IS BOB JONES UNIVERSITY STANDING TRUE TO THE INSPIRED WORD OF THE LIVING GOD?

This question has been asked of us by several people as a result of a most unfortunate reference in the Sword of the Lord for Jan. 10, 1975. A regrettable comparison was made between the position of Bob Jones University with the position of Moody Bible Institute, Wheaton College & Dallas Seminary. Lest a wrong inference be gathered from the article we hasten to assure all of our people that there can be no question about the stand, direction, loyalty, and faithfulness of this institution toward the verbally inspired, inerrant and infallible Word of God. We do not believe that the editor intended to discredit BJU in this article. The Pastor, who is a warm friend of Dr. John R. Rice and has been for years a member of the Cooperating Board of the Sword, is also a member of the Board of Trustees of the University and is glad to affirm his whole-hearted support of this University. We moreover would urge that God's people pray for this institution as never before, support it sacrificially with financial gifts, urge students to make application to enroll, and remember it generously in solemn bequest.

..The Master-Example of Separation in ecclesiastical history, we believe, is that of Charles Haddon Spurgeon and the Metropolitan Tabernacle from the British Baptist Union, in a titanic struggle lasting from 1887 to 1992. Dr. G. Archer Weniger has just compiled a document giving significant quotes from the powerful pen of Spurgeon as taken from his sermons and his weekly paper "The Sword & Trowel". MORE LIGHT ON NEW EVANGELICAL CASH

Since Johnny Cash is to figure in a big world premier double-feature this Sat. night at nearby Neighborhood Church, the big CMA Cathedral of the Crossroads here in Castro Valley, it might be good to read the latest on the black-dressed singer in the Review of the News for Feb. 5, 1975 & his art in subverting country music to the revolution: "One of the great obstacles to subverting country music for revolutionary purposes was that too many of its 'old-school' performers were always around to defend traditional values. This tended to perpetuate country attitudes and powerfully influenced newcomers. The Comrades saw that what was needed were modern idols - stars who could set 'Liberal' trends and give country music a 'social' identity. Along came John. When the craggy-faced Johnny Cash burst into notoriety in the mid-Sixties his longtime fans were happy for his success, but somewhat bewildered. For while Cash had been a big country seller at one time, his hits in recent years had been few and far between...Cash was popping pills and running from his origins by the time he developed a fondness for the degenerate radicals of folk-music circles and began to entertain them in his home. But, under careful tutelage, Big John was nurturing a 'social awareness.' He started championing the cause of the 'downtrodden,' singing numbers such as 'All God's Children Ain't Free' - a Cash composition that received priority attention in the blatantly pro-Communist trade sheet, Broadside. His 'What Is Truth?' - a sickening glorification of the seven defendants in the Chicago Conspiracy Trial - iced the cake. Before he knew it, Johnny Cash was not just a country singer but a famous personality. He had his own prime-time TV show. He was performing with, and being promoted by, such of his 'best friends' as Bob Dylan, Janis Joplin, and Pete Seeger. He soon developed a fetish for black clothes and said he wore black because of the Vietnam War. (Though he still wears black today for unexplained reasons.) He appeared at the riotous Newport Folk Festival. He took up the plight of the American Indian. Cash even 'got' religion, or so he said. So what if his old fans were now booing him in disgust. John was a recognized 'humanitarian' and a darling of the Left - just like ol' Woody Guthrie. Johnny Cash's example of success, based on radical propaganda, force-fed to the (Cont. on p.2)

..The Charismatic Movement Is Good for Roman Catholics, so says a published statement by the U.S. Bishops as found in the Catholic Voice for Feb. 3, 1975: "Many, too, have grown in devotion to the Eucharist and partake more fruitfully in the sacramental life of the Church," the statement continues. "Reverence for the Mother of the Lord takes on fresh meaning and many feel a deeper sense of and attachment for the Church. Things of this kind certainly merit encouragement and do reflect the biblical & church teaching."

..Catholics Are Told To Beware of any fundamentalism in the charismatic movement. "At the same time, the committee pointed to 'some dangers which continue to exist here and there' and which cannot be ignored 'if the movement is to develop in a positive and fruitful way. Elitism and that kind of biblical fundamentalism which offend against authenticating norms of Sacred Scripture and the teaching of the Church are two of these dangers. While it cannot be denied that other aspects of the charismatic renewal- healing, prophecy, praying in tongues- could be genuine manifestations of the Spirit, these phenomena 'must be carefully scrutinized and their importance, even if genuine, should not be exaggerated.'"



MASS KILLER GIVES ASTOUNDING TESTIMONY FOR CAPITAL PUNISHMENT FOR MURDERERS

The National Enquirer for Feb. 18, 1975 carried an interview with 21-year old Carl Junior Isaacs who is convicted of 6 murders and is now in Georgia State prison. He claims to have killed 15 people and has an ambition to kill 1,000. He is eligible for parole in 42 years. He stated: "I believe in the death penalty to prevent people like me from killing.... The death penalty always used to deter me because I knew I could die for murder. I'd walk into a place to stick it up and I'd think twice about blowing that man away. But when you know you won't fry and the worst you can get is life, and maybe parole later- why not get rid of the evidence? That's what I did... There's too much killing... And the only way to stop it is to bring back the death penalty. As long as killers know all they'll get is life, they'll keep right on killing- and that includes me." He laughed about the time when a judge let him off for an early offense. "The judge said, 'Give me your word you'll go straight and I'll set you free.' Imagine that!" Isaacs sneered. "So I said, 'I promise, your honor,' and he smiled, and I thought, 'You dumb old f---'!"

PRESS SECRETARY TO POPE IS A CHARISMATIC

The Full Gospel Business Men's Voice for March 1975 carried the picture, story & interview with a gentleman from Rome: "Fred Ladenius, besides being press secretary to the Pope is a writer and a Vatican City radio and TV personality. He will be a featured speaker at the FGBMFI World Convention in Anaheim, Calif. June 30-July 5, 1975." He said, "One day Pope John the 23rd came to the Vatican station to make a recording. He spoke of miracles of Pentecost which the Church must experience for renewal. At that time I didn't understand; now I understand. When Pope John was elected, some of the Cardinals thought, 'This is a calm old man; we'll have a wonderful period of peace.' But the Holy Spirit had other plans. I remember the first time Pope John held a reception for all the Vatican employees... Since my baptism in the Holy Spirit, I understand what the opening of the window really meant. Thank God for the open windows!" He told about an interview with Dr. Graham in Rome: "When I met him, however, I forgot all the tricky questions, and said, instead, 'Mr. Graham, if someone would come to you and say, I would like to meet the living God before night comes, what would you answer?' (I was that someone.) 'I would not waste my time discussing theology or religion,' he replied, unhesitatingly. 'I would say, Open your heart to the Holy Spirit, and He will reveal to you all truth.' I wrote this down and put it in my pocket... A few days later a long time friend, a Canadian Catholic priest, came to my office. 'Sunday you must come to the Gregorian University,' he said, 'because there is something new happening!... I found people in prayer & full of joy when I arrived. They were glorifying the Lord. Some were lay people, some were priests- and there were Catholic sisters as well."

THE LIBERALS ARE SEPARATISTS ALSO

DR. WENDELL ZIMMERMAN TO BE AT LUCERNE

A strange call to separation was issued by a bearded radical liberal, Rev. Wayne Saffen, pastor of a joint LCA-MS Lutheran Church in Manteca, Calif. In a "Statement on the Crisis in Missouri Synod" he said, "I say now that Missourians who care about the Gospel should say that we have lost; & get out. Abandon ship. Not everyone for himself. Women and children first then the sick & helpless. Help each other to escape the sinking ship. But get out. Get out together, if possible, & regroup to try to become together the church we had hoped we were becoming, one where the Gospel was our hallmark & where our evangelical way of dealing with each other & with the world would be our sign of credibility. The Missouri Synod, as presently constituted, has no credibility as a church with a saving word or act for anybody. It is an agent of destruction. It exhibits the will-to-power in religious fanaticism finally gone over the brink of sanity. Its defenders say that no one has to belong to it. Those who do not agree can get out. Right! For the first time, I agree with them. They have finally succeeded in breaking my fellowship with them. I no longer regard them as fellow Christians or as fellow human beings. I am one of the very last to admit the power of alienation. But I know when I am defeated. I quit. They win. I lose. It was never a contest, except for the Gospel, where everybody had a chance to win...The whole Missouri Synod can be split, probably will be & probably should be. The schism will not prove the facticity of the Bible. It will prove the will to power & the weak faith of those who must destroy a church in order to 'save' it & their 'faith.'...To hell with them. Let them be lords of the dung heap, lords of the flies. Let them stare into the emptiness of their own making where heretofore they were people of faith. And let them wonder where they went & what they did wrong, should such an unlikely notion occur to them." Comment: Here is a rank liberal showing his true self when confronted with failure to take over completely the machinery of a major denomination. Missouri Synod Lutherans are in a life-and-death struggle this July in Anaheim which is being watched by the religious world. FELLOWSHIP WITH NON-CHRISTIAN SYSTEMS

THE COMMERCIALIZATION OF CHRISTIANITY

We find this interesting observation by the late Dr. Robert E. Speer in his book "The Finality of Christ." Though Dr. Speer took a soft position of compromise when the battle was intense, he does draw an important line of distinction here: "The question of the relation of Christianity to non-Christian systems is not the same question as the relation of Christians to non-Christians. One might think with disapproval & condemnation of some non-Christian system, or of the untruths & evils sanctioned or sheltered in it, & yet think only of good will & kindness & love of the men & women who adhere to this system. There have been men who have viewed the non-Christian religions with an intollerance which was called bigotry, who at the same time won & held the hearts of people of those religions, whom they loved with a passionate love. Few men ever loved the people of India as Alexander Duff loved them, or gave more proof of it, or were more deeply loved in return; but we have seen how he felt about the Hinduism of his day. 'How did he win you?' was the question put to one of his students, later a well-known & honored Christian. 'He won me,' was the reply, 'by his bigotry. I was dissatisfied with Hinduism. I found no peace & no hope in it. One day in the classroom Dr. Duff spoke of the gods the Hindus worship, & said in his own positive way, 'They are no gods; they are mere imaginary beings; they are no more worthy of worship than my old shoe or the paving stones on which I walk. There is only one true God, & He is Jehovah the Lord.' That went home to my heart as the truth, & I received Jehovah as my Lord, & found peace & hope.' This is the kind of separation which missionaries must practice abroad & believers at home which will satisfy the demands of God's holiness as expressed in the sacred Scriptures. It draws a helpful line of distinction between the people we want to reach, & yet be separate from the evil religious systems which God rejects.

THE FAMOUS KENYON CASE IN PENNSYLVANIA

The perversion of the apostasy can be seen in the now-famous Kenyon case in the United Presbyterian Church which is affiliated with the National Council of Churches. The (Cont. in Col. two)

This is the title of a superb article by Dr. Frank Garlock in the nation's most outstanding Christian magazine, known as "Faith for the Family", published by Bob Jones University. Every concerned Christian family should have this magazine (\$3 per year, \$5 for two years). In the July-August issue, Dr. Garlock deals with Deceitful Disciples, Holy Hippies, Shallow Saints, Carnal Charismatics, & Mixed-up Musicians. He writes about two recent "gospel" albums by Billy Preston: "Yet both albums were produced by George Harrison of Beatles fame & featured songs like 'My Sweet Lord' by Harrison, which is a prayer for demon possession addressed to Hare Krishna. Harrison has been a devout, practicing Hindu since 1967. When asked about his relationship with Harrison, Preston said: 'It's so close, man, the names change. His god is Krishna & mine is Christ. The spiritual promotion, praising god, chanting, speaking & turning on to people are things we have in common. I've spoken so many times to him about Jesus. I'm turning him on to Jesus & he's turning me on to Krishna. I never heard of Krishna until George told me. Krishna & Christ are very close. They both lived similar lives. I want to show people truth. I want to help them. I don't care where they get it from.'" Dr. Garlock observed: "Anyone who makes a blasphemous comparison between the Lord Jesus Christ & the mythological figure of Hare Krishna cannot be called a born-again Christian, but Preston is constantly promoting himself & being accepted as a believer in Christ."

(Cont. from Col. 1) Pittsburgh presbytery decided to ordain Mr. Walter Kenyon to the ministry which was followed by a protest against his ordination by Rev. Jack M. Maxwell. Let the Presbyterian Journal of 7-16-75 tell it: "Mr. Kenyon told the presbytery he would not ordain a woman, though he would be willing to serve with a woman ordained by someone else. Mr. Maxwell's complaint went all the way to the General Assembly & effectively barred Mr. Kenyon from the UPUSA ministry. A DESCRIPTION OF A HYPER-CALVINIST

Since the term "Hyper-Calvinist" is being widely used to describe a certain theological mentality today & since it probably means different things to different people, we venture a description in the interests of light & understanding, if not peace & harmony. We recognize that not all Calvinists are "Hyper-Calvinists", 1. A Hyper-Calvinist is one who is constantly crusading for his position as though this were the most important consideration in theology, often to an offensive degree. This is what some call "grinding an axe". He is not content to allow his five points to be the quiet framework of his thought system, but prefers to not only carry a chip on the shoulder but also to wear a big red, fresh tulip in his lapel. 2. He is one who insists on making his five-point theology a test of fellowship with his brethren whether his frame of reference is his local church, association, college or seminary. If he is defeated he is not deterred but regroups his forces & plans carefully the next parliamentary & educational thrust. The fact that his theology will split, divide & deaden his church, often driving it straight into the ground, does not stop him for he feels that this brings honor to God, just as predestinating souls to an eternal hell brings glory to the Father. 3. He suffers from a delusion that a Baptist is one who adheres to the 5 points of Calvin, when the truth is that Calvin bitterly opposed every historic distinctive that characterized Baptists & often persecuted Baptists to the death in cooperation with the local magistrates. Either he has failed to study Bapt. history or Reformation history for it is an established fact that the Baptists of his time completely rejected Reformation theology & the Reformers vehemently denounced the Baptists. 4. He errs greatly when he equates the Reformed Faith & Calvinism with the Biblical Faith of the Word of God. He seems more attached to historic creeds of the Reformed communions than he is to the Bible itself which is the sole authority for matters of faith and practice. Having taken this position he marks those who disagree as heretics and purveyors of false doctrine. The 5 points of Calvinism are elevated to a position far above the original 5 points of an earlier Fundamentalism. (Cont. in col.2)

SEPARATION AND THE BATTLE FOR THE TRUTH

In an old book of sermons by Chas. Haddon Spurgeon, published in 1864 (5th Series), our hearts were blessed as we read on p. 387: "Truth could not be truth in this world if it were not a warning thing, & we should at once suspect that it were not true if error were friends with it. The spotless purity of truth must always bear war with the blackness of heresy & lies. I say again, it would cast a suspicion upon its own nature; we should feel at once that it was not true, if it were not at enmity with the false. And so at this present time, the church of Christ, being in herself the only incarnation of truth left upon this world, must be at war with error of every kind of shape; or if she were not, we should at once conclude that she was not herself the church of the living God. It is but a rule of nature that holiness must be at enmity with sin. That would be but a mock purity which could lie side by side with iniquity & claim its kinship. 'Shall the throne of iniquity have fellowship with thee.' Shall Christ & Belial walk together? Shall the holy be linked with the unholy? If it were so, beloved, we might then not only suspect it, but we might beyond suspicion pronounce a verdict upon her, 'Thou art no more Christ's bride; thou art an anti-Christ, an apostate. Reprobate silver shall men call thee, because thou hast not yet learned to distinguish between the precious & the vile.' Thus, you see, if the church be a true church, & a holy church, she must be armed: there are so many untrue things & unholy things, that she must be perpetually with her sword in hand, carrying on combat against them." What a statement out of the last century from a valient warrior for God.

(Cont. from col.1) By relegating all other doctrines to a position of secondary importance, he becomes an adherent of a reductionism in theology which no responsible Fundamentalist would accept. 5. When his arguments fail & he finds solid Christian believers who do not accept his reformed logic, he thrusts forth his little brush & tars his antagonist with the smear name of "Arminianism", a title which is often completely rejected by his opponent. Unless his opponent will accept all 4 or 5 points he does not merit any theological respectability & must be content to travel through the earth with this (Cont. on p.2)

THE POSITION OF THEOLOGIAN WM. BARCLAY

Since the New Evangelical power structure is featuring the British theologian William Barclay more & more, we thought it wise to find out what he believes on a few issues. In Billy Graham's Belfast Relay Crusade Barclay's book "Daily Bible Readings: The Gospel of John" was given to each convert. Barclay states that Jesus was divine, though not God. He comments on John 1:8- "This does not mean that Jesus is identical with God; it does mean that in mind & character Jesus is one with God. In this case, it might be better if we thought of it as meaning that Jesus is divine." (P.56). He evidently takes the same position as Fosdick who drew a distinction between the deity of Jesus & the divinity of Jesus. Fosdick held that Jesus was not God the Son, but believed that He was divine, in the same sense that his mother was divine. Barclay has trouble with the miracles of Jesus. He denies on pages 211-212 the miracle of Christ walking on the sea. He explains away the miracle of feeding the five thousand on pages 205-207: "If there were pilgrims with them they would certainly possess supplies for the way. But it may be that none of them would produce what they had for they selfishly - and very humanly - wished to keep it all for themselves. It may then be that Jesus, with that rare smile of His, produced the little store that He and His disciples had; with sunny faith He thanked God for it & shared it out. Moved by His example, everyone who had anything did the same; & in the end there was enough, & more than enough for all. It may be that is a miracle in which the presence of Jesus and His loveliness turned a crowd of selfish men & women into a fellowship of sharers. It may be that in the presence of Jesus those whose one thought was to keep were miraculously turned into people whose one thought was to give. It may be that this story represents the biggest miracle of all- a miracle which changed human nature, & altered, not loaves & fishes, but men & women." This book recommends the Apocrypha on p. 9. These are the spurious books which are accepted in the Roman Catholic Bible. Four pages of material is devoted to Wm. Barclay in Dr. Ian R. K. Paisley's book- "Billy Graham & the Church of Rome". This explanation of the supernatural is much akin to (Cont. in col.2)

GOD DEMANDS PURITY OF THE CHURCH

Charles Haddon Spurgeon in a sermon "The Great Revival" published in his 5th Sermon Series in 1864 stated: "God will never bless an unholy people, & in proportion to our unholiness, he will withhold the blessing from us. Tell me of a church that is inconsistent, you shall tell me of a church that is unblest. God will first sweep the house before he will come to dwell in it. He will have his church pure before he will bless it with all the blessing of his grace. Remember that, ye inconsistent ones, & turn unto God, & ask to be rendered holy. There are others of you that are so cold-hearted, that you stand in the way of all progress. You are a skid upon the wheels of the church. It can not move for you. If we would be earnest, you put your cold hand on everything that is both bold and daring."

THE MINISTRY IS NOT AN EASY LIFE

One not only gets this idea from a reading of the Book of Acts, especially as it relates to the Apostle Paul, but also in reading David Otis Fuller's book "Valiant for the Truth" which quotes the noted defender of the Faith Dr. J. Gresham Machen: "If you decide to stand for Christ, you will not have an easy life in the ministry. Of course, you may try to evade the conflict. All men will speak well of you if, after preaching no matter how unpopular a Gospel on Sunday, you will only vote against that Gospel in the councils of the church the next day; you will be graciously permitted to believe in supernatural Christianity all you please if you will not act as though you did believe in it, if you will only make common cause with its opponents. Such is the program that will win the favor of the church. A man may believe what he pleases, provided he does not believe anything strongly enough to risk his life on it & fight for it. 'Tolerance' is the great word. Men even ask for tolerance when they look to God in prayer. But how can any Christian possibly pray such a prayer as that? What a terrible prayer it is, how full of disloyalty to the Lord Jesus Christ!!" FUNDAMENTAL BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP NATIONAL MEETINGS DATES CHANGED TO MAY 5-6-7, 1976

The Fundamental Baptist Fellowship board met last week in Muncie, Indiana at the Grace Baptist Church with Pastor Collins Glenn as the gracious host minister. After considerable evaluation & discussion the Board voted unanimously to re-affirm its intention to accept the invitation of the Engleside Baptist Church, 8428 Highland Lane, Alexandria, Virginia 22309. Pastor Wayne Thompson was present to urge acceptance of their invitation, with the assurance that adequate housing would be available as well as an enthusiastic local constituency. The Church is located one mile north of Ft. Belvoir off Route 1, just ten miles from the White House & about two miles from Mt. Vernon. Though the FBF has never been this far east, it was felt that this would be strategic to meet near the nation's capitol during this strategic Bicentennial year. The earlier date was chosen to resolve a number of conflicting schedules affecting leaders who had schools of all levels. Pastor Wayne Thompson is a member of the Baptist World Mission board. The theme for the Conference: "Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty" II Cor. 3:17. Some of the great preachers of the nation are being invited in to bring addresses on lofty themes of liberty & freedom. The headquarters hotel will probably be the Happy Inn, about one mile from the church in Alexandria. A limited number of homes will be available to out-of-state messengers. Preachers from all over the nation are urged to make plans now to attend, along with Church officers, missionaries, evangelists. This should be a thrilling conference. The Fundamental Baptist Fellowship has an unbroken history going back to 1920 when it began its ministry of protest against unbelieving liberalism and a continuing program to contend earnestly for the Faith once delivered unto the saints.

GOOD ADVICE ON DIVINE WORSHIP

..In This Age of Jumbo Religion.. Bishop J. C. Ryle on John 4:21 in Vol. III of John, p. 207- "The most gorgeous cathedral-service is offensive in God's sight, if all is gone through coldly, heartlessly, and without grace. The feeblest gathering of three or four poor believers in a cottage to read the Bible and pray, is a more acceptable sight to Him who searches the heart than the fullest congregation which is ever gathered in St. Peter's in Rome."
..The Ecumenical World Has Gone Crazy on liturgy and ritualism. These words by Bishop J.C. Ryle on John, Vol. III- "A Church was about to be founded, whose members would find access to the Father everywhere, and would need no temple-service, and no priests or sacrifices or altars in order to approach God. It was therefore mere waste of time to be disputing about the comparative claims of either Samaria or Jerusalem. Under the Gospel all places would soon be alike" p. 222. "The utter passing away of the whole Jewish system seems clearly pointed at in this verse. To bring into the Christian Church holy places, sanctuaries, altars, priests, sacrifices, gorgeous vestments and the like, is to dig up that which has been long buried, and to turn to candles for light under the noon-day sun."

..Worshipping God With the Heart.. "Worship in spirit' is heart-worship in contradistinction to all formal, material, carnal worship, consisting only of ceremonies, offerings, sacrifices, and the like," p.225. Again- "Any religious system which tends to depreciate heart-worship, and to turn Christianity into a mere formal service, or which tends to bring back Jewish shadows, ceremonies, and services, and to introduce them into Christian worship, is on the face of these remarkable verses (John 4:7-26) most unscriptural and deserving of reprobation." p.226. Bishop J.C. Ryle, Vol. III, John. These are interesting statements coming from an Anglican.

UNBELIEVING THEOLOGIAN ON FACULTY OF CALIFORNIA GRADUATE SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY

A glossy folder from the California Graduate School of Theology carries pictures of the faculty for the 1975-76 extension classes held in Santa Clara at the First Presbyterian Church, which is identified with the National Council of Churches. The President is Holland London. The founder, chairman & controller is Dr. W. S. McBirnie, who is also on the faculty. A number of the faculty are connected with NCC churches. The faculty member listed to teach "The Life, Letters and Thought of Paul" is James Kallas, noted Lutheran liberal theologian. He is professor of New Testament studies at California Lutheran College (ALC & LCA). He is identified with the ALC which is in the NCC. He not only charges the Bible with having errors but charges the Gospel writers with dishonesty. He implies that they are fraudulent characters by saying that they "did not hesitate at all to alter history and data if it would make their theological points stand out more clearly." (Jesus and the Power of Satan, 1968, Westminster Press, p.99). This liberal theologian rejects the very heart of the Christian Faith as he denies the scriptural doctrine of the vicarious satisfaction of Christ when he writes: "Why is Jesus going to die? To procure forgiveness? To pay a ransom to God? To satisfy divine justice in some Anselmian sense? Absolutely not. One the one hand, Jesus claimed the right to forgive sins quite independently of his death. Mark 2:5 f. shows him forgiving sins long before the thought of death came to prominence. On the other hand, he is not paying ransom to God. The Synoptics do not show us loving Son pitted against demanding Father. Jesus does not pay this ransom to the Father. He is not dying to redress the scales of divine justice." page 178. A number of Fundamentalists are being deceived by this kind of unbelief. The California Clergyman Journal for October 1972 listed H.M.S. Richards on the faculty of this institution along with Harold Fickett, John E. Boehmer, Butrus Abd-Al-Malik, Richard Laird, Holland B. The Christian world should be pleased with the selection of the new pastor by the Temple Baptist Church of Detroit at a business meeting on November 19, 1975 when Dr. A.V. WORLD COUNCIL LEADER AT WHEATON COLLEGE

Wheaton College gave the honor of its platform to one of the leading liberals in the world ecumenical movement when Archbishop Arthur Michael Ramsey of Britain spoke on Oct. 12, 1975, according to the National Courier of Nov. 4, 1975. He spoke at Trinity Episcopal Church on its 100th anniversary. "Later, in a public address at Wheaton College, the Archbishop again emphasized his vision of ecumenical union between Anglicans and Catholics, promising that 'the united Church will come.' He said that the central matter in Christian unity was the deity of Jesus, and since 'Protestants, Anglicans, and Catholics all believe that, we ought to recognize each other as brothers.' He seemed to exclude no one from the circle of those reconciled to God through the death and resurrection of Christ. 'Jesus' death was the basis of a new covenant between God and all mankind,' he said. 'It is a bewildered world that is asking whether God cares. The answer is that conversion happens in the totality of all our relationships, so that personal conversion leads to conversion of society as well.'" It is difficult for Fundamentalists to understand the reasons for allowing a theologian with the unquestioned liberal credentials of Dr. Ramsey to appear on any evangelical platform, conservative or neo-evangelical. His views of the one world church, universalism, conversion, salvation, evangelism and the deity of Christ places him squarely in the group of apostate leaders who come under the review of Gal. 1:6-9, in the judgment of many former supporters of Wheaton College. It is now understandable why so many Fundamentalists across the land charge Wheaton with infidelity on the Gospel when known opponents of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ are accorded such honor.

SEVEN ADDED TO LUCERNE "HALL OF FAME"

In a simple ceremony at the noon-hour on Thanksgiving Day, the colored portraits of seven outstanding leaders of our time were formally placed in the Fundamentalist "Hall of Fame" at the Lucerne Christian Conference Center on the north shore of Clear Lake in California. Dr. G. Archer Weniger, Chairman of the Lucerne Management Committee, presided as he paid tribute to these militant leaders of Fundamental Christianity. Selection of those to be recognized is in the hands of the Lucerne Management Committee composed of eight Fundamental Baptist ministers in the West. The Christian Gospel brings all men on a level by concluding all under sin, in order that those who repent and believe may be redeemed; the social gospel divides men into groups and classes, in order that the class struggle may be used to further social revolution. Other contrasts could be enumerated, but these few are sufficient to lay a background for revealing the methods of Communist clergymen within the churches of America."
