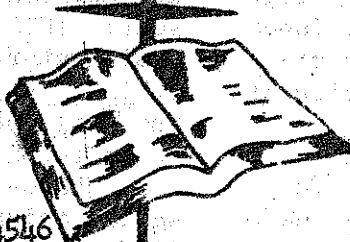

DR. JERRY FALWELL CANNOT BE IGNORED

..The schedule of Lynchburg speakers is interesting. Because of the fact that Dr. Jerry Falwell comes into homes via TV several times on Sunday, it is important for Baptists to examine his profession of Fundamentalism. Appearing recently: Josh McDowell of Campus Crusade; Dr. Harold Lindsell, editor of Christianity Today, for a week in November, 1977 Warren Wiersbe of Moody Church in Fall of 1977. He has had Jerome Hines, who is alleged to have gone charismatic; Psychologist Clyde Narramore, who has accommodated himself to both charismatics and New Evangelicalism; Doug Oldham, a charismatic, was on the staff from 1971 to 1975; Evie Tournquist has helped to draw crowds; Dr. J. Harold Smith of the SBC is a powerful speaker; Bob Harrington has held several campaigns there; SBC evangelist Jim Robison and others.

..At the Southwide Baptist Fellowship, Oct. 5, 1977 at Northside Baptist Church where Jack Hudson is pastor, Dr. Jerry Falwell stated: "I want to tell you I love charismatics. Do you know that there are many charismatics in America who know that we are just like this who support us regularly, and I have never sent a dime back. I love them and they love me. And I am gentle in my dealings with all sinners. Now this is family talk, we are all preachers tonight. I wouldn't say what I am saying on television."

..Dr. Jerry Falwell's Method of Operation
Dr. Falwell's address on Oct. 5, 1977 at the Southwide Baptist Fellowship held at the Northside Baptist Church of Charlotte stated: "I have always preached wherever I wanted to. I have always invited whoever I wanted to the pulpit to preach, and if I ever decide to bring the Pope of Rome in, I will do it. Now I don't plan to, but if I do, I will. And you can write your letters and I will still do it." BILLY GRAHAM GRABS THE HEADLINES AGAIN

These statements from the McCall's magazine for January 1978 are bound to send tital waves throughout the religious world. The Fundamentalists have recoiled in near horror. It will be interesting to see how the liberals, Catholics, neo-orthodox and Jews react.

..On the Salvation of the Heathen... "I used to play God...but I can't do that anymore. I used to believe that pagans in far-off countries were lost--were going to hell--if they did not have the Gospel of Jesus Christ preached to them. I no longer believe that...I believe there are other ways of recognizing the existence of God--through nature, for instance--and plenty of other opportunities therefore, of saying 'yes' to God."

..On the Salvation of the Jewish folk... "In recent years Graham has shown particular affection for Jews. Like most Christian Fundamentalists, Graham once believed that Jews, too, were lost if they did not convert to Christianity. Today Graham is willing to leave that up to God...Billy is particularly opposed to evangelical groups such as 'Jews for Jesus' who have made Jews the special target of their proselytizing efforts. 'If a person wants to convert to Christianity that is his own free-will decision,' Billy declares. 'I would never go after someone just because he is a Jew, which is why I have never supported Jewish missions.'"

..Agreement with Catholic Doctrine... "I am far more tolerant of other kinds of Christians than I once was...I've found that my beliefs are essentially the same as those of orthodox Roman Catholics, for instance. They believe in the Virgin Birth, and so do I. They believe in the blood atonement of the cross, and so do I. They believe in the Resurrection of Jesus and the coming judgment of God, and so do I. We only differ on some matters of later church tradition...What's more, he has received word through his friend the Papal Nuncio of Belgium that the Vatican would not be opposed to a Graham Crusade in Rome."

..About His Immense Personal Wealth... "We had to give about four hundred thousand dollars to the government, and gave away another six hundred thousand last year...I'd say Ruth and I spend a quarter of our time trying to figure out how to

..Truth is Outraged by Silence" President John A. Howard of Rockford College in an address before an university stated: "I invite you to take a little card and put it on your mirror...I suggest you inscribe on that card the phrase, 'Truth is outraged by silence.' 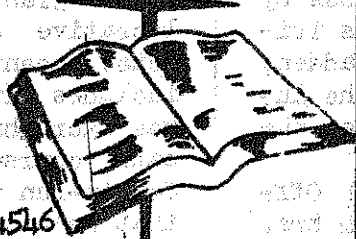

GLENN CLARK AND CAMP FARTHEST OUT CULT

One of the deadliest cults of this century is known as "Camp Farthest Out" founded by the late Glenn Clark, Professor of Creative Religious Living, of Macalester College of St. Paul. One of the most prominent exponents of this cult is Jimmy Carter's sister, Ruth Carter Stapleton. This has recently come to the attention of the American religious public with the revelation in the public press of August 3, 1976 in a Copely News Service story in the Oakland Tribune, which stated: "It was at Camp Farthest Out session in the South that Stapleton began to effect changes in her life." Time magazine for April 26, 1976 gave the story: "Though a devout Baptist, for the first time she 'experienced God as a God of love.' After spending three months in a backwoods cabin, she attended a second retreat. While there she had a session with a pioneer in the Neo-Pentecostal movement that was just then beginning to introduce healing and other 'gifts of the Holy Spirit' into mainstream churches. In a private ceremony she knelt to receive the 'Baptism of the Holy Spirit' through the laying on of hands, the Pentecostal initiation rite. She later experienced speaking in tongues." So Mrs. Stapleton had the unique experience of getting trapped into a second cult while she was involved in the first cult. The Sunday School Times, a venerable periodical on the American scene until it fell victim as a casualty to New Evangelicalism, had a lengthy review of Glenn Clark's writings in the issue of July 26, 1941. It summarized: "In all this literature quoted above there is no evidence that Glenn Clark or his followers believe that man is a sinner and needs a Savior; that forgiveness and acceptance with God come only through the blood of the Lord Jesus Christ; that God is a just God, as well as a God of love, and that he must condemn and punish sin, and that this punishment has been born for man by the Lord Jesus; that the Bible which is the inspired Word of God, is the foundation of their movement, though references are made to it and many quotations are given from it." The S.S. Times concludes: "Since the Glenn Clark movement does not proclaim the Bible as the inspired Word of God, or the Blood of Christ as the only means of salvation, or the fact of sin and the need for pun-

INEXCUSABLE BETRAYAL OF THE WORD OF GOD AND THE CHRISTIAN FAITH AT TYNDALE HOUSE

Christians everywhere should write to Mr. Kenneth Taylor, author of the Living Bible and owner of Tyndale House, a multi-million dollar publishing firm, and ask him for the justification for giving honor and Christian recognition to an avowed enemy of the Bible, the Virgin-born Christ, and the Christian Faith. One might also address a letter to his Vice-President, Wendall Hawley who professes to be a Fundamentalist. Mr. Taylor is responsible for publishing "The Story Bible" by Pearl S. Buck. It sells for \$7.95. She was the foremost exhibit of apostasy and unbelief on the Presbyterian foreign mission field in China, cited by J. Gresham Machen in his valient stand for the faith. In Harper's Magazine for January 1933, Mrs. Buck speaks of orthodox Christianity as: "a narrow and superstitious form of religion and this the intelligent Chinese is loath to see fastened upon his people." She condemns missionaries who tell the heathen, "you must believe on the Lord Jesus and your sins will be washed away." Speaking of historic and evangelical Christianity, she says: "Our forefathers believed sincerely in a magic religion...I agree with the Chinese who feel their people should be protected from such superstition...We no longer believe that a soul can in a moment choose its eternity." In an article for Cosmopolitan magazine for May 1933, she says concerning the Lord Jesus Christ: "And what if he never lived? What of that? Whether Christ had a body or not, whether he had a time to be born in history and a time to die as other men have is of no matter now: perhaps it never was of any matter. What lives today is not the ephemeral body of flesh and bone. If once it lived, then well enough, if not, then well, too... What need, then for the poor proof of a single body, born of one woman?" This was quoted in the Sunday School Times for May 20, 1933 in a scathing article involving Pearl Buck by Ernest Gordon.

INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVES

..Graham's Idea of Christian Education.. McCall's magazine (January 1978, p. 154) stated: "His oldest daughter, Gigi, is married to Swiss psychologist Stephen Tchividjian who subsequently gave up a lucrative career to work with drug addicts. Recently, their family, which also includes five children, moved to Milwaukee where his son-in-law is taking graduate courses at Marquette University, a Jesuit-run institution. 'I'm glad to see that he's at a school that has a religious orientation,' Graham says. 'I think that psychology or psychiatry without religious faith can be a dangerous thing!'" While he's at this Roman Catholic institution he might take some courses in sociology from Dr. David Mogerger, who is the former Bethel professor.


..Is Flynt's 'Conversion' A Phony..Larry Flynt, convicted felon who is alleged to be one of Ruth Carter Stapleton's converts, and the owner of Hustler, a pornographic magazine, was reported in Lubbock Avalanche-Journal (12/5/77): "He said he has not joined any congregation nor does he intend to. I'm a Christian, I'm not religious," he said. "It's between me and the man upstairs. I'm not going to join any organized religion." Flynt, who reportedly made \$20 million in profits last year from Hustler, Chic, and Leisure Time sex aids, said he will not discontinue the sex aids marketing business." Reprinted in Plains Baptist Challenger of December 1977.

..Kris Kristofferson-The Sex Symbol..When asked about the sudden deaths of Joplin and Presley, he said: "Certainly. Wouldn't the death of some of yours affect you?...Look, I'm not trying to be facetious. Their deaths point to the dangers this business is not all just playing those kid's games...I know all this has played a part in my decision to quit drinking. And I'm working better than I ever did before. I used to be potted all the time. Once, I even did a gig for Billy Graham 'cause Johnny Cash asked me to, but I doubt if I did him anyd... good because I stayed drunk the whole time." (Lubbock Avalanche-Journal (11/27 77). This is to be classified in the Dept. of Shocking Events. We wonder if this was at Explo '72.

..Sharp judgment of New Evangelicalism.. The IFCA Voice had a remarkably sharp article in the Dec.1977 issue branding New Evangelicalism a New Religion. "But, the Jesus currently being presented is an alien christ that has no relationship to the Christ of the New Testament, but is a gnostic idol, an imaginary hero or a personified slogan for the aspirations of the flesh--the product of fallen man's preference for a deity conceived in man's image; said to merit man's best efforts, making few demands that might interfere with the pursuit of pleasure. This christ does not present a cross nor a yoke; he promises freedom from guilt complexes." This article is one of the most scathing indictments of New Evangelicalism we have seen in many weeks.

ROGER STAUBACK-SUPER BOWL QUARTERBACK

..The New Evangelicalist publishers Word Inc. have come out with a story on "Stauback, First Down, Life-Time To Go," which is reviewed by Dr. Robert Sumner in The Biblical Evangelist for December 1977, who said: "However, our opinion of his brand of Christianity has diminished tremendously--partly, perhaps, because he speaks so disparagingly of the Fundamentalists. Stauback is a born, confirmed, dyed-in-the-wool Roman Catholic and has absolutely no intention of ever becoming anything different."

..He Prays to the Virgin for Victory..
"...He describes a hair-raising finish in an Army/Navy game when it appeared his bitter enemy might pull the game out in the closing seconds. He says, 'I must have said about a hundred Hail Marys the last couple of minutes' (p. 83), which gives an insight into whom he turns in prayer for help in emergencies."

..Stauback's Ideas of Worldliness..On page 280 he says: "I don't think the things of this earth are evil...when used properly they can contribute to our happiness and the Glory of God. I can't see how drinking, dancing, and enjoying the things of this earth can be wrong. So many people make religion seem like a 'shall not' religion...I welcome the disappearance of the over-occupation with sin and the greater accent on loving, caring, and doing for others. There are some who say that if you have a beer or a glass of wine occasionally that you're not a Christian. That is ridiculous." So he drinks or dances to the glory of God.

..The Most Objectionable Part is This...
On Page 276, the Quarterback said: "I do know this: I believe in Jesus Christ as the Son of God. He is the redeemer of our sins and the savior of all mankind. He is my Lord and I believe that he loves all of us with a constant and intense love. I believe in the Bible as his Word but I am very concerned when fellow Christians start using it so strictly, allowing little interpretation to judge the worthiness and the chance of salvation of all other people. It disturbs me when the fundamentalist Christian says the Jewish person is not saved because of ignoring Christ. I believe that all people have a chance for salvation, based on their own situation and God's all-fair judgment."

MODERN EVANGELISM IS BIG BUSINESS

The San Francisco Examiner for November 26, 1977 had a big four-page article on "Evangelism-from revival tents to big corporations." In addition to revealing about Billy Graham's \$23 million trust fund in Dallas, it might have pointed out that the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association took in \$29 million in 1976. The Examiner stated that Oral Robert's annual income is over \$50 million, with a current campaign to raise \$100 million for a 60-story hospital on the ORU campus. Bill Bright's Campus Crusade has an annual income of \$34 million, with 6,000 employees world-wide, with plans to raise \$100 million this year and a total of \$1 billion by 1982. Rex Humbard takes in \$12 million annually for his Akron-based operations on 250 television stations. Garner Ted Armstrong, the Worldwide Church of God cult leader, has an estimated annual income of \$60 million. Pat Robertson takes in \$20 million annually for his 700 Club charismatic TV operations, with plans to launch a \$50 million program to develop network TV broadcasting. The names of several wealthy businessmen behind these activities include: Art DeMoss of National Liberty Life Insurance Co. of Valley Forge; The Hunt family in Dallas; The Colorado brewer of Golden, Joseph Coors; W. Maxey Jarman of Nashville's Genesco firms; Richard DeVos of Amway Corporation, and other tycoons. The Christian Booksellers Association grossed over \$600 million in 1977, most of these are New Evangelicalist books with a charismatic flavor. Since these organizations all have money sticking out of their ears, humble Christian believers might well consider supporting their own little ole Fundamental Baptist Church with which they are in covenant relations.

VAN TIL'S REJECTION OF CAMPUS CRUSADE

In an interview in Christianity Today for Dec. 30, 1977: "Q. You have been a little hard on Bill Bright and Campus Crusade. Why? A. My problem is that the so-called four spiritual laws that are supposed to be the distilled essence of the Gospel is Christ and him crucified, Christ and his resurrection, and these are conspicuous by their absence in the four spiritual laws. I have a similar problem with Schaeffer."

BILLY GRAHAM'S FRIGHTENING NEW ATTITUDE TOWARD COMMUNISM ON RECENT HUNGARY VISIT

The Catholic Voice for Feb. 6, 1978 states: "Billy Graham has been named the most influential person in the field of religion in the U.S. today in a poll of 35 religion writers and editors...taken by the Christian Century magazine (Jan. 18)" The Christian Century is the Nation's leading modernist paper. This tremendous influence becomes all the more significant in the light of the releases of the Hungarian Church Press, a news service sponsored by the Communist-oriented church in Hungary, and reproduced in the Christian Beacon for Feb. 2, 1978 in which Graham is quoted speaking before the presidium of the Ecumenical Council of Churches in Hungary: "This visit will mean a great turning point of my life, and even if it produces no other result than what I have experienced and felt here, I shall certainly have to be most thankful for it." On the second day Dr. Graham said exactly what his communist hosts wanted him to say: "I have already been informed that there is a close cooperation in this country between the church members and other members of the state who do not belong to churches. I understand that you join your forces and make common efforts to serve what is for the good of the nation...I come to learn from you. You live in a socialist society in which the organized church has no special privilege or advantage. You can teach us a great deal about the way how the true followers of Christ may show their faith not only in words but in deeds also. You can teach us a great deal about what Christian responsibility and obedience mean in a society." Continuing to delight the communist masters and the phony religious puppets of these leaders, Dr. Graham said: "During the past five to ten years my thinking and perception have also changed in many things and have acquired a wider scope and perspective when I realized that the church was church, and in whatever society the church may exist it has redemptive and social tasks in the society into which it has been placed by God." Graham then dealt with the question of war and how disarmament must be realized and murderous atomic weapons must be destroyed. He tried to tie Christ

JIMMY CARTER'S PASTOR MAKES BOLD ATTACK ON THE BIBLE ITSELF AS THE WORD OF GOD

Every Christian ought to pray every Lord's Day for President Jimmy Carter, for the security of the nation. BISHOP JOHN A.T. ROBINSON COMES TO TOWN

..One of the leading New Testament scholars of theological modernism is John A. T. Robinson of Cambridge University, England, who will lecture in Oakland on February 16, 1978 at First Presbyterian Church, 24th & Broadway, as a part of a world tour. Christianity Today for June 21, 1963 describes him as: "a ban-the-bomb marcher, member of the Labour party defender of Lady Chatterley's Lover, opponent of capital punishment, and campaigner for reform of severe legislation against homosexuality ('a peculiarly odious piece of English hypocrisy')."

..At his consecration in 1959, he said in his public vows to be "ready with all faithful diligence, to banish and drive away all erroneous and strange doctrine contrary to God's Word."

..He Rejects a Personal God in Heaven.. In his controversial book, "Honest to God", he scoffs at what he considers our outdated image of God as "up there" or "out there"—neither the literal or symbolic view will do. He suggests the Freudians might be right: that "the God of traditional popular theology is a projection, and perhaps we are being called to live without that projection in any form...actually the Bible speaks in literal terms of a God whom we have already abandoned." (C.T. 6/21/63). Like the late Bishop Pike, his warm friend, Robinson is an atheist to the God of the Bible.

..Robinson Has No Sense or Doctrine of Sin..He states on pages 118, 119: "The only intrinsic evil is lack of love... this is the criterion for every form of behavior, inside marriage or out of it, in sexual ethics or in any other field. For nothing else makes a thing right or wrong." J.D. Douglas wrote of this: "Unless words are carefully defined, this is dangerous nonsense." (C.T. 6/21/63 p. 956)

..Of Christ's Blood Sacrifice at Calvary "The whole scheme of a supernatural Being coming down from heaven to 'save' mankind from sin, in the way that a man might put his finger into a glass of water to rescue a struggling insect, is frankly incredible to man 'come of age' ...the 'full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction for the sins of the whole world' supposed (Continued Back Page Column 2)

NEW EVANGELICALS AND IMMORAL PERVERSION

..Harold Ockenga's Policy of Infiltration of the major ecumenical and apostate denominations may have come home to haunt him, with the involvement of one of his Gordon-Conwell professors who not only has deliberately rejected the Biblical doctrine of Separation but has actively elected to stay within the apostate United Presbyterian Church USA. Time magazine for Jan. 30, 1978 featured the picture of Prof. Richard Lovelace as serving on a 19-person Task Force to Study Homosexuality. The 30-page policy statement was approved by the Advisory Council on Church and Society. The big fight will come up May 16-24 in San Diego when the General Assembly will meet. Dr. Lovelace and four others brought in a 20-page minority report. Dr. Ockenga's policy of penetration and infiltration will be very much in the public mind between now and next May.

..Homosexual Ordinations to be Approved if the report is adopted. It states: "May a self-affirming, practicing homosexual Christian be ordained?" the report asks. "We believe so, if the person manifests such gifts as are required for ordination. For some homosexual Christians growth toward mature Christian living may imply accepting celibacy; for some it may imply accomplishing reorientation to heterosexuality; however, for others it may imply remaining open to or attaining full companionship and partnership with a person of the same sex." Presbyterian Journal, Feb. 1, 1978. The Journal stated that the report recommends that the General Assembly "give permission to presbyteries and congregations to ordain avowed, practicing homosexuals to the ministry of the Church." This is ecclesiastical degradation at its worst. How can a Bible-believing Christian who is loyal to Christ remain in fellowship with such moral depravity—that's the question on the minds of multitudes today.

..New Evangelical Moral Compromise.. "Some conservatives in the UPC-USA were surprised to learn that even the minority report called on members of the Church 'to work for the passage of laws which prohibit discrimination based on the sexual orientation of a person in the areas of employment, housing, and public accommodation' (Continued Back Page, Column 1)

The minority report also encouraged seminaries to welcome homosexual persons as students while counseling them about their unacceptability for ordination." ..On the Incarnation of God the Son he states on page 70: "The belief that we are at this point and in this person in touch with God has increasingly been left to the religious minority that can still accept the old mythology as physically and metaphysically true."

..Christ's Supernatural Deity Impossible In an advertisement in the Christian Century for May 15, 1963 on his blasphemous book published by the Westminster Press of the United Presbyterians, we find on page 655: "Popular preaching and teaching presents a supranaturalistic view of Christ which cannot be substantiated from the New Testament...the New Testament does not say that Jesus was God, but that if one looked at Jesus, one saw God...when one met him, one was met--and saved and judged--by God."(What about: Rom. 9:5, Heb. 1:8, John 20:28; John 1:1, Titus 2:13, etc.)

..An Atheistic Attack upon the Living God..The liberal Christian Century on June 24, 1964, in a review of Robinson's thought by the noted Martin E. Marty states: "Robinson speaks for those who quote Tillich, Butlmann and Bonhoeffer, and who want to work out the logic of their attacks on traditional theism."

..The Immorality of His Sexual Views.. Even the Christian Century voiced disapproval in the April 15, 1964 issue in an editorial, quoting him: "The decisive thing in moral judgment is not the line between marital and extramarital sex, but the presence or absence of love at the deepest level." The liberal Century then said: "If we understand the bishop correctly, he has written for extramarital sexual freedom a Magna Charta just as permissive and irresponsible as Bertrand Russell's openly preached free love...In the Christian view the presence of love at the deepest level is fundamental to moral sexual relations, but beyond that foundation and as testimony to it the marital status remains decisive."

..Robinson's Further Moral Deterioration The Christian News of July 17, 1972, p.2 "Dr. John Robinson, former Anglican Suffragan Bishop of Woolwich and controversial author of 'Honest to God,' has been sharply criticized for his recent suggestion that children should legally be allowed to have sexual relations at age 14...Dr. Robinson, 53, dean of Trinity College, Cambridge, and chairman of the Sexual Law Reform Society, made his remarks at the Methodist Conference in Nottingham."

..When he was consecrated a bishop, these words were addressed to him: "Be to the flock of Christ a shepherd, not a wolf; feed them, devour them not. Hold up the weak, heal the sick, bind up the broken, bring again the outcasts, seek the lost. 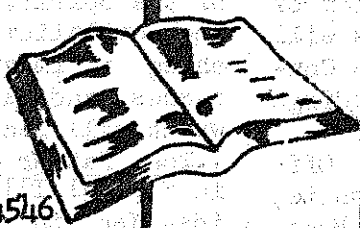

DR. BUSWELL'S LETTER TO DR. BARNHOUSE

A choice document on Biblical Separation is the letter which the former President of Wheaton College, Dr. James Oliver Buswell, Jr. wrote on October 19, 1951 to Dr. Donald Grey Barnhouse, the editor of Revelation magazine and later Eternity magazine. Dr. Barnhouse was a violent opponent of the Biblical doctrine of Separation. In this letter Dr. Buswell rebuked him for his position: "The Biblical passages supporting your position are non-existent, for the entire Bible is true and does not contradict itself. God's people are commanded not to be in religious communion with worshippers of other gods. The God of modernism is not the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore the only Biblical position anyone can possibly take is either to be consistently engaged in putting false religion out from the communion to which he belongs, or to withdraw from any communion in which false religion is so dominant that it cannot be put out. I am enclosing an article of mine written several years ago setting forth what the Bible teaches on this subject. For years you have remained in communion with false religion, and you have used your influence strenuously to persuade other believers to remain in such communion, and to injure the testimony of those of us who are endeavoring to persuade God's people to obey God's Word on this point. I do not deny that you sometimes speak out with brilliant rhetoric against Modernism. But you are at the same time advising young men to study in Princeton Theological Seminary. Men like you are the greatest asset that the Modernists have, because of the very fact that the sheep of the Lord's flock know that in general your message is Biblical. This fact makes your attack upon the Scriptural doctrine of the purity of the visible organized church all the more damaging. You say that you have turned dozens of whole congregations toward a better spiritual condition...you leave the churches which you influence with a false and anti-Scriptural doctrine on the question of communion with idolotry." At the Intersarsity student missionary convention in Urbana in 1957, Dr. Barnhouse stated: "And I wish I could put before you to the utmost that second-degree separation is a sin." (Eternity, 7/58, p. 20). He

..The Charismatic Ecumenical Dream.. At the 1977 Christian Booksellers Convention in the keynote address, tongues leader Jamie Buckingham in his message "We Need Each Other" stated: "I believe that the Lord wants to break down these barriers which we have raised up between ourselves so that Catholics, protestants, pentecostals, charismatics, fundamentalists, and liberals can all come together as part of the body of Christ, edifying one another." (The Voice of Fundamentalism, Feb. 1978) He used John 17:21-23 as "God's unmistakable formula" for bringing this to pass. This statement of Buckingham represents total lack of spiritual and biblical discernment. These are exactly the same components which will make up the satanic church of antichrist with the Vatican in the lead as he has correctly listed them.

..Missionary Phil Saint's testimony.. "I had been saturated for many years with teaching on the negative aspects of the 'last days'--the religious apostasy--the 'perilous times,' and so on. Until the infilling of the Holy Spirit became mine over ten years ago, I was completely unprepared for the massive spiritual renewal that God was sending upon the whole world...I had a strong mental block against what I believed to be 'false doctrine' coupled with a 'shallow and dangerous emotionalism.' So I clung tenaciously to 'sound doctrine,' determined to be true to the fundamentalist position I had been taught from childhood." FGBMI magazine, Feb. 1978-p. 22. Evangelist Don Jasmin added: "When did his opposition to religious apostasy cease? It is clear--when he accepted the false charismatic experience."

..The finality of the Holy Scriptures and their complete sufficiency is under attack by the charismatic movement in their insistence on continuing revelation In his book "The Spirit Bade Me Go," Dr. David duPlessis explains it all: "It was my privilege to edit and prepare for publication in this form those revelations that I received from Him while ministering in conferences...Friends have pleaded with me to put into print the things I have said, or rather those things that the Holy Ghost has said through me. ..The Pastor addressed a Pastor's group in Central Illinois recently at the Holiday Inn in Peoria, which had been set up by Pastor William C. "Bill" Peterson of suburban Bartonville. Dr. Weniger represented the Seminary and then brought an impromptu message dealing with the issues of the day. It is hoped that this type of meeting can be set up in other parts of the nation.

..The Pastor arrived back from Illinois after being one of the speakers at a Missionary Conference at Oak Grove Baptist Church in Bartonville, Illinois. Pastor and Mrs. Wm. C. The Presbyterian Journal for January 18 1978 reported: "Voting simultaneously on Jan. 8 to separate from the PCUS (Presbyterian Church U.S.-Southern) were the 4,500-member Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church here and the 500-member First Presbyterian Church of Plantation. The vote in the Coral Ridge congregational meeting was 1754 to 1...Dr. Kennedy indicated that before the congregational meeting, all of the organizational leadership of the church, from the session to the Christian education council, had registered unanimous votes in support of separation."

..Keith Miller is weak on Liquor Advice. Faith at Work magazine for Feb. 1978 answers a question about behaving so as not to cause others to stumble (Tim. 14: 13-23). He said: "Where I disagree with many Christians is in saying that we are to abstain from drinking just to keep a good reputation with other Christians who have a firm but legalistic view that wine in itself is evil and therefore that drinking it is not Christian...Many Christian scholars say it is ridiculous to apply this principle to drinking wine since they feel it is clear that Jesus and the members of the early church drank wine as a common practice. But I think the larger issue is not one of drinking wine, but one of love. How much are we willing to curtail our freedom (as we believe God did in Jesus) to love people where they are."

CARTER AT THE NATIONAL PRAYER BREAKFAST

Jimmy Carter spoke at the 26th Annual Breakfast, February 2, 1978, in Washington. Several items surfaced concerning Mr. Carter's religion, listed in the Presidential Documents, pp. 263-265:

..A Perverted Idea of the New Birth. "But for those of us who share the Christian faith, the words 'born again' have a very simple meaning--that through a personal experience, we recommit our lives as humble children of God, which makes us in the realist possible sense brothers and sisters of one another. Families are bound by the closest possible ties." (This definition has nothing to do with what the Bible says when it speaks about those who are born of God. Carter's definition clearly conveys the thought that all people are the children of God by nature, and that in this idea of the "new birth" one simply "recommits our lives as humble children of God." This is the liberal notion of the Universal Fatherhood of God and Universal Brotherhood of man.)

..He Worships Same God as Mr. Begin.. "I met with Prime Minister Begin twice during this past year and hope to see him again soon when he comes to our country. I like him. I admire him, and respect him, because throughout his conversations with me in the quiet, lonely, private times together, and even when he talks with others in a larger group, there's a fervor of a deeply committed religious man who again worships the same God I do and you do." (A Christian Bible believer is one who worships the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, as the New Testament phrases it. This God is a Triune God. The god Mr. Begin worships, as a modern Jew, is a unitarian god. How can one imagine that they are the same?)

..Begin and Sadat Worship The Same God.. "I felt an instant friendship with President Sadat. And in his message to me and in my talks with him, he never fails to point out that the Egyptians and the Jews are sons of Abraham, worship the same God, share a common heritage and a common faith, and that this is a transcendent thing, quite often forgotten, but still there; that it doesn't change." (Mr. Sadat is a muslim, whose god, Allah bears no identity with the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.)

THE BLU-PRINT GLADLY MAKES A RETRACTION

On December 13, 1977, the Blu-Print stated in an article entitled "John Calvin's Record in Geneva" that: "Within 48 hours of his rule in Geneva, John Calvin caused 48 people to be executed. His victims ranged in age from 16 to 80. The most capital offense was the opposition to infant baptism. Today, baptism only for accountable believers, is a Baptististic distinctive." Two days ago we learned that we were in error of saying 48 hours instead of 48 months. We do not understand how we made the mistake. We found in a letter from Mr. Zygmund Dobbs, the author of the statement, that it should have read: "Within 48 months of his rule in Geneva, John Calvin caused 48 people to be executed." We apologize for our error. Since publishing this horrifying report, we received some "flak" from hard-lined Calvinists charging us with publishing an historical lie. We corresponded with Mr. Dobbs, asking for documentation of his article. He responded last week: "Actually, my count is too low. I made a head count based on the executions listed separately in about a dozen historical sources. But now I find that Philip Schaff, in The Swiss Reformation (1893), page 492, Edinburgh, listed 58 people executed in the period between 1542 and 1546. This information has been confirmed in numerous other works. In preparation for my forthcoming book on Calvin I have come across the gory details of these executions and tortures, and it all fills me with horror. There is even a public beheading of a child who had struck back at his parents while in a tantrum. At the same time Calvin's step-children were carrying on scandalously in Geneva but they were spared public punishment, while other youngsters, whose offenses were mild in comparison, were punished severely with beatings and tortures." We wonder how a good theology could come out of a mind which tolerated and promoted such violence, terror, persecution and murder as was evident in the Calvin regime. Jesus taught authoritatively in Matthew 7:16-20 as follows: "Ye shall know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree bringeth

As part of my preparation for meeting with Indian leaders, I read the Bhagavad-Gita (The Hindu scriptures) and later visited the site where Mahatma Gandhi's body was cremated and thought about his simple, deeply committed life, his knowledge of Christianity and Judaism, his worship of God, the simplicity and humility and sensitivity of his life. And I felt a kinship with him and a kinship with Indian leaders who have not always been our friends in recent years. And as I talked to Prime Minister Desai, this was a common thread that ran through the conversations between us--how we shared something."

..These are all Mr. Carter's Own Words.. Judging by his own words, the President believes in the universal fatherhood of God, a teaching which is rejected by Jesus and is an anti-Christian doctrine. John 8:44. He holds to a common denominator connection between Christianity and Hinduism, Judaism, and Islam. His concept of the New Birth makes his religion a theological disaster area.

RECENT NEW EVANGELICAL LECTURERS

..Dr. David Hubbard of Fuller Seminary is an authentic New Evangelical leader who is very knowledgeable in many areas. He delivered the Colliver Lectures on Nov. 7 and 8, 1978 with Tom Skinner at the notoriously liberal University of Pacific in Stockton. He is totally committed to dialogue with the liberals, infiltration of the apostate denominations, and complete cooperation with ecumenism involving unbelieving modernists. THE PHONY FLYNT CONVERSION EXPERIENCE

The description of the four-hour "conversion" experience of the "Porno Prince" Larry Flynt was carried in the Washington Post Magazine for Jan. 8, 1978, with a portion being reprinted in The Biblical Evangelist for March 1978 on page 6. Dr. Robert Summer called this "weird". After he printed it he commented: "This is unadulterated tommyrot." But let the readers judge for themselves: "Dusk was falling when the Lear jet left the Ohio airport and the Lord began talking to Larry Flynt. With Ruth Carter Stapleton seated nearby, Flynt fell to his knees, his thick hands clasped in prayer as the jet headed for the West Coast. The feeling began as a warm, tingling, powerful sensation. Flynt could feel a slightly medicinal taste rising from his throat. He was frightened but outwardly calm as the vision appeared: a man laughing heartily and calling himself Paul stood with Jesus Christ. 'I promised to give up my wife for Him,' Flynt said. 'I promised to see myself castrated, to look down and see myself with no sexual organs and look up and say Yes God, it's okay, if that's Your will, that's fine.' I spoke in tongues. There were animals eating at my neck, like baboons and monkeys, gnawing at me. He told me my calling: to bring peace to earth. And He told me there had been a distortion of His Word, which confirmed my thing on religion: there are a lot of religions but only one God. Then I had to pray for my wife, Althea--He was taking Althea away from me, a natural death or an accident--oh, how I had to pray. Then I asked Him about Lenny Bruce and I got the feeling Lenny was in hell so I prayed and prayed for Lenny. But it seemed like He only reached down and picked up half of Lenny. I remember saying something like 'Did you get him, did you get him all?' and then I looked very close up at Jesus and he was holding Lenny in His arms... It lasted for hours."

THE HYPOCRISY OF NEW EVANGELICALIST LOVE

The late Dr. Bob Shuler, staunch Fundamentalist of Los Angeles is never to be confused with Dr. Robert Schuller of Garden Grove. They are as different as Carl McIntire is from Fulton J. Sheen. Dr. Shuler wrote an article in Biola's King's Business (June 1958 p. 11) during those days when New Evangelicalism was struggling for birth on the American scene. He wrote: "Sometimes I wonder if these love specialists really know what love and hate are. Certainly, it is not hate to stoutly oppose what a man conscientiously believes are false ideals and doctrines... There are many whose actions I detest. I cannot love what some about me stand for. I try to follow in the footsteps of the Master in my feelings toward false prophets, evil doers and the workers of iniquity everywhere. Christ with great feeling referred to some as whited sepulchres, wolves in sheep's clothing, false prophets, serpents and a generation of vipers, hypocrites. He said of them: 'How can ye escape the damnation of hell?' But he did not hate them. He died for them. In fact, there is a great deal of hypocrisy in too much pious love for everything and everybody. I have learned long ago that overemphasis on love is sometimes pretense. It is often a camouflage. It is mouthed sometimes as a defense when inside the heart there is deep and abiding bitterness. A genuine Christian, honest and sincere, should hate not only every evil thing but the evil in men that causes them to do evil. Nor should he be so cowardly and unChristlike as to profess to love the wrong that even now threatens to wreck humanity."

.. "Can We Trust The New Testament?" is the latest book by Dr. John A.T. Robinson, the unbelieving Anglican scholar of England, who lectured in Oakland on Feb. 16, 1978. It is published by Eerdmans, to their shame. The Concordia Theological Quarterly recently reviewed this book: "This volume is by the author of Honest To God, a diatribe in favor of theological liberalism... Anyone who expects to find such a defense will be in for the shock of his life. The miracles of Christ are not accepted, the Virgin Birth is not true, the bodily resurrection of Christ is denied. THE RELIGIOUS IDEAS OF JIMMY CARTER

..The Universal Brotherhood of Man is one of the key doctrines of liberalism and also of our supposedly born-again President Jimmy Carter. And I hope that we will make every effort during this Christmas season not only to bring our immediate family together but to look at the family of all humankind, so that we not any longer cherish a commitment toward animosity or retention of enemies but that we forgive one another and indeed, form a world-wide family where every human being on Earth is our brother or our sister."

..His God is the Same as Sadat's God.. At a question and answer session on Feb. 17 1978 at a Town Meeting at Bangor, Maine, a high school youth, John Bryant, asked him about Isa. 19:23,24 in relation to the Middle East. "Very fine. I believe that one of the great, positive factors in eventually finding a resolution of the differences in the Middle East is the deep religious convictions of both Prime Minister Begin and President Sadat. They and we, as Christians, worship the same God. Our religious beliefs differ in some degrees. But there's a special relationship between the Arabs in Egypt and the Jews in Israel. They recognize Abraham as a common father of them all. And I think they understand, as you say, the prophecies in Isaiah as applying to both peoples, that peace between Egypt and Israel is foreordained by God, and that they play a role in carrying out God's purposes." Mr. Begin is a Jew and Mr. Sadat is a Moslem. These quotes are

The distinguished President of the CBA Denver Seminary, Dr. Vernon C. Grounds, is advertised in the liberal Christian Century magazine for Feb. 1-8, 1978, as one of the featured speakers in a conference dominated by liberals entitled: "Liberation, Development, and Evangelism in Mission." This is sponsored by the Maryknoll Mission Institute, Church World Ministries, Ecumenical Development Cooperative Society and other groups connected with the World Council of Churches. Along with Dr. Grounds' name are those of Roman Catholic Thomas Stransky, Mortimer Arias, Denis Goulet, Walter Iwensby Waldron Scott, Sipo Mzimela, Joel Gajardo and others. On the same platform with Dr. Grounds will be Dr. Robert McAfee Brown, noted liberal professor of Union Theological Seminary of New York. The speaker who will raise eyebrows is Dr. Emilio Castro, secretary of evangelism for the World Council of Churches.

..Arrested for Alleged Communist Acts... The Uruguayan News Letter for Oct. 1970 stated: "Amongst the sensational things that have happened here lately was the arresting of pastor Castro and a Catholic priest by the police. They were arrested because the police had just arrested a very important terrorist, believed to be one of the murderers of the American diplomat. Out of 1010 cards at the end of the campaign, Dr. Castro got 400 (40%) for his Central Methodist Church, a liberal and leftwing situation. In the Crusade, Dr. Graham had him lead in prayer, and as he introduced him, he said, "My great friend, Castro." Dr. Graham invited Castro to be an observer at the Lausanne Congress on evangelism.

..Castro appointed to Christian Century as Editor at large. In a two-page editorial, he defended the Communist coalition this way: "It is in the light of this critical socioeconomic situation that Uruguay's Tupamara guerilla movement must be viewed. Organized under the name of the national Liberation movement, this guerilla group is made up mainly of young middle and upper-class people of various persuasions (Christian, Marxist, independent, etc.). Their object is to transform our society for the benefit of the Uruguayans, not just for the few. But this, they are convinced, cannot be done by democratic means--for one reason, because, as they see it, the democratic process is much too slow. Therefore they believe that they must seize power by force." (Blu-Print Nov. 14, 1972)

..The Homosexual Episcopalian Priest who was featured as an honored speaker on the campus of Westmont College and one known for his liberal and leftwing stance, Malcolm Boyd, joins another openly avowed Jesuit homosexual, Father John McNeil, of the Roman Catholic Church for a conference on "The Gay Christian" in Bangor, PA in June. It is open to: "For gays, friends of gays, noon-gays, women and men, clergy and laity." EVOLUTIONARY THOUGHT AT FULLER SEMINARY

One of the prominent professors at Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, founded by the fundamentalist dollars of Dr. Charles E. Fuller, is Dr. C. Peter Wagner. He wrote an article that sounded quite innocent, entitled: "The Origin of Life--A Christian View," published in Eternity magazine, September 1957. Some of his statements:

.. "Is it possible to accept the data of both science and the Bible without fear of contradiction? I think the answer is already clear. If the scientists, highly trained in their various professions, tell us that the fossil records and other data give us strong evidences that within the phyla the higher and more complex forms of life have evolved over millions of years from the more simple, why not take their word for it? There's nothing in the Bible that contradicts it. But at this point the scientists usually head for trouble."

.. "What shall we say, then? Can a Christian who accepts the plenary inspiration of the Bible believe in evolution? We answer: Why not? Of course, he must be very careful to define his theory of evolution so as not to violate any clear teaching of the Word of God."

.. "By Studying both science and the Bible we find that hundreds of millions of years ago God created seven kinds of life and that from these humble beginnings there developed by an evolutionary process the many thousands of species that populate the world today. Threshold evolution is a good term for this concept, and one that might well be adopted and taught by up-to-date Christians. With this concept in hand a Christian finds himself in a comfortable position. On the one hand he has not retreated a step from his high view of inspiration. On the other hand he can listen to and accept all the evolutionary facts and data that scientists uncover."

THE NEW EDITOR OF CHRISTIANITY TODAY

Dr. Kenneth S. Kantzer occupies one of the most influential positions in American evangelicalism as editor of the most strategic New Evangelical periodicals in the Western world. Some of his views might be understood from an interview he had in Eternity magazine for December 1956.

.. A kindly attitude toward Neo-Orthodoxy
"As the neo-orthodox have set forth their views of authority, moreover, evangelical Christians as well as modernists have tried to interact with what they have to say. Some evangelical Christians are greatly intrigued by this new movement. If the neo-orthodox are really standing for the authority of the Bible, so they urge, then let us not be overly fastidious; let us be satisfied with such a position. Other evangelical Christians in opposition to the neo-orthodox have bent over backwards and have tended to state their views in an extreme manner not true to traditional Protestantism. At Wheaton we would avoid both extremes" p. 8.

.. Rejection of a universal flood idea...
"The question as to whether or not the Flood was universal in an absolute sense covering all of the physical earth and all of the animal life, would seem to me not to be a point under consideration by the author. Now I do not deny that God might have brought a universal flood over all the earth, but I would insist only that the Genesis passage taken in its context is not specially interested in the universality of the Flood beyond that which relates to man and his sin." p. 35.

.. Adam's rib may not have been literal..
"On the other hand, I do not insist that the rib must be a literal rib. These words may well give a figurative description of the fact that Eve came from the seed of Adam and was thus related to Adam by the creative act of God. Such an interpretation, though slightly figurative, would be in perfect harmony with what the Scripture teaches elsewhere about man and fits in extremely well with the total context of Genesis." p. 36.

.. How is the Bible the Word of God? "It is true that the Bible contains the Word of God... Again, both are true. The Bible both is and becomes the Word of God... However, there is a very legitimate sense (Continued left column this side)

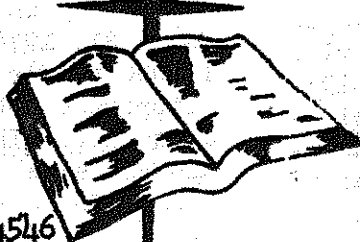

CHARISMATICS AND PSEUDO-FUNDAMENTALISTS

..Jerry Falwell's Letter to Van Impe... Under date of March 8, 1978 the noted Lynchburg TV preacher sent a letter to Dr. Jack Van Impe, which he in turn has sent out quite widely. Dr. Falwell wrote "As a matter of fact, we take a very strong stand against the charismatic movement. For example, we will not accept a student into Liberty Baptist College who either has spoken in tongues or believes that tongues is for today."

..A Charismatic on Old Time Gospel Hour. Fundamentalists were quite surprised to see one of the leading tongues leaders of today being honored on the Old Time Gospel Hour emanating from the Thomas Road Baptist Church. The program was released on the West Coast on Sunday, April 2, 1978 at 10 p.m. on Channel 6 of the Bay Area. Glowing praise was heaped on Mr. Robert Walker, publisher of the nation's leading charismatic periodical, Christian Life. Mr. Walker was asked to lead in prayer. Christian Life editorials, articles, advertisements all favor the charismatic movement.

..How Bob Walker Became A Charismatic... Mr. Miles J. Stanford has a 28-page document that is remarkable for those wanting to understand modern involvements of the charismatic movement. (\$1.50 each: P.O. Box 7507, Colorado Springs, Colo. 80933). He stated: "It was Paris Reidhead and Lee Vale who invited Bob Walker to a Chicago hotel room and manipulated him into a two-hour initial 'spasm' of tongues. Soon after that he recast his Christian Life magazine into a sort of charismatic catch-all. And there is at least one large evangelical organization that still offers the lethal periodical to its employees at a reduced subscription rate. Dr. Walker is also the head of the charismatic Creation House Publishing Company."

..The Christian Life Special Editor of this charismatic paper is Dr. Elmer Towns who has recently been re-engaged by Dr. Jerry Falwell for his vast enterprises in the Lynchburg college. He is listed in the March 1978 issue as the Sunday School "Special Editor." Fundamentalists around the nation wonder why this associate of Dr. Falwell continues his position on the staff of this widely-known Pentecostalist periodical.

It jumped to 2 million, then to 4 million, then to 8, then to 16. Last year it was 22 million; this year 35 million, as I mentioned." Most of this comes from Fundamental Baptists in local churches across the nation.

..What is Falwell's Worst Accusation? "That's a hard one. Occasionally I've been accused of being a compromiser because I try to befriend those who are friends of Christ, even if I don't agree with all their theological positions. We can stand against error without attacking persons. I do not believe that a fundamentalist has to be a monster. At our schools, we are trying to raise up fundamentalist gentlemen. For example, I consider myself a friend of many of the leaders in the charismatic movement, although I oppose their doctrine and I am not a charismatic."

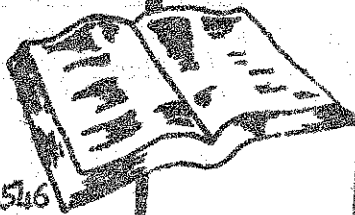

FULLER SEMINARY SPEAKERS DEFEND HOMOSEXUALITY AS A CHRISTIAN LIFE STYLE

The magazine, Faith at Work, for April 1978, carried a big ad on page 15 of a conference at Fuller Seminary, jointly sponsored by Fuller and the Evangelical Women's Caucus. It is set for June 14-16 1978 and lists a number of New Evangelicals, liberals, feminists, and charismatics. Two speakers are Virginia Mollenkott and Letha Scanzoni. They co-author an article in this issue of Faith at Work with an open defense of homosexuality as an acceptable Christian life-style. The article is unbelievable in its espousal of raw immorality and open defiance of the authority of the Word of God. Some choice quotes:

..The Apostle Paul in Romans One.. "The description fits well the idolatrous world Paul was concerned with in the latter part of that chapter, but it is hard to harmonize with the case of a sincere homosexual Christian (such as in our opening illustration) who wants above all else to honor the Lord Jesus Christ and to acknowledge God in every aspect of life. There are probably far more such Christians than any of us realize, because most of them have been forced to hide their sexual orientation in response to societal attitudes." p. 9

..Explaining Away The Sin of Sodom.. "Since the Bible itself interprets the destruction of Sodom as being the result of a complex pattern of violent and cruel lust, unconcern for the poor, and inhospitality to strangers, isn't it irresponsible to claim that Sodom was 'destroyed for homosexuality?' We know how to distinguish heterosexual love from heterosexual lust and rape. Surely we owe the same respect to our neighbors, the homosexuals." p. 9

..Homosexuals Are Not Accountable.. "Before making the unqualified statement that 'homosexuality is sin,' Christians need to ask themselves: can a very young child be held accountable for deliberately violating God's will because of a predisposition toward homosexuality that is unconscious and involuntary. Some authorities, such as Dr. John Money, compare the homosexual orientation to left-handedness." p. 10

..Homos Are A Godly Asset to America.... "All too often, Christians have viewed homosexuals as a single category and

..Vernon Grounds joins with WCC Leader.. In a conference jointly sponsored by a World Council of Churches agency, a Roman Catholic group, Lutheran World ministries and the Ecumenical Development Cooperative Society on May 2-5, 1978 at Ventnor, N.J. on Liberation and Evangelism in Mission. The publicity letter states: "Dr. Emilio Castro, director of the World Council's Commission on World Mission and Evangelism has consented to give the keynote address. Dr. Vernon Grounds, President of the Conservative Baptist Theological Seminary in Denver, will lead the Bible study. Other participants include leading figures of conciliar Protestant denominations, Roman Catholics, young evangelicals, Third World persons, pastors, lay people, and experts in political science and economics."

..One of the Roman Catholic leaders at this unbelievable gathering is a priest, Thomas Stransky, C.S.P., who was one of the Vatican leaders who represented the Roman Catholic Church at the Venice, Italy Conference in April 1977 at which Dr. David Hubbard and John R.W. Stott led evangelicals in a Catholic-Evangelical dialogue with leaders from the Vatican at Rome. Dr. Hubbard revealed that Stransky was one of the Catholic leaders as he delivered the Colliver lectures at the notoriously liberal University of Pacific in Stockton, an institution of the United Methodist Church. Another catholic prelate listed with Dr. Grounds is Mortimer Arias of South America.

..An Interfaith Ecumenical Gathering.. The general assembly of the Council of Churches of Santa Clara County gathered at the notoriously liberal St. Andrews Methodist Church in Palo Alto, according to the San Jose Mercury-News for Jan. 21, 1978, page 18E: "On the panel will be The Rev. After all, isn't celibacy the only option open to an unmarried heterosexual Christian?...This is why in his book The Church and the Homosexual, Roman Catholic priest John McNeill asks whether the Church itself may not be contributing to the problem of promiscuity by its failure to work with homosexuals toward developing an ethical and biblical way to live within their homosexual orientation." p. 10

..An Appeal For Blessing on Wickedness.. "Perhaps we need to give serious attention to Christian ethicists such as Helmut Thielicke (The Ethics of Sex), J. Rinzema (The Sexual Revolution), and Lewis Smedes (Sex for Christians), who suggest that the ideal for homosexuals lacking the gift of celibacy might be a covenantal, faithful homosexual relationship in much the same way as marriage is the ideal for heterosexual persons." p. 18.


..This is mighty near to blasphemy..The concluding paragraph: "In the light of all this, what should the heterosexual Christian majority be saying to the homosexual Christian minority? And what sort of leadership should Christians be providing for secular society on the issue of homosexuality? MORE NEW EVANGELICALIST DEVELOPMENTS

..Pat and Debby Boone at Las Vegas.."The Nevada Club Calendar Dates" section of the Oakland Tribune for April 23, 1978 (p. 9-E) lists the various Hollywood and TV entertainers who will be performing at the nightclubs at the gambling casinos in the wickedness of Las Vegas. At the Sahara gambling casino Midnight Show we find "Pat and Debby Boone and Rip Taylor open Thursday," which is April 27, 1978. It is one thing to corrupt one's own children in such a den of iniquity, but it is another thing to use one's worldly influence to corrupt the lives of thousands of other young people which Pat Boone will now be doing. The recent TV show of the Pat Boone family was a disgrace so far as dress, music and pelvic gyrations were concerned.

..Attitudes on Dr. Ockenga's Faculty..The Voice of Fundamentalism for March 1978 has an intriguing column: "Did You Know?" No. 39 states: That Dr. Richard Lovelace of Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary is quoted as saying "that if we compare Jesus' attitude toward uncompassionate pharisaism with his attitude toward sexual sin, 'it is likely (Jesus) would prefer a congregation of homosexual believers struggling toward a principled religious answer to their condition to a congregation of judgmental homophobes.' (people with a fear and loathing of homosexuals.)"

..Jarrell McCracken of Word Publishers..In the tongues magazine "Charisma" for April 1978, the youthful millionaire Jarrell McCracken tells how he broadened out his record and sheet music company in 1965 to get into books: "But books meant a lot to me. Books by Karl Barth, Reinhold Neibuhr and George Buttrick had saved my Christian faith in the 50's." We wonder what kind of faith he had both before and after. All three of these were not only Socialists, but every one of them rejected the historic Christian Faith based on an inerrant Bible as the Word of God. Two of these were among Jimmy Carter's favorite theologians. No wonder the country is in the sad shape it is.

..German Liberal Lectures at Fuller..Continuing a constant parade of liberals, rabbis, and Roman Catholics to the honored platform of Fuller Seminary in Pasadena, is Helmut Thielicke. The Fuller (Continued Right Hand Column This Side)

THE BASIC SIN IS ITS EGOCENTRICITY

Back in the late 50's before Dr. Donald Grey Barnhouse died, he had an editorial exposing Norman Vincent Peale in Eternity magazine. He quoted a strong criticism of Peale (who is one of the favorite preachers of Billy Graham) by neo-liberal Reinhold Niebuhr (who is Jimmy Carter's favorite theologian). Dr. Niebuhr: "The Christian religion is one of repentance and faith, sin and grace. Christianity stresses the idea that man tends to think more of himself than he should and that there can be no real meeting with God except through repentance and confession of sin. The basic sin of this new cult is its egocentricity. It puts 'self,' instead of the cross, at the center of the picture. Christianity insists that you cannot have faith without repentance, and since the very ideas of sin and repentance are negative, the positive thinkers simply leave them out, or at best, gloss them over. The result is a partial picture of Christianity, a sort of half-truth." Now since Niebuhr is a neo-orthodox unbeliever, he cannot be trusted to know anything about Bible subjects, such as sin and repentance. However, his evaluation of this cult is interesting. There are also cults intruding into evangelicalism today that major on egocentricity, the glorifying of the human ego.

..Continued..Bulletin for Feb.-March, 1978 stated: "Once forbidden by the Nazi regime to travel, speak publicly or to publish, noted German Theologian Helmut Thielicke lectured on 'Proclamation as a Political Factor' at Fuller in February. During his visit he participated in a panel on ethics in the German language moderated by Dr. Lewis Smedes, professor of theology and ethics. Dr. Darrell Guder, adjunct professor of theology translated from the German." There are others who think that Thielicke's hands during the Hitler era in Germany were less than clean.

..The World Literature Crusade on TV does it again. In their previous TV special, under direction of Jack McAlister, they featured such unbelieving liberals as Dietrick Bonhoeffer and Soren Kierkegaard. This brought a lot of flak and they promised constituents--never again. A big ad in the Atlanta Journal and (Continued Back Page Right Column)

Mrs. Mollenkott has openly called for evangelical acceptance of homosexuality as an acceptable Christian life-style in the Faith At Work magazine for April 1978 in a major article. 

This school also lists as a member of their faculty Dr. Edward Cole, pastor of the largest church in the liberal American Baptist Convention. ALONG THE NEW EVANGELICAL TONGUES' FRONT

..Dr. Kantzer will support Charismatics.
The new editor of Christianity Today stated in the April 7, 1978 issue: "The charismatic movement is an integral and significant part of the evangelical community. The vast majority of those who identify with the Pentecostal bodies of the past or with the present charismatic movement are working within the framework of an orthodox and biblical Christianity. We shall continue to support charismatics in their witness for Christ. We welcome their contributions. We plan to work together with them for the Gospel. Where there are departures from biblical orthodoxy, CHRISTIANITY TODAY will oppose error here as well as elsewhere." This is a far-reaching confession to heresy and error.

..On the Contrary the Bible Says This...
I Cor. 14:8: "For if the trumpet give an uncertain sound, who shall prepare himself to the battle?" This significant warning text is found in the very chapter which deals with the problem of tongues in the Corinthian church. It is on this very issue that the Bible says we must give no uncertain sound. The Pentecostal movement has been historically viewed by Fundamentalists as a cult (See Irvine: Heresies Exposed) and a clear-cut line must be drawn. The charismatic movement is heretical in relation to (1) An unbiblical doctrine of the Baptism of the Holy Spirit; (2) An unbiblical doctrine of speaking in tongues, (3) An unbiblical doctrine of faith healing, involving present gifts of healing, which constitutes a racket and a fraud, (4) Unbiblical doctrine of authority, which places their whole system on an experientially-based theology, rather than on a Word-based theology.

CHARISMATICS ARE ENEMIES OF FUNDAMENTALISM

The charismatic movement finds ready acceptance among unbelieving liberalism, deceptive Neo-orthodoxy, compromising neo-evangelicalism, and in Roman Catholicism, but not Fundamentalism. Something of the bitter antagonism against Fundamentalism is seen in these important quotes:

..Roman Catholic Cardinal Leo Suenens...
"I am thinking for instance of the 'Jesus Movement'...their reading of the Bible often accords with the fundamentalist pattern. Yet, despite these defects and ambiguities, young people are seeking in Jesus a reason for hope...The Protestant Churches have also regularly been confronted, along with genuine currents of revival, with false movements based on a fundamentalist biblical interpretation...There is a fundamentalist style of writing which cheapens the predictions in the Scriptures and is not really faithful to their message." A New Pentecost, pp. 52, 60, 175.

..The Danger of Biblical Fundamentalism.
"Does not Pentecostal teaching border on Scriptural fundamentalism?--If Catholics get involved with fundamentalist groups, they will be affected by the teaching. However, Catholic groups in general:... Integrate their reading of Scripture with the Church's dogmatic and sacramental theology." Walsh, "A Key to Charismatic Renewal" p. 274.

..Fundamentalism Borders on Heresy." "This is the inner meaning of heresy--the adherence to one truth at the expense of, instead of in relation to, its opposite. One could call it the refusal of paradox and then fundamentalism is not far behind...They are legion who are not secure enough to think for themselves...With that comes fundamentalism and the naivete that goes with it." Chachere, "Gift of Discernment and Church Authority," pp 31-32.

..Fundamentalism Can Be a Big Problem...
"When Scripture is used in a more public way by persons without specific exegetical training, a literalness of interpretation may become evident, with the danger of biblical fundamentalism...While this general Catholic population is not characterized by the great attention it accords to the Scripture as a major source of its spiritual food, a great attention to the Scriptures does typify the

SBC HONORS UNBELIEVING THEOLOGIAN

The Atlanta Journal and Constitution for April 29, 1978 reports that the Southern Baptist Convention is set for Atlanta June 13-15, 1978. Speakers announced: Jimmy Carter, Mrs. Billy Graham, Dr. Martin Luther King, Sr., Malcolm Muggeridge, Anita Bryant, Actress Jeanette Clift George, SBC President Jimmy Allen, and Quaker Theologian Elton Trueblood.

..Trueblood is at Sea on Salvation..In his book "The Essence of Spiritual Religion," on page 61: "Salvation consists in that change of means in which a man faithfully embraces his real self, overcomes the fundamental contradiction, and comes to the place where his heart is given to the best he can conceive." This is not only confusing, it is deceptive. What about repentance, grace, redemption depravity, and even God Himself? The Bible tells us that "Salvation is of the Lord."

..Trueblood is a Clear-cut Modernist on the Holy Scriptures. In his book "The Philosophy of Religion," he states: "Though some fringe groups still resist the fearless application of scientific inquiry to the origin, authorship and composition of the Bible, the agreement among thoughtful people in this area is almost universal. In the area of Biblical studies the struggle for intellectual integrity has ended in victory. Yet we take victory so for granted that we fail to realize how phenomenal it has been. How amazing it is that it has been possible, in spite of years of reverence for the very letter of Scripture, to face the sacred writings with complete scientific honesty, boldly pointing out the mythical and legendary elements in both the Old Testament and New Testament."

In his book "The Future of the Christian" on page 69: "Much as we admire the sincere devotion and sacrificial giving of many persons in the Fundamentalist camp, we must conclude that theirs is not a love option in the contemporary world. The Christian does not dare to take a stand which he cannot accept with the concurrence of all his mental powers. We do not know very much, but we at least know that we must avoid obscurantism. The Christian faith is disloyal to its own genius whenever it undertakes to prevent enlightenment."

JERRY FALWELL'S TRIP WITH CHARISMATICS

A series of television programs over the weekend of May 21, 1978 has revealed the astounding story of the trip by Jerry Falwell and a number of charismatic leaders to the Middle East to meet with Sadat and Begin. The whole trip was set up by a secular magazine called Inspiration which is produced by publishers of Hot Rod, Motor Trend and other magazines. Inspiration's release said: "A happy group of people is ready to embark on the Evangelical Fact-Finding Mission to the Middle East, arranged by Inspiration magazine." The news releases from one of the most famous tongues churches of the nation, Melodyland Charismatic Center in Southern California, stated that their leader Dr. Ralph Wilkerson made the trip with Dr. Falwell, along with Dr. John Warwick Montgomery, a Lutheran Missouri Synod theologian, who has joined the tongues faculty at Melodyland seminary. Dr. Montgomery has been known to be very caustic toward fundamentalism, and especially any Biblical separatist position. Dr. Falwell stated in all his releases that he "was invited to accompany a group of conservative religious leaders on a peace mission to the Middle East." He made no mention of Ralph Wilkerson, Dr. Montgomery and other charismatic leaders on the trip.

MORE ON THE FALWELL-WILKERSON TRIP

The noted tongues leader, Ralph Wilkerson, of the Melodyland Charismatic Center in Anaheim reported that he and Jerry Falwell were given permission to hold a crusade together in Cairo by President Sadat, when they spent an hour with him at Aswan. Wilkerson told television viewers, as he was giving his report on the trip with Falwell, that the two would alternate in their preaching on the crusade. Wilkerson would preach one night and then Falwell would preach the next night. Dr. Wilkerson said that "Mr. Sadat knew God in a very special way," and that he had the highest respect for the Bible as the Word of God, and even believed in its inerrancy. Dr. Wilkerson also revealed "that on the trip they found they were all being welded together into one group." This information was revealed to West Coast TV stations on Saturday and Sunday, May 20 and 21, 1978. In the

VERNON GROUNDS APPEARS IN MOVIE EXALTING A NEO-ORTHODOX UNBELIEVER

One of the most astounding developments this year is the announcement that a leading New Evangelicalist who is the most influential theologian in the Conservative Baptist Association, is to have a leading part in the new movie honoring the life and thought of the late noted German unbeliever, Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Dr. Vernon Grounds is known widely as a disciple of the 19th Century Danish apostate, Soren Kierkegaard, and one who has a profound sympathy for other neo-orthodox theologians, such as Barth. Now he becomes a champion of Bonhoeffer, who is actually an atheist to the God of the Bible. A publicity letter of May 12, 1978 from Heritage Media Productions of Fresno states: "Among those who are interviewed in the film are Dr. Vernon Grounds, President, Conservative Baptist Seminary Dr. Robert Blaney, Chairperson, Religious Studies Department, University of Pacific, Stockton, CA; Dr. Eberhard Bethge, noted biographer of Bonhoeffer, and Jeane Lasserre, pacifist and close friend of Bonhoeffer." This is unthinkable.

..Bonhoeffer's Blasphemy on God. In a letter of July 16, 1944, Bonhoeffer wrote: "There is no longer any need for God as a working hypothesis, whether in morals, politics, or science. Nor is there any need for such a God in religion or philosophy. In the name of intellectual honesty these working hypotheses should be dropped or dispensed with as far as possible."

..Bonhoeffer's Blast at God's Word. In his book "Creation and Fall," he held that both were myths and fairy tales. In his book "No Rusty Swords" on page 318: "The New Testament bears witness in both doctrine and history, it is nothing in itself but bears witness of something else...its words and statements are not in themselves true and eternal and holy. The whole New Testament in all its parts is meant to be expounded as a witness, not as a book of wisdom, a teaching book a book of eternal truth." This total rejection of the Bible as being in itself the Word of God is typical of all neo-orthodox thinkers. If there is wholesome food in a garbage can, then one can find some good things in Bonhoeffer. But if it be dangerous to expect to find nourishment in a garbage can, then Bonhoeffer

..The Melodyland School of Theology, the nation's largest and only charismatic graduate school, now has a Roman Catholic leader on their Board of Regents as well as an Orthodox Catholic prelate, according to Dr. David Hubbard in his recent Colliver Lecture at Stockton's University of Pacific. They advertise in their large half-page ads that they have Catholics in the student body. Dr. Ralph Wilkerson is the Chancellor and leading personality of this seminary.

..Christianity Today and Homosexuality.. FULLER SEMINARY AND THEIR MORAL SHAME

..The Nation's Leading New Evangelical seminary is sponsoring a conference on women's liberation on June 14-16, 1978 and lists a number of liberals, feminists, and pro-homosexuals on the program. The two most prominent speakers are Letha Scanzoni and Virginia Mollenkott. Mollenkott is divorced. Both of these are strong advocates for the acceptance of homosexuality as a proper Christian life style in harmony with the Word of God, and pleasing to God. This moral perversion is frightening. We cannot believe what we are reading about the moral bankruptcy of New Evangelicalism.

Read Romans 1:26-32; I Cor. 6:9-11

HIGH HONOR COMES TO OUR SEMINARY

It is a pleasure to spread the good news that the Dean of the San Francisco Baptist Theological Seminary, Charles Franklin Baker, has been awarded the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity by Maranatha Baptist Bible College. The degree was announced at the 1978 Commencement exercises at Watertown, Wisconsin, on Saturday, June 3, 1978 by the founder and president-Dr. B. Myron Cedarholm. Dr Baker, 34, is a graduate of Pillsbury Baptist College with a BA degree and pursued his graduate theological education in San Francisco. He received the BD degree in 1969 and the Master of Theology degree in 1974, with one of the highest grade point averages of any student to that time. He was the founding pastor of the Grace Baptist Church of Sonora from 1970 to 1976. He has been a professor of New Testament since 1976. The Board of Trustees unanimously appointed him as Dean of the faculty in 1977 where he has served with distinction. He also served as President of the Association of Fundamental Baptist Churches of Northern California. He and his wife, Janice, together with their children (Michelle-10; Timothy-7) live in San Leandro. We want to thank Dr. Cedarholm and the leadership of Maranatha for this worthy recognition of a coming Fundamentalist scholar.

REVIEW OF "THE WORLDLY EVANGELICALS"

A new book by Richard Quebedeaux (Harper and Row, 189 pages \$6.95) was reviewed by Donald Tinder in Christianity Today for May 19, 1978. It evidently contains some startling material. One section: "Many of his more provocative statements are undocumented, such as the assertions that Bethel, Gordon, and Trinity colleges are more liberal than their respective seminaries; that 'rumor has it that 70 per cent of Wheaton College seniors are breaking the pledge regularly' (p.93 that 'we can assume that the radicals' methodology will eventually become dominant in left evangelical circles' (p. 124) or that 'the governing boards of these colleges are not blind to this situation. They know that many of their faculty sign the required statement of faith with tongue in cheek...What does concern the governing board...is that

DEGREE CONFERRED UPON PENTECOSTALIST

A highly successful young pastor in Southern California who is associated with the Baptist Bible Fellowship wrote on May 30, 1978 to another prominent leader "I too have been quite upset with the way in which so many of our men have such compromising standards with associations. I too feel quite deeply about the matter of Dr. Holland London and the California Graduate School of Theology. They are willing to have just about anyone associated with them. On a recent occasion they awarded a 'doctorate' to the pastor of a large Assembly of God Church with Dr. London speaking in that church to make the presentation on a Sunday morning. They also hold extension courses in this city with a large cross-section of all denominations in full cooperation. It seems that we have lost sight of what separation means in the stand of the clergy for the sake of recognition and popularity. That is a real shame." Dr. Jerry Falwell announced over nationwide TV on May 27, 1978, after having Dr. Holland London bring a brief message, that he was a member of the faculty of this school, along with Dr. John Rawlings, Dr. David Cavin, Dr. Bill Dowell, Dr. A.V. Henderson, and Dr. Charles Billington. The latest piece of publicity is a letter of June 1, 1978, signed by Dr. London and Paul L. Dirks, that said: "...you will learn why our school continues to be one of the fastest growing schools of theology in the United States and why it has attracted leading pastors from 35 denominations."

..New Evangelical Leader Appears In A Film honoring the noted unbeliever, Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Dr. Vernon Grounds is one of the four who gives a benevolent commendation of this apostate leader, who was executed by Hitler forces. The film is produced by Heritage Media Productions of Fresno.

..ON Jesus Christ and Salvation... In Bonhoeffer's "Letters and Papers from Prison": "Unlike the other oriental religions the faith of the Old Testament is not a religion of salvation. Christianity, it is true, has always been regarded as a religion of salvation. But isn't this a cardinal error, which divorces Christ from the Old Testament and interprets him in the light of the myths of salvation?" He continues on the same page-112- "The Christian, unlike the devotees of the salvation myths does not need a last refuge in the eternal from earthly tacks and difficulties."

..Christianity Contains Many Myths Bonhoeffer refers to the Resurrection as "mythological". He says: "I am of the view that the full content, including mythological concepts, must be maintained. P.110. "Belief in the Resurrection is not the solution of the problem of death." P.93

..Radical Treatment of New Testament ... Concerning the horrifying thesis of Rudolf Bultmann that the New Testament first needed to be demythologized, Bonhoeffer said: "My view of it today would be not that he went too far, as most people think, but that he did not go far enough. It is not only the mythological conceptions, such as miracles, the ascension and the like (which are not in principle separate from the conceptions of God, faith and soon) that are problematic, but that 'religious' conceptions themselves." P.94.

..Atrocious New Testament Interpretation "God is teaching us that we must live as men who can get along very well without him. The God who is with us is the God who forsakes us (Mark 15:34)"; P.122. So says Dietrich Bonhoeffer. It is hard for us to believe that someone like Dr. Grounds, a gentleman in so many ways, would knowingly honor an enemy of our Lord Jesus Christ, and an opponent of the Bible.

That: Our highest aspiration should be "They will be done"- nothing more, nothing less, nothing else!

THE FAMOUS ROMAN CATHOLIC TONGUES PRIEST

Writing in the protestant charismatic paper "Logos Journal" for May/June 1978 P.11-14, John Bertolucci, contributed a revealing article: "The Disciplines of Discipleship That All May Be One." ..For All To Get Together As One.. "We must truly proclaim in full Gospel and not just our favorite part of it. ..In a widely circulated letter from Dr. Jerry Falwell to Dr. Jack Van Impe, which has been sent out from the Van Impe Crusade office, the following is claimed "Pastor (Mark) Andrews also quoted the Blu-Print, September 10, 1974 regarding Malcolm Muggeridge. 

 In his last will and testament the late Pope Paul VI had this to say on ecumenism: "On ecumenism - May the work of drawing closer to the separated brethren be continued with great understanding, with great patience, with great love, but without deflecting from the true Catholic doctrine." C.V. 8-21-78 P.9

..The United Nations "TM" Cult Leader ..
 conducted a memorial service for the late Pope before 150 diplomats and UN staffers. With a picture of the Pope before him he stated: "Your divine greatness was your contribution to the Heavenly Father. Your supreme goodness was your contribution to Mother Earth. Constant self-giving was your inner life. Constant peace-offering was your outer life. Our aspiration-heart treasures your Vision-Eye. Our dedication-life treasures your Perfection-Heart." The Christian News (8-21-78 -p.3) adds: "The Pope maintained that Hindus and other non-Christians could get to heaven without believing in Christ."

..Dr. Robert T. Ketcham With The Lord ..
 One of the giants of Fundamentalism entered Heaven on Aug. 21, 1978 in Chicago. The memorial service was at Belden Baptist in Niles, Ill. on Thursday, August 24, 1978, with burial the next day at Elmira, N.Y. Dr. Ketcham was born in 1889 and gave over 60 years to the Baptist ministry. He was a Fundamentalist fighter in the best sense of the word. He served 18 years in the leadership of the GARBC, of which he was one of the founders. He helped found the ACCC and ICCC. Nearly 500,000 copies of his books and over 3 million copies of his pamphlets were published. He is survived by his wife, Mary, and three children. We pay high tribute to his memory.

THE LEFT-WING CBHMS GENERAL DIRECTOR

Dr. Rufus Jones, General Director of the CBHMS and former President of the NAE, is a good example of the reason why scores of churches disassociated themselves from the CBA-CBFMS complex for compromise. Dr. Jones's new book "If I were In My Thirties" was reviewed by Dr. Robt. Sumner in the Biblical Evangelist for August 1978: "Perhaps a more appropriate title for this volume might be 'The Philosophies of Refus Jones for Socializing the World Within An Evangelical Context'. Jones, who has long served as General Director of the Conservative Baptist Home Mission Society, loses no time in putting down the fundamentalists...What is the 'whole gospel' to Jones? The reader is driven to the conclusion that it is part evangelical and part social. Ignoring the fact that neither our Lord nor His disciples worked for social reforms in their day...Jones seems to be advocating the radical liberal left in politics, after the same manner as Senator Mark Hatfield, another Conservative Baptist. He praises 'liberal programs' put into law 'sponsored by men like Franklin D. Roosevelt, Jr., Nelson Rockefeller, Jr., and John and Edward Kennedy.' (p.67). What he fails to say is that these 'liberal programs' have just about destroyed the fiscal solvency of our nation and, rather than helping the common man, in the long run they have taken away his initiative for self-help and honest labor...To us, the most tragic statement in the book is found in the author's claim that those who disagree with him on the social issue represent only 'a minority of the people' in the Conservative Baptist Association of America (p.73). We hope he is mistaken. Perhaps to disassociate himself even more from the lowly fundamentalist, all the 'Scripture quotations in this publication are from the Revised Standard Version,' the favorite text of liberals and one repudiated by fundamentalists."

THE PEOPLE'S CHURCH OF TORONTO

..Dr. Paul Smith Of Toromto People's Church is listed in a big ad of the California Graduate School of Theology in Christianity Today for Sept. 22, 1978.p.45. On the conference program with Dr. Smith is Dr. W.A. Criswell and Dr. Jerry Falwell, along with Dr. Charles Billington and Dr. A.V. Henderson. Dr. Smith is a thorough-going New Evangelicalist. He was a leading official and supporter of the recent Toronot Graham Crusade. We presume he assumes the same post-tribulationist position as his father , Oswald J. Smith, by rejecting an any-moment rapture of the saints.

..Smith Opens His Pulpit To Charismatics. Richard and Patti Roberts have been honored on the platform of the People's Church, bringing their unique style of music which is featured at Oral Roberts University, the nation's largest charismatic university.

..Pat Robertson of the TV "700 Club" was also a recent speaker at the famous People's Church of Toronto. This noted tongues and faith healing promoter was listed as the speaker of Sunday evening, April 30, 1978. Pat Robertson is not friend of Fundamentalism and is known for the promotion of entertainment stars who have a superficial Christian testimony while they continue a shoddy way of life immersed in the world.

..Bob Harrington Is The Ideal Evangelist at a church like this. A pastor wrote in 1976: "I was saddened the other day to read in the Toronto Star that the People's Church in Toronto was having Bob Harrington for revival meetings during September. We are indeed in a battle." Long before Bob Harrington's life-style became a disaster, he was plugging the charismatic movement on such TV talk shows as PTL, and casting derogatory remarks about the Fundamentalists on such appearances as the Lou Gordon show out of Detroit.

..Smith Is For Ecumenical Evangelism. He started out the New Year of 1977 with a bang by having Dr. Jon Wesley White twice on January 23 and February 13. The big ad in the Toronto Daily Star read: "Our Guest Speaker is an Associate Evangelist of the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association. His subject is: THE BIONIC MAN." Ecumenical evangelism has cast a spiritual blight on America.

..Smith Shows Contempt for Bob Jones III, who launched a campaign in 1977 against General Motor's sponsorship of the controversial film of Zeffrelli on the life of Jesus. The Toronto Star (4-16-77,p.B8) reported: "Rev. Paul Smith, pastor of Canada's largest Fundamentalist congregation, the People's Church on Sheppard Ave., told the Star he was 'astounded' that General Motors--who were to have been the sponsors of the programs- had yielded to Fundamentalist pressure in the United States and turned the film down. 'Members of my congregation that I've talked to were very, very impressed by it,' he said. 'I haven't heard a critical word.'" Don't be harsh on the Star for mistakenly calling Smith a Fundamentalist.

..Smith Is All-Out For The Living Bible. Encounter magazine of Canada in the May - June 1977 issue, page 21-"The Living Bible has been a great source of inspiration to the English-speaking world. Now we have the opportunity of putting it into other languages. In my opinion there is no more effective manner in which to evangelize our rapidly dying world." The Living Bible is a fraudulent substitute for the Word of God It is impossible that a man-made paraphrase could be equated with the Living Word of the Living God.

..Spiritual Blindness on Living Bible. In a missionary letter of April 1976, Dr. Paul Smith wrote: "It is out hope that God will send in a sufficient amount beyond our present commitments so that we can make a substantial investment in the International Living Bible Ministry. This will put the Actual Word Of God in the hands of ordinary people in a dozen different countries. (also quoted in the Australian Beacon, June-July 1976.p.9). Dr. Smith is not the only New Evangelicalist operating under the delusion that a man-made paraphrase such as the Living Bible, is the actual Word of God.

..New Evangelical Betrayal At This Church. "The 50,000,000th copy of the Good News for Modern Man version of the New Testament was presented to the Archbishop of Canterbury. The 50,000,001st copy was given to Dr. Charles Seidenspinner, president of the Evangelical Fellowship of Canada. The presentation was made in the People's Church in Toronto, formerly the church of Oswald J. Smith. This version makes for itself the claim of being ecumenical." (News and Notes, No.159, Dr. Bolton Davidheiser, editor).

He then had on successive Sundays : a Mormon preacher, a Unitarian minister, a Christian Science leader, a Spiritualist pastor and a Jehovah's Witness leader. Regardless of the good reasons for having them, no unbeliever should be allowed in a Christian pulpit.

BISHOP LASHES OUT AT FUNDAMENTALISTS

"Describing himself as a 'vulnerable and sinful human being', the Right Rev. C. Kilmer Myers emotionally announced his resignation...at a diocesan convention in Grace Cathedral this weekend" reported the San Francisco Examiner of Oct. 28, 1978 on the front page. Concluding his address he said: "The fundamentalists are the contemporary descendents of those pharisees and scribes who confronted Jesus... We have been polite and tolerant long enough. Now is the time to attack, and in a manner that does not ape the hatred many of them have for us. It is time to assert that theirs is a false Christianity. To be sure, they grow in numbers, financial power and influence teaching into the highest levels of government. We have been nice to the fundamentalists. Now we Anglicans must fight back and re-assert our own tradition." The Examiner continued: "Myers admits he is unofficially separated from his wife, but he says he has no plans for divorce because he does not believe in it for himself." Concerning his alcoholism: "But it was a hard thing to admit, very hard. I was a closet drinker. I drank normal amounts in public at cocktail parties. One of my staff members helped me to see I was an alcoholic...And now I don't drink at all. Maybe one day I'll give up smoking, too." The Examiner also stated: "Behind his weekend attack on Fundamentalists, he said, was a distrust for the judgement of born-again Christians. They are fanatical, anti-human. And because of that Carter troubles him." "This burst of anger is a revelation of the deep seated hatred which ecumenical forces have for the Fundamentalists, who staunchly believe the Bible to be the objective, inerrant Word of God. In a recent sermon at the Cathedral, Bishop Myers attacked the Fundamentalists while he strongly defended the homosexual community and opposed Prop. 6.

FALWELLS INTERVIEW WITH ESQUIRE MAGAZINE

..Entitled- "The Next Billy Graham"... A friend in San Diego sent us a zerox copy of Esquire magazine article on Jerry Falwell, otherwise we would not have magazine. It is a pornographic magazine that has contributed heavily to the flith of the American newstand. ..Esquire Writer Mary Murphy Wrote It.. On the index page it says: "Jerry Falwell is the hottest comer in the group of new evangelical preachers now spreading the gospel in our born-again society. His ministry, in Lynchburg, Virginia, is the second largest in the country. It takes in \$32.5 million a year. In part, it's old-time religion: no smoking, dancing, dating or movies. On the other hand, it's very up-to-date: television cameras, headsets, tape recorders. It may create a climate that could lead to the unification of church and state."

...People Are Turning To Dr. Falwell from Billy Graham..Esquire states on page 29: "And younger people are more likely to turn to a hot property like Jerry Falwell than, say, to the established superstar of TV evangelism, Billy Graham, who turns sixty in November and who is strongly identified with the presidency of Richard Nixon. Aman who knows both Graham and Falwell intimately is Jerry Strober. He has written two books about Graham and is currently working on a biography of Falwell. 'Jerry will replace Graham as the leading prononent of evangelism in the United States,' Strober said. 'He is less emotional than either Billy or Oral Roberts. He is friendlier, nicer, and much less divisive. It isn't so much what he says as know he says it that makes people respond to him. He is not threatening. He is probably the only religious leader I know who could run for political office, and win.'"

..Concerning Dr. Falwell's Bankruptcy when the SEC forced him into receivership in 1971 and declared that Falwell's church and enterprises were insolvent, the court required five businessmen, not connected with the Church to help straighten out the finances. THE GUYANA COMMUNIST MURDER-MASSACRE

THE COMMUNIST EMPHASIS UPON DEATH

Certain unhappy conclusions concerning the mass murder horror of the People's Temple in San Francisco can now be drawn. 1. Pastor Jim Jones was a committed communist, trained as a Methodist preacher and now a Church of Christ ordained minister. 2. He lent strong political muscle to every far-left politician in recent elections, such as delivering hundreds of his followers by bus to political rallies to give support at points of need. 3. His attorney was a noted Bay Area attorney who has been identified many times under oath as a communist party member by several credible witnesses before various responsible government investigative bodies. 5. His private physician has been a known supporter of communist & left-wing causes in the area. 6. He established a communist commune in the South American jungles. 7. He practiced communist morals, with alleged widespread promiscuity throughout the communal settlement. 8. Homosexuals At Moody Bible Institute. We can hardly believe this but Faith At Work magazine for December 1978 had a letter from the Midwest Coordinator for Evangelicals Concerned, a homosexual outfit, which stated: "However, out of my Moody Bible Institute class, not one of the eight homosexuals I know of has ever changed despite prayer, therapy and marriage for most. All are still homosexual, and most live a veritable nightmare in their churches, communities and families lest anyone should discover that they're still unchanged. So I would say that, while nothing is impossible with God, the much-touted examples of change from clear homosexual orientation to an authentic heterosexual orientation seem generally to evaporate on closer examination." A MODERN ATROCITY AGAINST THE BIBLE

With the recent publication of "The Concise Bible", on twelfth the size of the King James Version, we are reminded of an editorial which appeared in Revelation magazine, November 1933, when Donald Grey Barnhouse was taking a more substantial Fundamentalist position. He wrote: "The University of Chicago has perpetrated another in a long series of atrocities in connection with the Bible. In the middle of September there came from the press 'The Shorter Bible, An American Translation,' edited by Professors Goodspeed & Powis Smith. Amos is the first book of their Bible, not for any alphabetical reason, for Hosea, Micah, Isaiah, Zephaniah, Nahum, Deuteronomy, Habbakuk, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, the Samuels, Kings, Judges, Haggi, Zechariah, Joel, Ruth and Job come in that order before Genesis. Thus in the middle of the book the creation story is given. The whole matter may be judged by their translation of what is the first verse of the Bible as we know it. 'When God began to create the heavens and the earth, the earth was a desolate waste, with darkness covering the abyss, and a tempestuous wind raging over the surface of the waters. Then God said, : Let there be light.' By referring to the Bible, one finds that the Spirit of God moving upon the face of the waters becomes a tempestuous wind raging over the surface of the waters. In the New Testament (not theirs) we read that holy men of old spake as they were borne along by the Holy Spirit. It would appear now that unholy men of modern times are borne along by a tempestuous wind that rages. They have taken away from the Book many parts in order to shorten it according to their own ideas. They have added to it by reading their own ideas into the translation, while in many cases they have latered the clear meaning of the original tongue. A few years ago when Dr. Kent issued his 'Shorter Bible' there was a furor in church circles because of this abridgement, and it is safe to say, in view of the low state of the church, that it will be received with even less apprehension." p.407. Read Revelation 22:18-19.
