

DR. CHESTER E. TULGA AT HOME WITH THE LORD - A GREAT CHAMPION OF THE FAITH

On January 21, 1976 at 10:30 AM one of the most influential Fundamentalists of this century in American Christianity slipped into the presence of the Lord as Dr. Chester E. Tulga breathed his last in Albuquerque, N.M. He would have been 80 yrs. of age on Feb. 17, 1976. Memorial services were conducted by his son, Louis, in Albuquerque, with burial in the afternoon at the national Cemetary in Santa Fe, 60 miles distant from his home. Dr. Tulga is survived by his faithful wife, together with five children: Louis, Paul, Louis, Elna & Carol. He was a pastor for 25 yrs. serving churches in Ohio, Pennsylvania, in addition to Brookings & North Platte, with his last church, the Norwood Park Baptist in Chicago. His most significant contribution was his 12 yrs. spent as Research Secretary for the Conservative Baptist Fellowship, which became known as the Fundamental Baptist Fellowship, after he led in separating it from the convention. His famous "Case" books had a profound influence on Fundamental Christianity. In addition to numerous documents on a wide variety of significant topics, he produced the 200 page book "The Foreign Missions Controversy in the Northern Baptist Convention." He was honored with the degree of "DD" from Selma University in the south. With only seven months of high school & no training in college, institute, or seminary, he was yet regarded as one of the leading bibliographers among Fundamentalists. He preached in 40 states & Canada. He brought addresses before 25 colleges, universities, seminaries, & institutes. Twice the University of Chicago asked him to give his famous address: "Why I Am Not a Liberal". No history of Fundamentalism in the Western hemisphere would be complete without extensive recognition of the life, ministry, & defense of the Faith by this noble servant of our Lord Jesus Christ. His last words, in the face of death, were a prayer that he might be filled with the Holy Spirit. Many Fundamentalists across the nation feel a great debt of gratitude to him, & shall miss him. DR. TALBOT ENTERS GLORY AT 86 YEARS

One of the most prominent Fundamentalist leaders of the West Coast entered into the presence of the Lord on Thursday, Jan. 22, 1976 at the age of 86 years in Southern California. Dr. Louis T. Talbot died in the arms of his wife as she was praying, & when she said "Amen" he breathed his last. Services were held on January 25, 1976 at 2:30 PM at the Church of the Open Door in Los Angeles. For nearly 20 years he was Pastor of the Church of the Open Door, while serving concurrently as President of BIOLA. He was by far the most popular radio preacher of the Gospel for two decades on the West Coast in network broadcasts. He was the author of a score of books, mostly of expository character. His wife of ten years survives him, together with two children, Betty & Audrey, plus six grandchildren. Two of his grandsons are studying for the ministry today. The Christian Faith was very real. He was a warm friend of Dr. G. Archer Weniger & his brothers in the ministry. COMMUNIST INFLUENCE IN CHURCHES

Anglican Bishop Mervyn Stockwood of Southwark got into a tangle recently with the new Archbishop of Canterbury, Donald Coggan, who probably has more sense than the last archbishop (Ramsey) if not a conservative. Stockwood wrote in a Communist daily, the Morning Star: "Those of us who have visited Socialist countries in Europe know that if a Communist government were to be established in Britain, the West End would be cleaned up overnight & the ugly features of our permissive society would be changed within a matter of days... We can learn much from Communist systems. I have been to Romania & was to go to China this year. I have been impressed by what they have done." The Chinese system, he added, "is very much in keeping with the teachings of Jesus... I have no intention of shoring up a society which, because of its basic injustice, is at last crumbling in ruins. Western Civilization is based on profit, greed & exploitation," he continued, praising the moral & economic climate in Communist countries. (Presb. Journal, 11-19-75, p.4)

..Liberal Catholic Priest Commends TM.. Father Daniel J. O'Hanlan, S.J., a professor at the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, writes in the Catholic Voice for Dec. 1, 1975: "I hope that the severe criticism of TM will not leave the impression that Hindu & Buddhist meditation practices are incompatible with the Christian faith. For I have found in both traditions significant aids for my Christian prayer & spiritual growth."

..Another Priest Got Stirred Up when the Editor of the Catholic Voice came out with a sharp criticism of Transcendental Meditation recently. In a letter to the editor Dan Danielson writes in the same issue: "I strongly disagree that for someone to practice TM, as opposed to joining the movement as a disciple or teacher, is to change religions. There is a great variety of religious practices, meditation techniques, postures, gestures, that come from other religions and yet are capable of being reconciled as a practice with our Catholic faith." That's what Romanism has been doing for centuries- incorporating heathen elements into its faith all over the world without much difficulty.

..Teaching Arithmetic In Red China.. "A teacher in a Peiping school for factory workers...drills his pupils in arithmetic with problems such as this: "In the United States, the number of half-starved people is twice the number of the unemployed, and is 5,000,000 less than the number of people who have to live in slums. As one half of the number of slum dwellers is 11½ million, what is the number of the unemployed in the U.S? (China News Service)

..Youthful L. Ronald Brushwyler is an official of the American Baptist Convention, the most liberal of all 28 Baptist bodies in America. He is known as an "Area Minister" in northern California. He is regarded as one of the brightest lights on the horizon of coming ABC leadership in the West. He is the son of Dr. Vincent Brushwyler, the mission executive who shaped the course of the Conservative Baptist Foreign Mission Society into its present New Evangelical direction.

..Marquette Manor Baptist Burns.. On early Sat., Jan. 10, 1976 fire gutted the historic Chicago church building of the Marquette Manor Baptist Church, an historic location for the Fundamental Baptist movement. The fire department had 22 units fighting the blaze in the early hours. Dr. Wayne Van Gelderen, present pastor, was called to the scene at 4 AM in the morning to watch flames consume the entire structure. Services will continue in the educational structure which was left intact. The Church had been operating not only in Chicago, but at the new location in Downers Grove at 75th & Fairview where they have constructed a magnificent new complex. This will undoubtedly help solve some important problems. This Church has been the scene of many historic Fundamentalist gatherings.

THE BLOCKBUSTER BOOK OF THE YEAR

Dr. Harold Lindsell, distinguished editor of Christianity Today, is the author of the book published this month by Zondervan entitled: "The Battle for the Bible". The forward is written by Dr. Harold John Ockenga, co-founder of Fuller Seminary & trustee. Copies of the book may be ordered thru the S.F. Baptist Seminary Bookstore, 1225 Franklin St., S.F. 94109. Since the book exposes the drift of Fuller Seminary toward a modernist position, Dr. David A. Hubbard, Fuller President, sent a letter dated April 5, 1976 to all faculty members indicating his distress over the new book. "Inasmuch as one chapter discusses the changes which led to our new statement of faith in 1970 and also deals with the views of biblical inspiration, revelation, and authority held by some of our faculty members, I wanted to alert you to the book's publication." Dr. Hubbard then outlined his strategy to counteract this new criticism against Fuller by: "a strengthened program of ads in national periodicals...a publication on the real issues of inspiration and authority with the aid of several leading evangelical theologians...a conference of evangelical scholars and churchmen to discuss evangelical priorities for the next ten years with the hope that the misplaced focus on the question of inerrancy can be shifted to the more important issues in our struggle to combat liberal and secular view of life...a series of messages in The Joyful Sound..." Dr. Hubbard stated: "Your thoughts and prayers will be essential as we seek to deal with the impact of this criticism as fairly and positively as possible. My prediction-- and I hope it is not wishful thinking--- is that numbers of churchmen and women will express their support of the Seminary at this time. A call last week from Mark Hatfield was most encouraging as he expressed his distress over the pending publication." Dr. Hubbard criticized Dr. Harold Lindsell, who served as Fuller Vice-President in earlier days before they changed their statement of faith on inspiration, eternal punishment and the premillennial Coming of Christ. Dr. Hubbard wrote: "The theological position expressed by Harold Lindsell and his interpretation of church history will get support from few, if any, qualified scholars. And the spirit of alarm expressed will (Cont. on p.2)

SEPARATION MUST BE APPLIED TO MUSIC

A Pentecostalist warns of the dangers of rock Gospel music: "More and more it is becoming obvious that rock gospel is half-way to hard rock; and unless there is a turning away from the contemporary musical beat and a turning back to God, we Pentecostalists are going to have to cope with a demonic power which will dominate our singing. We can expect anything to happen in today's mass meetings during periods of loud repetitious, amplified beat and syncopation. We could cite a number of situations where young girls have filled their minds with this beat and ended up hissing like snakes and wiggling like worms. Contemporary music in the rock vogue is dangerous, gospel rock is ultra-dangerous, & hard rock is demonic. Biblical separation must be applied to our choirs, to our singers, and to all our music. It is significant that in this day when all-night sings are in vogue, the deeper Bible preaching is becoming more scarce. Unless we separate our music from that of the world, we ourselves shall surely become worldly. It is my firm conviction that a demonic spirit is working through this music and is wielding a new and uncontrollable power which is going to destroy its adherents."

But those who desire to misunderstand our stance at Fuller will be given some aid and comfort, and those lay persons of simple faith and insight unhappily may be left confused... If we let this book rob us of our courage to be what we need to be, we will be far more guilty than even Harold Lindsell thinks we are."

(Cont. from p.1, col.2) Jose Miguez Bonino, vice-president of the WCC of Buenos Aires. In promoting the book Eerdmans state: "Jose Miguez Bonino, a Latin American Christian theologian, often finds himself working side by side with Marxists in a common struggle for human equality and liberation. But he acknowledges that with such cooperation there exists an uneasy tension.... Miguez argues however, in this provocative book, that there are areas where Christianity and Marxism can, and indeed must, be brought together. Miguez is first of all a Christian... And it is his contention that certain fundamental insights, perspectives, and socioanalytic tools of Marxism are indispensable for revolutionary change... It is likewise a challenge, urging Christians to repossess their revolutionary heritage, and Marxists to see their understanding of revolution is not revolutionary enough". This is sad evidence of the inherent leftward drift in New Evangelicalism.



..Southern Baptists Publish Carter Book .
 The Alabama Baptist for June 3, 1976 had a BP dispatch from Nashville-"Why Not The Best?", presidential candidate Jimmy Carter's book published by Broadman Press, has been the subject of some recent criticism over whether the publishing and promotion of his candidacy...Bantam Books, a major paperback publisher in the United States, has been granted permission by Broadman Press to publish the fast-selling book in paperback form for nationwide marketing in secular stores...On the first printing, Bantam will release 150,000 copies of the book, making a total of 250,00 copies in print."

 The Far East Reporter Special Edition (Vol.22, No.120) reported an EP dispatch from Huntington, Ind. about Dale Francis, declaring in an editorial in its June 6 issue that:"Carter is something new in Presidential candidates. DR. ARNO Q. WENIGER TERMINATES SIGNIFICANT MINISTRY AT HAMILTON SQUARE BAPTIST IN SF

On the occasion of the 35th anniversary of his pastorate at the Hamilton Square Baptist Church in San Francisco, following the message by his son, Dr. Arno Q. Weniger, Jr., the Pastor read his resignation to the Church, to become effective when the Church chooses a successor. Dr. Weniger came to San Francisco the first Sunday in July of 1941 and began leading in a new building program which resulted in the move to the present site and erection of a beautiful edifice, which is debt-free with a value of a million dollars in this great port city of the Pacific Coast. Dr. Weniger was honored with the Doctor Divinity degree from Northwestern Schools of Minneapolis, with Dr. W.B. Riley conferring the degree in 1939. He also received the Doctor of Laws degree from Bob Jones University, with Dr. Bob Jones conferring the degree in 1974. He has served as President of the San Francisco Baptist Seminary for the past 15 years, with his church providing rent-free facilities for the Seminary. He has served as president and chairman of numerous organizations. He asked the Seminary Board to appoint a special President Committee in early 1975 to begin search for a successor. Dr. Weniger is expected to give valuable service to the Seminary, the churches, and other interests as opportunities present themselves. Friends everywhere are asked to pray that God's man shall be found and appointed to the pastorate of what has been historically, the most influential Fundamentalist pulpit in the city by the Golden Gate.



..Cont. from Page 1, Column 2..has her standards of doctrine; of course we shall never interfere with them; we only ask for ourselves to be spared interference with our private opinions. Indulged in this for a time, error goes on to assert equal rights. Truth and error are two balancing forces..The Church shall do nothing which looks like deciding between them; that would be partiality. It is bigotry to assert any superior right for the truth. We are to agree to differ, and any favoring of the truth, because it is truth, is partisanship. What the friends of truth and error hold in common is fundamental.. Anything on which they differ is ipso facto non-essential. Anybody who makes account of such a thing is a disturber of the peace of the church. Truth and error are two co-ordinate powers, and the great secret of church-statesmanship is to preserve the balance between them. From this point error soon goes on to its natural end, which is to assert supremacy. Truth started with tolerating; it comes to be merely tolerated, and that only for a time. Error claims a preference for its judgments on all disputed points. It puts men into position, not as at first in spite of their departure from the church's faith, but in consequence of it. Their recommendation is that they repudiate that faith, and position is given them to teach others to repudiate it, and to make them skilful in combating it." (The Conservative Reformation and Its Theology, p.195-196).

THE PASTOR ELECTED PRESIDENT OF THE SAN FRANCISCO BAPTIST SEMINARY

At the request of Dr. Arno Q. Weniger a year and a half ago, the Board of the San Francisco Baptist Seminary appointed a Presidential Committee to search for a successor. At the Board meeting on August 19, 1976 Dr. Weniger's resignation was accepted, to be effective September 15, 1976, and was named President Emeritus. The Board then adopted the Committee's recommendation and elected Dr. G. Archer Weniger to succeed his brother. The new President was one of the three incorporators of the Seminary in 1958 and has served as Chairman of the Board since the founding of the Seminary. He was appointed as Professor of Practical Theology in 1958 and has served on the faculty for all that time. He will continue as pastor of the Foothill Baptist Church of Castro Valley, and has no intention of resigning. After prayer he agreed to assume this responsibility, with the assistance of Dr. Eugene J. Petersen as Dean along with loyal assistance of his brother, as well as the entire Board of Trustees. The new President is one of five preacher brothers. He holds degrees from Northwestern Bible School, Northwestern Evangelical Seminary (ThG, ThB), Bethel College (A.A.) and University of Minnesota (B.A.). He received the Doctor of Divinity degree from Dr. Billy Graham in 1951 when he was President at Northwestern Schools. He received the Doctor of Letters degree from Bob Jones University in 1974. He had previously received the Bob Jones Memorial Award for the Defense of the Scriptures at Bob Jones University at the 1972 Commencement, their highest award. He is a trustee of Bob Jones University, Maranatha Baptist College, as well as S.F. Baptist Seminary. He is President of the Fundamental Baptist Fellowship of Chicago, Co-chairman of the Fundamental Baptist Congress of North America, Contributor to Faith for the Family. He has been pastor of the Foothill Baptist Church for 34 years. He has been happily married to Irene Adeline (Jacobsen) Weniger for 39 years. 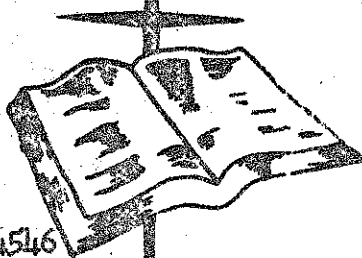

DR. BOB JONES SPEAKS IN SAN FRANCISCO THIS FRIDAY AT SEMINARY CONVOCATION

The Christian public is invited to attend the Seminary Rally this coming Friday, Sept. 16, 1976 at 7:45 pm at the Hamilton Square Baptist Church, Geary and Franklin Streets, at which time the noted Chancellor of Bob Jones University, Dr. Bob Jones will be the speaker. The meeting will have historic importance since this will be the time when Dr. Arno Q. Weniger will relinquish the Seminary presidency to Dr. G. Archer Weniger who has served as Chairman of the Board since the founding in 1958. Dr. Weniger asked the Board in February of 1975 to appoint a Committee to seek a successor. He resigned from the Hamilton Square Baptist Church on his 35th anniversary of the pastorate to be effective around November 1. He will continue to give counsel to the new President through the coming year. Participating in the program will be Dr. Roy H. Austin, Vice-chairman of the Board. New students will give testimonies. Refreshments will be served following the service in the Lower Auditorium. An especial welcome will be given to Pastors and former students of Bob Jones University, with which this Seminary works closely. It is hoped that delegations will be on hand from various churches both near and far. Dr. Jones is widely regarded as probably the leading spokesman for Fundamental Separatists in the entire world.

..Astounding Pentecostalist Statement. The noted world tongues leader from Oakland, Dr. David J. duPlessis, 71, says he accepts as truth the catholic dogma of papal infallibility. JIMMY CARTER'S KEY ILLINOIS MANAGER IS A NOTORIOUS LIBERAL THEOLOGICAL UNBELIEVER

The editor of the left-wing Christian Century, regarded as the most radically liberal theological paper in America, has been named as the manager for Jimmy Carter in the key state of Illinois. His name is James Wall, a United Methodist minister. The Atlanta Journal for September 4, 1976 (P. 60A) stated: A minister is obligated to be involved in public affairs, says the editor of the nation's leading liberal Protestant weekly, as he prepares to take a leave of absence to work in Jimmy Carter's campaign as campaign co-ordinator in Illinois... A SERIOUS FLAW IN A GRAND BOOK

Dr. Harold Lindsell's book "The Fattale for the Bible" can be ordered at \$7 per copy from San Francisco Baptist Seminary Bookstore, 1225 Franklin St., S. F. 94109. It is without doubt the most important book of 1976 in the struggle for the Christian Faith. Every Christian leader at every level of operation should have, read, and know the facts of this remarkable book. A very serious flaw in the book appears on pages 139-140 where the author shows a serious weakness which we hope he will see on further reflection; and where he denies the very important Biblical principle of Separation from unbelief: "Nor does it necessarily imply that those who believe in inerrancy must separate themselves from groups and denominations that fail to support the viewpoint. So long as the believer is not called upon to renounce his convictions at this point, and had the freedom to propagate what he believes, he may find it within the will of God to have a ministry in such a group or denomination. In principle, there is no reason why an evangelical believer could not accept a post on the faculty of the Harvard Divinity School however distasteful some of its theological opinions might be so long as he is not required to compromise his own convictions." Dr. Marion Reynolds of Los Angeles then observes: "Yet Dr. Lindsell's own experience at Fuller Seminary contradicts such an unscriptural principle. By Dr. Lindsell's own testimony, Fuller Seminary came into being to represent the biblical inerrancy position. What brought about the change? It was not because men of Fuller Seminary faculty were denied the right to teach biblical inerrancy. It was because men were accepted and remained on the faculty who did not believe in biblical inerrancy. "Whenever doctrinal infection is introduced into any group, it will spread unless it is removed. You do not stop infection of any kind by placing healthy persons in contact with those carrying the infection. Those who are well and knowledgeable do have a responsibility to warn against infection and identify its sources and carriers—but infection cannot be successfully combatted apart from separation and God's Word makes that abundantly clear. II Corinthians 6:14-18; Ephesians 5:11; II Thessalonians 3:6,14-15; II John 10-11."

ROCKEFELLER'S VISION OF A UNITED ECUMENICAL CHURCH WAS IRRESISTIBLE

Nelson Rockefeller's father did more financially to hasten the world church merger than any other one individual. His biography was written by the lawyer, Raymond B. Fosdick, a brother of the famous Harry Emerson Fosdick and also Under-Secretary General of the League of Nations. Entitled, "John D. Rockefeller, Jr.: A Portrait", (Harper, 1956), Mr. Fosdick quoted from an address before the Protestant Council of New York in February 1945, in which he revealed his vision for the one church: "It would pronounce ordinance, ritual, creed, all non-essential for admission into the Kingdom of God or His Church. A life, not a creed, would be its test; what a man does, not what he professes; what he is, not what he has. Its object would be to promote applied religion, not theoretical religion...Would that I had the power to bring to your minds the vision as it unfolds before me! I see all denominational emphasis set aside. I see co-operation not competition. In the large cities, I see great religious centers, wisely located, adequately equipped, strongly supported and inspiring their members to participation in all community matters. In smaller places, instead of a half dozen dying churches, competing with each other, I see one or two strong churches, uniting the Christian life of the town... I see the church moulding the thought of the world as it has never done before, leading in all great movements as it should. I see it literally establishing the Kingdom of God on earth. Shall this vision be realized? The future of the Christian Church depends on the answer Christian men and women give to that question." (p. 206).

Niebuhr denied the inerrancy of the Bible, the Divine conception of Christ, His virgin birth, and His bodily resurrection as the Son of God. For Carter to call himself a 'born-again believer' whose favorite theologian is Reinhold Niebuhr is like a rabbi saying his favorite politician is Hitler."

..The Castro Valley Ministerial Ass'n evidently had an election recently and Father Chrysostom Maniudakis was elected president, who is probably an eastern Orthodox Catholic. While our Church is often listed by them as a part of that association, we want it known publicly that this Church stands outside the ecumenical movement and claims to be a Fundamental Separatist Church.

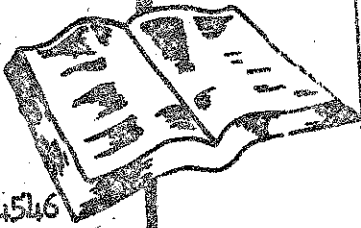

..He Worships Same God As The Jews..This kind of a statement will help him carry the important city of New York, which will help him carry the state of New York, which is essential to any democratic victory. Dr. Holland London and the California Graduate School of Theology are promoting the "Fourth Annual Pastors' Congress on Church Growth" at the largest New Evangelicalist church in the country at Van Nuys First Baptist Church in Southern California. Among the headliners are Dr. Charles Allen, whose United Methodist Church in Houston is identified with the National Council of Churches. In addition, they list Dr. W. A. Criswell, who served for two years as President of the Southern Baptist convention and one of the leading promoters of the convention at state convention meetings over the nation. Likewise, Dr. Malcom R. Cronk, who is usually listed with New Evangelists and who is pastor of the Church of the Open Door, which once was known as a great Fundamentalist Center of the West. Another leading speaker is Dr. Charles F. Stanley, pastor of the First Baptist Church of Atlanta Georgia, one of the outstanding Southern Baptist leaders today. Fundamentalists remember that not one of the six seminaries of the SBC teaches that the Bible is the objective revelation of God. Teamed with them is Dr. Jerry Falwell of Lynchburg, Virginia. But the thing that floors Fundamentalists is the presence of four more national leaders of the Baptist Bible Fellowship. The conference will also feature two noted black pulpit-eers; the eloquent Dr. S.M. Lockridge of San Diego, plus Dr. Ed V. Hill, who is associated frequently with the Billy Graham Crusades. This conference is promoted by a graduate school which probably gives the easiest Doctor of Philosophy degree with the least amount of effort in the country. Liberals have served on this faculty, along with Seventh Day Adventists, many New Evangelicalists, and several ministers who have been divorced. The extension classes are held in churches belonging to the National Council of Churches in some cases. Fundamentalists are watching this with much interest.

G. BROMLEY OXNAM'S ECUMENICAL VIEWS AND THE RECENT SPACECRAFT LANDING ON MARS

All that barren landscape on Mars which has been thrown on the TV screens as a result of a fantastically successful landing more than 200 million miles distant from earth, has brought to mind the statement made by the late ecumenical architect, Bishop G. Bromley Oxnam of the Methodist Church. Esquire magazine in January 1960 asked the Bishop to predict what would happen between 1960 and 1970. This false prophet wrote: "The decade's most dramatic event will be the Interplanetary Conference on Religious Faith to be attended by the finest minds of all the planets of the universe. It will be the first 'universal' conference on religion made possible by scientific mastery of space travel. Teachable humility will characterize the delegates who will represent the religious thought of all the planets and make known the revelation of God to all. Fundamentalist dogma and papal infallibility will have no place among men who love one another and seek the truth in freedom. It will be a 'sharing' conference. How did God make Himself known to the inhabitants of Mars? Through incarnation in a Person, by revelation in a Book, through the thinking of some scholar and saint? Is there evidence for immortality? The sessions will be televised and the universe will come to know the universal truth that frees." The demonstrated fact that not a spark of life can be found on this distant sphere points up the lamentably sad spiritual plight of this blind leader who not only misled the religious world with respect to this world but also the next. Fundamentalists should read again the keynote address which Bishop Oxnam delivered before the Fifth World Order Study Conference in Cleveland in 1958 sponsored by the National Council of Churches, which issued a call for the recognition of Red China. The address was entitled: "Christian Responsibility on a Changing Planet." He was brilliant, personable, and charming in many ways. He was then the most powerful Protestant leader in the USA, as President of the Methodist board of bishops, as first President of the World Council of Churches and as a member of its Central and Executive committees. As one has said: "He falsely uses the idea of bro-

JIMMY CARTER AND THEOLOGIAN PAUL TILLICH

Tillich's radical theology branded him actually as an atheist. He was the idol of thousands of young ministers in ecumenical denominations and it is impossible to estimate the theological damage he wrought on young scholars whose minds were cursed by his influence. It is quite possible that the admitted influence of Tillich on Jimmy Carter helps us to understand the absolutely incredible interview he gave to that pornographic magazine of obscene filth called Playboy, an interview which could conceivably cost him the election. Tillich's wife Hannah wrote a book after his death called "From Time to Time" (Stein and Day). What she wrote about this leftwing religious leader would provide solid evidence for a lawsuit for defamation of character. She wrote: "I was shocked and troubled when I found out about Paulus' inclination to pornography. He would cover a pornography book with an acceptable book during his rest hour. He hid his inclination from me for many years; I discovered it by chance one day in the United States. I cried and was so troubled about the deformation of the human image, as I saw it, that I talked to a friend, a psychoanalyst, who must have helped me greatly to understand the motive behind reading pornography... But he used me to order books for him and of course his many lady friends took pleasure in it. To them it was a welcome basis for conversation". (pp. 189-190). .. "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he". This is a Scripture which both Tillich and Mr. Carter might well remember. Mrs. Paul Tillich goes on to describe the wretched moral life of this liberal theological giant of this century, whom Jimmy Carter states as one of his four favorite theologians: "Our marriage had been broken into small pieces by the relentless assault of the many women not only his sweetheart who functioned as his secretary and who lived across the street from us in New York, but the emigre friends, newcomers, students, socialites, wives of friends... Only after a bottle of wine at midnight, alone with me, did he confide, admit, reassure, and talk about his infidelity as his predicament, adding that, if I were to remind him the next morning about our conversation, he would remember nothing" (p. 240)

He falsely uses the concept of the 'kingdom of God,' applying it to a visible, social, political, economic order which he and church leaders are seeking to bring to pass with the aid of political power. They are working for a one-world church." In the conclusion of his significant address, Bishop Oxnam stated: "Let us take up our Christian responsibility and in cooperation with brothers everywhere so change the planet that when our first visitors from Mars arrive they will find a society fit to be called The Kingdom of God." (Christian Beacon, 12-4-58, p. 5) The Biblical description of unregenerate man is found in Romans 1:30 which speaks about "...despiteful, proud, bcasters, inventers of evil things..." Every picture sent back from Mars seems to mock this arrogant prediction of this apostate bishop whose evolutionary and revolutionary views cannot allow for God's ordination of this earth as the theatre of the universe and the arena of faith.

OLD FASHIONED LIBERALISM OF WALTER JUDD

..Dr. W.B. Riley and Dr. Walter Judd...
The Northwestern Pilot for January 1943 had an article on page 110 entitled: "Dr. Walter Judd and the First Baptist Church", which covered an address by the noted medical missionary in China to the Minneapolis congregation's mission society of ladies. Dr. Riley stated: "Dr. Judd's address clearly indicated a modernistic attitude to the subject of foreign missions. He failed to distinguish between American civilization and Christianity". Dr. Riley's gracious concluding remarks: "Now after having made the above remarks, let me add that I was appreciative of Dr. Judd's address. It gave us, at least, the Modernist viewpoint of missions." Evidently someone had engaged the noted liberal to speak to the ladies without Dr. Riley's knowledge, and afterward Dr. Riley wrote the article to warn his people of Dr. Walter Judd's liberalism.

..Walter Judd's Liberalism Comes Through in an article in Christianity Today, June 23, 1958, entitled "World Issues and the Christian". Dr. Judd served as a medical missionary in China from 1925-1938, then was elected to Congress where he served for 16 years. He states: "What the people of the world need most is ministry. That has to come through persons who go not because our government sends them, but because they care about human beings who are in need and who are also God's children." (pgs 7-8) "It is the Christian church and Christian people that must be the leaven working in the world to change its character and to reform it...What deals with the human heart? Religion. In short, our greatest need is to recapture a faith in our faith, like the faith the communists share in theirs. Do we really believe in the leaven process? Do we really believe that the Christian gospel presented to men will change their hearts? If so, we'd better work in earnest. We are never again going to be able to relax until the communist conspiracy gives up its program of world conquest...The way to change Communism is to change communists, that is, change men through the Gospel. Surely God did not bring our beloved country to its position of unprecedented power and influence in the world for no great purpose. Surely he expects us and

..Place Your Faith in Mankind says the noted physician-statesman, Dr. Walter Judd--who is on the Advisory Board of Campus Crusade and the dedication speaker at Arrowhead Springs--brought a significant address at the very liberal First Congregational Church, San Francisco, on June 16, 1968. The 12 page sermon was published by the Church. He stated his humanistic convictions this way: "Man, as the anthropologists say, is the only animal that can step out of instinct. All the other animals live by instinct. Man can rise above instinct and be sublime, and he can step out of instinct and be cruel and sadistic and evil...The Christian religion puts its faith in human beings...This is why Christian churches have always sent out missionaries to share the best they knew in medicine, in agriculture, in education, and in that which gave them the motivation to do it--belief that there is a God and that every man is his child...The third, is that the Christian religion is the only thing I know that gives us an adequate concept for uniting the many different peoples of the earth into a world order...The Christian religion is the only thing that I know that gives not only an adequate concept around which you can intelligently hope to build a world that will last--it gives an adequate leader...The world goes to pieces before our eyes, shattered for lack of the willingness to follow, to discover reality or witness to the leadership of Jesus."

..How Shall We Analyze These Beliefs?...
Dr. Walter Judd evidently still holds to the old liberal post-millennial dream that the gospel will bring in some kind of a millenium. He is in serious error when he interprets the gospel as leaven since leaven is always and everywhere a type of evil in the Bible. He is right if he believes that the apostate church is operating as leaven--an evil influence in society. To him, the heart of the faith is faith in faith, or faith in the leavening process of religion, which of course is not the Christian faith at all. He evidently holds to the evolutionary hypothesis that man is an animal--the same beginning point of communism, which he professes to despise. The Christian faith does not put its faith in man--that's pure liberal unbelief. He repeatedly expresses his belief in the universal fatherhood of God and univer-

DIVIDED BY TRUTH OR UNITED BY ERROR

We came across a gem on separation, written by the late brilliant theologian, Edward John Carnell, penned in his earlier, more orthodox days before he succumbed to the logical outworkings of his New Evangelicalism at Fuller Seminary. In Christianity Today for Sept. 1, 1958, Dr. Carnell had a commendable five-page article, in which he said: "Martin Luther did not want to disturb the visible unity of Christendom. But he did not see how such a disturbance could be avoided, for the gospel of Rome and the gospel of Scripture were different gospels. A tragic moral choice had to be made. Luther had to decide between a united church that taught error and a divided church that at least allowed for the possibility of truth. And being bound by the Word of God, he threw himself on the higher alternative. When a decision must be made between unity and truth, unity must yield to truth; for it is better to be divided by truth than to be united by error. We test the church by truth, not truth by the church. The apostles judged the Christian community by the norm of divine revelation. Each generation must make this same tragic moral choice--and not only once but again and again. If we want the comfort of the Christian gospel, we must accept the distress of a divided church. When men are free to unite in Christ, they are also free to divide in Christ. Religious liberty brings dissension, and dissension brings disunity. (He cites I Cor. 11:19)...If we remove the threat of factions, we corrupt the very matrix of evangelical confrontation. Sincere and unavoidable divisions should excite a sense of honor, not shame in us." It is incredible that the one who wrote these lucid words was found dead of barbituate intoxication in his room in the Claremont Hotel in Berkeley one hour before he was scheduled to deliver a feature address before a national Catholic ecumenical congress on how to win the conservative evangelical to the ecumenical movement.

SHOULD A BORN AGAIN CATHOLIC SEPARATE?

The noted evangelical authority on Roman Catholics here on the West Coast, Rev. Bill Jackson of the Conversion Center in San Jose published a folder entitled: "Charismatic Catholics." He states: "A person who claims to be a born again Christian and remains in the Roman Catholic Church is ignorant, disobedient or hypocritical. Human arguments sound good (Shouldn't we go back to the Roman Catholic Church and evangelize? How can we win them if we leave? Would not they be offended if we suggested the Roman Catholic Church was not a Christian Church?) But we are left with the simple choice of believing human logic or believing the Word of God. He told his people to come out of paganism and idolotry (II Corinthians 6:14-18). Some converted Roman Catholics may be ignorant of this, and we can help them by showing them what the Bible says. Instead of waiting for a personal revelation from the Holy Spirit, they should obey what He has written to all. While the word 'hypocrite' sounds very ugly, it merely means 'play-acting', or pretending to be what you are not. If you are a truly converted child of God (Born of God according to I John 5:1), and you attend mass, pretending to participate but knowing that its 'sacrifice' is void of spiritual benefit, you are 'play-acting'; you are a hypocrite. On the other hand, there are people who are still convinced Roman Catholics; they still look to the sacraments to remove sin and are therefore not relying on and trusting in the perfect work of Christ. If they pretend to be evangelical Christians, they are hypocrites. Therefore, it is essential that every truly born again child of God separate from the church of Rome or any other false system of religion and unite with a Bible believing fundamental Christian local church so that they can serve God in true obedience. These Biblical truths are offered in a spirit of true Christian love. We ask you to consider them objectively so that with the Psalmist you can declare, 'I have chosen the way of truth' (Psalm 119:30)." ..Episcopal Church Admits Homosexuals..A form letter from Bishop James P. Dees of the separatist Anglican Orthodox Church states: "At its General Convention in Minneapolis in September, the Episcopal Church voted to accept practicing homosexuals into membership in good standing. This is an insult to the Lord of life, and it is insulting to all Christians who are seeking to serve God and live moral lives. ..Carter is Likened to Pontius Pilate.. Dr. Harold O. J. Brown, prominent protestant professor at Trinity Divinity School at Deerfield, Illinois, accused Carter of abandoning spiritual principles in his pro-abortion position. "For someone to say that he is morally opposed to abortion and then that he is against doing anything to stop the present flood of abortions is rather like Pontius Pilate's actions in washing his hands at the trial of Jesus. Pilate didn't fool many people then...and this sort of thing will not fool many today. If it is true that Governor Carter personally intervened to change the vote of several platform committee members to get a pro-abortion plank into the Democratic platform, then he is making it clear what he means when he says that his evangelical Christian commitment will not have any influence on his political conduct." ..Carter's views on morals were learned from a leftwing rock singer, and not from the Bible. Time magazine for May 10, 1976 quoted Mr. Carter, after he acknowledged indebtedness to radical theologian Reinhold Niebuhr, he stated: "The other source of my understanding about what's right and wrong in this society is from a friend of mine, a poet named Bob Dylan. After listening to his records...I've learned to appreciate the dynamism of change in a modern society." And who is Bob Dylan? The Berkeley Citizens United Bulletin (Vol. XVII, No. 8, 1976) stated on Page 6: "Bob Dylan is a poet-musician for the far, far left; he is Marxist-inclined; a revolutionary of the typical hate America breed; and associate of the radical left."
