church has officially joined Key 73. Representing about 1,800,000 Catholics, Archbishop Timothy Manning significantly reminded his people that 'our participation in this joint undertaking will take place within the framework and context of our own Catholic teachings and traditions.' He also called upon Catholics to 'make more frequent use of the sacraments.' Confusion is the inevitable result of failing to practice Biblical separation." F.E.A. News and Views, January - February 1973.

But he still looks on the rest of the church as a lifeless structure...Ultimately the Catholic Pentecostals expect that their renewal will become so widespread that it will become part of the church itself"...

..Tongues and a New Social Order...The article in the Sunday Chronicle and Examiner for February 15, 1973 had this revealing paragraph: "The community is also encouraging members to form common households in which two or more families live as one. 'We feel the Spirit is calling us to a new social order, much more in accord with the Gospel,' says Kortenkamp." The paper said: "Leon Kortenkamp is an art teacher at Notre Dame high school in Belmont and a recently chosen leader of the charismatic community."

..The General Director of the N.A.E., Dr. Clyde W. Taylor, used to write this way in June 1959 (Christian Heritage, P. 12)- "Outside Protestantism, the greatest threat to religious freedom in America comes from the Roman Catholic Hierarchy." The N.A.E. has had Roman Catholics on their program the past two annual sessions, as we recall.

..What is Syncretism in Religion? This is the uniting of various systems of religion on the basis of tenets common to all. Dr. Clyde W. Taylor states: "These disciples of syncretism are busily tearing down the walls that separate the various faiths. Many would like to see one religion incorporating the followers of Christ, Moses and the Pope by simply minimizing or overruling the differences. The net result is a lifeless, messageless Protestantism, which considers the 'protest' a cardinal sin. It seems to forget that our Lord found it necessary to protest against the errors of the Pharisees, and that Paul protested forcefully when Judaistic legalism threatened the New Testament Church. It also forgets the protests of the reformers against the enshrinement of religious externals to the loss of personal faith in Christ." (Christian Heritage, June 1959).

..Ecumenical Evangelistic Crusade Results on society and crime. The Atlanta Constitution for March 5, 1973 in a big picture and article stretching across the entire front page stated, in a friendly vein, getting ready for the next big crusade: "Crime reports from other cities where Graham held recent Crusades, however, don't always reflect Cousins' optimism. Major crimes in Birmingham rose steadily while Graham was in town and for at least six months following his crusade. In Charlotte, North Carolina, where he preached last April, crime rose while he was in town and also the following month. During his Dallas crusade of 1971, crime dropped the month he was in town, but went right back up after he left."

KEY '73 A TOTAL FLOP IN PORTLAND

The Hinson Memorial Baptist Church of Portland, previously noted as a strong Fundamentalist voice, carried the following announcement in their Sunday Bulletin for March 11, 1973: "Sen. Mark Hatfield will be the speaker at the Key '73 banquet in the Grand Ballroom at the Hilton Hotel on Friday, March 16 at 8:00 P.M. Tickets are \$6.00. Call 234-5017 for reservations." Dr. Herbert E. Anderson, former general director of the CBMS is the pastor of Hinson Church. Sources in Oregon have informed us that the lady in charge "said she was told that Hinson would buy 1,000 tickets!! She confessed that she has not been apprised about Key 73...She had planned for 1500...(Hinson people did not buy one ticket). She had put out 'an awful lot of publicity'." Sources in the area indicated: "It was canceled for lack of response. She said she was through with supporting Key 73. She had entered wholeheartedly into it because of Billy Graham, and also Senator Hatfield, and thought it would be a great spiritual evening as Mark would inform the people of what was going on."

"IS CHRIST IN THE HEATHEN RELIGIONS"

The Liberal Christian Century for April 4, 1973 had a major article by a Hindu turned Catholic by the name of Robert Moffitt. His final paragraph: "We Christians are now faced, it appears to me, with the problem of determining whether we are to continue looking on the non-Christian religions as 'preparations' leading to an eventual embracing of Christianity by their followers or whether we are to agree that Christ, in some way sufficient to non-Christians, is already manifesting himself in their religions. We must decide whether, for all except those who are temperamentally fitted to become professing Christians, Christ's revelation of himself beyond the church is somehow already suited to non-Christians of sincere faith, so that we need not impose on them our own specific 'myths' and dogmas, or whether the fullness of the riches of Christ can be enjoyed only through the Judeo-Christian revelation. If we find it in ourselves to overcome, in Bishop Khodr's phrase, 'our subtle spiritual imperialism' we shall have passed beyond confrontation to communion in the Spirit." Believers in the Biblical revelation should study this carefully to understand the present subtle nature of the apostasy.

AMOUNTING CONCERN ABOUT KEY 73

..Catholic Father Anthony Harcar..The Catholic Voice for March 15, 1973 carried a big article on "Where is Key 73 Around the Diocese". He said: "These past few weeks have been interesting and challenging for me. I have been meeting with Christians of all faiths in trying to make Key 73 a reality. Cooperation among the different groups is encouraging...Perhaps the second most important part of Key 73 is the Home Visitation. In his recent pastoral letter on Key 73, (Voice, Feb. 1) Bishop Begin has encouraged home visitation throughout our diocese. This can be done in cooperation with other Christian groups as well...Lent is with us!! Phase II continues throughout this penitential season. Now is the time to do something! Key 73 is NOW!!!"

..Dr. Sherwood E. Wirt of Decision magazine, had an editorial in April 1973 issue carrying an enthusiastic endorsement of Key 73. Some quotes: "A quick survey of what is taking place in the churches of North America today will give one answer: Beyond all doubt, God is blessing Key 73. The New York Times calls it 'the biggest evangelical campaign ever undertaken ecumenically'...With three-fourths of the year to go, Key 73 is now gaining momentum...One of the encouraging aspects of Key 73 has been the response of the mass media...Dr. Raddeke says that Key 73 'promises to be the greatest thing that has happened to the church in our generation'. Has Key 73 touched your town? Or your church? Or you?"

..More Catholic Participation..The Catholic Voice for April 5, 1973: "St. David's parish, Richmond, is cooperating with the First Baptist and Arlington Methodist Church in the home visitation program of Key 73. In an effort to make people of the community more conscious of Christ, volunteers from the three churches will visit every home in the area leaving a copy of the Gospel of Luke and a pamphlet listing all the churches in the area and the hours of their services."

After celebrating peace Masses in war-torn Biafra, within the Pentagon and during the turmoil at Grant Park, Chicago, Bishop Crowther was dubbed 'bishop to the unarmed forces'." He spoke at Westmont Chapel the first week of February, 1973.

THE CULTURAL MANDATE AND THE W.C.C.

Eternity Magazine for April 1973 carried an interview with Fuller Seminary professor Dr. Arthur Glasser concerning the recent World Council of Churches conference at Bangkok where Dr. Glasser was a voting delegate. The interview showed Dr. Glasser's complete commitment to the Cultural Mandate. He stated that the Bangkok conference placed a great emphasis upon the Cultural Mandate. "Petersen: What do you mean by that? Glasser: Well, in Scripture there are two mandates; the evangelistic mandate and the cultural mandate. Salvation really has implications for both. According to the cultural mandate, God desires to involve men in accepting responsibility for the world. He is concerned about the poor, the oppressed, the weak. He is concerned about government, injustice, oppression and so on. At Bangkok, this cultural mandate was central, rather than the evangelistic mandate. Petersen: Do you believe in a cultural mandate? Glasser: I certainly do. If the whole Bible is the Word of God, obviously there is a place for the Old Testament prophet as well as the New Testament evangelist...As an evangelical I cannot stand against what the Bible says about my responsibility in relation to government, to racism, and so forth. Just as the World Council has forgotten the evangelistic mandate, so evangelicals have often forgotten the cultural mandate. The Bible says we are to be the salt in the earth. This isn't modernism; it's the Word of God. We are to let Jesus Christ save us from being captured by the status quo, from being selfish, from participating in those societal activities that dehumanize others." THE THOROUGH-GOING ECUMENISM OF KEY 73

The Baptist Bible Tribune Editorial by Dr. Noel Smith (4-6-73) on Key 73 carries a punch: "Like the variety of chemicals that pollute the river, many varieties of religion are a part of this campaign-from Roman Catholicism with its denial of the Bible as the sole rule of faith and practice, its baptismal regeneration, and its practical worship of Mary to Pentecostalism with the jabbering it calls tongues...The fanatical effort of this campaign to force light and darkness and truth and falsehood into a common fellowship, is reflected in the 'Church Growth Bibliography' in the back of the resource Book... Now these anti-Christian books standing by themselves are books that Christian leaders should be familiar with. But in this official Key 73 Resource Book they don't stand by themselves. They are recommended as basic and important study for the success of the Key 73 campaign... And what is that essential goal? It is to bring into a common fellowship all the religions of Canada and the United States calling themselves evangelical... But all of this does not modify the fundamental and decisive truth; namely, that Christianity unity and common Christian effort must rest upon a doctrinal foundation, not upon a foundation of emotion, not upon a foundation of praise-worthy desire... But the real reason is, we don't have the compassion for men that the Holy Spirit has for them. If we did, we would be jealous for the pure Gospel, for that is the only thing that will save them. If we did, we would have the same attitude toward those who deny or pervert the Gospel that the Holy Spirit has. And because a perverted Gospel or 'another Gospel', means the damnation of men for whom Christ died... Paul couldn't preach the pure Gospel without waging war against those who either denied it or perverted it. Key 73 claims it can do what Paul couldn't do."

Stanley Jones under the caption: "Drenched With Christ". Dr. Rees: "In the late 20's a misguided fundamentalist attempt was made to put upon Dr. Jones the brand of 'modernist'. No one could make it stick. If a man can be a heretic who confesses the deity of our Lord, the redeeming efficacy of His cross and blood, the actuality of His resurrection, the person and power of the Holy Spirit, and the inspired uniqueness of the Holy Scriptures, then Stanley Jones was a heretic. One of my friends, who had been prejudiced against him, went to hear him speak. He told me that, one by one Dr. Jones unconsciously demolished the false images that my friend had been carrying around with him. He said to me: 'When Jones began, I was cold; when he finished, I was in tears.'"

..'Stanley Jones Was a Man of Prayer. In his 'The Christ of Every Road' he spoke very personally: 'I find myself better or worse as I pray more or less. It works with almost mathematical precision.' For years on New Year's Day he and a small group of kindred spirits-Frank Laubach, Elton Trueblood, Sam Shoemaker, Walter Judd, and others-met in Washington for a day of prayer on behalf of the United States of America and the world." (Paul S. Rees, World Vision, April 1973).

..An Ecumenical Marital Combination..The Lenten Profile in the Oakland Tribune for April 1, 1973 had a big picture of the bearded young pastor of Laurel Methodist Church in Oakland. The husband is the pastor, while his wife is a Roman Catholic. "Since their marriage, Mrs. Tillinghast says she wants to be active in her husband's ministry, while at the same time retaining her Catholic roots. She worships regularly at St. Elizabeth's Catholic Church...Having a Catholic and a Methodist in the same household poses no problems, Mrs. Tillinghast said..."

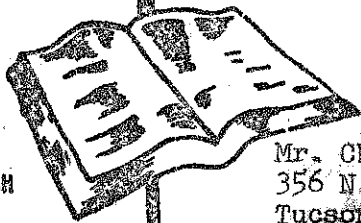
..Bethel Promotes A.C.L.U. The official Baptist General Conference (Swedish) paper is "The Standard". In the issue of November 15, 1972 they had an article by Bethel College professor Dwight Jessup, associate professor of political science. .. "The Son of God" - What Does It Mean? Christian friends in New Zealand sent us a clipping from the Auckland Star for April 21, 1973 containing an article by the noted Presbyterian Seminary scholar, Lloyd Geering. He wrote about Paul Tillich: "He said that if it turns out that the questioner intends the phrase in some literalistic sense (such as one which implies a divine supernatural being), then the application of the title to Jesus must be rejected as a bit of superstition. He declared that much harm has been done in Christianity by such a literalistic understanding of the term."

..Dr. Geering Quotes Pannenberg, the noted German scholar: "But initially, as Pannenberg remarks, 'the title Son of God did not originally signify physical sonship, nor did it mark Jesus out as a divine, supernatural being'. It was only when Christianity entered the Graeco-Roman world of ideas that the title came to imply a superhuman or divine being."

..The Deception of Modern Liberalism... "Those who want to affirm the unique importance of Jesus as a man, but who have difficulties in ascribing divinity to Him, may still legitimately apply to Him the title 'Son of God', if this is intended metaphorically. Indeed, they may be even closer to the intentions of the primitive Gospel than is the classical Christian doctrine."

..New Orleans Holds A Key 73 Parade..5,000 people marched through the downtown business district, according to a RNS dispatch from New Orleans, in the Christian News for April 23, 1973. "At the conclusion of the parade, which was held to publicize Key 73, the continent-wide cooperative evangelistic effort, 1,500 of the marchers jammed the historic St. Louis Catholic Cathedral for a one hour service at which Archbishop Philip M. Hannan and Dr. David E. Mason, Head of the Greater New Orleans Federation of Churches spoke..."

..Roman Catholic Archbishop Hannan addressed the big Key 73 rally at the New Orleans Cathedral, according to Christian News for April 23, 1973: "In gathering together for the Key 73 march and worship service, he said, marchers were 'asking Jesus to prepare us to accept his strength. We know that He gives us that power if we place no hindrance to it. He can literally transform us by His presence, and in transforming us, we transform society.'"

CBA SEMINARY PRESIDENT ON PROPHECY

The liberal Christian Century for May 2, 1973 quoted Dr. Vernon Grounds of the CBA Seminary in Denver, in connection with his address at the New Evangelicalist conference "In Search of a Theology of Politics". The Century said: "Vernon Grounds president of the Conservative Baptist Seminary dealt with the influence of evangelical eschatology on the social attitudes of evangelicals. Wryly admitting that for most of his audience (who largely ignore the 'biblical prophecy' debates of past evangelism) he was probably 'flogging a dead horse', Grounds argued that biblical prophecies concerning the future must be seen as contingent on human action. Citing the biblical examples of King Hezekiah and the City of Nineveh, he contended that repentance on the part of individuals and nations in response to prophetic warnings can forstall or cancel predicted events: 'The fulfillment of prophecy is neither automatic nor unconditional.'" Dr. Grounds views will clash violently with those who hold that the predicted events of the prophetic future are sure and can be believed. Are we to conclude under Dr. Ground's views - maybe there will no be a Rapture, a Tribulation, a Judgment on the Nations, a Personal Return, the establishment of the Millennium, the Great White Throne Judgment, etc. etc. Such views can be expected from the Post-Tribulationists, from the Amillennialists, from the Cultural Mandate crowd who set-up this conference.

GRAHAM GAVE LIVING BIBLE BIG START

The Living Bible has now sold over seven million copies, was given the big boost by Dr. Billy Graham which helped to rocket it to fame and big sales. An interview in Eternity magazine for April 1973 with Living Bible author Ken Taylor has this paragraph: "Eternity: Didn't Billy Graham get into the picture somewhere along the line? Taylor: Yes, in the spring of 1963 he was confined to a hospital in Hawaii for a while and someone must have given him a copy of Living Letters. He became interested in the possibility of using it to give away on their telecasts. His first printing was 50,000 copies, but they had such a good response that eventually they gave away about half-a-million copies. INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES

..This News Is Utterly Fantastic..Fuller Theological Seminary, a New Evangelicalistic graduate school started with Fundamentalists dollars, is led by a Tongues exponent Dr. David Hubbard. Sitting on the Board are such men as Ray Stedman and Billy Graham. Now listen: "Roman Catholic Cardinal Timothy Manning was the Speaker at Fuller Theological Seminary Convocation on March 29, 1973. The manner in which Fuller Seminary continues to schedule speakers representing almost every brand of religious heresy and political radicalism is a clear indication that it no longer deserves to be called an evangelical school." (FEA. News and Views, March-April 1973).

..New Evangelical Political Convention at Grand Rapids' Calvin College featured such speakers as David Moberg from Roman Catholic Marquette University, Rep. John Anderson of the Evangelical Free Church, Dr. Vernon Grounds, Fuller professor Lewis Smedes, and others. It was organized by Carl F.H. Henry's son, Paul Henry, a professor at the Reformed Church college. Richard J. Mouw gave an extensive report of the conference in the liberal Christian Century for May 2, 1973.

..New Evangelicals and Violence..The Christian Century of May 2, 1973 reported on "Fuller Seminary Professor Lewis Smedes' call for evangelicals to identify with the needs of 'the poor and the oppressed'. Smedes dealt at length with the 'as-a-last-resort' justification of the use of violence. While not proposing a full-blown pacifism, he suggested that violence must be kept 'in the shadows' of Christian decision-making: 'The Christian community must make peaceful revolution possible lest we make violent revolution necessary.'"

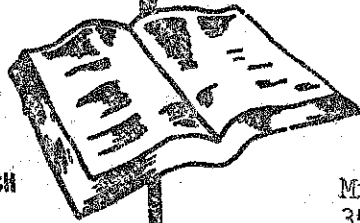

RECENT EVENTS IN NEW EVANGELICALISM

..What the Black Student Want..Graham evangelist Howard Jones stated: "It is a fact that many Christian schools discourage any socializing between blacks and whites. Why? Because the college alumni feel this would lead to inter-racial dating and interracial marriage. Frankly, this is the crux of the whole issue...A policy of segregation in any form on the campus is wrong scripturally...More Christian schools must drop their racist policies." (Voice, April 1971)

..Neo-Lettist Describes the Revolution.. Tom Skinner, the highly capable black evangelist who is being endorsed strongly by new-evangelicalists across the country stated that Jesus "wanted to change the system". He said, "Keep in mind it was never questioned as to whether you were going to have a revolution. You are going to have a revolution...It is a matter of what kind of revolution and who is going to lead it. And the thing I say to you as black students, the black revolution is inevitable. You can't stop it. And there is no sense in your becoming brainwashed by the white, evangelical subculture into going out and trying to preach the gospel in the black community for the purpose of stopping the revolution." (BJU Voice, April 1971)

GRAHAM ENDORSES ORAL ROBERTS UNIVERSITY

"The Black Student at the Christian College" was the title of a conference held some time ago at the Quincy Nazarene College, which was addressed by several black evangelists. One was Ralph Bell of the Billy Graham team. He said, "One day down in Knoxville, Tennessee, I was in conversation with Billy Graham and he asked me what evangelical school I would recommend for a black friend of his whom he wanted to help through Bible School, College and Seminary. I told him that frankly I would not send him to any Christian institution, but rather to a secular one. I felt that when he experienced racism on the secular campus, he would cope with it, and expect it and understand it because he was coming from an unredeemed community. But if he should encounter the same racism on a Christian campus, it could very well destroy him, and cause him to abandon his faith forever. He agreed. And then he went on to tell me about one school where the students were experiencing freedom socially with no static or opposition. That school was Oral Roberts University. The parents are told that there are no rules or restrictions on that campus that bar minority young people from dating white young people or anybody that they please..." (The Alumni magazine called "Voice", April 1971).

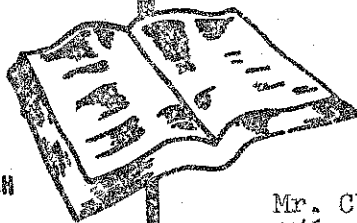

The official Key 73 Congregational Resource Book recommends as one of the suggested authors for further insight, the famous Australian Methodist, Dr. Alan Walker. In a rather strange article entitled "I Believe in the Holy Spirit", in the Pulpit magazine for June 1961, Dr. Alan Walker states: "Standing at the heart of the Christian faith is the doctrine of the Trinity. It declares that God is known to us as Father, Son and Holy Spirit... Let me say, in passing, that the doctrine of the Trinity is not an explanation of what God is; it is simply the statement of a fact. It is a minimum definition of the nature and function of God. Rising out of human experience has come the conviction that whatever else God is, he is not less than Creator and Father, the Sustainer of the universe. God at one point in time did come in Jesus Christ, breaking into history, dwelling among us. The doctrine of the Trinity also declares a belief in the Holy Spirit, which is simply the conviction that God is in action today. When a Christian says, 'I believe in the Holy Spirit', he is really saying, 'I believe that God is no absent being but one who is at work in human hearts and in the human scene today'. But how is God at work today?... Take, for example, the affairs of our own time. Sometimes we look upon the chaos and turmoil of our own century and are afraid. Yet great advances are being recorded in the conscience of mankind at this very time... All these developments represent a great advance in human understanding and conviction... Why have these convictions grown? Because the Spirit of God has been at work, leading us to new truth. Sometimes we call movements communist, or by some other name of condemnation, when perhaps we would be nearer to the truth if we looked in them for the God who is ever preparing mankind to go forward to a better day."

..The Pastor of the World's Largest Sunday School, Dr. Jack Hyles, will be the speaker at Lucerne the forepart of the Maranatha Baptist College week - July 30 to August 4. Recently, on Sunday, May 20, Dr. Hyles had over 12,400 present. 600 made professions of faith. 193 were baptized. 6,000 came in on the buses. 3,000 were at morning service at Hammond, Indiana, First Baptist Church.

In fact, counting cigarettes versus Bibles produced, at times, some stunning statistics in favor of the former". Page 18.

..Long Hair on the Males.."Hair grown by men delegates to women's length was not at all uncommon. In fact, long hair was characteristic of a large portion of the male delegates."

..The Skimp Dress on the Women.."The only modest thing about much of the women's clothing at Explo was the very small amount of material used to fabricate each outfit. The braless look, being promoted by Women's Lib, definitely infiltrated Explo. It was not uncommon to see a handkerchief as the top covering with short shorts or man's levis as the bottom compliment. What the Bible calls indecent, Explo delegates would describe as 'cultural relativity'. Bare the maximum was the unwritten dress code." Page 29

..Rock Music Star Kris Kristofferson participated on the program. Quoting from the Dallas Times Herald, June 18, 1972, Page B-9: "Kristofferson, who friends said was very nervous by his appearance, told the 150,000 fans: 'Probably the only reason I'm here is this song. Larry wrote it and he's going to help me sing it. I heard it in church, probably the only time I had been in Church in 30 years.'" Page 37. There's plenty more.

DEVELOPMENTS ON THE ECUMENICAL SCENE

..The Chairman of the Korean Crusade featuring Dr. Billy Graham was Dr. Kyung G. K. Han, head of the World Council of Churches in Korea. He is the outstanding ecumenical leader in all Korea, according to Rev. Sang Chan Lee, now in the graduate school of Bob Jones University. The largest denominational grouping in Korea, the Hapdong Presbyterian Church, with over 2,000 churches, refused to participate in this ecumenical crusade which closed last Sunday.

..The World Council of Churches recent conference at Bangkok on "Salvation Today", was criticized by Dr. Peter Bayerhaus from University of Tübingen; as quoted in Christianity Today for March 30, 1973: "Maoism was presented several times as an acceptable alternative to Christianity. This became evident when on the China evening the stress was not upon how the Gospel could be reintroduced to China but upon what the cultural revolution in China meant to our understanding of Salvation Today."

..Billy Graham Advises A Roman Catholic.. The Word of Truth magazine for Spring 1973 carried a news story from the Sun Telegram for Jan. 6, 1973, with this question for Dr. Graham: "As a Roman Catholic, my wife and I were shocked when St. Christopher was discredited. We find that many of the old confidences are being shaken in the church today. Where will it all stop? G.B. Answer: "The Bible presents the church as a dynamic force that moves on toward ultimate perfection. ...Your church is going through turbulence which both lay and clergy forces are bringing about. Such re-examination is never easy, but historically, we know good can come from it...Above all, don't pull out of the church! Stay in, stay close to the Lord, and use these experiences as an opportunity to help your church be what God intends and what the world needs." This is something new, but logical in Dr. Graham's counsel.

..Behind Much of the Moral Filth Today.. At a Conference of Socialist Scholars in New York a few years ago, the leftwing San Diego professor, Dr. Herbert Marcuse, was alleged to have said, according to the Presbyterian Journal of Dec. 18, 1968: "The Marxian idea of Socialism is not radical enough. We must develop the moral-sexual rebellion of the youth."



DEVELOPMENTS AT LUCERNE ON CLEAR LAKE

..The San Francisco Examiner for June 10, 1972 had a feature article on Page A with large picture, of the fight to combat pollution at Clear Lake because of phosphates and nitrates from septic tanks, agricultural drainage from fertilizers, timbering and forest fire ashes. It stated: "The sheer physical beauty of Clear Lake, as you catch your first glimpse of it from the crest of the Mayacomas Mountains on a clear Spring morning is almost guaranteed to take your breath away." Drastic measures are being taken to clear away the algae. It said "One day you can see 18-inch bass, six feet down in crystal clear water. The next day the same spot will be covered by fist-sized globs of algae."

WHILE THE PIOUS WATERGATE INVESTIGATION CONTINUES, WHAT ABOUT SOME OTHER CRIMES?

A Certain man by the name of George F. Mc Nutt wrote a letter to the Editor of the Oakland Tribune, which was published on June 21, 1973. After dealing with Jeb Magruder, who learned his ethics from his former teacher and leftwing minister, William Sloane Coffin, he stated the formula for the anti-war movement: If I believe the cause is right, then it's okay to use any means, however illegal, to achieve it. Here is the Paragraph: "But what of the other side of the coin? When anti-war demonstrators broke into draft board offices and public buildings, burned and destroyed property at Berkeley, Columbia, Kent, Santa Barbara, cut fire hoses and assaulted firemen and policemen - all criminal acts; when Coffin, former Attorney General Clark, Jane Fonda, the Berrigan brothers, et al, journeyed to Hanoi - an illegal, war-prolonging act, did liberal politicians, professors, and news media call for Senate investigations into the crimes and also indictments for arson, inciting to riots, property damage, assault, etc? Did the media dig into whence came the funds to fly, support, and provide legal counsel for those who committed these acts? No, they demanded the police be punished for brutality.

THIS IS THE LIBERAL IDEA OF APOSTASY

Dr. Jitsuo Morikawa, liberal evangelism official of the American Baptist convention, brought an address on April 17, 1972 at New Orleans for the Key 73 National Training Conference. He said, "Key '73 is the occasion to repent of the awful apostasy of the church whoring after other gods than the God of our Fathers, gods in image of General Motors and Wall Street, Cape Canaveral and the Pentagon, - Key '73 can be the occasion for evangelism, for an evangelistic lifestyle which reexamines with radical reassessment the meaning of Christian conversion, through a radical exposure to biblical insight-group therapy replaced Bible study groups, transients replacing transcendents, conversion to ends and values which may in fact reject and repudiate our cultural values as unqualified good - and the adoption of values which are redeeming, saving, liberating and humanizing."

THESE ARE THE TIMES IN WHICH WE LIVE

..The Colorful Ministry of Bob Shuler in the heart of Los Angeles was brought to mind with the big story in the Los Angeles Herald-Examiner for June 23, 1973 of the closing of the huge Trinity Methodist Church, and its merger with the Wilshire United Methodist Church. Dr. Bob Shuler, a friend of our Pastor in days gone by, was the minister there from 1920 to 1953. "During his ministry he was thrown in jail, almost won a U.S. Senate seat and has his radio station closed down by the government." The paper stated: "He pulled in a surprising 600,000 votes but was defeated by William Gibbs McAdoo, the Democratic nominee." Trinity Church had 5000 members under Dr. Shuler, but it is now down to 400.

..The Tragedy of Trinity Methodist Church was not that the old structure will be pulled down for a high rise office building, but that it will be merged with a liberal Methodist church. It is the judgment of careful Fundamentalist observers that Dr. Shuler lost his powerful influence when he failed to separate his church from an apostate Methodist machine and lead a large group of men into a position of Biblical separation. He was a valient warrior, an eloquent speaker, a stirring leader and historically one of the great preachers in American history. His son, Phil - an evangelist, follows in his train. 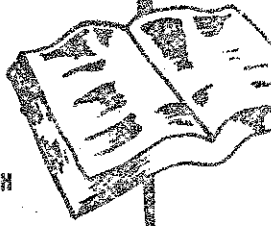

THE REACTION OF ONE ATLANTA NEWSPAPER

The Northside News of June 28, 1973 had this editorial on the very recent Atlanta Crusade at the Braves Stadium: "Why did the Reverend William Graham's sermons not draw crowds as expected? The lack was caused by his desperate effort to woo Negroes. Another reason was because of the hog-wash statement that Christ Jesus was not a white man. The Bible says that Jesus was of the House of David, and for Mr. Graham to say that a descendant of David was not white is not only ridiculous, but, according to the Bible, the statement might well be called an infamous and sacrilegious falsehood. But Atlanta's Negroes evidently, by and large, didn't care to be wooed. After all, they preferably felt that the sermons of Dr. Borders, and other brilliant pastors of Negro churches, were good enough for any Christian. Also, they probably felt that the tired, throaty and worn voice of Beverly Shea is not so good as half a dozen of the singers in the Morehouse college choir. But if Mr. Graham's sermons touched the soul of even one unrepentant sinner and causes him to walk in the light of His Word, the "crusade" was well worth while. Mr. Graham said that this will be his last crusade in Atlanta. I hope his not coming again will be no great spiritual loss. But it could be. However, I believe Atlanta could bring about a deeper spiritual awakening with another preacher who would cost them less in money and publicity. It seems to me that we could have picked any one of Atlanta's half dozen most forceful preachers and by giving them half as much ballyhoo as we gave Mr. Graham, and none of Mr. Shea's un-resonant and fog-hornish singing, and no shouting that Jesus Christ wasn't a white man, many more hearers would be guided along the narrow path of righteous living than were so influenced by the Rev. William Graham.

INTERESTING OBSERVATION OF FUNDAMENTALISTS

Dr. Elmer L. Towns, in Christianity Today for July 6, 1973 had this paragraph: "Fundamentalism is divided into two camps, reflecting two areas of emphasis. First, there are 'withdrawing fundamentalists', exemplified by the No. Bible church movement, which refused to cooperate with apostasy. (They might also be called 'militant fundamentalists'.) This group is often accused of 'button-holing' prospective converts or proselytizing believers from other churches. The 'withdrawing fundamentalists' believe in second-degree separation from liberalism (rejecting those who have fellowship with liberals). The two camps are similar.

.."Trends Among Fundamentalists" is the title of an article by Dr. Elmer Towns, Sunday School staffer of Christian Life magazine, which appeared in Christianity Today for July 6, 1973: He observed:

"Most fundamentalists are not the aggressive fighters of liberalism found in the past; they have learned that little progress is made through winning debates or 'showing up' the modernists. Most fundamentalists channel their 'aggressions' into an organized work, knowing that the greatest blow against liberalism is to win its lost church member to Christ and to get them into a Bible-believing church. Today's fundamentalists understand the dynamics that make them strong."

..Fundamentalism is Attacked This Way by Dr. Carl F. H. Henry, originator of Key 73, in United Evangelical Action, July 16, 1966, Pg. 303 - "Fundamentalism is considered a summary term for theological pugnaciousness, ecumenic disruptiveness, also unprogressiveness, scientific obliviousness, and/or anti-intellectual inexcusableness. By others, fundamentalism is equated with extreme dispensationalism, accepted emotionalism, social withdrawal, and bawdy church music." Psalm 1 warns against taking counsel with the ungodly for he is certain to end up sitting in the seat of the scornful.

..Missionary Aviation Fellowship, a New Evangelicalist mission group, has two missionaries, Mr. and Mrs. Paul Lewis, tongues advocates, now on loan to Evangelism-in-Depth in Brazil. A recent prayer letter from the Lewises: "Paul was invited to attend a 'Prayer Workshop' in Goiania. It was in English and held in a convent; about 55 attended. It was difficult to believe this was a Catholic gathering. The speaker was a priest from Ann Arbor, Michigan; the theme was 'Jesus Christ is Lord'. By the third night spiritual experiences were becoming a reality. The last meeting was impressive - a monk asked Paul to pray with him for unity in the Body of Christ."

..Bob Jones University has Spent nearly \$4,000,000 on the new amphitheater, a huge structure seating 7,500 people for chapel services, Bible conferences, graduation exercises. It is expected to be finished by the Fall. They need \$1,680,017.30 in gifts from God's people over present gifts to meet this cost. BJU will spend \$1½ million this summer on improvements on the dorms and other projects.

..The Snow Mountain Wilderness Area.. Two California congressmen are sponsoring legislation setting apart a 37,000 acre section of the Mendocino National Forest in the Snow Mt. area as a "wilderness area". The Oakland Tribune of July 2, 1973 said: "The Snow Mountain region is the last remaining potential wilderness area in that part of California." Snow Mountain is the highest peak in Lake Co. just north of Lucerne.

It was a truly ecumenical and community experience as a full church of Catholics, Methodists, Presbyterians, Baptists and friends from all over the Archdiocese came to pray together, sing God's praises and launch a Christian crusade to bring the 'Good News' of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, to all the 'People of God' dwelling in our North Philadelphia Community."

The program: "Johnny Cash, Judy Collins, Cissy Farenthold, Barbara Jordan, Ramon Roubideaux, Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen and Tom Skinner are among those scheduled to address, sing for or 'rap' with young people."

..The Church of the Open Door Pastor in L.A. is Dr. Maloomb Cronk who joined the number of New Evangelicals, charismatics, liberals, Jesus people in a big Key 73 youth rally at the L.A. coliseum on June 23. The big personality at the Rally is the world famous tongues advocate, Pat Boone, according to L.A. Times of June 16, 1973.

ABC MINISTER EXPOSES HIS LIBERALISM

The Christian News for July 9, 1973 has a full-column review of the latest book from Dr. Cecil G. Osborne entitled "You're in Charge" (Word Books) which reveals some amazing theology of which many of his friends were not aware. Dr. Osborne founder and director of Yokefellows, Inc. and pastor of First Baptist Church of Burlingame for 34 years, is a close associate of Dr. Elton Trueblood. This advocate of group therapy and sensitivity training writes: "I have become grossly irritated by hymns which affirm man's 'vile condition'. I refuse to sing the phrase in the hymn which tells us that Jesus died 'for such a worm as I'. There are days, or at least moments, when I do feel pretty 'wormlike', but at a deeper level I am still aware of the awesome fact that spiritually I am made in God's image - that the deathless part of each human consists of the same divine essence as God." Dr. Osborne further states: "God loves that portion of himself in ME, as in every human being. He has no other choice, for that is his nature. Thus man is a god, whether he knows it or not. He was put in charge of this planet, and more important, placed in charge of an inner kingdom over which he has exclusive control. He is the king of that inner kingdom. He has 'made us kings and priests'. (Page 8). Dr. Osborne claims that "It is not the literal blood of Jesus which 'cleanses us from all unrighteousness', but what the blood represents - the limitless, redeeming, unbelievable love of God revealed in Jesus Christ, the Son of God." (Page 21). He claims that "Christ did not tell his hearers that they must believe any set of doctrines." (Page 29). He insists that "I am a god encapsulated in a temple called a human body." (Page 34). After mentioning some pagan religions, he suggests that "Each seeker must find his own way. Only the intolerant and bigoted today claims that theirs is the one true faith, that their church is the custodian of all revealed truth." (Page 80). This appears to be simply the deification of man. It was Christ Himself and the New Testament which makes Christ the only and utterly exclusive way to God. John 14:6, Acts 4:12, Matthew 11:27,28, and Acts 10:43.

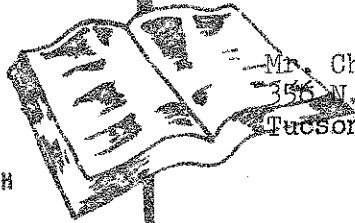

KATHRYN KUHLMAN VISITS THE POPE

The noted healing evangelist and Pentecostal tongues advocate of Pittsburgh, who claims to be a Baptist and who holds her meetings regularly in a Presbyterian Church gave a seven-page interview in Christianity Today for July 20, 1973. "Q. What was said between you? A. It was a beautiful experience. I had received word that if I were ever in Rome I was to send word where I was staying. I did, and an invitation came to the hotel. It could not have happened perhaps even five years ago. I'm Protestant. I am a woman minister. But we were just two human beings. The same purpose. Both love humanity, both wanting to help humanity. As I was announced and came walking toward him, he reached both hands out to me, and then when I came very near he took both of my hands in his hands and looked me directly in the face and said, 'You are doing admirable work'. He repeated the words. I thanked him. I told him I was trying to do the work of our Lord, too. He said he wanted me to know I had his constant prayers and his blessing. The day has come that we need to forget a lot of the differences that are dividing us. If you are a Roman Catholic and born again, cleansed by the blood of Christ, then you are my brother or sister in the Lord."

A POW FACES A GRIM FUTURE IN PRISON CAMP

Capt. Howard Rutledge tells what it is like in a POW prison camp for seven years in North Vietnam in his book "In the Presence of Mine Enemies" (Revell). "During those long years of enforced reflection, it became so much easier to separate the important from the trivial, the worthless from the waste. For example, in the past I usually worked or played hard on Sundays and had no time for church. For years Phyllis encouraged me to join the family at church. She never nagged or scolded - she just kept hoping. But I was too busy and too preoccupied, to spend one or two short hours a week thinking about the really important things... Now the sights and sounds and smells of death were all around me. My hunger for spiritual food soon outdid my hunger for a steak. Now I wanted to know about that part of me that will never die. Now I wanted to talk about God and Christ and the church, but in Heartbreak solitary confinement there was no pastor, no Sunday school teacher, no Bible, no hymnbook, no community of believers to guide and sustain me. I had completely neglected the spiritual dimension of my life. It took prison to show me how empty life is without God, and so I had to go back in my memory to those Sunday school days in the Nogales Avenue Baptist Church, Tulsa, Oklahoma. If I couldn't have a Bible and hymnbook, I would try to rebuild them in my mind. I tried desperately to recall snatches of Scripture, sermons, the gospel choruses from childhood, and the hymns we sang in church."

INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES

..Pentecostal Collaboration With Rome..The Catholic Voice for July 2, 1973 reported: "Dr. Rodman Williams, President of Melodyland School of Theology and a leader in the current Charismatic renewal, is in Europe to participate in five major Charismatic conferences. In Rome, Dr. Williams is a delegate at the Vatican for the second dialogue session between the Roman Catholic Church and the world-wide Pentecostal movement. Co-chairmen for the conference are Dr. David DuPlessis, a well-known Pentecostal leader, and father Kilian McDonnell, director of the Ecumenical Institute of Collegeville, Minnesota." Dr. DuPlessis is from Oakland.

..Situation Ethics Comes Home to roost... "Jeb Magruder was asked by members of the Senate Investigating Committee to explain his motives for committing perjury before the Grand Jury and during the trial. He explained that he believed he was operating in accordance with the prevailing moral mood. Members of the academy whom he respected such as the Rev. William Sloane Coffin, Jr. of Yale, who had taught him ethics, were themselves breaking the law and advising others to break the law in the name of the so-called 'higher good'...He made his decisions in accordance with 'situation ethics' advocated by so many theologians and educators." Dr. Fred C. Schwarz.

..A New Leftwing Professor was named for San Jose State University, with the appointment of identified Communist Jessica Mitford to become "Distinguished Professor of Sociology". She is the wife of Oakland attorney Robert Truehaft, an identified Communist lawyer, listed in the U.S. Government document "Communist Legal Subversion" as one of the 38 attorneys of the Communist Party elite. He drew an amazing number of votes when he ran for district attorney a few years ago.

..The Utter Hypocrisy of the Press..was noted by Dr. Fred C. Schwarz in his Crusade Bulletin for July 1, 1973: "If it is wrong for the government to secure information by burglary and bugging, it is also wrong for the press, which exercises as much power as the government in many areas. MORAL VIEWS OF WESTMONT SPEAKER

"THE CHRISTIAN WORLD OF C.S. LEWIS"

Westmont College honored the noted left-wing Episcopalian priest, Malcom Boyd with an appearance on their campus, according to the Santa Barbara News-Press of Nov. 20, 1971. He was to appear on November 23, 1971. More recently, the magazine "The Living Church" for April 8, 1973 carried a story of the unorthodox views on morality by this priest. He said: "I think it has been very necessary for the 'gay' movement to develop since both it and the women's liberation movement stem from the civil rights movement." He maintained that the church "has been far too cruel" in matters of sexual behavior and cited cases in which homosexuals and lesbians have been refused permission to worship in church buildings. He scored censorship of pornographic books and movies. He said he had seen a number of "porno" films and declared, "For myself, to be very honest about it, I find that virtually nothing of a sexual nature shocks me." He said that hard-core "porno" films have value. Westmont began as a fundamentalist institution but steadily drifted into a New Evangelicalist position with standards of morality, theology and separation far removed from Bible-believing Fundamentalists.

This is the title of a book by Clyde S. Kilby, professor at Wheaton College, a noted New Evangelical institution. C. S. Lewis is one of the favorite writers of the New Evangelicalists. This book was reviewed by a Reformed pastor in New Jersey in the Presbyterian Journal for Dec. 9, 1964. In that article the reviewer stated: "Lewis did not accept all the positions of his - toric conservative Christendom such as total depravity, inspiration, and the Genesis account of creation. Yet this should not cause us to listen to him. His works stand out above any others in our day in their appeal to the doubter or skeptic. They will also do much to strengthen our faith." It appears clear to us that if one does not accept total depravity, inspiration, and the Genesis account that he is a modernist without any question. Modernism begins in a rejection of any or all the Book. By this definition, and by this admission of this author, C. S. Lewis is a modernist. As such, his works must be very critically examined and instead of being benevolently endorsed and recommended. This is so often true of modernists writings which are sometimes evangelically attractive. The Apostle Paul states in I Cor. 5:6 (also in Gal. 5:9) - "Know ye not that a little leaven leaveneth the whole lump." It doesn't take much unbelief to completely destroy the usefulness of a man's philosophy or theology. Jesus taught us in Matthew 7:18, "A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit."

CBFMS GENERAL DIRECTOR ANNOUNCED AS TEAMED UP WITH CATHOLIC MONSIGNOR

The NEWS of the St. Paul Area Council of Churches of August 1, 1973 carried the startling news as follows: "MINNESOTA SCHOOL OF MISSIONS ANNOUNCEMENT. The 67th Annual Session will be held September 25 and 26, 1973 at the Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, 700 Snelling Avenue South at Highland Parkway...The topics for the School this year are 'Why Christian Mission? What Can We Do About Our Father's Business? What Can We Do To Express Ways To Understanding?' Guests will include: Dr. Dorris Flesner, Professor of Missions at Northwestern Lutheran Seminary. Monsignor Francis J. Gilligan, Director for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. Dr. Robert Thomas, Executive, Overseas Missions of the Christian Church. Dr. Warren Webster, General Secretary of the Conservative Baptist Foreign Mission Board." Dr. Webster is a graduate of Fuller Seminary. We presume that this entire operation is a project of the Council of Churches. A large host of Fundamental churches across the nation withdrew from the affiliation with the CBA - CBFMS - CBFMS during the years of 1965-68 because the CBFMS had fallen under total and complete control of the supporters of New Evangelicalism.

ALONG THE NEW EVANGELICAL FRONT

..Dr. Vernon Grounds and Egocentric Pietism..In the Berkeley hippie paper: "Right On", Dr. Grounds states: "There's always this danger latent in the Christian Faith. OAKLAND MINISTER BRINGS TONGUES TO ROME

The Catholic Voice for August 22, 1973 reported the recent second Lutheran International Conference on the Holy Spirit. "At the closing session of the unofficial conference, Dr. David du Plessis, a 68 year-old world Pentecostal leader from Oakland, California told of a vision of a positive future for the movement. He said that vision was received in 1936 by Smith Wiggelsworth, an English Pentecostal evangelist...Wiggelsworth warned me that I would have a great part in this new revival coming through the old-line denominations', he said. 'It so happened that in 1951 the Lord spoke to me to go to the heads of the World Council of Churches and I did so, expecting to be cold-shouldered. But to my surprise I was accepted and I was given opportunities to address World Council of Churches meetings from 1952 on...At first there was nothing to encourage me to believe that the Roman Catholic Church would recognize the Pentecostal blessing...Then, Pope John said before the Church could be renewed there would have to be a new Pentecost. Immediately all Catholicism began to give attention to the Pentecostal movement. It was my privilege to be the first to speak to them in Rome and to explain what it is all about. Today, it is generally known that Pentecostalism in the Roman Catholic Church is spreading faster than in any other Church.'...Dr. du Plessis reported that he had just been in Rome for the second session of the world-level dialogue going on between Roman Catholic and Pentecostal theologians. The 10 member Pentecostal team, which he heads, includes both neo-Pentecostals and classic Pentecostals, he said. The dialogue is scheduled to continue until 1976."

INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES

The Liberal Washington Post said this 19 years ago during the McCarthy investigations: "...it would be absurd to suppose that any congressional body could compel this testimony if the President should decide to forbid it...It is a settled principle, moreover, a principle enunciated by George Washington and adhered to uniformly by his successors in the presidency, that it is a matter of presidential discretion to determine whether it is in the public interest to give Congress executive documents which it may request. No useful purpose can be served in any case by a conflict on this issue." (Human Events, August 18, 1973).

..The Washington Post is Now Screaming for the President to turn over his tapes and documents to Sen. Ervin's Committee as they investigate government "morality". But the Post said in 1954: "The President's authority under the Constitution to withhold from Congress confidences, presidential information, the disclosure of which in his judgment would be incompatible with the public interest is altogether beyond question. His obligation to do it in vindication of the American constitutional system is clear."

..Cover-Up, Scandal, Perjury and Conspiracy were uncovered by Sen. Joseph McCarthy in 1954, but on May 17, 1954 the Washington Post commented that "if a congressional investigating committee could compel a presidential agent to reveal what went on at a Cabinet meeting, the constitutional separation of powers would be ended. Congress could then in effect have its delegates and spokesmen at every gathering of the presidential advisers.." It added that: "congressional committees have been increasingly tempted into lines of inquiry which are legally and morally none of their business. A limit had to be reached sometime. Maybe it has been reached."



LATEST ATTACK ON THE SON OF GOD

A Presbyterian minister by the name of Rev. Ewing Stevens, has sparked "one of the greatest controversies in the history of religion in New Zealand" with the July publication of his book "Jesus". He said on the Virgin Birth: "I detect in the wonder stories about his birth something of an apologia for the obviously well-known fact that Mary was Jesus' mother, but Joseph was not his father." Written mainly for teen-agers, the book states that the birth story material was the product of devout imagination. In reviewing the book by the paper "New Zealand Truth" for July 17, 1973, we find: "His interpretation is that Mary, 'the attractive 16-year-old, early-matured daughter of a peasant family', although betrothed to Joseph, became pregnant to a Roman soldier. Her village like all others in the region was under Roman domination, and it was not hard to believe that sometimes the soldiers took more than they were entitled to in the homes where they stayed." He indicates that Jesus decided to become a religious teacher when he attended one of John the Baptist's meetings. "Jesus was swept up in the emotion of what amounted to a mass revival meeting", according to the review. On the miracles: "Mr. Stevens believes the miracles attributed to Jesus are myths and dismisses them seriously as religious schizophrenics." On His healing we are told, "Jesus, in fact, practiced a type of psychosomatic medicine." The Man of Gadara was healed "in his 'group-therapy' sessions with his disciples." On His Deity: "Jesus was only the son of God inasmuch as everyone is a son of God, according to the author. When Jesus spoke of God as his father, he meant the father of man, not his personal father. Many remarks attributed to him in that respect were wrong. 'I do not believe Jesus was ever egocentric enough to say: I am the good shepherd, Mr. Stevens says.'" On the Resurrection: "The 'resurrection stories' are the mythological clothing around the explanations the various disciples put forward to amplify the basic belief and experience of Christ's spirit they share in common. He suggests that the appearance of Jesus before various people was a psychological, rather than a physical event. 'All the talk of Jesus being raised from the ground begs the question', says the (Cont. next Col.)

A SOUTHERN BAPTISM ORDINATION COUNCIL

The North Charleston BANNER of North Charleston, South Carolina for August 1, 1973 had an amazing front-page article about the ordination council for Roger Baxter Dobbins at the First Baptist Church of North Charleston, of which Paul Pridgen, Jr. is pastor. "What made it 'out of the ordinary' as far as a Baptist ordination was the composition of the 25 member examination council. Besides Bishop Ernest L. Unterkoefer of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Charleston, council members included two other priests, a black Baptist minister and several laywomen of the church. According to Pridgen, Dobbins... passed the examination with ease. Dobbins is currently a student at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary working toward a master of divinity degree... Furthermore, Bishop Unterkoefer is scheduled to participate in a special program of interfaith understanding this Sunday evening at the Rivers Avenue church. The Bishop will appear at 6:30 P.M. in a program of dialogue on the topic 'Catholic and Baptist Relations'. During the regular evening worship service the sermon will be brought by Bishop Unterkoefer."

When Jesus died on the cross, he really died, and his resurrection is to be understood in terms of his continuing influence in loving actions, strengthening, encouraging and inspiring every future generation, 'he says. And, he says, he thinks Jesus would be horrified to think that men would come in time to make him an object of worship!' On His Saviorhood: "He does not see Jesus as an easy way out. He is no cheap 'trip' for anyone. He cannot be used as a miracle-worker out of the past who will be a kind of a salesman to save us from facing life in the present with all its dangers and hard decisions." He then flatters the Savior this way: "Jesus Christ still speaks for every man who will listen. He is the greatest call to love that we have in our world today." The book is published by Logos House Division of Typesetting and Design, Ltd., Dunedin, New Zealand.

..An Eastern Seminary in Deep Water..Like many conservative institutions Biblical School of Theology in suburban Philadelphia is having a hard time with finances. Dr. Allan A. MacRae sent out a recent letter: "Faculty members and their families must eat in summer as well as winter. Salaries tend to fall behind during the summer. At present they are three months behind. No complaint has come from any faculty member. Many are tightening their belts and looking for means of earning extra money to pay expenses. Yet this is not a desirable situation. We are looking to the Lord to bring these salaries and expenses up to date and to provide the money that is necessary to carry on in full fashion." We sympathize with these problems.

..This Seminary Should Feel Good that they have a faculty which takes a wholesome attitude toward this situation. It is fortunate for them that the faculty did not take the Seminary into court, prefer charges against the Administration, demand that the state department of labor law enforcement bring the weight of the secular magistrates to bear to get their demands. They are favored indeed with a group of godly men on the faculty who did not encourage a rebellion among the students against the school, set up a separate treasury to which people were invited to send gifts for the dissidents, endeavor to destroy the confidence of the constituency in the school, and set up a climate favorable to a series of lawsuits against the Seminary.

..Catholic Profession of Communism...The RNS dispatch from Caracas stated: "The Communist Party of Venezuela has announced that several 'left-wing Roman Catholic priests will be listed as Communist Party candidates in next December's general elections...Recently, a Catholic priest, Father Martin Soto, who is pastor in an impoverished district of Caracas, announced he would run as a Communist candidate for city councilor in local Caracas elections." NO CULTURAL MANDATE AT BOB JONES U.

Though Bob Jones University presents one of the most cultural curriculums of any school in the nation and though it adheres strongly to the fulfillment of the Evangelistic mandate of the Great Commission, it evidently has no time for the so-called Cultural Mandate being taught in certain New Evangelicalist institutions today. Dr. Bob Jones, III, youthful President of BJU told the largest student body in the history of the school: "We have a Lord who has saved us out of the world and given us a command to reach the world with the Gospel...The mission of the Lord's earthly ministry was not to change the world's system or to deal with its problems of slavery, famine, tyranny, social injustice, war, poverty, or any of the other multitudinous problems which beset the world in his day and continue to trouble men today...Your education here will not consist of the world's silly, gradiose, and impractical schemes for making a better earth. Such efforts are doomed to failure; and if people would just take the time to read the Bible, they would realize that man is not going to set his world in order--that only the Lord Jesus Christ who changes man's heart by the soul's salvation He makes possible through His shed blood on Calvary, is the answer for the world's needs." 5,000 people were present in the auditorium and in several other buildings on the campus through closed-circuit TV to hear the opening address.

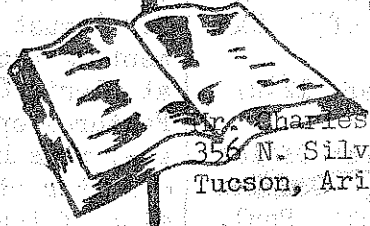



THE 1973 BOOK OF THE YEAR IS OUT

The first printing of the monumental book "A History of Fundamentalism in America" from the Bob Jones University Press. The author is Prof. George W. Dollar, BA, BD, MA, ThM, PhD, Litt.D.. The attractive jacket states: "This outstanding scholar brings to the Christian public Fundamentalism's first historical reference book—a full-length, factual study of this movement, charting it's faith, it's fights it's figures, it's failings, and it's future." This book is worth it's weight in gold. Many features make the book a invaluable writing, including the biographical index, with 100 pages of highly interesting and important brief biographies of leading figures, both friends, and the foes of the movement. The Glossary of terms will help the layman understand what goes on in the movement. The Selective Bibliography will be of enormous help to youthful candidates for the ministry. The book will stir a storm of controversy because of it's frank evaluations of the present scene. It endeavors to tear the mask off from those who make merchandise of an orthodox profession but who are selling out it's principles. It is exactly the antidote which is needed to correct the excessess of the hour. We are greatful to the author for dealing extensively with the dangers that threaten Fundamentalism. This is not just another book, but asolid reference volume which compels us to regard it as the Book of the Year. It has been made required reading in the Department of Practical Theology at the San Francisco Baptist Seminary in the course of Contemporary Christendom. We believe that this is one of the b-st commentaries we have today on the current movement of Neo-Evangelicalism. It sells for \$3.95 in paperback and \$6.95 in hardcover.

CATHOLICISM AND A COMMUNIST GOVERNMENT

For those wanting to know how Roman Catholicism will adjust to a Communist takeover, we reprint herewith some paragraphs from a remarkable article in the Catholic Voice for September 26, 73: "When Salvadore Allende Gossens became President of Chile in early November, 1970— the first freely elected Marxist President in the Western Hemisphere— he went to Santiago's Roman Catholic cathedral and received the blessing of the country's relious leaders. It was his first offical act. Inside the church, Cardinal Raul Silva Hendriquez of Santiago led representatives of 25 Christian Churches and a rabbi in an ecumenical service of thanksgiving. The ceremony ended with a collective blessing of President Allende and his Marxist government... Allende's downfall as chief of state of a predominately Roman Catholic nation was accomplished despite the correct, and even friendly, relations between the Freemason president and the Catholic Church." Dr. Allende told the Cardinal after being presented with the Jerusalem Bible: "Although you may not believe this, I have spent many hours of my life reading the Bible." The Catholic Voice continued: "The Chilean prelate, who has said said that he was under pressure to put out a statement declaring that Marxism and the Christianity are incompatible, has refused to issue any such statement. 'The best thing is to accept the good points of (socialism) and favor them and not to appear as an enemy,' he once said. The approach is to feel that we are working with (government) for the common good as long as it is the common good.' In another contex, Cardinal Henruiguez, while critical of both capitalism and socialism, remarked that 'in socialism there are more evangelical values than in capitalism.' Another member of the Chilean Roman Catholic hierarchy, Bishop Carlos Gonzales Cruchaga of Talca declared in a 1971 pastoral letter that Christians can justifiably participate in the construction of a socialist society in Chile. Christians, he said, should not fear socialism but help develop in a socialist society such Christian ideas as 'the dignity of men, the family, solidarity, participation, ar' equality.'... But most of the Catholic faithful of Chile seemed to show no signes of discomfort at the Churches accomodation with a Marxist government."

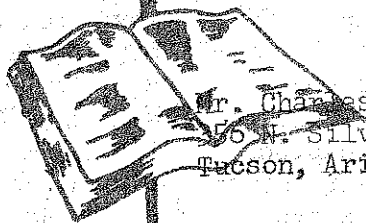

NOTED LIBERAL SCHOLAR DIES AT 89

The Christian Century of October 10, 1973 stated: "The distinguished British biblical scholar C. H. Dodd died at Oxford on September 22. Among his numerous achievements was the publication of the New English Bible, a monumental project of which he was the general director." "We can only hope that Dr. Dodds got right with God and repented of his higher critical sins before he died. In his book on "The Authority of the Bible", Dr. Dodds states unambiguously that "The Bible contains a great deal which, if it is taken out of a contemporary historical context and given general and permanent validity, is simply pernicious. The old dogmatic view of the Bible therefore is not only open to attack from the standpoint of science and historical criticism, but if taken seriously it becomes a danger to religion and public morals. A revision of this view is therefore an imperative necessity." His attitude toward the final book of the Bible - the Revelation, is seen in this statement from the same book on page 15 - "The most downright claims to infallibility are made by the apocalyptists, as for example, in the New Testament Revelation (see 22:6, 16, 18-19), a book which some of the early Church wished to exclude from the Canon, and which as a whole is sub-Christian in tone and outlook." Jesus stated in Matthew 7:18, "A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit." It would seem impossible for one with such an attitude toward the Bible to supervise a translation which would inspire any confidence. His attitude toward the sacrifice of Christ, which lies at the heart of the Gospel is seen in this statement in the same book, on page 215 - "For indeed the bare idea of vicarious expiation is not wholly rational, and easily lends itself to fanaticism. After all, if God demands the suffering of one in order that the sins of others may be forgiven, a meaning is found for suffering, but at the expense of the rationality of God for which the prophets contended so vigorously."

BLACK PANTHERS OPEN THEIR NEW CHURCH

DISPENSATIONALISTS TAKE A RAPPING

One of the most newsworthy developments of this year is the incredible announcement in the San Francisco Chronicle of October 22, 1973 (page 12) about the opening of the new Black Panther church-known as the Son of Man Temple in the former property of Calvary Temple of the Assembly of God in Oakland. "About 600 persons were on hand for the grand opening yesterday of the Black Panther party's big new interdenominational church and school center in Oakland. The operation will be called the Son of Man Temple and is housed in what used to be known as the Calvary Temple, 6118 East 14th Street...The church, housed on the ground floor of the three-story building will feature weekly sermons from clergymen of different denominations. Contributions from the congregation will help pay for various Panther programs, according to party chairman Bobby Seale. Seale, who said he was an ordained minister in the Universal Life Church, was the main speaker at a four-hour service yesterday." The Universal Life Church was founded by Vergil Hensley of Modesto who gave out honorary doctorates rather freely in the minds of legal authorities. The Black Panthers have been described by some elements as allegedly being a communist action group. They are giving strong emphasis to social action programs in their community.

The new book on "A History of Fundamentalism in America" by George W. It is absolutely essential for every pastor, church officer, and Christian leader to read this for better perspective. It will cause some heart-searching by all separatist groups, including the Regular Baptists, Baptist Bible Fellowship, IFCA, Fundamental Baptists, and independents. It is very revealing with respect to New Evangelicalist leaders and institutions. He raps the non-fundamentalist dispensationalist groups this way on page 210 - "Most dispensationalists are amazingly ignorant of what is happening in Bible schools, colleges, and seminaries, while they spend their time discussing intricately related events within the different periods of the Old Testament. While discernment of the signs of the times has become an academic playtoy, wrapped in theological verbiage, the dispensationalists look incredulously at Fundamentalists who are trying to alert them to the dangers of present conditions. It is strange phenomenon that militant Fundamentalists are barred from these middle-of-the-road schools while known middle-of-the-roaders and new-evangelical sympathizers are welcomed and praised. The hypocrisy of this compromise seems not to have dawned on the minds of supposedly thoughtful and sincere Christian leaders. They can afford to be friendly with all types and kinds except outspoken Fundamentalists." It should be remembered that practically all Fundamentalists are dispensationalists but not all dispensationalists would classify themselves as Fundamentalists.

..Dr. Jack Hyles Thundered In San Jose recently at the United Baptist Church, as he was expressing disapproval at the short length of women's skirts in Fundamental churches: "If you don't have anything for sale, you had better quit advertising." He said skirts for believers in Christ should be at the knees. We agree.

..The Pastor Spoke Twelve Times last week in connection with his recent trip to Evansville, Indiana, down on the Kentucky border, at the Dedication week of the Evansville Rescue Mission and Christian Center. This magnificent preaching center, featuring Bible conferences and evangelistic campaigns, is under the direction of Rev. George A. Blackmore, who has led in the construction of a beautiful million dollar building of attractive Indiana limestone. When Dr. Weniger brought the Dedication address on October 14, the auditorium was jammed with supporters, friends and civic leaders, including Mayor Lloyd and U.S. Congressman Roger Zion. It was an unforgettable experience.

..Sen. Hatfield At Ecumenical Meet..The most prominent Oregon CBA church member from Calvary Baptist of Salem, and the leading layman of New Evangelicalism identified himself strongly with the ecumenical movement. The Catholic Voice for October 17, 1973 - "Sen. Hatfield, a prominent Baptist layman, spoke at the fifth annual Iowa City Ecumenical celebration at the University of Iowa fieldhouse. He told a crowd estimated at 4500 that there is a crisis of purpose which 'tries the soul of the nation and tests the resilience of the republic'. To face the crisis is 'to come face to face with the reality of sin'."

..Striking At False Patriotism, Sen. Hatfield "said that the nation cannot continue to pretend 'that God has somehow chosen and blessed America as he did ancient Israel'....The Ecumenical Celebration was sponsored by the Ecumenical Consultation, and inter-religious group here, and 22 Protestant and Catholic churches in the Iowa City area."

..Vice-President Designate Ford of Grand Rapids has four children. One of them, Michael, 23, is a student at Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary in Massachusetts according to the Chicago Daily News for October 13-14, 1973, page 6. The admitted father of New Evangelicalism is the president of this Seminary, Dr. H. J. Ockenga.

..WCC President At Graham Crusade.. For the first time in the Graham ecumenical crusades, a president of the World Council of Churches was introduced from and spoke on the platform with the noted evangelist at Raleigh, N.C., Anglican Bishop Alphaeus Zulu of Zululand, South Africa's highest ranking black churchman and a president of the World Council of Churches "told the crowd at one evening program that South African Christians have been praying for the crusade ever since the evangelist was in that country in March." (The Christian News, October 15, 1973).

.. "Making Ecumenism Happen" is the title of an editorial in the Catholic Voice for October 17, 1973 by the Oakland Director of Key 73 for the Catholics, Father Anthony Harcar. He states: "Key 73, the great evangelical thrust for this current year, is an attempt to make people aware that the spread of the gospel is the work of all. Although strictly not ecumenical, it does focus our attention on the great work being done by many. Strong participation is being felt in areas like Richmond, North Oakland, Hayward, Fremont and East Contra Costa County."

..Tongues Leader Returns From Europe..The magazine "Melodyland in Motion" for August 1973 had an article by Dr. J. Rodman Williams, President of Melodyland School of Theology and Ecumenical Research Center. "First, there was the trip to Rome for the second dialogue between the vatican (its Secretariat for Promoting Christian Unity) and the world-wide Pentecostal/Charismatic movement. I went as a member of the team, headed by David DuPlessis, that each year spends a week discussing and studying with Roman Catholic officials and scholars the significance of this contemporary movement of the Holy Spirit. This year I was more impressed than ever with the growing openness of the Vatican to the Pentecostal reality breaking everywhere.

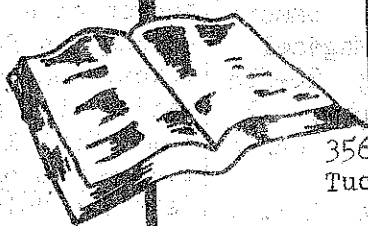

DISPENSATIONALISM HAS BEEN DISASTROUS

This is the conclusion of Dr. Stuart Crane, who recently resigned from the faculty of Bob Jones University where he served as Dean of the School of Business. He is now active in launching a "Christian Party" to operate in the political field. Because he believes that America is destined to dominate the world for the next two centuries, Dr. Crane believes that believers should throw themselves into the political arena and change society. In his recent booklet, "The Christian Party and the Other Religion", he raps dispensationalism hard: "The other branch was dispensationalism, which converted born-again Christians to the concept that we are only to be concerned about the eternal future and have no role in the present, that Christian activities should be limited to soul-saving; i.e., snatching brands from the fire. Their cliché became 'Don't polish brass on a sinking ship'. They cut the Bible up into dispensations, portions applied only to Old Testament time, other portions to the future kingdom age or the Millennium. They were able to reduce the Bible as did the liberals and only a few of the passages being relevant. They abandoned this world to Satan who was more powerful than the Holy Spirit. They turned their eyes to the Rapture and became concerned only with the future and abandoned the present. The results have been disastrous. As the schools have been lost, the state has been lost, their children have been lost, the families have been lost to eternal Hell. All this time, these Christians maintain that this collapse is inevitable anyway, rather than seeing their position as its greatest cause. The Church Militant has become the church complacent, drawn into spiritual monasteries of soul-winning Protestant cloisters." This sounds very much like a call to join the Cultural Mandate. We find it very painful to have to respectfully differ with this distinguished scholar. He is wrong in his understanding of dispensationalism, wrong in his conclusions concerning the influence of dispensationalism, and we humbly suggest that he is wrong in his understanding of Biblical prophecy. We do not see how his rosy picture of the future of America can be harmonized with the revealed program of divine judgment.

Mrs. Feinstein has served as chairman of the College's Board of Regents for the past year." (Catholic Voice, September 19, 1973). ..High Catholic Praise For Tongues... The Catholic Voice (9-19-73) reported: "Archbishop James Hayes of Halifax, N.D., called the charismatic movement 'a genuine renewal in the sense of Vatican II...it renews faith, love and dedication of Catholics in and for the church.' 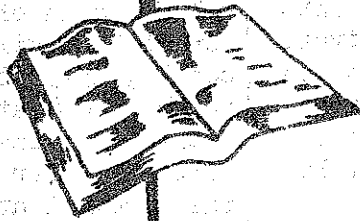

..The Editor of Present Truth magazine is a Seventh Day Adventist, we are informed by the noted scholar, Dr. Bolton Davidheiser. Two Present Truth leaders conducting seminars across the country on Neo-Pentecostalism, New-Romanism and Neo-Evangelicalism. On October 15 they were to address a Conservative Baptist Ministers Conference at the OBA church in The Dalles, Oregon from 3-5 P.M., according to their publicity folder. On October 17, they were to speak at Western Baptist Seminary in Portland. On October 18 they are at Western Baptist Bible College in Salem. On November 5 they are at Grace Bible Institute in Omaha. On November 9 at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, Deerfield, Illinois.

..Dr. Walter Martin At Tongues Center.... Christian Life magazine for September of 1973 announces that Dr. Walter R. Martin, author of "Kingdom of the Cults", will be one of the main guest speakers at the large Southern California Tongues center at Anaheim - Melodyland Dr. Martin was previously connected with Western Baptist Seminary in Portland. He will be remembered in the late fifties, associated with the late Donald Grey Barnhouse, in extending right hand of evangelical fellowship to the Seventh Day Adventists and welcoming them as brethren in Christ.

..We Believe Exactly Like This...Dr. Billy Graham wrote in Eternity Magazine, November 1958: "We ought to be separated from those who deny the deity of Christ. If a man blatantly denies the deity of Christ, or that Christ has come in the flesh, we are not even to bid him God speed...Thus the Scriptures teach that we are to be separated from those who deny the deity of the Lord Jesus Christ. INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES

..A Leftist Catholic Priest in Congress is trying to throw wide the doors of the USA and welcome all the Communist refugees of the Allende movement in Chile. The Survival Bulletin of the Christian Heritage Center of Louisville in their issue of October 18, 1973 states: "A bold move to open the United States to thousands of 'revolutionaries, Communists, Marxists and socialists' is under way on Congress. Leading the movement are Sen. Edward Kennedy (D - Mass.) chairman of the Senate Subcommittee on Refugees, and Rep. Robert F. Drinan, also of Massachusetts, a leftist Catholic priest. Rep. Drinan endangered the lives of two secret witnesses before the House of Internal Security Committee by revealing their identity to the press."

..One of the Biggest New Evangelical publishers is WORD Books of Waco, Texas. Their full-page Ad in the liberal Christian Century for October 31, 1973 featured four books on the leading neo-orthodox scholars of the past generation: Karl Barth; Rudolph Bultmann, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, and Charles Hartshorne. They said of Barth: "Karl Barth has earned an eternal place in the ranks of the great. Perhaps more than any other man he deserves the title of 'Father of the Modern Church.'" This might be true, if by the modern church one means the modernist church.

..The State of Israel Is Debating the idea of limiting Christianity by denying immigrant status to any Jews who have espoused the faith of the Messiah and become a believer in our Lord Jesus Christ. Not all Jews agree to this. Shlomo Hizak, Director of the Mount of Olives International Bible Center, stated after his center was attacked by arsonists: "A Jew can be a criminal Jew, an atheist Jew, a Communist Jew, and still be accepted. Why don't the people accept a Jew who believes in the Messiah?"

..Key 73 No Threat To The Jews.. "Far from posing any threat to the Jewish community, Key 73 has apparently failed to catch fire even among Christians, a prominent rabbi has suggested. Rabbi Harry Siegman, executive vice-president of the Synagogue Council of America, said many Christians he talked with had not heard of Key 73, while virtually every Jew knew about it. If Key 73 presents a challenge to the Jewish community, that would be good, he said, but it does not constitute a 'threat'."

..The Present Truth Magazine, which has appeared in the past year or two is edited by a Seventh Day Adventist. The Biblical Evangelist of September 1973 pointed out that the editor of Present Truth is Robert D. Brimsmead and he "admits he is a Seventh Day Adventist...We would like to go on record as not recommending Present Truth or the International Christian Forum which it sponsors."

..The Continuing Assault on the Person of Christ has turned up a new book by William E. Phipps entitled "The Sexuality of Jesus" by Harper and Row, available at \$5.95, according to a recent ad in the liberal Christian Century. One of the observable aspects of the ecumenical movement is its obsession with sex.

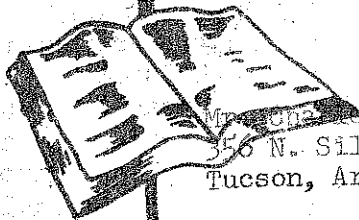

The Presbyterian Journal of November 7, 1973 said of this: "This Eminent Baptist preacher opened a singular evangelical ministry of the Gospel in the spring of 1861 as pastor of the historic Metropolitan Tabernacle in the city of London, and his labor was sustained by the Lord for 38 years." This book tells of the three great battles he fought in relation to Arminianism, baptismal regeneration and liberal ecclesiasticism.

..At the Episcopal Convention in Louisville, in October of 1973, a large room was set aside and called "Common Ground", where large pillows were strewn around on the floor for people to lie around on and talk - long-haired priests, barefooted nuns, hippies, in psychedelic dress, etc., ad nauseum." - according to pictures and eye-witnesses who were there. 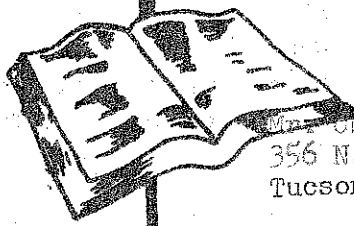

CHARISMATICS ARE HEADED FOR ROME

The tongues advocates have given the ecumenical movement a new thrust to the amazement of religious leaders around the world. The Catholic Voice for November 7, 1973 reported in a news story entitled - "Pope Encourages Charismatic Renewal". The article stated: "Some 126 leaders of the Catholic charismatic renewal met near Rome October 9-13 to assess the growth of the charismatic movement within the Catholic Church and were warmly encouraged by Pope Paul VI... Among those taking part were Leo Cardinal Suenens of Belgium, and Archbishop James Hayes of Halifax, Nova Scotia, and Bishop Joseph McKinney, the liason between the bishops of the United States and the Catholic charismatic prayer groups of that country... The rapid growth of the Catholic charismatic renewal (this year's conference at Notre Dame drew 22 thousand participants) is one of the extraordinary phenomena of the Roman Catholic Church today. This growth is reflected in the 32 countries represented, compared to some three or four countries which had Catholic charismatic prayer groups as recently as 1969. The unusual characteristic of the Catholic groups is that they have not, by and large, caused disunity and divisiveness, but have developed in harmony with ecclesiastical leadership, as evidenced by the desire of the prayer group leaders to hold their first international convention near Rome. As part of its audience, 11 leaders presented a statement to Pope Paul VI clarifying the movement's thrust... 'The charismatic renewal wishes to widen the expectations of the Church universal so that the full spectrum of gifts become real possibilities for the total life of the Church. In no way does the charismatic renewal wish to focus the Church's theological and pastoral attention on the more prophetic gifts. The renewal recognized the excessive attention to the gifts results in a basic distortion of the Gospel. The Spirit comes to visibility through the gifts for the upbuilding of the Church and the service of the world. They are not ends in themselves. But they contribute to that fullness of life in Christ and the Holy Spirit to which the Church is called.'

THE HEALING MINISTRY OF ORAL ROBERTS

Author Kurt Koch in his 1970 book "Occult Bondage and Deliverance" (Kregel, pp. 52-54) had these words: "I come now to a painful duty I have put off for many years. However, after a great deal of prayer, I feel I must fulfill the obligation which God has placed on me. In the autumn of 1966 together with about 2,000 other delegates, observers and staff members, I attended the World Congress on Evangelism in Berlin. Among the leaders of the various discussion groups was Oral Roberts, a man who had been publicly greeted by Billy Graham on the platform. As a fellow delegate, I wrote to the committee informing them of the fact that the healing ability of Oral Roberts was of a mediumistic rather than a charismatic nature. The letter caused a lot of anger among those who read it and the next day Billy Graham introduced Oral Roberts a second time to the great audience, putting his arms around his shoulder and addressing him by the name of brother. I have been troubled for some years now by this lack of discernment on the part of Billy Graham and his committee... However, on account of the immense amount of damage which is being caused by Oral Roberts in many areas of the world, I feel unable to remain silent any longer... Yet even great man can make mistakes. Not every person has all the gifts of the Holy Spirit. My prayer is therefore that in the light of the harmful activities of Oral Roberts, Billy Graham will be given a greater gift of discernment in these matters. To argue that Oral Roberts has founded a university, or has collected millions of dollars for the kingdom of heaven, is no proof he derived his healing ability from God... And so, after a great deal of prayer and after a number of unsuccessful attempts to warn both Billy Graham and his friends, am I forced to bring these things to the notice of the Christian public at large?"

Britain's top "Christian Rock Artist" who shared the Spree 73 platform with Dr. Billy Graham and Johnny Cash on September 1, 1973 at Wembley Stadium in London, stated in his new book - "The Way I See It Now" his attitude on drinking: "I think it is rather different in drinking - though that may be just because, where as I hate smoking, I do like an occasional glass of wine or something. But I think the difference is that drinking is a natural thing (that is everybody has to drink something), where as smoking is basically unnatural. After all, Jesus Christ drank alcoholic drinks, so if it was all right for the Son of God, I guess it's all right for me, too!" (Reprinted in Accent for October, 1973).

..Decision Magazine On "Spree-73". Editor Sherwood Wirt writes in Decision, November 1973 concerning the Spree-73 meetings at Earl's Court of London, the largest indoor stadium in Europe: "The euphoria created by the handclapping, singing, and the sounds coming from the platform is hard to describe. A dazzling array of Christian artists included Johnny Cash, Cliff Richards and Terry Dene. Thirty-eight members of a young Swedish musical group, Choralerna, took the nightly crowd by storm. Mr. Graham came with a Gospel message tailored to the theme of Spree-73 - 'Jesus is the King'. He spoke on love, assurance, commitment and social involvement." pg. 9.

.."How I Lost My Protestant Prejudice" appeared in Eternity magazine, Nov. 1971, by James Hefley: "Here I was, sharing the pulpit with a Catholic priest - curly-haired young Irishman I called 'Mike' and thought of as a brother in Christ. Our Church, Circle Evangelical Free in Chicago, stands firmly upon the fundamentals of evangelical doctrine. But we were having special prayer for this young priest because he was leaving for foreign missionary service in the Philippines." This was an amazing incident, almost.

.."Sex and the Single Seminarian". The student publication at Fuller Theological Seminary, of which Dr. David Hubbard is President, had this article in "The Opinion" for March 1969 by a Randall Shelley, a junior student: "My conclusion, then, from all of the above is that God does not condemn sex between unmarried persons when the use of modern contraceptive methods, unknown in Christ's day, eliminate the possibility of children." No wonder Fundamentalist Churches across the nation have completely rejected this Seminary as a place where youngmen can be safely trained for the ministry.

..An Aborted Baby Survives Horror. Christian Crusade for Nov. 18, 1973 states: "A Bakersfield, CA., physician has been charged with solicitation to commit murder for allegedly telling a nurse to stop administering oxygen to an infant which survived an abortion, according to the Chicago Tribune, Oct. 25...It charges that when the infant, a boy, survived, Ramirez told Nurse Margaret Krause to stop giving oxygen which was being administered to him but that she refused."

HAL LINDSEY ENDORSES TONGUES MOVEMENT

The author of the fast-selling book "The Late Great Planet Earth" takes a typical New Evangelicalist position on tongues in his book "Satan is Alive and Well", pg. 147: "I believe there is a genuine gift of tongues which God is giving today. It often quickens a person to believe God for the power of the Spirit to live a godly life. Many people have received this gift without even seeking it, and others who have sought it have been graciously granted it because it was obviously one of the gifts God had already planned for them. The exercise of this gift, both in private and public, has been a personal blessing to them. Some feel that when they pray in tongues they are able to express the inexpressible to God. Others sing in the Spirit, letting the Spirit compose the music and words as they yield their vocal cords to Him." Mr. Lindsay is being widely used in the tongues movement today.

..Missionary Ed Guerrant who serves with his family in Papua New Guinea wrote a news letter in which he said: "The Lord answered your prayers and ours in saving souls. The Lord has called us, and He is faithful in enabling us to serve Him. From Jan. 1 to Oct. 13, 1973 we had the privilege of leading 568 natives to Christ and baptizing 114. ..Evangelism-In-Depth Activity.. "In spite of potential difficulties, the unanimous decision was to proceed with the plans for Evangelism-in-Depth and trust the Lord to take care of Catholic-Protestant relations. The results were amazing ... once it was under way, relations became cordial as Catholic leaders realized that instead of competing with them, the Protestant activity was actually stirring up the relatively few faithful Roman Catholic believers to renewed interest in their own church. Cooperation between Catholics and Protestants grew as Catholic leaders (who obtained copies of all of the Evangelism-in-Depth manuals) began copying some of the methods used by the evangelicals." (Eternity, November, 1971 - 38).

..The Catholic Church Is The Most Open to the tongues movement.. The magazine entitled "Christ for the Nations" in the July 1973 issue (p.2) stated: "Nearly all of the Christian world is aware of the spiritual awakening taking place within the Roman Catholic Church...For interestingly enough, in the last few years the Catholic Church has been the denomination most open to Christ's desire to baptize His people in the Holy Spirit...Of course there are as yet unsolved difficulties within the Renewal. The tendency so far has been to rigidly obey church leadership, even if such would restrict the whole Charismatic move. Many sincere Catholics believe that this obedience will prove to the leadership that the Holy Spirit is not anti-Church but has come to help the Church. Others feel that they must look to the Lord Himself for ultimate direction."

..Catholic Church Hires a Baptist as assistant pastor. "Since that time there has been increasing cooperation between Catholics and Protestants in the distribution of Bibles, in Bible study, in the use of modern communications media, and in social concerns. In one area a Catholic parish has even hired a Baptist minister to be an assistant pastor, and neighborhood evangelism is being conducted by Catholic laymen with the aid of materials built around the 'Four Spiritual Laws'." (Eternity, November 17, 1971, pg. 40).
