Dr. Elmer L. Towns is a right-hand man for Dr. Jerry Falwell, as editor-in-chief of his publications. His background includes a position for 12 years on the staff of Christian Life magazine, and also a professor at Trinity Evangelical Seminary, the New Evangelical seminary of the Evangelical Free Church denomination. He had a revealing four-page article in Christianity Today for July 6, 1973, entitled "Trends Among Fundamentalists". He stated "Fundamentalism is divided into two camps, reflecting two areas of emphasis. First, there are 'withdrawing fundamentalists,' exemplified by the Northern Bible church movement, which refused to cooperate with apostasy. (They also might be called 'militant fundamentalists.'). These churches place priority on pure doctrine and pure life. The second are 'aggressive fundamentalists,' who are committed to bold evangelistic outreach. The catalyst for this movement is aggressive soul-winning through local churches: pure doctrine and pure life are seen as important ingredients but as means to the end. This group is often accused of 'buttonholing' prospective converts or proselyting believers from other churches. The 'withdrawing fundamentalists' believe in second-degree separation from liberalism (rejecting those who have fellowship with liberals), while 'aggressive fundamentalists' believe only in first-degree separation (refusal to have direct fellowship with liberals). The two camps among fundamentalists have fellowship with each other and are more similar to each other than either is to the evangelical camp." He further states: "Most fundamentalists are not the aggressive fighters of liberalism found in the past: they have learned that little progress is made through winning debates or 'showing up' the modernists. Most fundamentalists channel their 'aggressions' into an organized work, knowing that the greatest blow against liberalism is to win its lost church members to Christ and get them into a Bible-believing church. Today's fundamentalists understand the dynamics that make them strong. They appreciate 'relevance'-oriented ministries..." Actually, Dr. Towns is simply pointing up the difference between the real Fundamentalists and the "pseudo-fundamentalists". He leaves no (Continued next column).....

Letters to all Trustees of Bob Jones University last week from Chancellor Bob Jones brought the delightful news, that after eight agonizing years of expensive litigation, costing probably hundreds of thousands of dollars, victory came on Dec 26, 1978. U.S. District Judge Robt. F. Chapman ruled against the Internal Revenue Service and in favor of the University, according to Dr. Bob Jones III, President. The heart of the case were these words of the Judge: "... This court cannot and will not approve changes in the Law by an administrative agency that completely bypasses the legislative process... The revocation by the IRS of Plaintiff's (BJU) tax-exempt status under its misinterpretation of 501 (c)(3) is unlawful and unconstitutional..." This decision destroys two leading arguments of the IRS: 1. That the IRS has the right to make federal public policy to replace freedom of religion, and 2. That Christians schools such as BJU (and SF Baptist Seminary) are primarily educational, not religious. We will have more of this case. The University has had its rights restored to tax-exemption, though no one will be surprised if the IRS presses an appeal right to the Supreme Court. Let us pray that Judge Robt. Chapman is considered for the next opening on the U.S. Supreme Court, though it is not likely that racially discriminatory Carter Administration would entertain such a possibility. The whole thing revolved around its "Biblically based convictions against interracial dating and marriage". BJU does allow blacks, as well as all other minorities to have admission. "It did, however, retain its Biblical convictions against interracial dating and marriage by refusing to allow such within the student body. Because the IRS did not approve of this religious tenet of Bob Jones University, it withdrew its tax-exempt status anyway on January 19, 1975. The University sued the IRS for restoration of its tax-exempt status, and Judge Chapman's decision has decreed in our favor", says Dr. Bob Jones III, President. This has had and will have far-reaching implications for every Christian in the nation, of which there are thousands.

He has correctly observed that the basic difference lies in the failure in thorough-going Biblical separation, and also a failure to aggressively oppose modernism and liberalism. It is interesting that pure doctrine and pure life are considered as secondary means to an end - the end of what? They manifest a further serious weakness and that is to think that their greatest blow against liberalism is aggressive soul-winning. This is simply a pious way of building up large groups and churches to be more easily taken over by the ecumenical movement. If soul-winning were the antidote to apostasy, then the quarter-century of Grahams ecumenical evangelism would have long since destroyed apostasy. Today the apostasy is more deeply entrenched in American life than ever before in this century.

PRESIDENT JIMMY CARTER HONORS WOMAN OF IMMORAL VIEWS WITH NATIONS HIGHEST AWARD

..The San Francisco Chronicle for Jan. 20, 1979 (p.10) stated "President Carter announced yesterday he is awarding the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the government's highest civilian award, to the late anthropologist Margaret Mead. Her medal will be presented today to Mead's daughter, Dr. Catherine Bateson, by United Nations Ambassador Andrew Young. The citation accompanying the medal says: 'Margaret Mead was both a student of civilization and an exemplar of it...Intrepid, independent, plain-spoken, fearless, she remains a model for the young and a teacher from whom all may learn.' If our 'born-again' Baptist President honestly believes this and if he knows what Margaret Mead believed and taught, then the moral weakness of the White House is far more serious than we dared to think."

..An Orthodox Lutheran Evaluation is found in the Christian News for Jan. 24, '79 "Ms. Mead, who has been a featured speaker at important meetings of the National and World Council of Churches, rejects Christian standards of morality. She has been divorced several times herself. She expressed some of her anti-Christian notions in an interview published in the Aug. 23, 1968 issue of Life. Speaking about the population explosion she said: "Once we have realized this, we free women to be people, and whether we free them to copulate oftener or with more partners is less relevant."

..Ms. Mead Favors Legalized Adultery..... "I have recommended that we have different kinds of marriages- individual marriage in which young people who aren't ready to have children can legally live together. I don't think they should be ready for children until they have tried marriage for a couple of years first. Then, after a couple knows they can get along together, there could be a second kind of marriage involving parental responsibility...The ideal of young people in this country is still totally monogamous marriage for life...It's a hopeless position, a ridiculous position and utterly untenable. But we live in this unreal world where people still assume in spite of the divorce rate that THEIR marriage is going to be different".

A NEW MOVEMENT IN REFORMED THEOLOGY ON THE RELIGIOUS HORIZON

A interesting struggle has developed within Reformed theology in the United States which bears watching by Fundamental Baptists for several reasons. This movement called "Theonomy" is marked by four significant characteristics, it appears to us: 1. It represents a resurgence of a previously discredited postmillennialism; 2. A re-emphasis upon "a hyper-Calvinistic witness"; 3. A bold declaration of the necessity for believers for literal observance of the Old Testament law, both moral and ceremonial as a strictway of life; 4. The prescriptive and penal codes of the New Testament are equally binding upon believers and unbelievers, upon pagan states as well as "Christian" states. The leading textbook is a massive 600-page book by Dr. Greg L. Bahnsen of the Reformed Seminary of Jackson, Mississippi, entitled "Theonomy in Christian Ethics." This group "makes little apology for leaning heavily on the political and economic unfluence of writers like R.J. Rushdoony and Gary North." Its leading challenger within the Reformed faith right now has been the Presbyterian Journal, which in a half dozen issues (Sept. 6, 13, 20; Nov. 1, Dec. 6) has raised some significant questions. The Journal realizes how serious this is and how far-reaching it is to the Christian Faith. Angry reaction to the Journals discussion appears to have silenced the Journal from further debate. This is regrettable. Since voices of self-criticism have been silenced within the Reformed arena, it may be wholesome to discuss this from without those confines. Dr. Bahnsen writes: "The law of God, even its jots and tittkes, has contemporary obligation and value in the New Testament age ... Every word which proceeds from God's mouth... binds the behavior of God's people." He also writes: "So important is the law in our salvation that our justification is grounded in Christ's obedience to it." This obedience, imputed to us, was "to both the prescriptive and penal requirements" of the law. The Journal of Sept. 13, 1978 states on page 9 - "The Old Testament law writes Rushdoony, 'is God's program for conquest in His name.' (Here is where the new postmillennialism connects in). Jesus Christ, 'by redeeming and restoring man in God's image,' restored man, 'to his creation mandate to subdue the earth by means of science, agriculture, the arts, commerce and industry, education and every other legitimate human pursuit, and to exercise dominion over all things under God." Dr. G. Aiken Taylor states on page 19: "Theonomy is deceptively attractive and impressively Biblical in its claims." Permit these preliminary observations: 1. It is obvious that with this unwarranted mixing of New Testament and Old Testament, this movement represents an attack upon any dispensational distinctions between these two economies. 2. It is an espousal of the deadly Cultural Mandate idea that give strength to the Social Gospel, and is bound to lead to sympathy of postmillennial and amillennial concepts. 3. It involves a rejection of the basic ideas of the Doctrine of Biblical Separation, and ignores the important crucial decision (Acts 15) to separate clearly and cleanly from Judaism in the historical development of Separation. 4. It will prove very attractive to those who have taken the logical road into the Reformed Baptist position as a result of a rigid commitment to a hyper-Calvinist position. This will prove very critical to many in the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches. It is not secret that the revival of a strong Calvinist position within the GARB as represented by such distinguished men as Van Gilder, Nettleton, Good, Pickering, Brown and a host of others is a matter of deep concern to men in the GARBC and elsewhere in Fundamentalism.

..Communist Thought In The Cuban Church. Cuban theologian Prof. Arce Martinez, rec-
tor of the Evangelical Theological Seminary, Matanzas, Cuba states this in the
Ecumenical Review for July 1978: "In its confrontation with socialism and its Marx-
ist-Leninist ideology, the Church may even come to appreciate this upheaval in all
its dimensions. This has certainly been our theological experience in Socialist
Cuba... The Scriptures teach us that salvation must bring with it a new brotherly
solidarity which takes concrete form in a 'community of goods' in which 'private
ownership (of the means of production)' is abolished so that all may benefit from
the good produced... Theology today is faced with the task of redefining through pra-
ctice the apostolicity and catholicity of faith in the context of today's world, THE
WORLD OF THE PROLETARIAN REVOLUTION, OF THE DEATH OF CAPITALISM AND THE EMERGENCE OF
SOCIALISM." (ACCent, Nov-Dec. 1978). This Marxist will lecture this summer at Paci-
fic School of Religion, Berkeley, July 2-27.



DR. CRISWELL DIALOGUES WITH LIBERAL JEW

..Are People Inherantly good or bad?....
"They're inherantly good- the bad reactions aren't basic. Every human being is a child of God and has more of God in him than of evil-but circumstances and associates can step up the bad and reduce the good. I've got great faith in the essential fairness and decency-you may say goodness- of the human being." (Modern Maturity for Dec.-Jan.1975/76).

..Is Darwin or the Bible Account True?...
"Both are true. Darwin's work is not in conflict with the Bible. In fact, it only serves to clarify the more succinct and compact account given in the Bible. You will discover, the better educated you become, that all of man's advancing knowledge serves only to emphasize the amazing spiritual and philosophical insight of the writers of the Bible." (Look Magazine, Oct.15,1957).

..A Chorus Girl in a Burlesque Theatre...
wrote Dr. Peale for advise whether she should quit attending church while on the job: "No, don't stop attending church. While yours is not perhaps the most propitious occupation for spiritual development, try to make it a demonstration of Christian living. Our function as church members is to raise standards by transmitting vital religion wherever we are." (Look, Feb.4,1958).

One of the most astounding developments is found in "Perception" magazine for January 1979, published by Evangelical United for Zion. It is an article by Dr. W. A. Criswell telling of dialoguing with, and preaching for a Reformed Jewish Rabbi. The Jews in the USA are divided: Orthodox and Conservative, and Reformed. The Reformed are the most liberal and "modernistic" among the Jews. Dr. Criswell writes: "In the city of Dallas there is a splendid and gifted rabbi by the name of Saul Besser. He is the head of Temple Shalom, an affluent, reformed Synagogue located in the 'silk stocking' area of our city...Through this last decade Rabbi Saul Besser and I have come to be close friends. We help each other in the word of the Lord (Underlines-BP), and we encourage each other as we face an increasing atheistic, materialistic and Communistic world. But even though we have been close friends, I was not prepared for the invitation that came to me from him when he asked me to be his preacher on a Sabbath day service of recent date. It was a doubly meaningful service because his son was being bar mitzvahed in that holy and worshipful hour. I said to Rabbi Besser, 'This is the first time I have been invited to speak at a Sabbath Day Synagogue service.' The Rabbi replied to me, 'My dear friend, I want you to know that this is the first time I even invited a Christian minister to preach in my Synagogue.' The invitation was accepted the day came for me to be a part of the Synagogue worship hour. The rest of the story you would already know if you have attended a praise and prayer and preaching service with God's devout Chosen People. Every moment of the course of ritual blessed my heart-the prayers, the singing the reading from the Torah, the reading from the prophets, the expressions of love and appreciation. Then I prayed for God to help me bring the message. The Lord answered that prayer and doubly blessed the word that I brought, making it doubly appropriate because I had just been visiting with some of the Jewish people in Warsaw, Poland. It was an unforgettable experience to me, one that I shall treasure through all the unfolding years.



MOODY BIBLE INSTITUTE AND THE E.R.A.

HOLLAND LONDON LISTED AS SPEAKER AT HUGE CATHOLIC CHARISMATIC ECUMENICAL MEETING

The Daily Journal for March 4, 1979, published in suburban Chicago, had a shocking story: "Patricia Gundry, Wheaton home maker and author of 'Woman Be Free', a biblical study on equality for women, will discuss her book Monday at a meeting of the DuPage Chapter of Housewives for ERA. The program will begin at 7:30 PM...Glen Ellyn...Gundry attended Los Angeles Baptist College and is married to a former pastor and now professor of theology at Moody Bible Institute. DuPage Housewives for ERA is dedicated to helping pass the Equal Rights Amendment in Illinois. The group believes 'that the housewife makes an important contribution to our society which should receive legal recognition...that passage of the Equal Rights Amendment will both raise the housewife's status and strengthen the family unit.'" Many Bible believers across America would say that the last statement is a flat falsehood. The news story states that this Moody professor's wife has lectured at Moody, Wheaton and Trinity College, as well as having appeared on Moody radio station WMBI. For a detailed account of what she said at this Glen Ellyn lecture on March 5, 1979, interested parties may write to Mrs. Elsie C. Moore, 338 S. Lewis Avenue, Lombard, Ill. She expressed concern and sympathy for the homosexuals, drafting of woman into armed forces for combat and barracked with men. She flatly stated she did not accept Ephesians 5:22-33 and God's revealed order for the family. She said Eph. 6:1 (Children obey your parents) was "foreign to the sense of mutuality". If indeed we are in the will of God, ultimately 1 billion Christians may unite in celebration of Pentecost." Frederish stated: "Thursday, March 29th, there will be a special meeting of the Board of Trustees to consider the Committee's unanimous recommendation that Dr. Robinson be called to the presidency of our school...His early years in the Conservative Baptist movement, his theological commitment, and his breadth of spirit and vision match well with the heart and purpose of Denver Seminary. We believe that he has the stature to become a worthy successor to our honored and beloved President Grounds."



DOES THE CONDUCT OF JESUS JUSTIFY OUR INVOLVEMENT IN ECUMENICAL DIALOGUE?

The New Evangelical promoters of ecumenical dialogue with unbelievers, and the rejection of the doctrine of personal separation from unbelieving religious leaders, often use the account of Jesus in Luke 11:37-to justify their strategy of "infiltration" into pagan and modernistic cultures."And as he spake, a certain Pharisee besought him to dine with them." The sainted Bishop J.C. Ryle wrote in his commentary on Luke:"From this circumstance the conclusion is often drawn by weak believers that it is lawful and desirable to keep up social intercourse with unconverted people. As to the lawfulness there can be no doubt. As to the desirableness and expediency, everyone must judge for himself, and consider what he can do, and what he cannot. Those Christians who plead our Lord's example as an argument for dining with unconverted people, would do well to make our Lord's conduct and conversation at the tables of those with whom He dined. Let them copy Him in His conversation as well as in the acceptance of invitations. Unhappily, there are many who will accept the invitation as our Lord accepted, but will not talk at the table as our Lord talked. Read Luke 11:37-44 about the denunciations He made of his host and the Pharisees in the woes He pronounced against them. Bishop Ryle further states:"The conduct of our Lord on this occasion, as on others, is meant to be an example to all Christians. Christ is our pattern as well as our propitiation. There are evidently times and occasions when the servant of Christ must mix with the ungodly and the children of this world...Nothing, of course, must induce the Christian to be a partaker in the sins or frivolous amusements of the world...Let us take heed that we go down into the company of the unconverted in the same spirit in which Christ went. Let us remember His boldness in speaking of the things of God. He was always 'about His Father's business.' Let us remember His faithfulness in rebuking sin. He spared not even the sins of those that entertained Him, when His attention was publicly called to them. Let us go into company in the same frame of mind, and our souls will take no harm."

YFC PRESIDENT RECOMMENDS LIBERAL BOOKS

..New Evangelical Helps In Soul Winning..

The sad situation that prevails is seen in Youth for Christ's magazine - "Campus Life" for March 1979, P.30. A student writes for counsel on how to deal with and win a faculty member. YFC President Jay Kesler responds: "In such cases, it's good to offer something to read other than the usual devotional books or tracts. A book like C.S. Lewis's Mere Christianity is a great way to open up people's minds. I've also found that Chuck Colson's book Born Again has been a way of communicating with certain people. If the person has a deep intellectual commitment, I think probably the best things available right now is Malcolm Muggeridge's book Jesus Rediscovered."

..This Is Enough To Warn People Against..

Youth for Christ, if this is the type of thinking found in its leadership. C.S. Lewis, in the book recommended, refers to the substitutionary sacrifice of Christ, which is right at the heart of the Gospel and without belief in which no one can be saved, as a "very silly theory." This book by Muggeridge is a theological disaster, which scoffs at the Deity of Christ, the bodily resurrection, and other matters vital to the Faith.

..Muggeridge Rejected the Deity of Christ

On page 95 of "Jesus Rediscovered": To imagine this deity having a son in any particular sense, and this son to have been born of a virgin, and to have lived on earth for thirty years or so as a man; then to have died and to have risen from the dead, is, as far as I am concerned, beyond credibility."

..Muggeridge Rejected the Virgin Birth...

On page 1 of his book: "Christ's mother, Mary, conceived him out of wedlock but believed, when an inner voice, or angel, told her that her pregnancy was divinely ordained." so far as we know, Mr. Muggeridge has not publicly apologized to the Christian world for this kind of blasphemy against Christ and the mother of His humanity.

AN EVALUATION OF BOB JONES UNIVERSITY

One of the most unique Bible preachers of our time is Rev. J. Hoyett Lemmon of Tabernacle Baptist Church (Box 386) of Altus, Oklahoma 73521. He was recently invited to speak before the vast throng at Bob Jones University in the 7000-seat Amphitorium. In his weekly paper, which every Christian leader should have, for April 18, 1979, he wrote after the visit: "The School has been in operation approximately 50 years. It has never lowered its standards, never compromised the fundamentals of the faith, never sold out to the world and never been intimidated by the bureaucrats in government. Despite this, they have enjoyed a continued phenomenal growth, having approximately 7,000 students enrolled this year and a faculty and staff of over 900. This is positive proof that a school does not have to follow the worldly, ungodly educational crowd and succeed...It is without doubt one of, if not the most beautiful campus in the country. There are no hippies, bums, long hairs, and malcontents there. They simply are not permitted. A NEW RESIDENT MANAGER FOR LUCERNE

On Friday, May 18, 1979 the Lucerne Management Committee met in San Francisco at the San Francisco Baptist Seminary to interview and then announce the appointment of Mr. Larry White of Wisconsin as the new Resident Manager of Lucerne Christian Conference Center. He will succeed Mr. Robert Vining, who has given generous and sacrificial service for more than ten years. Mr. White is a specialist in supervising food services, operating more than 16 years in that capacity, including ten years as an actual cook. He has served as Food Service Director, Commissary Manager, Restaurant Manager, as well as being involved in large and small scale catering. Prior to this he worked as an Assistant Chef, Broiler Cook, and Fry Cook. He has had extensive experience in supervising and training of personnel, scheduling meals, ordering provisions, and menu planning. For two summers he had full responsibilities for the "Cowboy Cook Out" program at the Bill Rice Ranch in Tennessee. In addition he has had some experience in General Construction, plant maintenance, Mill Wright, some Welding, Plumbing, Masonry and cement work and Heavy Equipment. He has an Honorable Discharge from the U.S. Army in 1946, after two years active duty plus active and inactive reserves. He was saved in 1971 through the faithful witness of his wife, after which he was baptized. He and his wife have three children: 13, 11, and 7 years. He spent a year and half at Maranatha Baptist College. He flew back from S.F. to the Middle West on Saturday. His plan is to move his family to the West Coast the forepart of June and take up residence at Lucerne to be ready for a challenging summer. The brethren on the Lucerne Management Committee (Rev. John Browning, Dr. Chester Hallberg, Dr. Frank Castaneda, Dr. Arno Weniger, Dr. David Innes, and Dr. G. Archer Weniger) were all of one mind that this man and his family provide an exciting answer to the prayers of many people. This means that the same high standards of food service, for which Lucerne has become famous all over the Christian Fundamentalist world will continue in the days ahead. DR. JESS MOODY DIDN'T QUITE MAKE IT

The popular Southern Baptist pastor, Dr. Jess C. Moody, failed to win an overwhelming vote recently at First Baptist of San Jose, which left this large New Evangelical pulpit out of the hands of the Southern Baptist Convention for the moment. Dr. Moody is pastor of the 12,000 member First Baptist Church of Van Nuys, California, one of the largest New Evangelical churches in the nation. He had openly announced his intention of bringing the church closer to the SBC. He could not be accused of being a Fundamentalist or a Separatist from his consistent record of compromise. In his resume which was distributed widely in San Jose he indicated: "Son Patrick - born 1955 - Movie actor under contract with Burt Reynolds." He indicated that he has three books published by Word, Inc. the largest New Evangelical publishers in the world. He also conducted seminars at University of Edinburgh and at Oxford University on C.S. Lewis. He had preached at the American Baptist Convention, Conservative Baptist, and at the liberal American Church in Paris. He evidently is close to Dr. Robt. Schuller of Garden Grove's Hour of Power TV broadcast since he addressed the Possibility Thinkers Luncheon in Garden Grove, and was twice the speaker at the Possibility Thinkers Dinner for Dr. Schuller. He boasted of being the speaker five times for the Sisterhood Conference-Jesuit Women in Palm Beach. He has appeared on the Mike Douglas TV Show, also was narrator for a 90 minute special with Burt Reynolds. He is perhaps best known for his 8-hour weekly TV show entitled "Lifestyle" which is aired through Dr. Gene Scott's four charismatic stations, including Channell 38 in the Bay Area. The CBA-CBFMS crowd were not happy in Jess Moody's attempt to take over this huge, nearly-bankrupt church as the center for a new advance of the Southern Baptists in California.

DR. JESS MOODY IS THE PRIME MINISTER OF ALL ECUMENICAL NEW EVANGELICALS

JERRY FALWELL'S OFFICE DEFENDS GRAHAM

Dr. Jess Moody is not only remembered for his big smile, but can also be best described as one committed to "broad affiliations." He made a valiant effort to be called to First Baptist of San Jose, and failing to receive an overwhelming vote by the congregation, he now sees that he will remain at First Baptist of Van Nuys California. People in the West remember him for his weekly TV show on the four charismatic stations of Dr. Gene Scott's pentecostal network. In his church bulletin - "Lifestyle" for May 20, 1979, he outlined the "A New Era, A New Pastor, A New Plan." He stated: "We will not merely be giving to Conservative Baptist Missions, we will actually be joining the Conservative Baptist Association of America. This represents our being the largest church in that denomination of 300,000 members, 1,121 churches with 652 missionaries (home and foreign). We will be joining the Southern Baptist Convention. This represents our being the largest church in that denomination in the western United States. The Southern Baptist are the largest Protestant denomination in the nation with 13,273,000 members, 35,172 churches, and 5,706 missionaries. We will be cooperating with the Los Angeles Baptist City Mission Society, the local representatives of the original founders of our Church. We will move from a multi-Board system to a one-Board system." It is interesting that this church withdrew from the American Baptist Convention over the National Council of Churches pro-Marxist issue, and now they are returning to some kind of an affiliation with the ABC-related L.A. City Mission Society. Dr. Moody could hardly be classified as a Separatist. It is one thing to be reluctant to withdraw a church from the Southern Baptist Convention, but it is quite another thing, given the apostate condition of every SBC Seminary, to deliberately take a church back into this kind of affiliation. Such a leader places a big question mark over his own loyalty to a virgin-born Christ and His inerrant Word, in these late hours of the Apostasy. We predict that he will be rewarded for this three-pronged action by being elected as President of the Southern Baptist Convention.

The Soul Winning Director for Dr. Jerry Falwell's ministries is Rev. J.O. Grooms. Recently he stated in a letter from Falwell's office to a leader in the middle west: "Some of our good brethren who desire to do the right thing by exposing modernism make a terrible mistake by saying derogatory statements against our brother, Billy Graham. They definitely violate James 4:11, Proverbs 6:19, and multitudes of other Scriptures in the Bible. If Mr. Graham is wrong, they have a Biblical right to go to him personally and restore him in the spirit of meekness. The question is not whether Mr. Graham is right or wrong. We cannot justify anyone who deliberately violates Scriptures. You will never hear Jerry Falwell or Jack Hyles make a critical statement in a publication against him or any other brother in Christ. The men who Mr. mentioned that Paul exposed --- Hymenaeus and Alexander (I Timothy 1:20), Demas, Phygellus, Hermogenes, Diotrophes---were either unsaved or had completely departed from the Christian faith. Billy Graham has never departed from the Christian faith. He preaches with tremendous power. Whatever his weaknesses may be, he still carries a heavy burden from heaven for lost souls. Probably ten million souls will be in heaven as a result of his ministry. The heart of God must be grieved to see some of His own soldiers slaying each other. If the born-again believers would unite, a great revival could sweep our nation." Since this type of letter is being sent widely across the nation, it should be pointed out that it is doubtful if Dr. Jack Hyles can be classed as a defender of Billy Graham, by silence or otherwise. It should be remembered that one of the bitterest critics against Dr. Graham's type of ministry was, and is, Dr. John R. Rice. Dr. Falwell's assistant seems to forget that Dr. Rice's opposition to Billy Graham (which is an action of "secondary separation") takes pages 199 to 220 in Dr. Bob Sumner's biography of Dr. Rice.

I think, have lost their minds. And they say 'no censorship.' You've got to have censorship. Life is full of censorship. I can't spit in your eye." (The Revival Road, Hugh Pile, Mar. 1979). No Christian who loves Christ and His Word should have anything to do with the Hollywood theatre, directly or indirectly.

..Southern Baptist Anti-Militarism.. Dr. James Dunn, director of Christian Life Commission of the SBC of Texas, spoke in February at Golden Gate Seminary in Mill Valley. The Jan.-Mar. 1979 "Church at Work" quoted his remarks on militarism: "Probably some of you here who are studying to proclaim the gospel of peace, are keeping bread on your table through an industry that denies the gospel of peace. Our world has enough kill-power to kill everyone in it 12 times. We spend \$400 billion a year on munitions. Half of all the scientists in the world are in some way related to the so-called defense industries. And, the U.S. has become the arms monger of the world."

'I am a born-again Christian and I go to prayer meetings.' Lynda feels so strongly that she draws her power from Christ that she doesn't want to be confused with a cartoon character whose 'powers' come from other sources. So, if you watch the show regularly, you've probably noticed that down-to-earth conservative Diana Prince, Wonder Woman's alter ego, is getting more time on screen. And this is Lynda's doing." "When she sings in clubs Saturday nights, she finds the nearest Unity Center Sunday and sings there, sometimes leading the meditations as well. This seeming dichotomy in the life of Connie Haines is nothing new, she exclaims. 'Singing is my avocation. Dedication to God is my vocation.' Even in the early days of her career- she sang with Harry James' band when she was 16 and with Tommy Dorsey and Frank Sinatra from 17-20- religion was always an important thing in her life. She sang with Billy Graham as a teen-ager and came from the South and a Baptist upbringing. Her strong religious convictions caused her some mixed emotions during the years of her greatest commercial success. She never drank when she appeared in night clubs and often spent her Sundays singing in churches in the towns she was playing. But she found that some ministers doubted her sincerity, since she spent Saturday night singing in spots they considered to be unsavory." The Unity School of Christianity is a unitarian cult. The cheap and superficial kind of Christianity which is featured by these worldly entertainers and honored over charismatic and New Evangelical media outlets is becoming sickening. The Word of God explicitly warns in I John 2:15, "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world."

THE RECENT CRAZE TO BECOME EPISCOPALIANS

..New Evangelicals Going Anglican. Miles J. Stanford traces this recent trend in a remarkable document (\$1.50, Box 7507, Colo. Spr., Colo. 80933) this way: "A recent tributary to the subjective stream that is flowing through the church at present might be termed the C.S. Lewis cult...The C.S. Lewis influence toward Anglicanism has been strongly aided and abetted in this country by such British Anglican writers and leaders as John Stott J.I. Packer (both published by InterVarsity Press), Geoffrey Bromily, of Fuller Seminary, and Philip Hughes, of Westminster Seminary. All of these are Covenant theologians."

..The Powerful C.S. Lewis Anglican Influence. "Mainly through the influence of Lewis' Anglican affiliation and his fine writings, numerous highly intellectual neo-evangelical leaders are following his lead into the Anglican and Episcopal churches--there to be immersed in the subjective religion of so-called Apostolic succession, baptismal regeneration, ritualism, and priestcraft."

..The New Covenant Apostolic Order. This is a new movement started by ex-Campus Crusade workers. Jon Braun wrote in "It Ain't Gonna Reign No More" (Thos. Nelson, 1978) - "You can call it the Lord's Table Holy Communion, the Supper, the Eucharist, or whatever you want, but by any name it is the partaking of the body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ. This is the chief means of nurture of the Christian Life." p.119.

..Elizabeth Elliot Joins Episcopalians... In a recent Christianity Today interview this noted evangelical writer was asked about her Episcopalian membership: "If your denomination should ordain self-confessed homosexuals, what would be your continuing relationship to that church?" She replied: "I am a member of such a church and I'm continue to be a member." She was asked: "How can Christians justify continuing membership in such a situation?" Her reply: "Although I deplore and abhor what the Episcopal Church has done, I don't think it gives me the warrant to withdraw. I just don't believe that is the meaning of being separate."

DIVISION IS THE PROOF OF CHRISTIANITY

With all the ecumenical pressure today for "unity" in the Christian world, we must remind ourselves of the utter incompatibility of truth and error. We ought to thank God for a country where we can still have division in the denominations and churches in order to preserve the truth. Bishop J.C. Ryle wrote in his commentary on Luke, Vol.II, p.98- "Let us never be moved by those who charge the Gospel will being the cause of strife and divisions upon earth. Such men only show their ignorance when they talk in this way. It is not the Gospel, which is to blame, but the corrupt heart of man. It is not God's glorious remedy which is at fault, but the diseased nature of Adam's race, which, like a self-willed child, refused the medicine provided for its cure. So long as some men and women will not repent and believe, and some will, there must needs be division. To be surprised at it is the height of folly. The very existence of division is one proof of Christ's foresight, and of the truth of Christianity." Jesus said in Luke 12:51, "Suppose ye that I am come to give peace on earth. I tell you, Nay; but rather division."

FUNDAMENTAL BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP RESOLUTIONS

IS THIS THE WAY THE B.B.F. IS GOING?

..The Resolutions Committee of the F.B.F. which met June 12-14, 1979 at South Sheridan Baptist Church in Denver, passed a series of ringing resolutions. Dr. James Singleton of Tempe was Chairman. Serving with him: Dr. Wayne Van Gelderen of Chicago, Dr. Wendell Mullen of Hartford, Dr. Russell Stolp of Greenville, Rev. Homey Massey of Virginia Beach, Evangelist Dave Sproul of Phoenix, and Dr. G. Archer Weniger of Oakland.

A large Baptist Bible Fellowship church in Southern California is the Central Baptist Church of Huntington Beach. The Pastor is Rev. Bruce Melton who formerly taught at BBC at Springfield. On February 25, 1979 the church featured the "Singing Bergtholds" representing Mycliffe Translators, the world's largest New Evangelical mission organization. On Mary 15, 1979 they promoted the Basic Youth Conflicts course set for April 17-22 with Bill Gothard's organization. On March 31-April 12, they advertised a Singles Retreat at Arrowhead Springs, which is the headquarters of Bill Bright's Campus Crusade. On November 26, 1979 they advertised as the speaker for both services Dr. Holland London, one of the leading New Evangelicalists of Southern California, who is president of the California Graduate School of Theology. On March 2, 1979 the church paper read: "March 27 - Teens meet Eldon Lawyer in an afterglow of very special interest. Eldon is part of the fine Athletes in Action group that tours the country talking to teens about our wonderful Lord. He is an outstanding basketball player from Oral Roberts University ..." Athletes in Action are a group from Campus Crusade. He is on the faculty of Pacific Coast Baptist Bible College. It is obvious that the high purpose of the BBF founders is being slowly dissipated with the continuing compromises by second generation leaders who give only lip service to the original Fundamentalist position.

..Regarding The American Defense Posture. The Fundamental Baptist Fellowship deplores what appears to be a systematic and diabolical unilateral disarmament of our military establishment while at the same time the Soviet Union continues a massive arms buildup; and since the terms of SALT II provide for further curtailment of our military and the expansion of Soviet power, we go on record as opposing the ratification of the SALT II Disarmament Treaty.

..Regarding Present Pseudo-Fundamentalism The Fundamental Baptist Fellowship recognizes the danger of the movement known as pseudo-fundamentalism, sees it as new evangelicalism in embryonic form, and calls upon all local Bible-believing churches to reject pseudo-fundamental activities as those of the Jerry Falwell ministries.

..Regarding Our Position on Nuclear Power Inasmuch as the liberty we enjoy for the propagation of the Gospel both at home and abroad depends to a large extent on the human level on a free and strong America, and view of the high priority the radical left and the ecumenical movement have assigned in the next few years for the destruction of our nuclear capabilities and generating plants, we call on our legislative and congressional leaders to go "full steam" ahead in the development of nuclear power, consistent with strict safety and security regulations, as well as of developing alternative sources of energy from the vast stores of coal, shale solar, and geo-thermal potential with which God has stocked this good land. We moreover call for the death penalty for anyone found guilty of sabotage of any of our nuclear facilities.

CHARLES ALLEN'S LIBERAL METHODIST CHURCH

The First Methodist Church of Houston, of which Dr. Charles Allen is Pastor, published a large paper called "The Texas Methodist". The issue of Nov. 3, 1978 had a front-page article about the Downtown Singles, which meets every Sunday evening in the church. It stated: "Joe Young's Orchestra has been engaged to provide lovely, live music each Sunday evening. Persons attending pay \$1.50 each to help cover the cost. They can enjoy dancing or listening with friends. Refreshment are provided. This is a wonderful way to enjoy a social activity in a friendly, safe and fun atmosphere. For further information, call the Christian Education Office, 652-299." A shocked Colorado Pastor sent this paper. We wonder what a pastor of this kind of Sunday evening activity has to offer in the way of evangelistic strategy for the cause of Christ. Evidence of modernism is found in the Sunday School classes of Dr. Allen's Church. The Disciples Class news: "Dr. Strong began the lesson with an introduction to the book of Exodus... Emphasis was made on understanding that the Book was not written by Moses but is a collection from four different sources." This was the news from the Keystone Class of the Sunday School: "Mary Krider announced a play and dinner given by the Windmill Theatre, Can Johnson, 'Send Me No Flowers', on Nov. 19th. Price \$9.50. Make your reservation and see Mary about this. On Wednesday, Nov. 14th at the S.R.P.J. Lodge an auction will be given by Jim Woods... Don't forget our Christmas Dinner Dance." The Builders Class had this choice bit: "For next week we should all read Barclay, pg. 237-265 which deals with Matthew 21. Barclay is the British liberal which American New Evangelicals like to exalt as an acceptable evangelical, but the evidence of his liberal and higher critical views does not allow this to stick. The adventuring Singleaires Class: "Isn't it wonderful there were people like Karl Barth who led a resistance to Naziism based on Romans." Karl Barth was the father of neo-orthodoxy-the most colossal system of deceit in the history of Christian thought. There's alot more where this came from. These bits were found in just one issue of his paper. Just imagine the sum total of this worldliness, delusion, and theological deception.

THE BILLY GRAHAM SCHOOL OF EVANGELISM

The dates were June 25-29, 1979, for the Billy Graham School of Evangelism, bank-rolled by Best Fertilizer millionaire Lowell W. Berry of Oakland. It was held, in connection with the Crusade, on the campus of Vanderbilt University in Nashville. It featured such liberal leaders as Dr. Roger Fredrickson of First Baptist Church of Wichita, who served as President of the American Baptist Convention, the most liberal of all 28 Baptist bodies in America. Another liberal was Dr. George G. Hunter, III who is a high official of the United Methodist Church, one of the most apostate denominations in the nation. Several wheel-horses of the Southern Baptist Convention were used including Dr. Tal Bonham of the Oklahoma Convention, Dr. Milton Cunningham of Houston, and Dr. Kenneth L. Chafin, who is no friend of Fundamentalists. The one gaining much attention for various reasons is Dr. Charles Allen, of the First United Methodist Church in Houston. This Church is a part of the National Council of Churches, a leftwing haven for heretics. These men are all for the Social Gospel.

THE BUSY SCHEDULE OF DR. CHARLES ALLEN

..Dr. Jerry Falwell and Dr. Charles Allen Dr. Falwell appeared on the same platform as a speaker with Dr. Charles Allen, whose church is in the National Council of Churches, at a national pastor's congress on Church Growth, sponsored by Dr. Hol-land London and his California Graduate School of Theology. Hill, and others, whose names we will mercifully omit. Dr. Jerry Falwell is a member of the executive committee of the California Graduate School.

Dr. Allen was interviewed by Dr. Schuller in the spring of 1979 in his Garden Grove pulpit.

..Dr. Allen Will Appear at the Convocation of Christian Leaders Aug.27-31,1979 at Stanford, which is probably the most daring gathering of apostates in this century- again financed by Millionaire Lowell Berry. This one also features Dr. David Hubbard, Dr. S.M. Lockridge, Dr. Robert Schuller, plus Dr. Kenneth L. Chaffin , (Southern Baptist opponent of inerrancy). Others include several Jesuit priests and other Roman Catholic prelates, as well as several noted charismatics such as David DuPlessis, Dennis Bennett, and others . This is probably the most imposing list of liberals, apostates, New Evangelicals, charismatics, and Roman Catholics brought together in our time. It is sponsored by Fuller Seminary and the Lowell Berry Foundation.



This church is the leading church identified with the American Baptist Convention, the most liberal of all 28 Baptist bodies in America. The Pastor is John Lavender , who is an author, together with his wife, of several books by Baptist Publication .

..The People's Church Of Toronto..where Dr. Paul B. Smith is pastor announced a summer Bible conference with David Mainse noted charismatic leader of Canada, according to the Toronto Star of June 9, '79 The Star announced on June 16,1979 that they would have Warren Wiersebe as speaker at Peoples Church.

A WEALTHY NEW EVANGELICAL ORGANIZATION

..World Vision, Tongues and Catholics.....
A rather astounding RNS photo in the Christian News for June 11, 1979 on page 6, has a picture of Mooneyham and the Brooklyn Roman Catholic bishop on the same platform: "Bishop Francis J. Magavero, top left, leader of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn, and the Rev. W. Stanely Mooneyham, International President of World Vision, address a crowd of 40,000 attending the Jesus '79 Interfaith Rally at Shea Stadium, N.Y., on June 2. The wide-angle photograph, bottom, shows part of the vast audience during a prayer."

..World Vision And Catholic Dialogue.....
Dr. W. Stanley Mooneyham is the president of the New Evangelical organization which is taking in millions of dollars for largely social action activities, many of which are in support of the Social Gospel. In a letter to the editor of the liberal Christian Century, Dr. Mooneyham answers a May 16 editorial: "World Vision, Go Home." Concerning his joint Roman Catholic activities he said: "In one of those projects, incidentally, an ecumenical service has subsequently been held, with both Catholic and Protestant churches participating. I was invited to speak, and my sermon was translated into Tagalog by the local Catholic priest. A very brotherly dialogue was held with Cardinal Jaime Sin and members of his staff. Our relations are cordial & the dialogue continues."

..A Leftwing Article By World Vision President, Dr. Stanley Mooneyham. Dr. Fred Schwarz, one of the world's leading authorities on Communist activity, scored Dr. Mooneyham for his article "The System Creating Hunger Amidst Plenty" which was published in the March 1979 Campus Crusade "Worldwide Challenge", monthly publication of Dr. Bill Bright's Campus Crusade. "The central theme of the message, as indicated by the title...is that abject poverty of the developing world is caused by an international 'System' and the primary duty of Christians is to change the 'System.'" Dr. Schwarz' sharp criticism is found in his April 15, 1979 issue of the newsletter of the Anti-Communism Crusade. This is a remarkable piece of evidence of the leftward drift of the New Evangelical organizations. Christian people, who are enamored of placing millions in the hands of these two undiscerning leaders who haven't the faintest idea of how they are being used to further Marxist ideology.

SOME RELIGIOUS DEVELOPMENTS IN THE NEWS

..BBF Has Dr. S.M. Lockridge As Speaker..
At the annual Baptist Bible Fellowship meeting in Chula Vista in July 28-31, 1979 the list of speakers finds Dr. Ray Batema and Dr. J.C. Joiner on the same platform with Bruce Melton and Dr. S.M. Lockridge. Dr. Lockridge, the eloquent black preacher of San Diego, is listed as one of the main speakers at one of the most daringly apostate meetings of this century at Stanford University in August 27-31, 1979 - the National Convocation of Christian leaders. The list of speakers at Stanford sponsored by Fuller Seminary's David Hubbard and the liberal Stanford Memorial Church, includes several Jesuit priests, charismatics, liberals, and New Evangelicals. It is hoped that the BBF will reject all ecumenical leaders, such as Dr. Lockridge, just as they cancelled Dr. Harold Fickett as their national speaker a few years ago.

..A Humble African Pastor Observes The WCC.. Biblical Missions (4-78, p.3) quoted this leader at Nairobi World Council of Churches plenary session in 1975 - "Because I had only been reading about the WCC I wanted to see what they taught. I went there as a visitor, and the first things I saw was their choir doing a tribal, custom dance---which I didn't like to see, not because it was African music, but because it was sinful. The people were singing, half-naked. Another thing I saw was in their pulpit: the preacher smoking; he had his pipe, smoking. During lunch they had their beer and would be drunk. In the evening, after the meeting, they had a big dance...They also had a Moslem, a Jewish rabbi, a Hindu, a Buddhist, a Roman Catholic, and a Sikh all these religions were there, trying to find God. And Dr. Potter, who is the general secretary, was the one who led the dance, a singing dance, of all these religions, trying to find God. And what was the main thing? What they call 'salvation is libertaion.'"

..Concerning Terrorism Against Rhodesia. in which missionaries and innocent citizens are being killed by the Marxist "Patriotic Front" of Nkomo and Mugabe, this news reporter, Georgie Anne Geyer (L.A. Times, 7-7-78), stated: "So where are we today? "BORN-AGAIN" JIMMY CARTER PAYS RELIGIOUS RESPECT TO HEATHEN SHINTO SHRINE IN JAPAN

Rev. Timothy Pietsch, the oldest Baptist missionary, now working in Japan, wrote a significant Open Letter to President Carter which was published in the Asahi Evening News in Toyko dated June 27, 1979. It read: "Dear President Carter: What a feeling of shame and sadness I have had since I saw the news of your attending Meiji Shrine, as a Guest of State of Japan, while representing all the people of the USA. You had brought great shame and disgrace upon the Baptist, 'born again Christian' position that you profess to hold. You have, by going to Meiji Shrine betrayed the position Baptists have held of separation of religion and state, and that no group have special privilege or be granted special honor by the government. Why did you give special honor and prestige to one religion, and that the one that in recent history has had such an adverse record of oppression, tyranny and cruelty? Surely you know that a Shinto Shrine is a Shinto god's house (Yashiro) and is unlike the Lincoln Memorial, where the memory of a great man is honored...Is there any politician in Japan who would dare to openly declare that Meiji is not a Shinto god? Shinto priests are in attendance at Meiji Shrine, offerings of food and money are made and prayers and petitions made to the god, and amulets and good luck charms are sold. What a sorrow to see the picture of you at Meiji Shrine as a Guest of State. The shrine book you signed is a book of the registration of worshippers at the Shrine...You have made the missionary work in Japan much more difficult, by giving prestige and honor to the idolatrous system of Shintoism, which is based upon the false religious concept that a creature can become a god..." Both Richard Nixon and Gerald Ford cancelled their proposed visits to Shinto shrines while in Japan. Rev. Pietsch added: "You now go down in history as the first American President to attend a Shinto Shrine while a guest of state and in so doing you have given great aid and comfort to the revival of Shinto Nationalism."

HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER CAMP IN AUGUST

Jonathan Edwards, one of the most knowledgeable ministers working in Mormon country, presently establishing a new church in suburban Salt Lake City. The Dean will be Dr. David R. Potter of the Seminary faculty, with Pastor Phil Roades of Sparks, prominent youth leader in the Pacific West, assisting. The cost will be \$48 for board and room for young people in the Dorms in sleeping bags. Adults only in the bedrooms at higher rate. All churches are asked to send Counselors on ratio of one to eight youth. Counselors who stay with the youth in dorm areas, must be 21 years or older. Men are especially needed. Special price allowed for Counselors. The purpose of the Camp is to fire up the young people with a new love for Christ and His Word, which is manifested by a new loyalty to every service in their own local church.

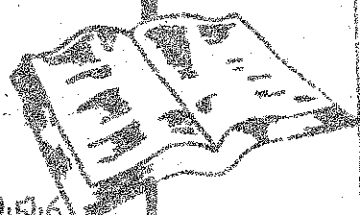

...A Shocking Ecclesiastical Revelation...
Richard Quebedeaux in his book "The Worldly Evangelicals" states on page 100 -

We have no cross because we believe we're all the children of God. We don't believe in hell. We don't believe there is a Satan. If God created everything, why would He create competition?'" Wm. C. Irvine's book "Heresies Exposed" has a chapter on "The Unity School of Christianity" by H. A. Ironside on page 206. Dr. Ironside states:"...it proved to be as truly opposed to real Biblical Christianity as any heresy referred to in this volume... The system is thoroughly pantheistic ... A more careful examination of the Unity cult shows it to be a conglomeration of ancient errors presented to modern seekers after truth as a new and attractive discovery. In addition to its Gnostic ideas as to Christ and Jesus, it is theosophical in that it teaches the Hindu doctrine of reincarnation..This is a complete denial of the gospel of the grace of God."

It is my hope that the cardinals elect a new pope who will follow the same line as John. It would be a great tragedy if they chose a man who reacted against John, who re-erected the walls." P.48.

..Supports the Hollywood Movie Industry... In Photoplay magazine, Dec.1965; Dr. Graham said "I do hope that I haven't created impression that I am an enemy of the entertainment industry, or Hollywood, because nothing could be farther from the truth. I have alot of friends out there and think the world of them...I have found some of the finest people to be motion picture actors...I've come to know and appreciate these people not as actors, but as nice people. Some of them are very devout Christian." P.50. (BP- It is impossible for one to be a "devout" Christian and be identified with the wickedness of Hollywood as an institution, with all the moral filth that prevails as an essential part).

..Strong Endorsement of the Social Gospel The RNS dispatch from Crete, Aug.24,1967 quoted Dr. Graham in a document he draws up for the World Council of Churches Central Committee meeting in Herakelion: "There is no doubt that the social gospel has directed its energies toward the release (Continued next column)....."

GRAHAM DEDICATES CHARISMATIC CENTER

AN UNCONSCIONABLE FINANCIAL SCANDAL

"Evangelist Billy Graham will be the featured speaker when the Christian Broadcasting Network dedicates its new CBN Center on Oct. 6. The two-hour dedication broadcast will be seen on four continents. Christian teaching programs, situation comedies, children's shows, motion pictures, daytime dramas and the popular '700 Club' will be produced here. Dr. M.G. 'Pat' Robertson, CBN president, will be the dedication broadcast host with Efrem Zimbalist, Jr. of 'FBI' fame. Located next to CBN Center is CBN University, a graduate school of Communications is already in operation at the university. Schools of Education and Fine Arts are scheduled to begin classes in 1980." Dr. Graham, who allows for the Pentecostal gift of tongues, has been used widely by the Pentecostal movement—such as addressing the the Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship and the dedication in 1967 of Oral Roberts University, the leading tongues institution in the nation. The Full Gospel Businessmen's Voice for October 1962 carried four pictures of Graham at their 10th annual convention in Seattle on July 6, 1961 when he shared the same platform with H.M.S. Richards of the Seventh-Day Adventist church. Graham was quoted: "But I have already read and quoted what God the Holy Spirit has been doing in your midst and saying to you and through you for this hour. Many of you have served on committees and various crusades throughout the country and I thank God for you and your steadfastness in the faith and I join hands with you, at all the Holy Spirit has been saying and doing during these days." Oral Roberts was also on that platform. Author Kurt Kock in his 1970 book "Occult Bondage and Deliverance" (Kregel, pp. 52-54) stated: "I come now to a painful duty I have put off for many years... In the autumn of 1966 together with about 2,000 other delegates, observers and staff members, I attended the World Congress on Evangelism in Berlin. Among the leaders of the various discussion groups was Oral Roberts, a man who had been publicly greeted by Billy Graham on the platform. As a fellow delegate, I wrote to the committee informing them of the fact that the healing ability of Oral Roberts was of mediumistic rather than a charismatic nature. The letter caused a lot of anger among those who read it and the (Continued next Column)..

The Atlanta Journal and Constitution carried a front-page story, plus a whole page on the inside concerning the tragic bankruptcy of Marietta Baptist Tabernacle, where Dr. Bob Moore is pastor. The FBI and the Cobb County Sheriff's Dept. said they still are in preliminary stages of investigations." They have repudiated \$3.6 million in bonds. And what does the staff drive? With so many "soul-winning" churches operating in a state of bankruptcy, many Christian leaders think its about time to return to financial sanity, begin to live within incomes, repudiate this statistical nightmare which some have confused with doing the will of God, and cease glorifying these financial disasters as godly success stories. This kind of operation is a disgrace to the cause of Christ. The worldly carnal, materialistic, and egotistical ecclesiastical philosophy that would produce such a monstrosity of dishonesty should be denounced.

DR. JERRY FALWELL AND THE SBC CONVENTION

THE NEW BOOK BY DR. HAROLD LINDSELL

..Biggest Of The BigTime TV Preachers is the way the Birmingham News for Aug.4, '79 referred to Dr. Jerry Falwell in a two-page interview. Dr. Falwell is quoted: "Fundamentalists learn to fight before they can read or write". Referring to Dr. John R. Rice, at whose Sword conference Falwell was speaking, he said, "I would not come to his conference and speak out for pantsuits, and he would not come to my church and condemn pantsuits!" He said: "Most fundamentalist churches are independent, he said, but they are finding they can get along with other churches, including a number in the Southern Baptist Convention."

..Falwell Recommends SBC President.. The Birmingham News (8-4-79, p.22) - "There are some real fundamentalist churches in the Southern Baptist Convention and other denominational movements just as true to the Word of God as any other church," said Falwell. In fact, he said he suggested Rice get Dr. Adrian Rogers, newly elected conservative president of the Southern Baptist Convention, to speak at a future Sword of the Lord conference such as the one held here last week. He didn't say Rice had agreed to ask Rogers, but in past days the matter never would have come up." In addition: "He said graduates of his school alone plant 5,000 new churches in the United States during the next decade, and the plans are for each church to begin a school right off the bat."

..There Are No Real Fundamental Churches in the Southern Baptist Convention since the Southern Baptist Convention is a thoroughly inclusivist body, including both liberal, neo-orthodox, New Evangelical, and conservative groups. And a Fundamentalist is one who is historically opposed to the principle of inclusivism and always fought it. A Fundamentalist is one who believes in Separation, and Adrain Rogers opposes in practice this extensively-taught Biblical doctrine. Every pastor and church in the SBC has accepted the principle of the inclusivist church. Any pastor or church who will accommodate himself to the apostate condition within the SBC is not "just as true to the Word of God as any other church", as Dr. Falwell said. Always remember that not one of the six major seminaries of (Cont.back pg. Col.2).....

The Christian world must take into account the new book by Dr. Harold Lindsell on "The Bible in the Balance" (\$9.95, Zondervan). It is written by one who has spent most of his life in the New Evangelical movement. The book contains valuable information and documentation of theological defection in New Evangelicalism. Some examples:

..Wm. Barclay Was Not A Christian.. "I do not think William Barclay Was a Christian. In his autobiography he clearly stated that he was not a Trinitarian, he did not believe Jesus is God, he denied the doctrine of the vicarious atonement and also the virgin birth of Christ, and his view of the Holy Spirit fits no discernable orthodox definition in the history of the Christian church. Needless to say, he did not believe in the inerrancy of the Bible...Thus, I feel that William Barclay was not a Christian because by no reasonable understanding of the Bible could he be called one. It is the Bible which makes it impossible to claim this man as a fellow believer without emptying Christianity of its basic content." P.45.

..The Seriousness of Giving Up Inerrancy "Dr. Berkouwer has gone beyond denial of biblical inerrancy. He doubts the historicity of Adam and Eve. Moreover, I have in my files information that in his classroom teaching he has denied the existence of hell...But this is also true of Drs. Bruce and Berkouwer, and it is excellent evidence in support of my thesis that once you drop inerrancy, it opens the door wide to further departures about matters of faith and practice. And this is what has happened in the cases of Professors Bruce and Berkouwer as well as in the case of Paul King Jewett." PP.33-34.

..Evangelical Opponents of Inerrancy.... Dr. Clark Pinnock, who now serves on a liberal divinity faculty at McMaster University in Toronto, stated that there are three positions on inerrancy: The militant advocates of unqualified biblical inerrancy, advocates of modified or limited inerrancy and outright opponents "Third, there are evangelical opponents of inerrancy. Though a distinct minority they happen to include some of the best known and most capable of the scholars of evangelicalism (Cont. back pg. Col.2).....

true to the Word of God as any other
church."

..The Trouble With The SEC Convention...A
number of men in the SEC (Lindsell, Rogers
Criswell, Powell) are trying to fight the
battle of an inerrant Bible. Before they
discuss whether the Bible is errant or
inerrant, they need to fight another bat-
tle: Is the Bible the Word of God, or is
the Word of God something different from,
and other than, the Bible? Not one of
their seminaries teach that the Bible is
itself the supernatural, divine objective
revelation of the Living God of Heaven.
Neo-orthodoxy, which always and everywhere
drives a big wedge between the Bible and
the Word of God, is the majority theology
in every SEC seminary. It is futile to
discuss inerrancy with an opponent who
does not even believe the Bible is itself
the Word of God, instead of being a record
of, a channel for, a medium of, an instru-
ment for, or a sign pointing toward the
Word of God.

NATURE OF THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST TRAGEDY

The problem is simply raw neo-orthodox unbelief all through their seminaries. This is illustrated by an article by veteran SBC theologian Dr. Fred L. Fisher, professor of New Testament for more than 21 years at the SBC Seminary in Mill Valley, near San Francisco. Dr. Fisher wrote an article in The California Southern Baptist paper for January 21, 1965: "This is what we mean when we say that behind the Bible is a revelation which preserves it for our time. The Bible is not a revelation of God; (Underlines-BP); it is a record of that revelation. To say this is not to belittle the Bible; it is only to recognize it for what it is...Scientific and historic statements reflect the knowledge that men had of the world in that day; such statements may be in error; they are subject to the judgement of facts. But they are only the framework; they do not constitute the heart of the Bible. To admit that they may be in error does not disturb the faith of the Christian; if they are proved to be, faith still retains its strength...The point is that the accuracy or inaccuracy of this statement is not vital to our faith...The Bible expresses God's authority and it is authoritative only when God actually speaks to us through it." This statement is loaded with unbelief. He states that the Bible is not the Word of God, but only a record of it. This is a higher critical lie. This not only belittles the Bible, it simply destroys it in the minds of Southern Baptist sheep who love to follow their leaders. To accept the fact that the Bible is a human book containing errors in fact, is to open up the mind for all sorts of attack upon the Christian Faith, with Fuller Seminary, an example, as well as every SBC seminary. The Bible is authoritative whether we read it or not, whether "God actually speaks to us", or whether we think of it or not. It stands forever as the objective Word of the Living God in all of its parts, inerrant through and through.

THE NATURE OF THE JEWISH TRAGEDY

..Rabbi John J. Zuckor of San Leandro is a prominent Bay Area Jewish leader. In the Catholic Voice for July 26, 1979, he stated: "But Jews cannot worship in a Christian way. They would have to cease being Jews were they to concur doctrinally with Christian faith...The fundamental division between Christianity and Judaism is over the figure and meaning of Jesus. It is a gap which cannot be bridged. Ecumenicity between Catholics and Protestants can and perhaps should include the nurturing of unity of Christendom, though in the future. But ecumenicity between Christian and Jew is possible only if neither one hopes for or aims at a fusion of Jewish and Christian faith...Whether Christianity can give up the hope that all mankind will eventually accept Jesus as savior I do not know. But it appears as a necessary condition for true ecumenicity. It would mean that other religions, including Judaism, would be seen as equals." However, a converted first-century Jew, under divine inspiration wrote in Acts 4: 12: "Neither is there salvation in any other, for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved."

..Rabbi Maurice Eisendrath, the distinguished liberal Reform Jewish leader, writing in Eternity magazine of March 1964, was quoted: "Needless today, Jews never can and never will accept Jesus as the Messiah or as the Son of God. But, despite this constant reality, there is room for improved understanding and openness to change in interpreting Jesus as a positive and prophetic spirit in the stream of Jewish tradition." The noted rabbi might read Philipians 2:9-11.

..Rabbi Ben Zion Bokser had a revealing article published by the Anti-Defamation League entitled "Judaism and the Christian Predicament". He said, "The Christian belief in the Incarnation, ascribing divine nature to Jesus, with its various doctrinal ramifications, will always prove unacceptable to those schooled in the conception of God as taught in Jewish tradition...The belief that man's salvation can be effected only by God's 'self-sacrifice', by the blood of the crucified Jesus, is for the Jew a reversion to the primitive, which he cannot reconcile with his conviction that 'clean hands and a pure heart' (Psalms 24:4) is all a man needs to come before his Maker."

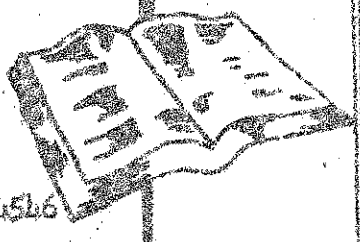

..Oral Roberts Has a Hot Right Hand.....
Newsweek magazine for Sept. 10, 1979 quoted Roberts from a recent letter to his contributors asking for money: "In the 32 yrs of this ministry, I feel his power today as never before. As I write these words, wave after wave of God's healing power is flooding through me. My hands feel as if there is a supernatural heat in them, my right hand is especially hot right now."

..Robert's Miracle Healing Cloth Is Free.
Newsweek for 9-10-79 (p.79) stated: "In one new appeal, Roberts reveals that God told him to make an imprint of his right hand on swatches of cloth, which he will send free to his partners. Roberts promises 'special miracles' to partners who touch the cloth, but he also asks for special miracles in return. Specifically, he urges partners to enter into a 'Blessing Pact Covenant' with God and 'His servant Oral Roberts' by purchasing a portion of his City of Faith- at \$38 per square foot."

..Roberts Is In Deep Financial Trouble...
"I am in serious financial trouble", said Oral Roberts while asking his followers for an immediate \$50 million to complete his Tulsa hospital. He took in \$38,728,439 in 1977-78 tax year. Newsweek (9-10-79) stated: Roberts is also having difficulty grooming a successor. His son, Richard, the only one of his four children still in the family business, is now divorced- a violation of God's law in the eyes of many of Oral's partners. Last month, Ron Smity, Robert's longtime second in command, suddenly resigned and moved out of Tulsa, saying only that he was going 'to pursue some personal business interests.' And Jerry Sholes, a former TV producer for the OREA, has published a pot-boiling paperback, 'Give Me That Prime-Time Religion,' in which he accuses Roberts and his lieutenants of a variety of unsavory practices." Movie star Elizabeth Taylor, who was honored by Jerry Falwell on several occasions who was introduced publicly on his Old Time Gospel Hour TV nation-wide network, whose picture appeared several times in his Journal-Champion newspaper, was the subject of a large article in The Oregonian for Feb. 13, 1979 (p. C2) by New York Times News Service writer Judy Klemesrud. "Mrs. Warner was in Richmond for the kick-off of Virginia's International Year of the Child celebration, of which she is honorary co-chairwoman. It is one of the first projects she decided to undertake after her sixth husband, John Warner, was sworn in last month as Virginia's freshman Republican senator... Does she plan to wear any of her famous jewels, including the 69.42 carat Cartier diamond and the 33.19 carat Krupp diamond, both gifts of a former husband, Richard Burton, to Washington social events? 'They're in the bank' she said, somewhat impatiently... Does that mean she's going to give up her acting career? 'No, I'll do something about once a year- if something appetizing comes along,' she said. 'John is very proud of me, proud of my career, and he wants me to go on working. He feels it's part of my life, and he certainly hasn't demanded I sacrifice my career for politics.'" While Dr. Falwell speaks out against the Year of the Child, he honors one of the co-chairwomen of the Year of the Child. While he speaks out against moral filth of Hollywood, he features a Hollywood movie star whose films are revolting to the Moral Majority. While he apparently speaks out for the defense of the family, he promotes one who has six known husbands with children from various husbands and she is only 46 years of age. Is Dr. Falwell being inconsistent honoring people who reject in life what he professes in the pulpit? Not at all. He is being completely inconsistent with his pattern of compromise which has involved him with Norman Vincent Peale, W.S. McBurnie, Holland London, S.M. Lockridge, Harold Fickett, Malcolm Muggeridge, Bob Harrison, Doug Oldham, Eldridge Cleaver, Chuck Colson, The World Literature Crusade, Christian Life magazine, California Graduate School of Theology and others. He is not only demonstrating each week that he is one of the leading TV preachers of the nation, but also that he is the most prominent Pseudo-fundamentalist in the American pulpit.

..Great Victories In The Senate Of The US
The Pastor had a pleasant conversation on the long distance phone with his nephew, Dr. Arno Q. Weniger, Jr. on Sept. 7, 1979 in which he informed us that the U.S. Senate had passed the Dornan Amendment, 54-31; and had also passed the Ashbrook Amendment 45-43. Both of these effectively restricts the IRS in using any funds to impose new racial guidelines and other restrictions on private Christian schools. MOODY INSTITUTE PROF. FORCED TO RESIGN

The Chicago Tribune for Friday, August 24, 1979 carried a news story of a significant change on the faculty of Moody Bible Institute concerning Dr. Stanley Gundry, their gifted theology professor of Wheaton because of his wife's support and promotion of the Equal Rights Amendment. The Institute released this public statement: "The position of Dr. Gundry and his wife regarding the feminist movement, and therefore, the role of women in the church is objectionable to the administration and trustees of the Moody Bible Institute, and is the basis of his resignation. A fair and honorable separation was agreed upon. Because this is a personal matter, we have no further comment...The dispute began last spring, after Dr. Gundry's wife, Patricia, author of the book, 'Women Be Free' (Zondervan, 1977) spoke at a Housewives for ERA meeting in Glen Ellyn...The institute began to receive letters of complaint...Dr. Gundry was called into the office of Dr. Alfred Martin, dean of education, this month and was told the administration had discussed the controversy with the trustees and wanted his resignation. Dr. Gundry refused, family friends said, until the administration agreed to give him an undisclosed amount of severance pay." (BP-Ed.)-Several questions should be answered for the Christian public:

1. How much money was given out of God's funds to secure the resignation which the administration asked. This will be of importance to those who contribute to the support of Moody.
2. Why did not George Sweeting, president of Moody, take action on this two years ago when her feminist views were first published by Zondervan?
3. Was Moody genuinely concerned about her feminist and pro-ERA views or were they more concerned about the volume of protest letters coming from the Moody constituency that forced their hand to ask for his resignation?

If this action represents a reversal of Moody's New Evangelical direction, Fundamentalists everywhere will praise the Lord. If it is simply an action of expediency, to quiet the troubled waters, then this is just another in a long series of unwise developments which will occur as Moody stumbles on its uncertain ways.

IS WORLD VISION AND CAMPUS CRUSADE GOING LEFTIST & PROMOTING SOCIALISTIC THOUGHT?

The Campus Crusade magazine for March - 1979 called "Worldwide Challenge" had a highly controversial article by World Vision President Dr. Stanley Mooneyham, entitled "The System: Creating Hunger Amidst Plenty". It was an excerpt from his book "What Do You Say To a Hungry World?" The central theme of the article is that poverty in the world is caused by an international "System", and that the primary duty of Christians is to change this "System". Some of the quotations advocating this: "What is needed is conscious effort, based on truth and compassion, to make fundamental changes in the system...I believe the people of God have a unique contribution to make toward the restructuring of the old systems and the creation of new ones... Should not doing good include working for systemic change as well as delivering a Christmas basket, making a contribution on Worldwide Communion Sunday, or writing a check to the United Way? ... The challenge is to change the system fundamentally. There is no single human task facing mankind today which has a higher priority." This sounds like it was written by one of the Marxist formulators of Liberation Theology. Christians should write to both of these organizations and demand from Dr. Bill Bright and Dr. Mooneyham a retraction, apology and repudiation of article before another dollar is given to its support. No leftwing socialist would find anything in this article to which he would object.

MOODY BIBLE INSTITUTE FACULTY RESIGNATION EXPLODES INTO A NATIONAL ISSUE FOR CHRISTIAN

..Moody Promoted The Feminist Movement in Moody Monthly in May 1975 when they published an article by Patricia Gundry, wife of the recently resigned and well-liked theology professor. Her article was entitled: "Perhaps We Should Take A Second Look." In this article when Moody obviously approved or they would not have published it, said: "Obviously it is unfair to equate the radicals with the reformers or to dismiss the entire movement as foolish or unbiblical...The feminists say the church is sexually repressive because there are so few women ministers...Use of Pauline passages to justify this position has caused the Bible to be condemned as a vehicle for antiwoman sentiment...Have we given feminists good reason to denounce the church?"

..The Moody Monthly Article Concludes... "If there are worthwhile goals in the feminist movement we should support them. Those we cannot support we should oppose or try to modify. We can be salt in this world if we work for what is right, but if we only ignore and denounce from re-examination, but if we are wrong and ignore the issue, we make ourselves willing instruments for evil." By publishing this article Moody Monthly has weakened its position when they dismissed her husband for supporting her feminist views and for her vigorous promotion of the Equal Rights Amendment.

..Moody Was Afraid To Lose Contributions.. The Wheaton Sunday Herald, Sept. 9, 1979 reported: "But Gundry, as a result of a book written by his wife on this subject, became the target of a few outspoken opponents of the Equal Rights Amendment who believe the Bible orders women to be subject to men. They launched a letter-writing campaign complaining about his position on the faculty, and Moody, a seminary that trains more Evangelical pastors and missionaries than any other institution in the United States, had to take action or risk losing the considerable support it receives from conservatives."

..Dr. Gundry Defends His Own Position.. "These are people who are quite sincere in the sense that they want to do as the Bible teaches," Gundry said of those who find his view objectionable. "They are taking these (Biblical) passages at what they would consider face value, and they think those passages are indicative of male leadership and female subordination. Most of the Evangelical movement would consider the matter open for discussion, but Moody, by asking me to resign, has taken a stand against the Evangelical feminist movement." The suburban Herald (9-9-79).

..Her Book Will Now Increase In Sales as a result of this furor. "Gundry's wife, Patricia, is the author of 'Woman Be Free' a book that supports the Evangelical belief that the Bible is the inspired word of God, but claims that a few passages have been misinterpreted and used by church leaders to keep women in a subordinate role in the home and in the church. The book has been in print for 2½ years, and Moody administrators had never complained about it until last March, when a group of people opposed to the ERA decided to use me, through my husband, to put pressure on Moody to make a statement about the ERA," according to Mrs. Gundry." Mrs. Gundry, along with her distinguished husband, and his gifted brother, Dr. Rober Gundry, author of the leading prophetic book on post-tribulationism- are all products of the GARB college in Los Angeles.

..Dr. George Sweeting Then Took Action.. "The administrators, after receiving as many as 70 letters, prohibited Mrs. Gundry from appearing again on the Moody radio station and banned advertisements for her book from Moody publications. Prof. Gundry was also banned from the airwaves if he intended to speak on feminism...The dismissal of Gundry was clearly a doctrinal dispute, in part, but it apparently also was an attempt to retain the favor of the most conservative wing of the Evangelical movement- the source of much of Moody's financial support. 'They were afraid they would lose money,' Mrs. Gundry said of the administrators. 'This was not a Biblical or doctrinal disagreement. What it boils down to is money and power.'" So this resignation was not requested because of disagreement over her feminist views, because her book was already in print 2½ years, and because Moody had published her feminist views in their official paper. They didn't object to her promotion of ERA. They objected to her because they were an offense to the potential donors out there in middle America where the conservative Moral Majority is just beginning to awaken. They did not act, until the letters of protest came in. Dr. George Sweeting is the President of Moody. We assume that the biggest fears the administrators entertained was that Godly (Cont.next pg., Col.2).....

However, his 'Thru the Bible Radio' report for Sept. 1979 had an interesting word on "The Numbers Game." "The casting of lots in Scripture had something to do with numbers. The rolling of the dice has developed into a sophisticated gambling establishment which makes the lights shine on the desert in Las Vegas. The numbers game is the very basis of all gambling which is one of the worst carnal sins. Wait! This is no religious tirade against gambling. It could be. The numbers game has gotten into the Christian community. Who has the 'mostest' at Sunday School, Sunday morning services, and Sunday evening services? The midweek service is not counted. If the pastor has 1,000 at church last Sunday and he has 1,001 this Sunday, he is a howling success. If the pastor has 1,001 this Sunday and only 999 next Sunday, he will fail the Lord and there will be 'no joy in Mudville'- the pastor will strike out. Across our land there are great kingdoms being built by certain preachers. Their success and fame are measured by numbers. Some of them may be good psychologists, comedians, entertainers, promoters, and just plain old con men. The numbers are the important factor. The number of people who are actually born again is not considered that important. The fact that divorce, dissension, and divers cases of immorality are in the congregation must be swept under the rug. We must love everybody and be jolly. The Sunday morning circus must go on and the crowd counted."

Jesus is kin not only to the Hebrew prophets but also to the leading figures of other great faiths. This ideal of sacrificial love is evident in the compassion of Buddha, who declared that hatred is never obliterated by hatred but only by love. It is revealed in the soul-force emanating from Hinduism. It expresses itself in the power of nonviolent resistance practiced by Mahatma Gandhi, the Hindu who inspired the Christian witness of Martin Luther King. The idea of sacrificial love unites rather than divides mankind. It makes a man's life, not his label, the ultimate test whether he is a man of God."

..Human Events Would Be A Good Gift for the Blu-Print. It has a lot of good things, such as this item about Rev. Andrew Young (Aug. 25, 1979) - "Young's legacy at the U.N. was not as a champion of the oppressed, but as a smear carrier for the oppressor. Whatever he may believe of himself, Young spent the greater part of his energies befriending- or trying to befriend- the most vicious kind of African and Third World terrorists. Contrary to the waxing liberal myth, his voice was not raised on behalf of the moderates, the peace makers and the poor, but leftist, totalitarian revolutionaries."

ELDRIDGE CLEAVER JOINS THE MOON CULT

The great wave of disappointment ha swept over the New Evangelical world with the announcement in the Oakland Tribune for October 19, 1979 that the noted former black Panther has joined up with the Sun Myung Moon's Unification Church after spending a week at the cult's ranch at Boonville in Northern California. He seemed to be bitter against Billy Graham and his associates. The Tribune reported his saying: "I would rather be the littl - est Moonie than with Billy Graham... not because Billy Graham is so bad or the Moonies are so good, but because they (Moonies) do what they say." Why this shift from evangelical Christianity to this anti-Christian cult, since he sound - ed so sincere and genuine to many people? Some have speculated that the recent death of multimillionaire Arthur DeMoss of Philadelphia may have something to do with this, since he had provided bail here in Oakland for Cleaver to the extent of close to \$100,000. He may have felt that he was not going to be supported with necessary funds for his upcoming murder trial in Oakland. This was a result of the attempted murder against three police - men stemming from a 1968 shoot-out with police that left Panther Booy Hutton dead. It may be that Rev. Moon's aides approach - ed him with an offer of legal support if he would identify with the Moon cult. His shift in profession and speaking at their church will cut him off completely from further invitations from evangelical churches. His refusal to abandon his pro - gram to market his "porno-pants" which are also called "Cleavers", which brazen - ly emphasize the male genital, together with his unwillingness to denounce his first book "Soul on Ice", has caused some grief for his New Evangelical supporters. He was quickly used by Dr. Jerry Falwell on his network TV program from Thomas Rd. Baptist Church as soon as he came back to America from overseas exile. Mr. De - Moss was a member of the Boards of Campus Crusade, Gordon-Conwell Seminary, and Jerry Falwell ministries. He was also us - ed by Dr. Robt. Schuller, Dr. Charles Blair, and others who felt he could help them draw a big crowd. The National Broad - casters dropped him from their programs a year and half ago. He was under the in - fluence of Dr. Ray Stedman and his Penin - sula Bible Fellowship where he attended with his family. (Continued bk.pg.col.2)

C.S. LEWIS REJECTION OF CHRISTIANITY

An objective evaluation of ths writings & views of the noted British scholar C.S . Lewis (1898-1963) shows that his religious and philosophical views were not in agreement with orthodox Christian teach - ings. He held to the authority of reason and experience. He believed that writings outside the Bible could be inspired of God. He rejected the exclusiveness of Jesus of Nazareth in favor of tolerance of other pagan religious beliefs. He re - cognized the validity of mythology. He held that pagan writers Virgil and Plato revealed a dim foreknowledge of Christ . The Bible was a book of human literature to him. He did not believe in plenary in - spiration, nor did he advocate the error - lessness of God's Word. He rejected the reliability of the first two chapters of Genesis as relates to Creation, and did not believe this to be historical. He did not accept the Biblical account of the origin of Adam and Eve as definitive. He espoused theistic evolution, and held to the animal ancestry of man. He regarded early man as a savage. He held that many male and female animals because human at the same time. He believed that immortal - ity is the goal of human evolution. He speculated that animals may have immortal souls. He calls into question the histor - icity of the Fall of man. One of Lewis' most serious views is a rejection of the Biblical doctrine of the finished work of Christ. He balked at the substitutionary and vicarious atonement. He held to the "moral influence" theory of the atonement, which is completely liberal. Christ was not the only way of salvation, and he would exclude pagans from salvation. He hated the distinction of Christian from non-Christians. He rejected the idea of a radical and instant conversion in favor of a process of salvation involving much time and development. He regarded heaven and hell as a state of mind. He rejected eternal punishment and believe in a se - cond change. He had quite a place for Purgatory in his thinking. He velieved in prayers for the dead. He held to a magical view of the eucharist, as he called it , and believed in the real presence of Christ. He had strong sympathies for Ro - man Catholicism. He used the historical - critical method to some degree in inter - pretation of the Bible. He rejected the idea of the Bible as "sole authority" , and was a (Continued back pg., column 2).

IS WYCLIFFE TRANSLATORS MOVING TO LEFT ?

..Wycliffe Translators Prints "The Catalyst", called a "social pastoral magazine for Melanesia". Wycliffe is the the largest New Evangelical mission organization in the world. They have been printing this for years in Goroka under Wycliffe's foreign field name of Summer Institute of Linguistics (SIL). The permanent members of the editorial Board of this magazine include three Roman Catholics: Joseph Knoebel, Leo Brouwer, William Seifert, all members of the SVD- The Society of the Divine Word (Catholic).

..An Article Praising Leftwing Socialism is found on pages 41 to 60, entitled "African Socialism- The Tanzanian Model" by Kevin J. Barr. They quote approvingly an article by Prime Minister Julius K. Nyerere: "An African in Africa will never simply become a black European...In determining our future out of the lessons of the present and past, we shall be working out a new synthesis, a way of life that draws from Europe as well as Africa, from Islam as well as Christianity, from communism and individualism..." P.43. (Catalyst, 2nd Quarter, 1975, Vol.5, No.2).

..Capitalism Must Be Totally Rejected, according to this article. Nyerere is further quoted with approval: "Our first step must be to re-educate ourselves; to regain our former attitude of mind... (we must) reject the capitalist attitude of mind which colonialism brought to Africa and we must reject the capitalist methods which go with it...We must regain our former attitude of mind- our traditional African socialism- and apply it to the new societies we are building today." The Prime Minister is a Catholic, having been trained in Catholic mission schools, and later taught in St. Mary's Mission School in Tabora.

..This Socialist Prime Minister Is Described by the Wycliffe-published paper this way: "His writings reveal him to be a man of wide reading and serious study. The fact that he is a dedicated Christian has been given to explain his concern, his anti-racialism and his moderation (Claget Taylor, 1963:222)." P.56.

..Only Committed Socialists Are Wanted... This "dedicated Christian" is further quoted on page 57 in this Wycliffe-published article "Socialism is a way of life, and a socialist society cannot simply come into existence. A socialist society can only be built (Continued next column)...."

TANU member (his political party), and especially of a TANU leader, is to accept those socialist principles and to live his own life in accordance with them." The article by Kevin J. Barr commented: "The final part of the declaration restricts membership of the TANU party to those who are willing to be fully committed to socialist policies. A programme of training for leaders is set up. Finally every TANU and Government leader was required to be either a peasant or a worker and was in no way to be associated with the practices of capitalism or feudalism. No TANU or Government leader was allowed to hold shares in any company, directorships in any privately owned enterprise, receive two or more salaries, or rent houses." The whole issue of "Catalyst" was filled with articles by and about Roman Catholics.

..An Ecumenical Dedication Service Held..
A Letter to the Editor by a Ellis W. Diebler and published on June 22, 1979 in Goroka in the Hailans Nius: "Part of the Bible in the Tokano language...has been finished by the Summer Institute of Linguistics at Ukarumpa.. There will be a dedication service for the book at the government school at Yufiyufa on Sunday, July 1. The SDA, Roman Catholic, and Lutheran churches will all be taking part."

..Billy Graham Was Different From Falwell..
When Billy Graham was President of Northwestern Schools, upon the death of Dr. W. B. Riley, the Northwestern Pilot magazine for April 1951 had this important boxed ad on page 222 over the signature of Billy Graham: "A Special Word. We sincerely regret that the ad on the back cover of the March issue of the Pilot carried an advertisement of a book by Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick. This completely slipped the attention of our Advertising Department. The PILOT represents the orthodox, conservative, fundamental theological position. We do not concene nor have fellowship with any form of modernism. Dr. Fosdick's position is well known as the of an extreme modernist. We do not commend his writings to our reading public. -- Billy Graham." Dr. Falwell continues to carry large advertisements from the liberal Christian Herald in his Journal Champion newspaper.

..Dr. Peale Doesn't Like The Fear Of God..
The Tri-Valley Herald for May 19, 1979 from Livermore, carries Norman Vincent Peale's column: "There's an Answer." It goes like this: "Q. I am a 76-year old retired man, active in my church and have believed in God all my life. There is one thing that puzzles me. In the Bible one very frequently sees the admonition, 'Fear God.' I know God loves us, but I find it very difficult, if not impossible, to fear one who loves me. I do stand in awe of all of His creations. Can you explain it to me? A. I never liked the phrase, 'the fear of God.' And after much study and thought I believe that what it really means is a profound respect for God. Love and respect go together much better than do love and fear." No. Dr. Peale. The fear of God means the fear of God. It means a fear of what God will do in discipline or judgment upon sin.

NEW EVANGELICAL DEVELOPMENTS OF CONCERN

NEWS ALONG THE CHARISMATIC FRONT

..The Billy Graham Crusade in Manila
Missionary Larry Boehning, ABWE, sent a letter dated Sept. 22, 1979: "Here is a list of churches you requested who cooperated in the Billy Graham Crusade held in Manila last year. As I said on the phone, Cardinal Sin of the Philippines represented the Catholic Church on the platform during the opening meeting. In addition to the Catholic Church other groups participating were the United Church of Christ in the Philippines, Methodist Church represented by the large Knox Memorial, Ellingwood and other liberal groups as well as many evangelical groups."

..Conservative Baptist Joined In Crusade.
The anniversary book "Partners Together" of the CBA of the Philippines, Dec. 26-28, 1977, p. 138-"The really big event of this year sponsored by P.C.E.A. (Philippine Council of Evangelical Churches) and other church bodies in the Philippines was the Metro-Manila Billy Graham Crusade last November 23-27...Our Conservative Baptist churches and leaders participated extensively in the planning, actual programming and follow-up activities of the crusade...Rev. Vernon Carvey served on the executive committee as vice-chairman represented the foreign community, and also on the finance committee."

..The Conservative Baptist Association of the Philippines "In their 15th Anniversary yearbook, 1975 carried on its inside cover a full-page advertisement for the 700 club." The 700 Club is the charismatic talk-show out of Virginia operated by Pat Robertson, one of the leading tongues leaders in America.

..Dr. Rufus Jones Favorable To Tongues...
The Gen. Director of the CBHMS wrote a book in 1978-"If I Were In My Thirties" stated-"The contemporary church renewal movement has caused scepticism among traditional evangelicals, especially in regard to the ecstatic experiences of many new converts. However, if the established churches would understand that gifts of the Spirit are a part of revival and would receive new converts without being turned off by their effervescence, they could profit greatly from these Christians, and their own members would be renewed in the process. However, if they are unable to recognize and welcome the supernatural work of the Holy Spirit, new structures (Cont. next page, col. 2)..."

..Charismatics Speak Of Their Opponents..
The Pentecostal magazine "Charisma" for October 1979 had an article on "Lutheran Renewal" by the liberal religion writer, Wilmar Thorkelson of Minneapolis - "There has been opposition to the movement, however. Vaagenes sees the major resistance centered in conservative fundamentalist churches. He says this is because 'where there is a strong emphasis on doctrine there is generally a lack of love and other fruits of the Spirit.' Vaagenes added, 'Usually they (fundamentalists) have developed a closed theological system which doesn't allow room for anything beyond the truths they have discovered' ... One of the Missouri Synod's two seminaries, Concordia in Fort Wayne, Indiana, will not allow students with charismatic experiences into the ministry. The other Concordia seminary in St. Louis 'officially says the same thing but in treatment seems more evangelical!'"

..The Reason For Fundamentalist Opposition to the charismatic movement is not the lack of love toward human beings, but because of love and loyalty to the Word of God. Charismatics have established experience as the authority for their religion and completely disregard the authority of the Scriptures. In the final analysis they don't care what the Bible says, they will still go on with their false tongues, spurious baptism, and their healing racket. The "closed theological system" of the Fundamentalists is another way of describing their complete loyalty to the Bible and their willingness to accept only what the Bible teaches on these subjects, and to reject all others as counterfeits.

..Pentecostalism And Dispensationalism...
In the periodical "Spirit: A Journal of Issues Incident to Black Pentecostalism" (Vol. I, No. 2, 1977) we find a letter to the editor by Bishop Robt. McAlister, New Life Pentecostal Churches, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil: "Our church considers the theory of dispensationalism to be a modern heresy and we reject its eschatological conclusions...I was most interested to see that black pentecostals have not emphasized the second coming to the extent that many white pentecostals do. In this point as well, we are unlike the fundamental churches, possibly because of our reformed theological position. Finally, I wish to (Continued back page, column two)

VALID CONCLUSIONS ON BIBLICAL SEPARATION

ON THE ECUMENICAL FRONT WITH DR. FALWELL

Dr. Francis A. Schaeffer came to these conclusions in his booklet "Here We Stand" written in 1947 following a tour of the mission fields of the world: "To stay in the old denominations where the third stage of Modernism is in effect is to do the very thing which the Modernists want you to do. All they ask is that the Bible-believing Christians stay in their denominations and councils and stay quiet ... Except in rare cases they will not now use strenuous means to keep a man from preaching the gospel or even preaching against Modernism... This is the one thing the Modernists will not tolerate: the teaching and active practice through discipline, that Bible-believing Christianity, the historic Christian Faith, is the only true religion. Anyone who brought the Modernists to trial would be ejected. When we have tried to bring the Modernists to trial as heretics and have failed or when we realize that such a procedure has become impossible, the Bible-believing Christians have only one recourse: Practice separation in reverse, found new denominations and councils which can be used to preach the gospel unfettered and which will draw the line clearly by insisting that Modernism is a false religion. This is what we have in our separatist denominations, and in the American Council, and God willing, will have in the international Council of Bible-believing churches. This is 'The Separatist Movement.' Abraham Kuyper, Spurgeon, and the leaders of the Free Church of Scotland, as well as Luther, Zwingli, Calvin and Knox have walked this road before us. Not to do one of these two things is to agree in practice with the Modernists. It is to allow the unbeliever to speak for us and control us. It is to deny the teaching of the Bible on the need of Church purity. It is to say to the world that there are many ways of salvation. It is to deny the holiness of God in our practice. This then is where we are. The stream of historic Christianity is outside the old established churches. Normal separation was neglected from 1900 to 1920 and so, like the Protestant Reformation, of four hundred years ago, we are in a position of separation in reverse. We are outside, instead of the heretic being outside; however, being outside by God's grace and for His glory, 'Here we stand.'" (Continued back page, col. 2)...

..Falwell Heads A New Moral Ecumenism...
Just as the charismatic movement provided the catalyst to get the ecumenical movement going for the liberals, so Jerry Falwell is using the issues of morality to get the ecumenical movement moving among evangelicals, producing a new evangelical inclusivism. Christianity Today for Nov. 2, 1979 described (P. 84) the crowd on the platform with Dr. Falwell in a rally in Dallas in behalf of Southern Baptist evangelist James Robison: "Seated with Falwell on the platform were ministers of varying racial, ethnic and denominational backgrounds, including traditionalist Catholic theologian William H. Marshner (a brilliant New Right theoretician), and president Gary Potter of the Washington-based Catholics for Christian Political Action. A Jew, director Howard Phillips of Conservative Caucus, gave the opening address."

..Quarterback Craig Morton's Picture appears in the Jerry Falwell Journal Champion for September 29, 1979, on page 14 in a reproduction of the front-page of the Christian Herald. Craig Morton is reported to have been the star of a movie produced by Charismatic Charles Blair's Calvary Temple in Denver, to help with the bankrupt financial condition of this troubled church. Mr. Morton, who is a star on the Denver Bronco football team, was reported arrested recently for drunken driving, which has cast a shadow over not only Charles Blair's hopes but also Dr. Jerry Falwell's testimony. People should write to Dr. Falwell and ask for his justification of advertising Christian Herald magazine and featuring the picture of Craig Morton.

..Dr. Falwell Advertises A Book by the Christian Literature Crusade in his Journal Champion for Sept. 28, 1979. The ad shows that Billy Graham has written the Foreward, while Warren Wiersbe has written an endorsement.

..The Christian Herald Book Club Enjoys advertising in Jerry Falwell's Journal Champion for Sept. 28, 1979 on page 9. This occupies one-half of this large page. One of the books advertised is by Wheaton professor Clyde Kilby on C.S. Lewis, a liberal who rejects several of the fundamental doctrines of the Christian Faith. The ad shows that: "The Christian Book Club for today's woman Advisory Board: Shirley Boone (Continued back page, col. 2).

THE VAST INFLUENCE OF BILLY GRAHAM

..Billy Graham's Glowing Praise For Pope.
One of our Blu-Print readers, a medical doctor sent this news sotry from the Kendallville News Sun (Ind.) for Nov. 7, 1979: "Billy Graham came to Chicaog Monday with a warning for Americans...His only bright note concerned Pope John Paull II- 'the greatest religious leader of the modern world and one of the greatest moral and spiritual leaders of this century.'" "Thirty-one years ago Graham stated publicly that Roman Catholicism was one of the three greatest enemies of the Gospel."

..Southern Baptist Defends Billy Graham..
Dr. Robert Sumner, editor of the Biblical Evangelist in the October 1979 issue cites the statement of Dr. E.J. Daniels, Southern Baptist evangelist, in his "Christ for the World" Family magazine (4.79) in defense of Graham ecumenical evangelism. "I visited a Billy Graham Crusade...As I sat on the platform and saw the enthusiasm of the trememdous crowds, and heard Dr. Graham bring a simple Gospel message, and then saw the tremendous response to the invitation, I kept saying in my soul, 'How could anyone oppose such soul-winning efforts?'" He then listed six reasons why Graham was doing a great job. His conclusion: "In my mind there can be no doubt that the Billy Graham Team has been raised up for this hour, and that God's mighty power is upon them. There is no other explanation of the miracle results that God gives them." We wonder if he is taking a slap at John R. Rice, in whose paper Dr. Daniel's message appear from time to time. Perhaps Dr Rice will answer this attack on critics of Graham's ecumenical evangelism."

..Billy Graham Is Branded As An Apostate.
One of the most startling developments in the Christian world at this holiday sea- son is the branding of Dr. Billy Graham as an apostate by Dr. Bob Jones, Chancellor of Bob Jones University, in an editorial in "Faith for the Family" for Nov. 1979. "The second very obvious truth is that Billy Graham has now revealed him- self apostate and has finally come to the place toward which he has been headed all these years-a denial of the Word of God, which describes the Roman Catholic Church as the great whore of Babylon...If any Bible-believing Christian has had any doubt that Graham is a servant of apost- asy, his recent statements about the Pope should dispell those doubts entirely."

COL. SANDERS PROMOTING HUGE LIQUOR FIRM

With various charismatic TV programs using Col. Harland Sanders on their talk shows, as well as Dr. Jack Van Impe in his July 1979 TV special, it might be good for Christians to know what this 89 year- old celebrity is doing in his retirement years. Time magazine for September 24, 1979 re- ported on his 89th birthday on page 76 - "Fifteen years ago Sanders sold the fried chicken business he started in 1956, but he still travels 250,000 miles yearly promoting the product for present owner, Heublein, Inc. Lest anyone think he's less than finger-lickin' good at his job, the colonel led his admiring crowd in a rous- ing version of My Old Kentucky Home." The National Enquirer for Nov. 6, 1979 on page 3 had a five -column article on the elderly colonel. "After I sold the company to Heublein, Inc., they good greedy," said the 89-year-old Sanders. "They started cutting corners on the cooking and the quality of the chicken declined..." Sanders, who still does commercials and makes personal appearances to promote Kentucky Fried Chicken, explained how Heublein cut cor- ners to increase profits...Cutting corners initially saved money for Heublein, Sand- ers said, but in the end it cost them mon- ey because they lost a lot of customers... 'And finally, two years ago, changes were made. Heublein decided to go back to bas- ics in order to improve the quality of the chicken...' John Cox, who is vice-presid- ent of public affairs for Kentucky Fried Chicken, confirmed Col. Sanders story. "In this article Col. Sanders stated dir- ectly that he sold his firm to the Heub- lin liquor firm. Since a multitude of Christian people became involved in own- ership of Heublein liquor empire, including a Fundamental Baptist college- we are in- formed, elaborate excuses have been made for Col Sanders. We wonder what justifi- cation Dr. Jerry Falwell gives for honor- ing Co. Sanders on his network program and providing Kentucky Fried Chicken for all who attended his Sunday School and there by indirectly and directly promoting the interests of this huge liquor conglo- merate."

JERRY FALWELL AND SPIRITUAL DISCERNMENT

Fundamentalist eyebrows were raised all over the nation when the 1979 Fall issue of Dr. Jerry Falwell's magazine "Faith Aflame" was sent throughout the country in the mails. This paper is published by the Thomas Road Baptist Church of Lynchburg. On the back page is an article by Dr. Edwin T. Dahlberg about "The Rainbow". The article stated: "Life is like that. Suddenly we have to make a blind leap of faith..." That language is standard neo-orthodox terminology, which really has no place in the Christian life. Who is Dr. Edwin T. Dahlberg, who is honored in Dr. Falwell's paper? For two years (1946-48) he was president of the Northern (American) Baptist Convention, the most liberal of the 28 national Baptist bodies in America. For three years he was President of the National Council of Churches. He was elected President of the NCC in 1957 in St. Louis, and presided until their third Triennium convention in San Francisco. Religion writer George Dugan, reporting in the New York Times, called him "a prominent Christian pacifist." Dr. Noel Smith had several articles in the Baptist Bible Tribune exposing Dr. Dahlberg's pro-communist stance. Dr. Dahlberg was the personal secretary to Dr. Walter Rauschenbusch, who is known as "The Father of the Social Gospel." He was sympathetic to socialism, extended his name to numerous left-wing causes, and lent dignity to many a radical social action experiment. One of the books which shaped his philosophy of life was Dr. Rauschenbusch's "Christianity and the Social Crisis", according to the Christian Century. Dr. Dahlberg said of Prof. Rauschenbusch in The American Baptist (9-76, p.21)- as he paid tribute to his teachers: "One of them in particular I must name: Walter Rauschenbusch, my church history teacher at the seminary. He was the most Christ-like man I ever knew ... Rauschenbusch made me see as he did so many others the necessity of community redemption also." Dr. W.B. Riley said: "Of all the modernists I know Dr. Dahlberg is the most gentlemanly." Dr. Dahlberg was one of the founders of the World Council of Churches in Amsterdam in 1948 and then served on the powerful Central Committee of the WCC from 1948 to 1954. He is esteemed by liberals everywhere. For Dr. Falwell to include this article in his (Continued on Back Page, Col. Two)...

..Evangelicals and Kentucky Fried Chicken. Since Falwell, Van Impe, PTL and other TV programs are featuring Col. Harland Sanders whose responsibility is to travel 250,000 each year plugging K.F.C., which is owned by Heublein, Inc., it is interesting to find this paragraph in Faith for the Family magazine, November 1979- "Kentucky Fried Chicken and other subsidiaries of Heublein, Inc., a large liquor manufacturer, are being boycotted by the National Federation for Decency in protest against their sponsorship of violent and vulgar television programming. NFD's executive director, Donald E. Wildmon, commented, 'It is ironic that Kentucky Fried Chicken provided our children with wholesome food while filling their minds with garbage.' According to the NFD Newsletter (8-6-79), the company also contributes thousands of dollars to porno magazines such as Playboy and Penthouse. Christians everywhere are urged to join the boycott!"

..Francis Schaeffer on Roman Catholicism. In 1947 Dr. Francis A. Schaeffer, then a missionary under the Independent Board For Presb. Foreign Missions, wrote a booklet entitled "Here We Stand". He stated: "Europe is being inundated by three streams of paganism. Bible-believing Christians should keep in mind that Biblically and historically a religion is not any the more Christian simply for having a Christian name. Each of the three streams of paganism that flood Europe has the name Christian, and each is pagan. The first of these is Roman Catholicism...It is well also not to forget that Roman Catholicism has brought forth the dictatorships of Mussolini and Franco." p.13.

..Advertising in a Roman Catholic Paper.. The Catholic Voice is the official diocesan paper of the Oakland Dioceses of the Roman Catholic Church. In the issue of October 29, 1979 on page 11 we find a very large ad by Dr. Francis Schaeffer promoting his Two-Day Seminary of Major Scope with film premier, Nov. 16-17, 1979. Dr. Schaeffer has come a long way. He states on page 16 of his 1947 booklet - "Here We Stand", "In the world today, there are three forms of false religion, each one of which calls itself Christian ...The first of these is Roman Catholicism, the second Greek Orthodoxy, and the third, what is commonly called modernistic Protestantism...Thus all three of these forms (Cont. Back pg., col. two).....

THE MOODY BIBLE INSTITUTE PROBLEM

..Professor's Wife Strong For ERA.. The Chicago Sun-Times for Sept. 20, 1979 had a three-page article on the resignation of Prof. Stanley Gundry from Moody faculty because of strong anti-Biblical feminist views of his wife Patricia. "I've changed my position. I am more determined than ever to work actively for ERA now because I believe the tactics being used against it are so wrong.", so said Pat Gundry. The Sun-Times continued: "And Pat Gundry hasn't finishing writing, either. If her critics found 'Woman Be Free!' disturbing, wait until they read her next book. The tentative title: 'Heirs Together-Biblical Equality in Marriage.'"

..Concerning Her Husband's Firing from Moody Faculty, Mrs. Gundry said: "It's intriguing, it's complicated and in the same sense I suppose it's simple. It's a political situation caused by stop-ERA activists conducting a smear campaign based on slander, innuendo and distortion directed at Moody Bible Institute in order to get them to take a political stand against ERA. The explanation is money and power."

..How Mrs. Gundry Attended Movies.. The Sun-Times article stated: "The Moody Bible Institute is a place where those in charge are acutely alert to immorality and sin. Faculty members, for instance, are forbidden to attend movies. Because of this regulation, Mr. Gundry sat in the parking lot, while his wife and children saw 'The Sound of Music.' Student television is regulated, and the faculty operate without the usual job-security protections afforded most teachers." (It should be pointed out that most Fundamental institutions have no job security for those who teach or condone unscriptural views.-BP)

..A Pro-Homosexual Defends Gundry.. The Sun-Times Article states: "Letha Scanzoni, a North Carolina-based leader of the Evangelical Women's Caucus and an alumnae of Moody, theorizes that the situation may have developed in part because of fear of unfavorable reaction from Moody alumni as well as a backlash of the extreme right who use dogma to defend their social views. Ultra-conservative Christians are threatened because some of us are reading and re-examining the Bible in a different way. Pat Gundry has tried to be a bridge person." Letha Scanzoni teamed up with Virginia Mollenkott to write a book calling for the acceptance of the homosexual lifestyle (Continued back page, column two)..

MR. MUGGERIDGE'S RELIGIOUS PLURALISM

We were astounded with an interview which British commentator Malcolm Muggeridge had in the U.S. Catholic magazine for November 1979 covering eight pages. In Part: "You speak of Jesus in terms of western civilization. Is your Jesus universal? Is your faith universal? A. Absolutely. Do you accept as authentic Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam? A. Absolutely. Is this a paradox? A. Not really, no. If you were a Moslem, a Buddhist, or a Hindu, I would tell you with the same earnestness that for me Jesus Christ and the Revelation have given me a faith. I would love to tell you about it. I have been given a vision, a knowledge through faith of what our life's about, what our Creator's like, and how our Creator relates himself to his creation. For me, this bright light which shone in the world- the Incarnation is the illumination that I discovered. I would invite you to explore it." If we understand him correct he has succumbed to the modern existential idea that all faiths are equally valid, but he happened to find salvation through this faith, rather than one of the others.

YOU WILL NEVER SHRINK FROM CONTROVERSY

In the last sermon which Dr. J. Gresham Machen delivered to ministerial students at Princeton before he deliberately separated from that modernistically-trending institution, the noted New Testament theologian declared: "Have you yourself that peace, my friends? If you have, you will not be deceived by the propoganda of any disloyal church. If you have the peace of God in your hearts, you will never shrink from controversy; you will never be afraid to contend earnestly for the Faith. Talk of peace in the present deadly peril of the Church, and you show, unless you be strangely ignorant of the conditions that exist, that you have little inkling of the true peace of God. Those who have been at the foot of the Cross will not be afraid to go forth under the banner of the Cross to a holy war of love. Where are you going to stand in the great battle which now rages in the church?...Are you going to stand coldly aloof when God's people fight against ecclesiastical tyranny at home and abroad? Are you going to excuse yourselves by pointing out personal defects in (Continued back page, column two)....

LUIS PALAU IN AN ECUMENICAL CONGRESS AT ORAL ROBERTS U. SPONSORED BY APOSTATES

Since this item has been called into question, we quote the entire article as it appears in the Richmond Times-Dispatch for Sunday, June 3, 1979 on page A-5. "A United Methodist Congress on Evangelism, slated for Jan. 1-4, will feature such evangelistic leaders as Billy Graham and Oral Roberts. The congress, which will be held at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa, Okla. will also feature Alan Walker, the Australian evangelist who is the director of world evangelism for the World Methodist Council; Samuel Kamaleson, a native of India, who is vice-president of World Vision International, and South American evangelist Luis Palau. Other speakers will include Charles Allen, pastor of United Methodism's largest congregation, First United Methodist Church of Houston; Bishop W. Kenneth Goodson of the Virginia Conference of the denomination and past president of the Council of Bishops; and Bishop Edward L. Tullis of Columbia, S.C., which is chairman of the Board of Discipleship's evangelism section." Evangelist Luis Palau, who is probably considered as exhibit A among the alumni at Multnomah in Portland will have a lot of explaining to do about his being used by this apostate Methodist denomination, as well as his associations with Oral Roberts in this charismatic context. People who hold to the Biblical Christian Faith have a right to wonder what justification he has for associating himself with such known liberals as this crowd of Methodist Bishops who have nothing but contempt for Biblical Fundamentalism and the defenders of the historic Christian Faith. WHO IS DR. ALAN WALKER OF AUSTRALIA?

.. His Record is Old-Fashioned Liberalism
He is without doubt one of the leading liberals of Australia known as a "progressive social thinker"; a frequent contributor to the Christian Century, the most notable liberal magazine in America; a noted supporter of left-wing causes. "Alan Walker is urgently insistent that the evangelization of the twentieth century man is dependent upon the social and political involvement of the Church", says S.B. Babbage. In a sermon at Riverside Church, New York (C.C. 3-3-58) Walker hinted he stood on the Deity of Christ - "First of all, I suggest that Jesus Christ is absolutely essential to the picture because only through him can we come to the Christian God." Our people have been hurt by war, depression, and war again, and are now in peril from atomic calamity. In other words, the point where we need great guidance is in economic, social political and international matter. It is our corporate life that must be redeemed from destruction..."

.. A Pious Cover For Left-Wing Theology...
Dr. Alan Walker continues (C.C. 5-16-51) "We must adjust our corporate life to the everlasting right as seen in Jesus and his ethical anti-Communist basis which, by a strange twist of human psychology, tends to sanctify the unholy existing ordering of society. The task of the preacher who would declare the lordship of Christ is not easy." Dr. Walker was a strong supporter and leader of the Graham 1959 Crusade in Sydney.
