THE FIRST CHURCH OF MODERNISM IN THE USA

This would have to be Riverside Church, New York City, which was built and endowed by millions of Rockefeller money. Christianity Today for Oct. 22,1976 stated on page 62: "American Baptist executive Jitsuo Morikawa will serve for one year as interim pastor of the well-known liberal Riverside Church in New York City ... " Listen to this piece of deception about this new pastoral relationship from the American Baptist magazine for Jan. 1977 (p.32): "Riverside Church has been noted for great preachers proclaiming the power of the gospel. One cannot help feeling that the Spirit of God has moved at this time to bring these two together. Who knows what newness may emerge?" It is interesting that the new pastor of Riverside received his training at BIOLA when it was located in Los Angeles. What does Dr. Morikawa believe? He first rejects the idea of individual salvation. He was quoted in Christianity Today for Jan 6, 1966: "God has already won a mighty redemption...for the entire world...the task of world is to tell all men...that they already belong to Christ ... The redemption of the world is not dependent upon the souls we win for Jesus Christ ... There cannot be individual salvation ... Salvation has more to do with the whole society than with the individual soul ... We must not be satisfied to win people one by one ... Contemporary evangelism is moving away from winning souls one by one to the evangelization of the structures of society."The Gospel according to Morikawa includes not only a pious universalism, but also a rejection of the idea of condemnation of those outside of Christ. He states: "The joyous urgency of the apostles could hardly have been rooted in the fear of damnation of all men who do not acknowledge Christ ... to proclaim the Gospel is to go to all men, to confirm our unity with them in Christ ... You are called to be ministers of the good news. Do you have good news for all men, for the exploited and the unjust, for the saint and the sinner, for the religious and the irreligious, for the post Christian man of unbelief? Or is it good news only for those who obey, only to those who decide, only to those who worship so your gospel is restricted in its goodness, confining in its breadth, a new law (Continued Page 2, Column 2)

WORLD'S BIGGEST EVANGELISTIC CONGLOMERATE

Time magazine for Jan. 3, 1977, which is worth purchasing, states that Bill Bright of Campus Crusade is out to raise \$100 million for his world operations. He claims to have 400,000 volunteers working in the USA giving out his 77word version of Christianity, the Four Spiritual Laws. His staff numbers 5,300 of whom 1,100 are foreign nationals working in 84 countries. He is on 426 US colleges and universities. The \$34 million a year operation is based at Arrowhead Springs near San Bernardino. On Oct. 10, ex-Black Panther Eldridge Cleaver and his wife Kathleen were baptized in the swimming pool. A surprising note is that less than 5% of his staff have had any theological training. 1976 his staff presented the four spirit ual laws to 1.9 million persons in the USA, logging 150,000 "conversions". Bright now rivals Billy Graham and Bill Gothard in evangelical appeal. With all of this evangelistic activity, surely America should have a spiritual revival but the truth is that the morals of this nation are worse than at any time, apostasy is overwhelming Christianity, churches sound in the Faith are increasingly hard to find, and the Faith revealed in the Bible is slowly disappearing from the earth. Jesus may not have been wrong when He said, "Nevertheless when the Son of Man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth." Luke 18:8.

BILLY GRAHAM AND JESUS' DRINKING HABITS

.. Billy Graham and Worldliness.. While endorsing Jimmy Carter's drinking habits recently in Miami, Billy Graham was quoted in the press: "I think most Baptists and some Christians today are coming to see that some of the rules we attached to Christianity were very much like the Pharisees in old-fashioned Judaism. They attached certain rules and regulations that really weren't taught in the law and we've attached things to Christianity that weren't there." Remember Dr. Chas. Woodbridge's Four-fold description of New Evangelicalism: It represents a shift in mood, methodology, doctrine and ethics. Billy Graham's ethics have evidently shifted a great deal from the days when he enforced the rules back at Northwestern College in 1947-51.

This is a New Evangelicalist school which gives a cheap and easy PhD degree, plus a lot of honorary doctorates to some fundamentalists who should know better. This faculty has had Seventh Day Adventists, liberals, New Evangelicalists, American Baptist Convention leaders. No one should ever confuse it, or the president, as a Fundamental-

LIBERALS, NEW EVANGELICALS WHY CATHOLICS. CAN UNITE IN THE CHARISMATIC MOVEMENT

Richard Quebedeaux of the Baptist General Conference has produced a new book "The New Charismatics" (Doubleday). This remarkable revealing book was reviewed by Robert Cleath, PhD in the National Courier for Jan. 21, 1977, a tongues paper. He states: "Quebedeaux sets forth the distinctive theological posture of the movement. He states: 'Charismatic renewal rejects the liberal, nonsuper-natural god who really isn't there anyhow, but it also rejects the rational evangelical god of the intellect--the great giver of propositional truth--in favor of the God you can feel, respond to, and love; the God who cares about our present and our future. It is the knowledge of this God, given through the experience of His Holy Spirit, that binds charismatics together. The movement celebrates the living God who is totally committed to work in evidential ways through the lives of those committed to Him. The author writes that subservient to the Holy Spirit's authority. Thus the gift of prophecy in the life of the church is existentially the Word of God that may go beyond Scripture. He quotes Rodman Williams of Melodyland School of Theology on this point: 'The Spirit as the living God moves through and beyond the records of past witness, however valuable such records are as a model for what happens today. For in the Spirit, the present fellowship is as much the arena of God's vital presence as anything in the biblical account. The primacy of a common experience that leads to theological truth in Pentecostalism is one reason, says Quebedeaux, 'why evangelicals, liberals and Roman Catholics have been joined together (spiritually at least) for the first time. ... If the author in stating that experience rather than Scripture is basic as authority in charismatic renewal, the movement may eventually drift into serious doctrinal errors and excessive psychologically induced practices justified on the basis of subjective judgments." This points up a serious error of the charismatics -- their source of knowledge of God and authority is in their experience rather than in the Holy Scriptures. CHURCHES MUST SUPPORT GOOD SEMINARIES

Dr. A. Duane Litfin wrote about question of financial support: "The most obvious answer, it seems, is that the local church must step into the gap. Even though most congregations are feeling deeply the economic crunch, the training of future leaders ought to be high on their list of priorities. Regrettably, many congregations are willing to support a person only after he or she has been trained and is ready to come as a pastor or begin service as a missionary. What about all that is gone into making that person what he or she is? Should not the churches be willing to help support a seminarian's training as well as his consequent ministry?" (Christian Today, Feb. 13, 1976, p. 11).

THE AMAZING FLOW OF ECUMENICAL EVENTS

.Baptist Hired on Catholic Staff. Out of an old Eternity issue of Nov. 1971, p. 39; we read about Catholic dialogue in Columbia: "Since that time there has been increasing cooperation between Catholics and Protestants in the distribution of Bibles, in Bible study, in the use of modern communications media, and in social concerns. In one area a Catholic parish has even hired a Baptist minister to be an assistant pastor, and neighborhood evangelism is being conducted by Catholic laymen with the aid of materials built around the 'Four Spiritual Laws.'"

.. Resuming Fellowship with the Pope.. The leftwing Lutheran radical, Richard John Meuhaus of Brooklyn, addressed the liberal Seminex in St. Louis: "Theologically historically, and strategically, the immediate task of Lutherans is the resumption of eucharistic fellowship with the Bishop of Rome and with those who are in fellowship with him... Ecumenism is not finally motored by the desire for a united and more effective cooperation among Christians, nor by the desire to deprive the world of the offense it takes in the divisions manifested by Christians. Ecumenism is made mandatory by the very nature of the Eucharist." (Chr. Century, Mar. 23, 1977, p. 271)

.. Theological Barriers to Fellowship at Eucharist have not evaporated says the "Long Island Catholic": "This is definitely not so... Pastor Neuhaus apparently believes that serious doctrinal disagreements can and should be clothed over by a common celebration of the Eucharist. This is a very Protestant point of view, but not a Catholic or an Orthodox point of view...When we can say together, 'I believe and profess all that the holy Catholic Church believes, teaches and proclaims to be revealed by God' -even if we don't understand it fullyand articulate it in exactly the same way-we can resume eucharistic fellowship. Not before." Evidently Rome has not changed one iota. (Christian Century, Mar. 23, 1977).

.. New Chancellor at Catholic University The San Francisco Chronicle for June 6, 1977 carried the news of the local Jesuit institution: "The Rev. Charles W. Dullea, S.J., has been named chancellor of the University of San Francisco by (Continued Page 2, Column 2)



DR. W. A. CRISWELL WHITEWASHES THE SBC

These sad words are found in the Dallas First Baptist Reminder for June 10,1977 in the "Pastor's Pen" column: "Often I am asked about a supposed and so-called liberal drift to the left in our Southern Baptist Convention. Uncounted lettcome to me concerning the subject, beside personal confrontations and telephone calls. There is always a posit-ive and assuring answer from my deepest conviction and from my observations that cover half a century. If you had all 13,000,000 members of the Southern Baptist Convertion in one review before you, you would find that 12,990,000 of them are as true to the Word of God, as committed to an Evangelistic program, as desirous to open the services of the church for spiritual response, as is the pastor and people of the First Baptist Church in Dallas. It is that little handful of termites who dig at the Foundation of the historical conviction and doctrines and practices of our beloved denomination that give some impression that our whole group is turning half-infidel and half-liberal." WHERE IS MOODY BIBLE INSTITUTE COING?

We have always had a soft spot in our hearts toward Moody Hible Institute since the father of the Blu-Print editor, Frederick Villiam Weniger, attended Moody Bible Institute when Moody was alive and was a good friend of Moody. However, consider this disturbing fact sent in by a prominent Fundamentalist in the Chicago area: "On June 13,1977, radio station WMBI carried a short program, about 10 minutes in length, relating the life story of one 'Brother Lawrence' who it was said, joined a Carmelite Order in Europe in the 1600's (to the best of my recollection). His life and philosophy was held up during the program as a fine example of Christianity, and was presented in a manner clearly intended to cause Christians to admire and seek to emulate 'Brother Lawrence's' example. Program was produced by Guidelines, Box 202, Redondo Beach, California 90277. Questions 1) Is WMBI now presenting Roman Catholics as if they were Christians? 2) The fact that the Carmelite Order is a Roman Catholic institution was not so much as mentioned. Why? 3) Dr. Donald Smith, chairman of Moody Bible Institute's communications department, will participate in a tent meeting in Bensenville, Ill. on July 3, 1977, according to the Bensenville Chronicle of June 9, 1977. The tent meeting is a cooperative effort by a local Lutheran Church and a Local Roman Catholic Church, according to the article, and a Jesuit priest is scheduled to address the tent meeting on June 15, 1977. Has WMBI and Moody Bible Institute joined hands with the Roman Catholic Church in 'ecumenical' endeavors, and in seeking to bring Christians into union with Romanism?" In the light of this and several other developments of kindred nature over the years, Christian people are urged to write the President of Moody and WMBI, Dr. George Sweeting, 820 North LaSalle St., Chicago, Ill. 60610, and ask for his justification for a school that was started by Fundamentalists and professedly continues this position.

In the June 1977 issue he shows his sympathy for wedding the social gospel and the New Testament Gospel as he cites Editor Jim Wallis of Soujourners: "He is convinced that our conception of the Gospel is a fractured thing unless it stands related to the whole of man in the totality of his relationships and responsibilities. Contemporary evangelicals, he feels, do a double-take on doctrine and a cop-out on discipleship. Even if they talk discipleship, it is safely pictistic (prayers, Bible Study, personal witnessing, etc.) rather than daringly prophetic. Thus: The United States is able to subsidize dozens of dictatorships-and still be the leader of the Free World. The American people are able to gobble up half the world's consumable resources and still 'praise God from whom all blessings flow." Ed: By "dozens of dictatorships", he means anti-communist governments such as Chile and Korea.

. Evangelicals Follow Catholic Evolutionist.. The Catholic Voice for June 20, 1977, р. 4: "Some scholars are attempting to find a synthesis that would provide a 'Christian evolutionary theory'. Many of those taking this bent have turned to the writings of the late Jesuit paleontologist Pierre Theilhard de Chardin. In his most famous book 'The Phenomenon of Man,' Teilhard 'Though frightened for a moment by evolution, the Christian now perceives that what it offers him is nothing but a magnificent means of feeling more at one with God and of giving himself more to him.'" Many New Evangelicals are enamored of Teilhard.



THE CATHOLIC-LED CHARISMATIC CONFERENCE IS LARGEST ECUMENICAL MEETING IN HISTORY

.. It meets in Kansas City but is run

from South Bend. The Catholic Voice for

June 20, 1977 stated: "More than 60,000 Catholic and Protestant Charismatics are expected to gather in Kansas City, ... for a four-day national convention July 20-24. The largely Catholic event which is held annually will carry an ecumenical slant this year...and will feature as guest speakers notables in the likes of Dr. David Duplessis, leader of the protestant Pentecostal movement... The meeting will also bring together international personalities like Cardinal Leon-Joseph Suenens, Belgium leader of the Renewal, Mrs. Maria von Trapp..." . Roman Catholic Kevin Ranaghan of Notre Dame is the leader of it all. In an interview in Christian Life magazine for July 1977, he said, "This is a conference of brothers and sisters in Christ, who normally, are separated from each other. We are coming together in unity around the Lordship of Jesus Christ and in the power of the Holy Spirit to worship the Father and to give common witness to the life we share. Yet, at the same time, we are coming together as Baptists, Catholics, Episcopalians, Presbyterians, Pentecostals, Memnonites, Messianic believers, and the rest. We are not coming together nondenominationally as a whole, but we are coming together as who we are, members of the Christian churches to which we belong, in which we seek to grow, which we seek to serve, and which in fact make up the collective Body of Christ in the U.S. today. And it is this coming together that I believe is the most significant thing about the Kansas City conference." p. 77

LATE CHARISMATIC ECUMENICAL NEWS

... Charismatics are loyal to CATHOLICISM. The National Courier for July 22, 1977 speaks a language that is foreign to historic evangelicalism. In the main editorial on page 18: "We are happy that Catholic charismatics are, generally speaking, so faithful and loyal to the tradition of their church, even though they may at times, as Ralph Martin, a popular lay leader, has said, need to speak prophetically to the church. We are also encouraged by the ecumenical spirit of Catholic charismatics and their openness to persons of other theological traditions. With their long tradition, Catholics can give to the worldwide renewal a depth and balance for which non-Catholics can be grateful."

..Tongues Lead the Way to Ecumenism..

Within the Charismatic renewal, Father
(Dennis) Bennett, who is rector of St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Seattle, sees an awareness that charismatics have the responsibility of speaking to their own particular traditions from within those traditions. "This is a reversal of the trend of people to leave those traditions, ' he says. 'We survived the threat of the formation of a new charismatic denomination. I think it's still a threat. I think this is still in the minds of some but I hope it won't happen.' Discussing ecumenism, Father Bennett said, 'If charismatic renewal can penetrate those churches, we'll see cooperation and a coming together of those congregations. All kinds of exciting things could happen."

Father Bertolucci also points out the renewal's contributions to the ecumenical movement. 

The same issue of the Oakland Tribune (6-24-77) shows that Ernie Ford is in a series of appearances at John Ascuaga's Nugget, "Reno Area's Largest Casino Hotel and Restaurant and Entertainment Center". No amount of Gospel song albums from the New Evangelicalist Word, Inc. (owned by ABC now), will cover up this identification with gambling wickedness.

GRAND STATEMENT OF SEPARATION BY DeHAAN

The noted Dr. M.R. DeHaan, founder and preacher of the Radio Bible Class, wrote a number of books including 'Daniel-The Prophet." He stated on pages 38-39 in comment on the first chapter of Daniel: Without fear of successful contradiction we dare to say that the greatest need of the Church today is a company of separated saints of God who will refuse steadfastly to be swayed by the world's program or the visible Church's apostasy No greater blight has ever beset the Church of Jesus Christ than the blight of compromise and conformity to the world and its program. We are a redeemed people, a peculiar people and an holy nation. We are to shine as lights in the world and firmly refuse to bow before the gods of compromise and worldly standards. The line of difference and demarcation between the Church and the world has almost been wiped out, and those few of Christ's followers who dare to be different and refuse to go along with the crowd are so small in number that they are looked upon as odd and peculiar, and even fanatical and narrow-minded. It does cost something to be different and separate, but it is the only way which leads to the highest reward. The whole Bible pleads for a life and walk of separation among believers." The San Francisco Eaptist Seminary indoctrinates its students in this militant position of separation.

RANK LIBERAL EVALUATES NEW ALLIES

Dr. Martin Marty of University of Chicago, a Lutheran liberal of radical sympathies wrote an article evaluating New Evangelicals and rejoicing in their radical social action policies and politics: Entitled, "A New Fire is Glowing", he concluded: "Any advice? KETCHAM WARNED AGAINST THE MOODY PULPIT

Among the great addresses given twenty years ago at the Silver anniversary of the GARBC in Grand Rapids was Dr. Chester E. Tulga's message on Fundamentalism and then the Keynote address on May 14, 1957 by the national GARBC representative Dr. Robert T. Ketcham, one of the authentic giants of Fundamentalism. He warned his fellow GARBC folk against two dangers Being Ashamed of the historic title "Baptist," and Fuzziness on the Matter of Separation. He then cited the illustration of the huge Moody Church. "I am disturbed when I see scores of our fine young men and women from our GARB churches across the country, coming to Chicago for their Bible training and seldom if ever showing up in one of our Chicago GARB churches. Pastor Hamilton in the Belden Avenue Baptist Church has a fleet of cars at the church door every Sunday morning to take back to the Moody Bible Institute any students who come to the morning service, but this great church in Chicago seldom sees a dozen of these students during the course of the year. Where do they go? Most of them go down to the Moody Memorial Church. I have no argument with the Moody Church, although I do with its pastor, who for two successive years now, has been the Lenten week noonday preacher in the downtown loop Methodist Temple, under the auspices of the Chicago City Council of Churches. This council is noted as one of the most modernistic religious organizations in the country. I have no argument with the great Moody Church, but I am wondering the sense of Baptist loyalty has gone to when our GARB young people, by the score, flock there on Sundays instead of to our own churches. We had better watch our axe head, brethren." Times have changed and now the pastor of the Moody Church is the honored conference speaker at several schools training men for the ministry, such as Grand Rapids, Denver Seminary, and Western Baptist Bible College. What has happened since Dr. Ketcham's warning?



• His Pilgrimage to Pro-Socialism • Christian News for 9/5/77, p. 3 states: "The August 29 Newsweek says in a story on Evangelist Billy Graham's recent trip to Communist Hungary that 'Graham's nonaligned message may make his still fervently anti-Communist followers nervous ... Newsweek noted: 'Graham's trip comes at a time when his views on Christianity under Communism are changing. In many of his fiery sermons of the '50s, Graham attacked Communists as 'inspired by Sat-'50s, Graham an. But after 1960, Graham put such anti Communist gospel behind him. In his 1967 visit to Yugoslavia, the evangelist urged Christians there to obey those in authority.' Since then, Graham told Newsweek, 'every country I go into has some form of socialism -- including the U.S. I've decided that if I am to have a world ministry, I'll have to leave political questions alone. Moreover, Billy believes criticizing governments in un-Biblical !!!

··<u>Wis N</u>ew Moderate Views on Communism... The Oakland Tribune for Aug. 30, 1977 on page 6E reported concerning his trip to Budapest: "As a young preacher in the American South, the Rev. Mr. Graham gained fame as a staunch anti-communist. But in recent years he has not been as virulent as some American evangelists in his denunciation of communist atheism, although he has maintained his views." He was welcomed to communist Hungary by Alexander Bichkov of the Soviet Union, general secretary of the World Baptist Federation. This fellowwas branded as an agent of the secret police by Russian emigrant Paul Voronoff. Bichkov was honored by Dr. W.A. Criswell in his Dallas pulpit last year.

The Christian Beacon for Sept. 6, 1977 states: "Graham has never been a leader. He has always been a follower of trends which he believes are going in a favorable direction for most of the people... He is now captivated by the Communist conspiracy. He has become their man to be used by them in further deceiving the West. Antichrist rules in Hungary. It is an atheistic, Communistic state that has enslaved the church and made the church an instrument of slavery, the enslaving of all its inhabitants. Graham has betrayed the martyred. A highly select group of leaders from sixteen states gathered in the huge convention facilities of the Ramada Inn near Chicago's O'Hare Airport on Sept.22 and 23, 1977 to map serious plans to expand the ministry of the Fundamental Baptist Fellowship. Dr. G. Archer Weniger, president for the past 13 years, presided over the sessions on Sept. 22, 1977 and asked to be relieved of this aspect of leadership. He then recommended the selection of Dr. Rodney Bell of the huge Tabernacle Baptist Church and schools of Virginia Beach, as the new President. Dr. Bell then outlined a series of steps and a program of action, designed to make the FBF more national than ever. Five regional groups were formed involving the whole nation. He endorses this program enthusiastically and believes in the integrity, ability, and positive approach of Dr. Rodney Bell. More about this decisive series of actions shortly. 

In Budapest on Sept. 9, the AP reported: "Billy Graham says that his first crusade behind the Iron Curtain has changed his thinking about Communism and has been a great success. 'I have not joined the Communist Party, nor have I been asked to join,' Graham tells newsmen, 'but the world is changing and both sides are beginning to understand each other more now.' He says that he achieved all his objectives in Hungary: to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ, to meet church leaders, to see how the church exists in a socialistic society, to get a perspective of Christians in a Socialist society, and to build bridges of understanding between people. 'I have learned many things' says the evangelist. 'People come to church and worship God. There were no preconditions or restraints on my preaching at any time. " This is the kind of naive propaganda message which the Communists want him to bring back to the Free World. Dr. Graham, with his immense influence, has done enormous damage to the cause of the Free World. What must the underground Christians think, when an evangelical makes a slave society look so good?

.. "Present Truth" Magazine Exposed. The Christian News for Aug. 29, 1977 had a lengthy critical article. In addition to rejection of the doctrine of the immortality of the soul, the article stated: "...any publication presenting a theology which approves of, and asserts that, Bonhoeffer, Kierkegaard, Thielicke, Althaus, Karl Barth, Calvin, etc. are 'orthodox' and of the same standing as Luther, to name only one, such a publication must be read with extreme caution." Present Truth has been mailed widely to min-

isters across the nation. ..Baptist Bible College of Denver goes into the GARB. The Biblical Evangelist for Sept. 1977, Which is edited by the noted evangelist, Dr. Robert Sumner, summed up the recent GARBC convention in Iowa: "The only real surprise of the meeting was the addition, by the Council of 18, of the Baptist Bible College of Denver to the list of approved associational schools. This is a strongly Calvinistic school and probably joins the Baptist Bible College of Clarks Summit as the most Calvinistic on the approved list." This college, which was founded in 1952 in Beth Eden Baptist Church of Denver, was once strongly identified with the Fundamental Captist Fellowship. .. Southern Baptist Charismatics are growing fast, according to the National Co-urier for Sept. 2, 1977. On Page 11, while reporting the second national charismatic conference for Southern Baptists in Dallas July 27-29, 1977: "Though charismatic Baptist churches continue to be ostracized by their local Baptist associations, the Dallas convention indicates the charismatics are growing in numbers. The three-day meeting drew 3,500 Southern Baptists, including 100 ministers, from 31 states -- an increase of 1,400 (Continued left column this side)

AN ECUMENICAL EXTRAVAGANZA IN DENVER SPONSORED BY NEW EVANGELICAL LEADERS

One of the wildest ecumenical gatherings one could imagine is scheduled for October 15, 1977 featuring Watergate figure Charles Colson and former democratic senator Harold Hughes of Iowa at a Denver sports arena. The sponsoring committee, headed by Dr. Vernon Grounds of the CBA Seminary in Denver sent out a letter on August 26, 1977 stating: "Cutting across all differences of religion, race, culture, and class, this really will be a venture in unified cooperation such as Colorado has perhaps never previously seen." They are so right. Joining Dr. Grounds in sponsoring this totally ecumenical gathering included: Catholic Archbishop James V. Casey; Dr. S. Jameson Jones of the very liberal Methodist Iliff seminary; Episcopal Bishop Wm. C. Frey and Rev. W. Spencer Wren, executive director of the Council of Churches. Representing the Conservative Baptists on the sponsoring committee are: Dr. Robert Frederick of Galilee Baptist and Rev. Edward Pittman of the Rocky Mountain CBA Other sponsors include Dr. David Beckman of Rockmont College, Mr. Wm. D. Boyd of Western Bible College, and Charles Blair of the charismatic Calvary Temple, which held the Denver headlines with its bankruptcy problems and fraud trials. Other sponsors included the leaders of the following organizations: Youth for Christ, Navigators, Campus Crusade, New Life in Christ Foundation, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Christian Businessmen, Young Life Campaign, Bible Study Fellowship, Assemblies of God, plus several liberal churches. One of the characteristics of New Evangelicalism is its affinity for ecumenical projects as well as broad affiliations, along with a rejection of Biblical Separation from apostasy, heresy, inclusivism and unbelief. This is a remarkable demonstration. .. continued. derstand that fact and still be a Christian. If he understands what evolution is and still says he's a Christian, I don't think that's possible." Fuller Seminary Openly for Evolution. The National Courier, a charismatic periodical, on June 24, 1977 reported on p. 3: "Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, Calif., a Scripture professor, Dr. W. Sanford LaSor, says he holds to theistic evolution, believing both that evolution occurred and that God is the creator of all things. Even if you believe that man evolved from lower forms of life, you still have this distinct act of breathing in the divine image, he adds. That would be the unique creative act in the case of man. " This is not the only time Dr. LaSor has publicly admitted he holds to an animal ancestry of man. He once debated for evolution on Los Angeles TV against Dr. Robt. Kofahl,

a noted creationist. Dr. Ockenga's Seminary Tolerates this form of evolution likewise. The National Courier continues: "At Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary in South Hamilton, Mass., Dr. Douglas Stuart, a Scripture professor, says man could have evolved from lower creatures, but what you have is a special intervention of God in the whole creative process at the point of the creation of human beings.' Discussing the Genesis accounts, Dr. Stuart says, 'The story is very selective. The Bible doesn't care about the scientific aspects and I'm glad that it doesn't. It would be terribly boring if it did.'" If Drs. Hubbard of Fuller and Ockenga of Gordon had not been so anesthetized for so long by gradual compromise and unbelief they might have fired these fellows a long time ago for such anti-Scriptural error. Columbia Bible College Shows Softness.. The National Courier reports: "Paul Ferris, an Old Testament professor at Colu-mbia Bible College in South Carolina, says the Genesis text don't require belief that creation occurred in six 24-hour days, 'The normal image of the word 'day' in the Old Testament can be understood as other than a 24-hour period, he says. Although he disagrees with the evolutionary theory, he thinks one can believe in it and still be a Christian. 'I think he's got some problems, but I think he can be a Christian, he says." Dr. Robt. ONE OF CARTER'S FAVORITE THEOLOGIANS THE INSANITY OF SOREN KIERKEGAARD

During the presidential campaign of 1976 Jimmy Carter let it be known that his Jimmy Carter let it be known that his four favorite theologians were: Reinhold Niebuhr, Paul Tillich, Karl Barth, and Soren Kierkegaard. Not one of these be-Lieved the orthodox Christian Faith, and not one believed that the Bible was the objective, divinely inspired revelation of God. It happens that Jimmy Carter's Kierkegaard was insane for 21 years until his death at 43 years, with empty liquor bottles all around him. The documentation of this insanity can be found in "Varieties of Christian Experience" (Augsburg) pp. 106, 113, 114. The author is Dr. Svere Norborg, Ph.D (U. of Cslo) Who taught at University of Minnesota in the Philosophy Department. He writes: "In the autumn of 1835 comes the fatal breakdown, that never was healed. He has covered up that accident or incident with the mystifying, willed fog of anonymous confession. . Wistorical analyses by Landmark, Heiberg, Hirsch, Geismar, File-Kilde and others together with a remarkable psychiatric study by Hjalmar Helweg, seem to point to both. From the age of twenty-two till a releasing death at forty-three, Soren Kierkegaard suffered from a manic-depressive insanity, according to psychiatric standards." Remember, this was written by an admirer and disciple of S.K. In a footnote at bottom of page 114, he states: "For analysis of Kierkegaard's mental illness the decisive source is H. Helweg: S. Kierkegaard. In Psykiatrist Studie. " Dr. Norborg states on page 106: "Scandinavia has given world literature three great names. All three were mentally absolutely sick men: Ibsen, Strindberg, and Kierkegaard." On page 113, Dr. Norborg wrote: "in conclusion: The tragedy of Soren Kierkegaard. A psychopathic soul, an eremite, a life-long martyrdom. He was born with a psychopathic burden, he had more added later on in life, giving as a total picture a manic-depressive personality." Kierkegaard must be regarded as the father of existential philosophy (both theistic and atheistic) and the "grandfather" of the wickedly deceptive system of Neo-orthodoxy, after Karl Barth. Sixteen years ago Eternity magazine had an article in the October 1961 issue by Wm. J. Krutza on 'We've Gone Success Crazy." It is revealing indeed. By modern synthetic measurements being taught in some shallow schools, one would have to judge Jesus as a failure. We realize that Eternity is a New Evangelical periodical but the law of averages would allow them to have a good article now and then. The concluding paragraph: "Faithfulness is far more important than successfulness, for we can be faithful to a minority truth in a majority corrupt society. Christianity always involves us in a moral tangle with an immoral society. The stand against sin and against worldly popularity might not be the will of the majority, or might not make our pastors and churches popular successes, but we can be assured that God will look in pleasure upon those who are willing to deny self, take up the cross, and follow Him. The homey illustration of the hare and tortoise pictures this quite vividly. The hare, bent upon attracting attention to himself, strutted before the crowd. All the spectators were for him, some of them even thought out loud, 'What a ridiculous fete for a tortoise.' But while the crowd cheered the hare and tormented the turtle, the clumsy turtle just kept walking, doing faithfully what he was able to do. His slow gait lacked the popular appeal, yet he passed the hare and received the reward for faithfully walking and winning the race. Perhaps it shall be this way in the Great Day when the Lord evaluates the pastors, the churches they served, and the people of the churches. 'Be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life. "

A. Yes, I do. It is the main deterrant to the crime of murder. God gave us a ruling in this matter long before the law was given. Genesis 9:5-6: '...At the hand of every man's brother will I require the life of man. Whoso sheddeth man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed: for in the image of God made he man.' This is a judicial decision which has nothing to do with personal revenge or personal hatred. The command Thou shalt not kill! in the decalogue refers to murder, and judicial taking of life for murder is not in the same category at all. That kind of reasoning is based upon sickly sentiment and has no foundation in the Word of God."

BLINDNESS OF CANADIAN NEW EVANGELICALISM

The NAE of Canada is known as the Evangelical Fellowship of Canada, whose president is Dr. Charles Seidenspinner. In the EFC paper "Thrust" for second quarter of 1977 Dr. Seidenspinner had an incredible article entitled "True Liberation." As examples of those liberated from sin and emancipated through the power of Christ he names Walter Rauschen-bush and Albert Schweitzer. Here is the shocking paragraph: "The Liberation brought about in the Gospels is not first a freedom from a particular cultist or culture, though this could follow through the impact of liberated lives. It is not simply the capturing and development of symbols so that God would become black or yellow or white, rather it calls men of all cultures, color and class to realize their deep need of being related to God. This relationship comes by the liberation from the guilt and sin and emancipation from its power through Jesus Christ. As a byproduct impact is made on the world community by those liberated lives delivered from selfishness and egocentricity and made to look at the world through the eyes of their Liberator, the Lord Jesus Christ. It was through such an emancipation that Lord Wilberforce in his day came to have deep concern about economic justice. Walter Rauschenbush, Frances Willard, Janne Adams (sic), Albert Schwitzer (sic) and others sought to bring about changes in the society of their day. In their love, concern and work they reflected their own liberation and in turn the flow and concern of the Love of God seeking to meet the needs of persons in their day." We wonder where this gentleman learned so much that is so completely erroneous. To cite Dr. Walter Rauschenbush and Dr. Albert Schweitzer as any kind of examples of people whose lives were transformed by the grace of Christ is to be grossly misinformed, to be generous. According to the Biographical Dictionary of the Left, P. 231 we read concerning Jane Addams: "It was not until 1972 that her most extreme affiliation became known. At that time, Maurice Malkin, a charter member and long-time official of the CPUSA, wrote in his book, Return to My Father's House, that Jane Addams became a secret Communist Party member in 1928 under auspices of Arne Sweback, a party organizer in Chicago. .. This is the way Dr. Donald G. Barn-house adjudged Dr. Albert Schweitzer in a full-page editorial in Eternity magazine for February 1959, p. 5. "But despite his greatness in the eyes of the world, Albert Schweitzer is possibly the foremost anti-Christian figure in the world today. Many people think that Antichrist will be a Caesar, a Napoleon, a Hitler. Actually, Antichrist will be much more like Schweitzer, He is in apostolic succession with Ghandi as a forerunner. The philosophical world is being prepared by such men for the future Antichrist who will arise as a counterfeit Christ. In his student days Schweitzer showed his antagonism for Christ. He wrote a thesis setting forth that Jesus Christ must be explained as an epileptic. He has never withdrawn that thesis... I believe that the issue is clear cut. You must take sides with the Lord Jesus Christ against any such ideas as those put forth by Schweitzer."

. Albert Schweitzer Defends His Atheism. This noted doctor was almost worshipped by some religious-minded people. The liberals idolized him until it dawned upon them that he was a segregationist at his African hospital. He excelled in theology, music, and medicine, winning doctorates in all and gave his life to medical missions in Africa until his death a few years ago. The Christian Century for April 7, 1976 had a remarkable article by a Schweitzer admirer, Dr Jackson Lee Ice of Florida State University: "Did Schweitzer Believe in God?" It will come as a shock to some sensitive souls to learn that Schweitzer was an atheist and defends his atheism in this way, with this quote: "Here I dare say that ethical religion of love can exist without the belief in a world ruling divine personality which corresponds to such an ethical religion."

Dr. Barnhouse was a New Evangelical, but he was straight as a die at this point. .. Theistic Evolution is a Live Option... In his book "Women Who Made Bible History," Dr. Harold John Ockenga, who claims to be the father of New Evangelicalism, stated on page 12: "As for man himself, although many theories may be advanced as to primitive man, or preadamic man, yet the Bible clearly says that God created man and at some point, regardless of whether God used the dust of the ground or whether he used an animal who He had already created, He bridged the gap between by breathing into man the breath of life and making him in His own image." CAPITAL PUNISHMENT BY GORDON CLARK PH.D.

"Capital Punishment is specified both in the OT (Gen. 9:6) and the NT (Rom. 13:4) It is implied in Gen. 4:14 and approved in Acts 25:11. Capital punishment is therefore an integral part of Christian ethics. Contemporary efforts to abolish capital punishment proceed on a non-Christian view of man, a secular theory of criminal law, and a low estimate of the value of life. The low evaluation of human life occurs in the liberal penology that holds criminal law to be solely for the purpose of rehabilitation. Not only does liberalism think that the murder of a human being is too minor a crime to justify execution; the theory constantly implies that no crime should ever be punished. Justice and punishment are deprecated as 'irrational vengeance.' This is a basic difference between Christian and liberal ethics. As such it can be resolved only by a decision on ultimate principles, to wit, whether ethical norms are established by divine decree, and secondarily what obligations God confers on civil government. The liberal arguments are superficial...God gave the right of capital punishment to human governments. He intended it to be used wisely and justly, but he intended it to be used. Abolition of the death penalty presupposes the falsity of Christian Principles." Gordon H. Clark of Butler University in "Baker's Dictionary of Christian Ethics," edited by Carl F.H. Henry, Ph.D. (page 34)

AN INDICTMENT OF THE INCLUSIVIST CHURCH

The sainted Bishop J.C. Ryle was born May 10, 1816 in England, was converted at Oxford University, and in 1880 he became the first Bishop of Liverpool. He went to be with the Lord on June 10, 1900 at the ripe old age of 84. He was an extraordinary scholar of the Word. He was probably one of the best "Baptists" the Anglicans had. He wrote: "I warn everyone who loves his soul, to be very jealous as to the preaching he regularly hears, and the place of worship he regularly attends. He who deliberately settles down under any ministry which is positively unsound is a very unwise man. I know well that many think it a shocking thing for a man to forsake his parish church. I cannot see with the eyes of such people. I do believe, if felse (continued right column this page)

CRUCIAL DOCTRINE OF BIBLICAL INERRANCY

errancy is the name given to a new organization brought into being to conduct a ten-year program "to study and defend the doctrine of Biblical inerrancy and to educate the evangelical community of its importance," according to the Religious News Service for 10/6/77. This council is composed largely of that branch of New Evangelicalism seeking to take a Biblical position on inerrancy. It is a well-known fact that the Evangelical Society is split down the center on this issue even though the ETS statement of faith is strongly in favor of this.

.. Negative Evangelical Reaction Surfaced Dr. Clark Pinnock of the McMaster Divinity School in Ontario, said: "The last thing we need is a ten-year inerrancy campaign. Our concern should be with the blatant liberals who demythologize parts of the Old and New Testament." The RNS dispatch from Philadelphia continued: "Jack Rogers, editor of a volume on Biblical Authority recently published by Word Books, commented, 'We need to spend our energies not in defending a particular theory, but on what the Scriptures say themselves and the Lord of creation, adjusting our lives according.'" The point is, however, that the position of verbal inspiration and Biblical inerrancy is exactly the position which our Lord Jesus Christ assumed toward His Word. The sparks will fly.

..An Alignment of New Evangelicals who are members of this council and trying to stand for inerrancy include: Earl Radmacher, Gleason Archer, Edmund Clowney, Norman Geisler, John Gerstner, Harold Hoehner, Donald Hoke, Harold Lindsell, J.I. Packer, Robert Preus, Frances Schaeffer and R.C. Sproul. Dr. Jay Grimstead, a graduate of Fuller, is the executive director. ligious News Service of 9/29/77 reports from Cleveland: "A task force appointed by the Commission on the Ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Ohio has recommended that practicing homosexuals be ordained and married in the Church. It said that 'many philandering heterosexuals have been ordained. Many promiscuous homsexuals have, too. Still the focus lies on the heterosexuality or homosexuality of the clergy and not on their manner of expressing their persuasion.' The situation is not only doctrinally inclusive in the Episcopalian church but also morally disastrous.
