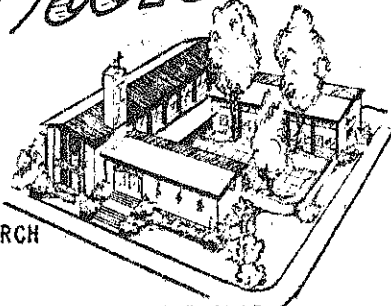

BAY AREA ASSN. JAN. 12 AT BAYSHORE

Pastor Ray Ames of San Francisco Bay-shore Baptist Church cordially invites Conservative Baptists to assemble in good numbers at their church near the Cow Palace next Tuesday for an all-day meeting. A Nursery will be provided for little folk and lunch will be served at noon at low cost. Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Jones, missionary candidates, will speak. Prof. Bernard Northrup of the San Francisco Seminary will bring the main address of the evening. A CBFMS film, "Shadows of the Vatican" will be shown in the evening. Theme for the day — "We are Ambassadors". Let us have a large representation.

DR. DAHLBERG LOSES FACE IN FREE CHINA

When the President of the National Council of Churches in USA and former President of the American Baptist Convention stepped off a plane in Taipei on Dec. 21 to visit US troops in Far East, NOT A SINGLE CHINESE welcomed him, as is usually the case when foreign dignitaries arrive. Instead a group of 29 leading Chinese Christians signed an open letter saying that they were gravely disturbed by his coming. The main reason for this reaction was the fact that Dr. Dahlberg was one of the NCC leaders at the Cleveland meeting a year ago calling for recognition of Red China in their 5th World Order study Conference. The Chinese leaders stated in Taipei, according to the Tribune of Dec. 31, "We do not understand how a spiritual Christian leader could be pro-atheistic-communistic or join any kind of pro-communistic activities". They were evidently referring to the extensive Communist Front connections of Dr. Dahlberg. Mr. M. G. Lowman lists 17 Front activities in his book "Recognize Red China?", but it is probably closer to 25. Dr. Dahlberg exerted influence and effort to get Browder out of jail, keep the US Government from deporting Harry Bridges, free Smith Act Communists, secure "Justice" for (Cont'd p.2)

THE SEMINARY OPENS 2nd SEMESTER JAN. 18

Another interchurch Seminary Rally on Monday, Jan. 18 at 7.30 p.m. will signal the opening of the second semester of instruction of the current year. The speaker will be the noted Scotch preacher Dr. David J. Laurie, DD, PhD. Dr. Laurie is without a peer in the Bible teaching field and his wide acquaintance in the Bay Area will be a distinct advantage to the attendance. People are always fed when he preaches. This semester is highly important because it means that the Seminary will now be able to apply for GI standing with the government. The law states that a Seminary must be in existence two years, and it is hoped that GI student assistance will be won for the Fall. The Dean has reported that several incoming students are expected, and that no current students are considering dropping out. The continued financial blessing amazes Seminary leaders in the face of so little promotion. Salaries are paid, but God's people are asked to keep their monthly gifts coming through in order that this School might be able to look back upon a strong spiritual heritage of God's provision.

CRUSADE LEADER NAMED CHURCH COUNCIL HEAD

Lowell Berry, President of Best Fertilizer Corporation, was recently elected president of the Northern California-Nevada Council of Churches. The prominent Oakland industrialist who is affiliated with 17 corporations in California, Arizona, and Texas, was a member of the 1958 San Francisco Crusade Executive Committee and served as Finance Chairman along with Mrs. William Lister Rogers, President of the S.F. Council of Churches. Mr. Berry is a trustee of the Pacific School of Religion, "The Union Seminary of the West". He endowed a Professor's Chair in Religion in Higher Education at Pacific School, now occupied by Clarence P. Shedd, Phd. He was very active in the Graham Crusade, and was reported among those who had a deep spiritual experience.

FOR CONSERVATIVE BAPTISTS

..Gov. Nelson Rockefeller, the only Baptist among Presidential possibilities, withdrew from the race, leaving the GOP field wide-open to Quaker Nixon. Rockefeller is a member of Riverside Church, New York City, famous Fosdick center of liberalism.

..According to Bill Rose, religion editor for Tribune, visiting Archbishop John of Brussels, identifies the head of the Russian Orthodox Church in Moscow as a slave of the Soviets. The story in Dec. 30, 1959 Tribune said, "CLERIC CALLS RUSS PATRIARCH SLAVE... The patriarch of the Russian Orthodox Church in Moscow is a slave of the Soviet, declares Archbishop John of Brussels, head of the Russian Church in Exile for Western Europe".

..Time Magazine, Jan. 4, 1960 reported a 17-day visit to Russia of a five-man delegation representing the World Council of Churches, showing their pictures with Metropolitan Nicolai in a worship service. "The Makeup of the World Council's delegation to Russia was well designed to disprove any lingering notions Moscow's Patriarch Alexis might have that the WCC was a 'political tool of Western imperialism' There were banquets and church services, meetings with Patriarch Alexis and Metropolitan Nicolai (Russian Orthodoxy's foreign expert), talks with leaders of the Russian Baptists (who claim a membership of 3,000,000) and the Lutheran churches of the Baltic states". What tragic betrayal of Christianity this is to fraternize with these Communist tools, as well as a betrayal of the true Christians of Russia.

..Paul Whittaker, former pastor of San Diego First Baptist and former member of the ABFMS Board, is now pastor of a San Diego area church affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention.

..Dr. John R. Rice, fearless editor of The Sword of the Lord and radio preacher (KGO, Sundays, 5.30 p.m.), was recently elected President of the Southern Baptist Fellowship, a loosely organized fellowship of fundamental and premillennial ministers, mostly in the southland. Dr. Charles H. Stevens. is Vice-president. Congratulations.

..The Korean Situation. Dr. L. Nelson-Bell flew to Korea at the request of the Board of World Missions of the Presbyterian Church in the US "to effect understanding and reconciliation between two major factions of the schism-riddled Presbyterian Church in Korea". This means that they oppose the recent action of the Koreans in disassociating themselves from the modernism and socialism of the Presbyterian Church USA and WCC. Dr. Bell is Executive Editor of Christianity Today.

..Hilmore Cedarholm's "Hour of Morning Worship" was recently dropped from Northwestern's Christian radio station KTIS in Minneapolis and their Fargo station KPNW. Christians, who remember that the strong Fundamentalist leader, W. B. Riley founded this station, will find it hard to understand. Mr. Cedarholm is the uncle of Dr. B. Myron Cedarholm.

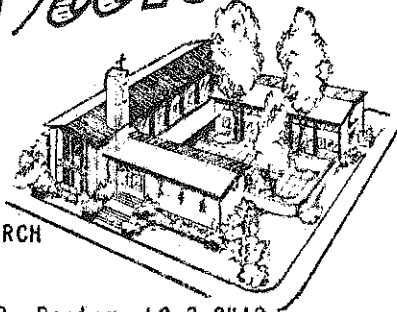

DR. DAVID J. LAURIE TO ADDRESS SEMINARY RALLY NEXT MONDAY IN SAN FRANCISCO

Conservative Baptists, within a 100 mile radius, who have a deep concern for the new San Francisco Conservative Baptist Seminary, will be coming together for the Rally on Jan. 18 at 7:30 p.m., celebrating the opening of the second semester work. The speaker is David J. Laurie, PhD, DD, noted Scotch preacher and Bible teacher. Dr. Laurie, who now lives at Mt. Hermon, has enjoyed a wide Bible conference ministry on this Coast. He was for years pastor of one of Europe's leading evangelistic centers in the great city of Edinburg. According to Pastor Roy H. Austin, who will preside at the Rally, refreshments will be served in the lower auditorium by Castro Valley Trinity Baptist Church. We are so grateful to pastor Eugene Petersen and the ladies of his church. The Bayshore Baptist Church of San Francisco has been invited to share their church choir for this occasion. Dear William G. Bellshaw will give a report of the Seminary developments relating to instruction, students, and faculty. God's people in this area should be so thankful for such a school and should support and protect it with all the devotion and faithfulness possible. We are hoping that we will have more pastors and church members present from the area than ever before.

DAHLBERG AND RECOGNITION OF RED CHINA

Mr. Wm. Frye, Director of Information of the NCC, is quoted in the Chinese News Service bulletin of Jan. 5, 1960 (which the Pastor receives weekly) as follows: "Dr. Dahlberg never advocated the recognition of the Chinese Communist regime and did not participate in the Fifth World Order Study Conference at Cleveland". He also stated, "Only the General Board and the General Assembly of the National Council of Churches can speak for the National Council. The Cleveland Conference spoke for itself only and not for the National Council". Something is wrong here. The NCC sponsored the Cleveland Conference. Dr. Edwin T. Dahlberg, President of NCC and frequent visitor and speaker to the Bay area, was an official delegate and failed to register any protest against the final passage of the recommendation on the subject of Red China. The Conference went on record by unanimous vote in favor of recognition of Red China and giving them a UN seat. The Communist press was jubilant that one of the major goals of Communist strategy for many years should be given an enormous boost by the 600 protestant church men who were delegates at Cleveland. Since the fate of 42 lesser nations in Southeast Asia depend upon our decision on Red China, and since the bulk of foreign missions are in the Far East, this issue is of the gravest importance to the gospel and every Christian.

Missionary Letters — from Austin and Nelda Boggan have been distributed. Let us remember these young people in prayer.

RYRIE LECTURES ON GOSPEL OF LUKE

One of the greatest opportunities for pure Bible study ever offered in the Bay area will be the two weeks of Seminary lectures beginning Tuesday, Jan. 26, with President Charles Ryrie, PhD, ThD, of the Philadelphia College of Bible. Two lectures will be given each day beginning at 10:15 a.m. on the Gospel of Luke, with a coffee break between them. Lectures will be given Tuesday through Friday of both weeks. An outline of the Gospel has been provided in advance by Dr. Ryrie and is available in mimeographed form. The other specified interference with local church affairs. Many pastors are disturbed because a Seminary Committee then called these two pastors on the carpet to explain why they had, for convictions of their own, taken this course of action.

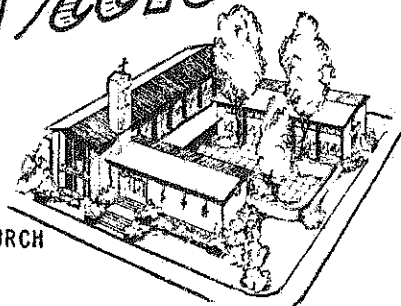

BAPTIST LEADERS ARE SOVIET TOOLS

The ABC Crusader, Jan., 1960 stated, "Soviet seeks Baptist support: According to a December report on Moscow's radio foreign language broadcast, the Evangelical Baptist Council of the USSR has urged all Baptists to work for disarmament. 'The best and most reliable way...is to implement the Soviet disarmament plan, to establish friendly cooperation among all nations and all churches and Christian peace committees'. The message was quoted. It was addressed to the Baptist World Alliance, the European Baptist Federation, and to several national Baptist organizations in the US and other countries". We have repeatedly indicated that the leaders of the Baptist Council in Russia, on the basis of sworn testimony, before the US Congressional Committees, are Communist agents and tools.

EVOLUTIONARY ASPECTS OF ECUMENICAL BROTHERHOOD ON WORLDWIDE SCALE

Dr. George C. Simpson, Prof. of Vertebrate Paleontology at Harvard, stated at the 126th meeting of AM Association of Advancement of Science, in Sherman Hotel, Chicago, on Dec. 29, 1959: "Man is in the fullest sense a part of nature and not apart from it. He is not figuratively but literally akin to every living thing, be it amoeba, a tapeworm, a flea, a seaweed, an oak tree, or a monkey—even though the degrees of relationship are different and we may feel less empathy for 42nd cousins like the tapeworm than for, comparatively speaking, brothers like monkeys. This is togetherness and brotherhood with a vengeance, beyond the wildest dreams of copy-righters or theologians".

Self-will instead of Submission
Self-seeking instead of Benevolence
Self-righteousness instead of Humility.

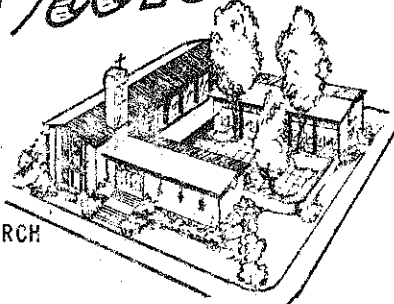

PASTOR VISITS SPURGEON LIBRARY

Last Thursday the Pastor, in company with Pastor Ralph Wilson, was able to fulfill a special desire to visit the world-famous private library of Charles Haddon Spurgeon, widely regarded as the greatest preacher since the Apostle Paul. Along with Dr. W. E. Riley, Spurgeon has been a great ministerial "hero" of the Pastor, exciting great admiration and affection. Though Spurgeon ministered for 40 years at London's noted Metropolitan Tabernacle, his library was purchased by Missouri Baptists and is now housed in William Jewell College, near Kansas City. Many of these 7,000 treasures are old pig-skinned covered books dating back to the seventeenth, sixteenth and even the fifteenth centuries. They were transported in 38 large boxes and are now housed on the second floor of the Library. Because the Pastor is also listed as the Professor of Practical Theology in the Seminary, he was accorded special privileges. He is pursuing a research project in "The Sword and the Trowell" which he wants to finish later, and which will take about a week.

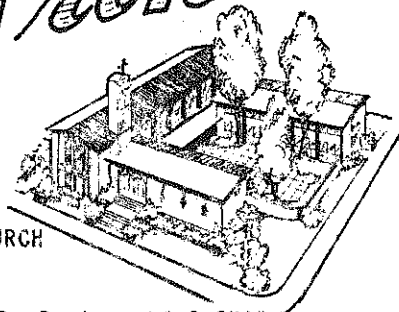

I think one reason is that we are not set up like a mission station as are stations in the bush—a huge land area with a grouping of missionary houses, a dispensary or hospital, a school or schools. Here we have no central land holdings and our work is scattered throughout the city. We have no medical work and we have no school. Schools and medicine are the big problem....I've never been one for much use of the term "revival" but with my understanding of it in a Biblical sense it is the need of the hour. Nothing short of a miracle can shatter the unfortunate state of affairs in this storm-tossed land and bring people to their senses.

COLORADO CBA SEPARATIST RESOLUTION

On Feb. 1 the State Council of the CBA of Colorado unanimously passed the following resolution which clearly states the original position of the CBA, declaring that this position is unchanged: WHEREAS, the Conservative Baptist movement came into being as a protest against cooperation in matters of religion with modernists and liberals, and WHEREAS, continual vigilance is necessary to guard the integrity of this movement, WE THEREFORE STATE the following reaffirmation: 'Positive separation from cooperation in matters of religion with modernists, liberals, or any other kind of unbeliever has been from its inception, and is now the position of the Conservative Baptist Association of Colorado and the Association can be represented only on the basis of this position'. The state association meeting the last week in April will consider this resolution. We commend the CBA leaders in Colorado for such a clear-cut reaffirmation. This is the true position, the official position, the original position, the majority position of the CBA of A.

WASCO PASTOR STATES CBA POSITION

On Jan. 29 Dr. Donald Grey Barnhouse preached at Wasco First Baptist Church. Two issues were dealt with in the question period which required Pastor Emery W. Nester, Jr. to discuss in detail in the Feb. 3 "Spotlight". We quote one: "The second subject had to do with that which is the "warp and woof" of our Conservative Baptist movement—opposition to that type of ecumenicism which involves us with the support of those who are liberal or modernistic in their theology. Dr. Barnhouse justified remaining in an all-inclusive program by suggesting that the orthodox element in such a movement would send the missionaries and the liberal element would support them...that these factors would balance out and in reality there is no such thing as money belonging to the Lord going to the support of those who have denied the faith. Of course the idea behind this is that to remain within such a group will enable the good element to purge the group of its liberalism. But this has not been the case in our Baptist situation. For years an attempt was made to cleanup the old organization within the Convention and this utterly failed. The thought is simply inconsistent with Scripture—"a little leaven leaveneth the whole lump." God warns His people saying, "come out and be ye separate..." The very heart of our Conservative Baptist movement... the reason for our existence today is connected with our separatist nature, and without this we will decay and fall into the ruins of those who have been "leavened" with the lump of liberalism. With all due regard for Dr. Barnhouse, and respecting his right to his own convictions, let it hereby be known that the above mentioned things represent our stand as Conservative Baptists. "Convictions unexpressed revert to mere opinions." I Tim. 4:6 says, "If thou put the brethren in remembrance of these things, thou shalt be a good minister of Jesus Christ."

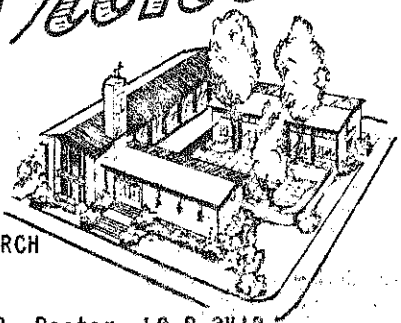

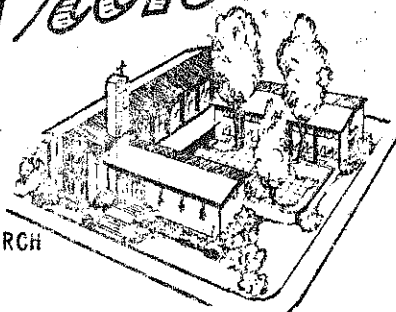

READ THESE WISE WORDS OF WARNING

"Today multitudes within the bounds of the Christian church are surrendering their faith in the infallibility of God's Word. They may not express it in just these words, yet it is true. This is the reason for the awful apostasy sweeping over Christendom now. They are not giving up the Bible all at once. The strategy of Satan is too keen to permit this. The process resembles a painless drug, lulling unsuspecting souls into soporific inactivity. All is being done in the name of scientific research. Scholarship is said to be on the side of unbelief, and men in their conceit have fancied themselves too intellectual to be deceived into the acceptance of the entire Bible as being inspired of God. The steps in the downward course are, first, the putting of Christ before His Word, as though the Lord Jesus outshone His Book; the surrender of the miraculous, which includes the virgin birth, the physical resurrection of Christ, His glorious miracles, and everything that pertains to the supernatural; and finally, the exaltation of man above the Savior. The "inclusive policy", which is plaguing evangelical Christianity, was invented to allow such Bible-deniers to continue in full fellowship with those who still cling to the old Book as of God.

INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVE BAPTISTS

..Dr. Marcus Barth, professor at the ABC related University of Chicago Federated Divinity faculty and author of the evangelism study book for the American Baptist Convention in 1959 on Ephesians, said "All talk and all striving for desegregation and for full equality and community rights and duties of the people of different races living together in America is but rubbish unless it includes the willingness to accept and protect racially-mixed marriages". Baptist Bible Tribune, Feb. 19, 1960.

..SBC Professor of Theology, Theo. R. Clark of New Orleans Baptist Seminary wrote a book, "Saved by his Life" by Macmillan Co. In it he objects to such hymns as "What Can Wash Away My Sin?", "Nothing but the Blood of Jesus" and "The Old Rugged Cross" as leading to a "most serious distortion of the Christian faith." He objects to the preaching "that salvation is to be found in the 'blood of the Lamb'". He also refers to "The Old Rugged Cross" in the statement, "It reflects a one-sided emphasis on the cross! Our sins were not atoned in the life of Christ nor in the work of the Holy Spirit as the book indicates, but in His Cross.

..SBC Quarterly recommends the monstrously wicked "Interpreter's Bible". Robt. W. Jackson in 1958 Adult SS quarterly, fourth quarter, pp 2,3 states, "Further, there should be a serious lifelong study of the Bible. During Bible Study Week in January, an individual should make a concentrated study with the pastor and other people. Then, throughout the year, he ought to study the Bible for at least two hours a week. Good commentaries are available for this study. The Interpreter's Bible is one of the latest sets".

..Dr. Wilbur Smith of Fuller Seminary -- said, after reviewing Vol. 1 of this commentary, "I would like to give it as my opinion after nearly forty years of preaching with a considerable acquaintance with Biblical literature, that this volume will do more to destroy faith in the Scriptures as the Word of God than any other publication issuing from within the confines of the Christian church in the last seventy years".

..Dr. John W. Bailey, professor of Berkeley Baptist Divinity School, is listed as as one of the consulting editors of this commentary. Others are Georgia Harkness, Wallace Bassett (Dallas Cliff Temple Baptist Church, SBC), Edwin McNeill Foteat Ellis A. Fuller, President of Southern Baptist Seminary.

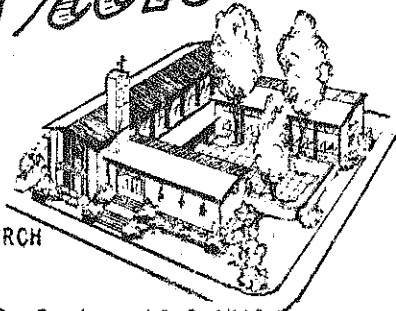

"SIN IS TO WORSHIP JESUS HIMSELF"

While the Pastor was driving to his office Thursday, Feb. 25, 1960 he was listening to the 8 a.m. broadcast from Berkeley radio KRE of the Earl Lectures of the Pacific School of Religion recorded in the First Congregational Church of Berkeley. The speaker was Dr. Harland E. Hogue, Carl Patton Professor of Homiletics at PSR. He spoke on the Biblical doctrine of Sin. He said, "Sin is misplaced allegiance. Sin is worship of reason. Sin is worship of the state. The song, 'God Bless America' is the most blasphemous song of the past three decades. Sin is to worship the Bible itself. Sin is to worship Jesus Himself. There is a great deal of Jesus-olatry today". He made a steady attack on Christian Orthodoxy. We have heard liberals say that the worship of Jesus is foolish, heathenish, and nonsense, but this is the first time we have heard it defined as sin. God's people should consult the Gospel of Matthew and find how many times Jesus invited, encouraged and promoted worship of Himself. Matt. 2:11; 8:2; 9:18; 14:33; 15:35; 28:9; 28:17. Dr. Hogue is identified as the Chaplain of the Earl Lectures conference in session last week. In spite of this wicked kind of preaching, four board members of this Seminary served as committeemen for the San Francisco Cow Palace Crusade. Lowell Berry, president of the Northern California Council of Churches, is listed as one of the main trustees of this school.

LARGEST CBA CHURCH IN U.S. GETS SET TO REPUDIATE AMERICAN BAPTIST CONVENTION

One of the most staggering religious developments of recent days was the action of the Deacons of the huge First Baptist Church of Wichita, Kansas, in recommending the following resolution to the church for adoption this Wednesday, March 9 repudiating the National Council of Churches as well as the ABC: "That the finance committee of the First Baptist Church be hereby instructed to immediately withdraw any and all financial support of the American Baptist Convention or to any of its affiliated organizations that support it under the Unified Budget of First Baptist Church. For the reason that the said American Baptist Convention and its affiliated organizations are apparently in full support of the policies and plans of the National Council of Churches and that these policies and plans are not in accordance with the faith and practices of First Baptist Church Wichita". This resolution was made following a study by ten laymen of the ecumenical movement in the US and its influence upon the ABC. The entire religious world is waiting for the outcome of the action of the church on Wednesday, since this church of 4,500 members is the largest ABC church on the American continent.

VISITATION PROGRAM ENTERS NEW PHASE

Quite frankly we are getting low on prospects, so the Church is inviting all friends to participate in a two-pronged religious census, which will be conducted door-to-door in very short visits in previously assigned city blocks on the second and fourth Thursday, all designed to find more prospects for a serious home visitation. The telephone squad will also begin working on the 236,000 telephone listings in a special street directory the Church will lease from the Telephone Company. It is hoped that this "electronic approach" to evangelism will add many worthwhile names to the visitation files. What a thrill to be a part of a Church which is taking seriously its Great Commissioned responsibility to extend the ministry of the gospel in this city.

QUOTES FOR CHRISTIAN THOUGHT

..The position of The Vatican is stated in La Civiltà Cattolica of April 1948: "The Roman Catholic Church convinced through its divine prerogatives of being the only true church must demand the right of freedom for herself alone...In some countries, Catholics will be obliged to ask full freedom for all, resigned to being forced to cohabit where they alone should rightfully be allowed to live. The Church cannot blush for want of tolerance". Murch, "Cooperation without Compromise", p. 145.

..Article 6, Spanish Charter.. "The profession and practice of the Catholic religion, which is that of the State shall enjoy official protection. ..Red penetration of NCC..Herbert A. Philbrick, former Communist and later counter-espionage for FBI of TV program "I Led Three Lives" stated in Feb. News and Views, "I have been a student of communist propaganda for more than 20 years. Since I was initially victimized and duped into joining a 'Christian' youth organization with 'peace' propaganda, I have naturally given particular attention, over the years, to this kind of red propaganda message. On the basis of that background, knowledge, and study, the 'peace' propaganda now being distributed to the local churches by the National Council of Churches is, in my opinion, the slickest, neatest, trickiest, and the most insidious I have ever seen. On every fundamental issue it agrees with the current line of Soviet foreign policy."

..Fuller Professor J. E. Carnell's book "Case for Orthodox Theology" was reviewed in Feb. Moody Monthly by Dr. John Walvoord of Dallas Seminary. The review closes-- "The most regrettable aspect of his treatment, however, is his betrayal of theological orthodoxy by a weakened plenary inspiration which no longer assumes verbal inerrancy and by his silence on many great fundamentals of the historic faith". Every Conservative who supports Fuller Seminary is supporting this betrayal of the historic Christian Faith.



WICHITA CHURCH VOTES REPUDIATION OF NCC
MOVES TO WITHHOLD ABC MISSION SUPPORT

The largest church in the American Baptist Convention voted overwhelmingly on March 9 to repudiate the National Council of Churches and withhold financial support from the ABC because of its affiliation with the NCC. The vote was 1,170 to 235 in a business meeting attended by over 2,000 people including 1,405 who were voting members out of a membership of 4,500. The business meeting took 2½ hours with one hour in debate moderated by Ivan Whitten, chairman of the Board of Deacons. First Baptist Church is located at 325 N. Broadway, Wichita, Kansas. The church gives \$33,000 per year to the ABC. The resolution was presented originally by a special committee of ten laymen, which was then affirmed by the Deacons a month ago by a vote of 32-7. NCC supporters tried to defeat the resolution of censure by a substitute motion to be presented by Deacon Jack Loman. Leroy Elmore, Wichita attorney, who drafted the substitute resolution, was ruled out of order when he attacked the meeting as being without legal jurisdiction. Attorney Les Arvin, Sunday School teacher running for the US Congress on a strong anti-communist platform, moved to terminate the one hour debate which was supported by a mass standing vote. A secret ballot followed. Preston Huston led the debate for the deacons. Dr. F. B. Thorn resigned a few weeks ago in the scuffle, after a pastorate of 14 years. Dr. Wm. Keucker, ABC executive-secretary in Kansas, sent a letter to the congregation pleading with them not to take the action. Dr. Edwin Tuller, ABC executive-secretary from New York, speaking before the church on March 2 stated that the ABC would respond to the resolution at the annual convention in Rochester, N.Y. in June by a vote of the delegates. Other churches are expected to support the action of this large church. Southern Baptists are very strong in Kansas and hope to reap from this defection from the ABC. The ABC is in for a big fight in June with the issue being the NCC's socialism, ecumenicalism, and pink program.

CENTENNIAL OF WILLIAM JENNINGS BRYAN

Since Saturday, March 19, marks the 100th year of the birth of a great American, the Pastor wants to pay tribute to William Jennings Bryan, three-time democratic candidate for the Presidency of the US. As a result of a lecture "Is the Bible True?", which he delivered at the state capitol in Nashville, Jan. 29, 1925, the legislature passed the famous "Anti-evolution Bill" which made it unlawful to teach evolution in tax-supported schools of Tennessee. The bill was passed in March 21, 1925. A Dayton high school science teacher, John T. Scopes, admitted he was teaching evolution in his classes. The American Civil Liberties Union offered to finance the case for the defense. The Chicago press arranged for Clarence Darrow, famous agnostic criminal lawyer, to support the defense. A group of earnest Memphis Christians enlisted the services of Bryan for the prosecution. On July 10, 1925, the most famous case in the history of the American Bar began. The courtroom was so crowded that sessions were transferred to the courthouse lawn. For eight days the battle raged. Darrow was cited for contempt for sarcastic remarks to the Judge, with bond fixed at \$5,000. He then made a moving apology which the court accepted. On July 21 a verdict of guilty was rendered by the jury, and Scopes ordered to pay a fine of \$100. Bryan gave a masterful address and easily won the case. Two days later, with out sickness and pain, he "was not, for God took him". Today in that same town a college exists to his memory standing for the absolute authority of the Bible. God bless his memory — a great Christian.

INTERCHURCH NEWS FOR CONSERVATIVE BAPTISTS

..The Baccalaureate address for Williams Jennings Bryan College, one of the activities celebrating the Centenary of the great commoner, will be delivered on June 5 by Dr. William Kerr, '39, pastor of Hinson Memorial Baptist Church in Portland—the largest CBA church in the nation.

..Herbert A. Philbrick, TV personality & former FBI counterspy in the Communist Party, said in a speech before the Daughters of the American Revolution, April 18, 1956 and quoted in the Air Force Manual: "We are losing the fight with Communism... there are more names of ministers than any other profession on the list of Communist supporters in this country...Protest this to your religious leaders... If their name is on the list, demand that they withdraw it or kick them out of your church organization".

..The Air Force Manual contained a UPI news dispatch of May 27, 1959 concerning statements of Dr. John A. Mackay, retiring president of Princeton Seminary (and who is listed in M.G. Lowman's book on Red China with 48 front affiliations) : "Dr. John Mackay...charged that America is turning its back on untold thousands of Christians in Red China. Dr. Mackay called for recognition of Red China.... backing a resolution that had been adopted at the General Assembly of the Church meeting at Indianapolis. Dr. Mackay told the delegates that while Red China had done some terrible things, so had the United States."

..We nominate Jack Hyles as a speaker worthy of consideration by CBA on a national level. This new pastor of the large Hammond First Baptist Church is a favorite writer in the Sword of the Lord. He became pastor of Miller Road Baptist Church, Garland, Texas when they had 75 members. Seven years later they had 4,000. The Sunday School grew from 44 to 1,700 average attendance. The property was valued at \$6,000 and became worth over a million. We think he has a story to tell.

..Geoffrey W. Bromiley, Anglican professor at Fuller Seminary, writes the section on infant baptism in Baker's "Dictionary of Theology" and defends it, giving Scriptural reasons for it. Is this what Baptist students at Fuller receive? Everett Harrison, also of Fuller, is Editor-in-chief. Will Baptists protest this unbiblical teaching?

SEC SEMINARY FIRES THEOLOGY PROFESSOR

According to the Baptist Standard the New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary (SBC) trustees at their annual meeting released this statement: "In the light of problems which the board has dealt with over a period of several years, it accepted unanimously the recommendation of a special committee that Theodore R. Clark be relieved of his status as associate professor, and his teaching responsibilities as of March 12, 1960. His salary will be continued for 12 months, and the possible renewal of his relationship to the institution may be reviewed on or before the expiration of a five-year period. His recently-published book is one of several instances in which the board has been confronted with questions as to limitations in the area of communication with students and hearers as well as content of lecture materials." The book referred to is Clark's "Saved by His Life", published last year by Macmillan. Some quotations: On substitutionary atonement, p. 33 — "Such an interpretation calls for two Gods, one strong and one weak, one who sacrifices and one who is sacrificed". Concerning hell, p. 176 — "But the extreme views of eternal punishment and torment must be rejected as the product of sadistic aborations of the human mind". Concerning the hymn, "Nothing but the Blood of Jesus", he states on p. 22—"The 'nothing but' of the above hymn by Robert Lowry is indicative of a 'theology of the Cross' which has led, I think, to a most serious distortion of the Christian Faith". This book drips with unbelief. We commend the SBC trustees for this action, and suggest that they get busy in Southern Baptist Seminary, Wake Forest College and other schools and clear out the rest of the modernists who operate so openly and blatantly.

Our Lakeport CBA Church has hired an architect for their new building across from the high school. They are also protesting a liquor outlet in a huge bowling alley to be erected next to their church. They have \$4100 in cash, have an additional \$3500 pledged toward their new building, in addition to holding title to their property. This is the kind of sacrifice and loyalty of which successful churches are made. Al Kunkel is the pastor.

CHURCH ATTENDANCE A BASIC PRINCIPLE

Church attendance is the basic principle in church life. This we have often emphasized, but it has to be re-emphasized. Fellowship in the church is based on confidence in one another, and confidence is based on an understanding of each other. Thus, you cannot say that whether or not you go to the services is your own business. It is not! It is our business — the business of the church. When you join our fellowship you agree to attend the services unless providentially hindered. That is why it is our business, and that is why the absentee should see that we all understand why he is absent. Repeated absence without any explanation destroys confidence, and this in turn destroys fellowship. We owe it to each other to keep this confidence. Let us be careful to keep our fellowship as a spiritual, loving thing rather than to take pride in "running our own business." Buell H. Kazee in "The Little Baptist".

VISITATION PROGRAM TAKES VACATION

The Pastor was mindful last Tuesday that March 22 marked the 99th anniversary of the birth of one of the greatest leaders in the history of the Christian church. All through this year, until March 22, 1961, Fundamentalists will be celebrating the 100th anniversary of his birth. William Jennings Bryan called him, "America's greatest Christian statesman". In a tribute following his death, on Dec. 5, 1947, Mrs. Riley stated in the Pilot (3-48), "At a faculty meeting held about his couch a short time before, he voiced in no uncertain sound his desires for Northwestern and said, 'Should we waver one iota from the established policy of the schools in militant conservatism for the cause of Christ we would perish'. So forceful was his appeal to all his co-workers that without his request they rose as one to pledge themselves that an unadulterated presentation of gospel truths would forever emanate from the halls of Northwestern. It was a solemn meeting, for all knew their leader was very frail, and all meant it". Dr. Billy Graham stated at his funeral: "Constantly he warned me in his last months of ever compromising one point as far as the gospel, or ever doing that which would dishonor my Lord. And if I remember anything from the life that I knew in the last few months, it was to stand without compromise for the things of Christ and the fundamentals of the faith, because he was the chief and he was the leader of fundamental forces in America for the last two generations. He stood against modernism. He stood against cheap politics. He stood against evolution. He stood against Communism... He was not afraid to rebuke. He was not afraid to reprove when he thought the other man had lowered his principles or had compromised".

A one-week vacation this week, since this is the fifth Thursday, but next week we go full steam ahead! The Minneapolis Fourth Baptist Church had these simple rules for their visitors: 1. Pray concerning each call. 2. Look as neat and attractive as you can. 3. Identify yourself at the door. 4. Get down to business as soon as possible. 5. Show an interest in the person. 6. Be positive aggressive, and enthusiastic. 7. "Sell" your Baptist church. 8. Try to get a definite commitment to attend. 9. Leave literature. 10. Pray with them. 11. MODERNIST CONCEPTION OF A CRANK

Leslie D. Weatherhead, author of 30 books and famed Methodist preacher at London's City Temple, came out with a very recent book "The Manner of the Resurrection" which is filled with unbelief. He can hardly wait in the introduction (p. 13) to get at the cranks: "I have yet to meet the minister of a large church who has not got in his congregation the typical crank. This man believes that Christ may return tomorrow from a heaven in the sky — presumably in Eastern robes, since a blue suit and bowler hat would not fit the preconceived picture — and take the righteous — namely all those who think like the crank — to eternal bliss, consigning the remainder to an ever-blazing hell. Another man believes that every word of the Bible is verbally inspired, though he does not explain which words are so inspired — Hebrew, Greek, Aramaic (the language Jesus spoke), King James' Version in English, the Revised Version, or Revised Standard Version, Dr. Moffat or Mr. J. 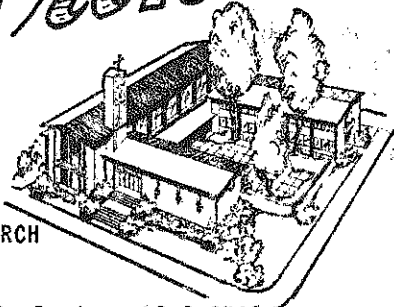

FAREWELL FOR ARGENTINA MISSIONARY JOEL ROMERO AND FAMILY SUNDAY EVENING AT 7 PM

We shall approach Sunday evening with both joy and sorrow as our Church gathers to bid one of our missionaries farewell before leaving for Argentina. Mr. and Mrs. Joel Romero are among the finest Spanish people we have ever met, and surely some of the very best trained ever appointed by the CBFMS. This veteran Spanish speaking evangelist has held many campaigns in Latin countries and will begin his work at once when he lands in South America. He will preach to our people, and then the family will be guests of honor at the Singspiration following. We want every loyal, faithful, and devoted missionary enthusiast to be sure to promote this meeting with everything. We shall receive a missionary offering for the support of these friends at this time.

WHY BAPTISTS DO NOT OBSERVE LENT

Dr. James Hollowood, Executive Secretary of Minnesota Baptist Convention (CBA) and professor at Central Baptist Seminary states; "Baptists are not liturgical people and have definite reasons for omitting the observance of Lent. The first of these is the fact that the resurrection of Jesus Christ is celebrated by Baptists, not only on Easter, but also on the first day of every week. That is why we call Sunday "the Lord's Day". The only possible explanation for worshipping on Sunday instead of Saturday is that Sunday worship is an observance of the resurrection of the Lord! Baptists are more conscious of worshipping a risen and victorious Christ than some others. It would be very difficult for Baptists to enter into the feelings of deprivation, of sorrow, and of remorse which many others seem to dwell upon during Lent. Baptists are too filled with the joy of the knowledge that Christ is arisen, and that He is victorious over death, and sin and the grave.

Second, Baptists believe in an experiential religion rather than a formal or institutional religion. Baptists believe the Christian life should be lived all the time, not just a few weeks of the year. Someone has well said, "If it is wrong during Lent, it is always wrong". Baptists teach and preach against the indulgence of the flesh at all times. The Bible says, "For to be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is life and peace" (Rom. 8:6).

Third, Baptists reject the idea that self-denial which is institutionally enforced can enhance the worthiness of the individual. Popular ideas about Lent suggest that the observance of the Lenten period with self-denial (Cont'd p.2)

MORE ON RED PENETRATION OF ABC BAPTISTS

Because of the repudiation by the largest church in the ABC in Wichita recently due to alleged Communist sympathies by certain ABC and National Council leaders, Dr. Edwin H. Tuller, General Secretary in New York, sent a long eight-page letter of defense on March 24 to all ABC pastors stoutly denying Red penetration, strongly condemning anti-Communist forces, warmly defending Dr. E. T. Dahlberg, (whose more than two dozen front connections are embarrassing) and bitterly attacking and smearing Edgar C. Bundy of Wheaton, Billy James Hargis of Tulsa, Carl McIntire of New Jersey, M. G. Lowman of Cincinnati, and Verne P. Kaub of Madison. Six pages were devoted to smears of these leaders who have produced uncontested court evidence of front connections of ABC leaders as well as NCC officials. Nothing was said of the daily running attack of Fulton Lewis, Jr. over the network against the NCC (KPRC, 5:45 p.m.). The letter shows the deep trouble the ABC is now in and desperate measures to which they are committed.

THE VALUE OF A "COMPLAINT BOOK"

There was once a wise clergyman who kept on his desk a special notebook, which he had labeled, "Complaints of Members". But the book contained nothing but blank pages. When one of his people called to tell him the faults of another, he would say, "Well, I have a complaint book here, and I shall write down the things you say. And when I take the matter up with the official board, I shall tell them of your complaint." The sight of the complaint book and the ready pen had its effect. A Baptist who feels he needs the spiritual experience of observing Lent is probably in need of a revival. Let him observe Lent by placing Christ first in all parts of his life. Then, let him celebrate Easter by promising the Lord to live his Lenten vows, to the glory of Christ, throughout the entire year!

..Our CBFMS missionaries are producing anti-communist tracts by Dr. Fred C. Schwarz in the Congo Swahili language in lots of 100,000. This is late in the day for this. CBFMS leaders there are now painfully aware that this anti-white strife which is forcing the missionary doors closed is inspired scientifically by the Communists.

A card from Wesley Nelson to the former United Evangelistic churches announces that the sunrise speaker this Easter is Dr. Boycé Van Osdel, pastor of the First Baptist Church. The UEC died after the San Francisco Crusade and in its stead an NAE was formed locally. ..Capital punishment is murder, said Bishop Pike, in San Francisco News-Call Bulletin, Mar. 2, 1960. "If we did not have a democratic form of government, we, as individual citizens could wash our hands of the matter, but since we have the privilege of choosing our legislators, then each and everyone of us who is silent about the matter is guilty every time an execution takes place".

..Judge Clifton Matthews, US Circuit Court of Appeals, wrote Dr. Arno Weniger: "I am happy to know that you do not agree with Bishop Pike that capital punishment is murder, and that we who favour capital punishment and oppose its abolition are murderers. Your views, both as to what the Bible teaches on the subject of Capital punishment and as to the deterrent effect of such punishment, are in accord with mine. My belief that capital punishment is a deterrent to crime is based on first-hand observation during 30 years of law practice and as 25 years as a Federal judge".



They have already more than half of this number of persons regularly in the attendance and membership. The pastor is Rev. William Pederson and I have been with them several times conducting short seminars on visitation evangelism and personal witnessing". It works. HISTORICAL OBSERVATION BY A WISE VETERAN

Dr. Sam Bradford, president of Baptist Bible College of Denver, recently stated: "Fundamentalists, Bible believers, high and strong principled ones build. Modernists, liberals and the neos have never builded anything. They must wait until others have builded and then move in to occupy. Their process of 'taking over' follows the same pattern always. Following is the pattern of their infiltration: 1. Institutions are founded by those of high and positive principles. 2. Infiltration is made by those holding weaker or different principles. 3. Appeal for toleration toward the infiltration on the basis of 'Christian love' is made. 4. Infiltrators' protestations of love accepted as sincere. 5. General acceptance of the infiltration as a legitimate opposition party within the movement or institution. 6. Opposition to the infiltration interpreted as lack of 'Christian love'. 7. Substitution of the infiltration position of the movement or institution. 8. Elimination of those holding the original position from leadership and official position in the movement or institution. 9. Complete capture of the movement by the infiltration.

ANNUAL ELECTION LAST WEEK

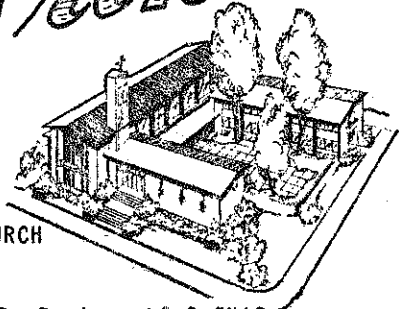





All political propoganda that Catholic leaders believe in separation of Church and State, when they are in the majority is a lie. Monsignor Ryan and Millar in "The State and the Church" (an official text in Catholic universities in US) state on pages 38-39: "But constitutions can be changed, and non-Catholic sects may decline to such a point that the political proscription (outlawing, rejection, condemning -- Ed) of them may become feasible and expedient. What protection would they have against a Catholic state? The latter could logically tolerate only such religious activities as were confined to the members of the dissenting groups. It could not permit them to carry on general propoganda nor accord their organization certain privileges that had formerly been extended to all religious corporations, for example, exemption from taxation ... It is true, indeed, some zealots and bigots will continue to attack the (Roman) church because they fear that some years hence the United States may become overwhelmingly Catholic and may then restrict the freedom of non-Catholic denominations". We want to thank the Catholics for language that could not be plainer in telling us that freedom of religion would be abolished if they came to power, even though limited freedom of worship would be tolerated. There is a vital difference. Evangelism would not be allowed. Before any Baptist votes for a Catholic president, it should be clearly understood that he would not be allowed to obey the Great Commission of Christ under Catholic power.

VICTORY FOR CBA IN ILLINOIS COURTS

In a nine-point decree, the Judge of the Circuit Court of McLean County, Illinois recently ruled against American Baptist Convention forces in their legal attempt to dispossess the Normal First Baptist Church of the church property. This case now ranks with ringing court victories which, CBA churches have won in Algona, Iowa; Pittsburg, Penn; Waupaca, Wisconsin and Fort Collins, Colo. In each instance the ABC elements forced the local churches into the courts. The disgruntled minority in each case was aided and abeted by ABC money and legal help. It is refreshing to note that the civil courts are helping to restore the legality of local church autonomy which the Convention has endeavored to systematically destroy. The full text of the Court decision may be secured from the Conservative Baptist Fellowship in Chicago at 10¢ per copy.

NOTED MODERNIST AT NORTHERN SEMINARY

The annual Wilkinson Lectures at Northern Baptist Seminary were delivered on March 1-2, by Dr. Emlyn Davies, Yorkminster Baptist Church of Toronto. Northern (ABC) still claims some sympathies toward orthodoxy. Dr. Davies wrote the following in the adult lessons of the Canadian Bible Lesson Series, for April 24, 1955, under the title of "What God We Worship?": "Idolotry is far nearer us than we realize. We set up all kinds of objects for reverence; and it is a modern as well as an ancient sin to bow down to our images. The Bible, Church, Creeds, Virgin Mother -- all these and other objects (each and every one of them having a true significance and value in its own place), have been set up in the place of God. We are only too familiar with the painful and sinful consequences of elevating the Book of the Lord above the Lord of the Book ...". Dr. Davies might find this verse interesting -- Psa. 138:2, "For thou hast magnified thy Word above all thy Name". This school, which was once strong for the Faith, will have difficulty even maintaining a facade of orthodoxy with these kind of lecturers.

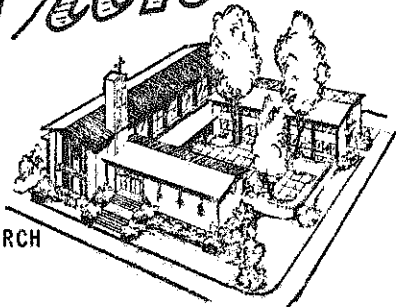

EYE WITNESS ACCOUNT BY A GROUP OF MINISTERS OF SAN FRANCISCO RED RIOTS

(A joint statement by Dr. G. Archer Weniger, of Oakland, Rev. Don Watson of Oakland, Dr. H. Austin of San Francisco, Rev. Robert F. Hakes of Alameda, Dean William G. Bellshaw of the San Francisco Baptist Seminary, Dr. H. O. Van Gilder of the Western Baptist Bible College, and Dr. Arno Weniger of San Francisco.)

More than a dozen ministers were in attendance at the Congressional hearings of the House Un-American Activities Committee in San Francisco on May 12 and 13 in the Supervisors Chambers in the City Hall. What we witnessed was utterly fantastic. The shameful demonstration against law and order and against this duly constituted Committee of the Congress defies description. We sat in the rear of the room on a raised platform where we could easily observe the proceedings, right in the midst of the student demonstrators. We studied the crowd carefully for hours and could easily discern which were the masterminds of the mob riots. It is our certain conviction that this indefensible demonstration against law and order was conceived, planned, and directed by a few hard-core Communist agitators who were carrying out their textbook orders on insurrection with classic success. Leaders of the mob included faculty members and well-known leftist lawyers for the fifth-amendment communists.

We were sitting where we were able to observe the giving of instructions by the riot leaders who had gained access to the room. The "Daily Californian", which was distributed widely at the scene, gave explicit instructions on the front page of the Thursday issue on exactly how to harrass the Committee. They were told to laugh out loud at every incident that appeared to be amusing in order to make the Congressmen look ridiculous. These well-disciplined mobsters laughed on the dotted line and obeyed their masters to the last jeer. We watched a national committeeman for the Party line up a dozen Communists near the railing and throw every sneer, invective, abusive language, vile profanity, and fiendish charge at the Congressmen they could conceive. For nearly fifteen minutes at one point, this lawless crowd of students from the University, together with Party cadres, had the Chambers almost in their control. The students, comprising the rear third of the audience stood up on their seats and yelled, jeered, hissed, and scoffed at the Congressmen. It was almost complete breakdown of law and order. We witnessed more violations of the law in fifteen minutes than we have seen in fifteen years! The only criticisms we have of the police authorities were of allowing this element to make such a mockery out of law and order, without jailing everyone of the leaders.

The height of their devilish hypocrisy was reached when they had the consummate nerve to profane the national anthem by singing it at the peak of their demonstration, and giving expression to their treasonable delight by singing "Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory of the Coming of the Lord". The depth of their deceit was reached when this mob element put their hand over their heart and pledged allegiance to the flag. We shall never forget the hiss and boos that greeted Mr. Arens when he first mentioned the name of God in connection with one who broke from the Party.

We are at a loss to understand how clergymen, such as Bishop James Pike, could give any aid and comfort to this lawless kind of activity by statements deriding the Committee, and by allowing his assistant pastor to address one of their despicable rallies.

We came away from this hearing absolutely convinced of the overwhelming necessity of continuing the House Committee on Un-American Activities. No free agent could view the hearings without being impressed with the fairness, justice, and dedication to a thankless, but positively necessary task. Chairman Edwin Willis was unusually temperate and patient. We have nothing but unbounded admiration for Richard Arens, Committee Counsel, whose skill and understanding of this perilous conspiracy was a blessing to behold. We apologize to these devoted public servants

from Congress for the devilish and deceitful conduct of an infinitesimally small but alarmingly arrogant segment of this area, who are willing to be tools of the Communist conspiracy which would make a shambles out of the liberty which marks this great nation as the land of the free and the home of the brave.

The War Memorial Auditorium in Rochester, N. Y. is the scene of the ABC, June 2-7, 1960. Dr. Chas. R. Bell, Jr. of Pasadena First Baptist is Program Chairman. The nations's eyes will be watching the struggle between the Wichita First Baptist Church and the ABC over the National Council of Churches. The Convention lectures will be given by Dr. Samuel H. Miller, dean of Harvard Divinity School—known for its Unitarianism. Robert H. Beaven, for years president of Baptist Missionary Training School in Chicago and now Chaplain at University of Rochester, is honored with a place on the program for June 7. Dr. Beaven states in his book "In Him Is Life",—Abingdon-Cokesbury Press, pp 125-126: "Christ's uniqueness lay, not in his divine substance, but in the relationship which existed between him and God. God chose Jesus, the human Galilean carpenter, nurtured in the cradle of Jewish religion, to whom he came with his living fellowship, and through whom he introduced such fellowship to men. Jesus was divine because God 'raised' him to a new level of life. But this was not a oneness of substance. Christ's life is an example revealing the kind of life God wills for, and from man; it is not a supernatural act set before us as a miraculous means of salvation... Jesus responded to God, not simply by striving after God's will, but by entering into that fellowship with God which enabled him to surmount reliance upon his own natural powers and find a higher level of life. He and God were one, as he maintained. But this was not a oneness of substance which would deny the distinction between himself and God This was not just another man. It was a man in a fellowship which God had made possible. It was God in a fellowship which man had accepted". This is total rejection of the Deity of our Savior. The ABC is not getting better, but tragically worse. In 1946 the entire Conservative movement branded the ABC as apostate by withdrawing to form a new alignment of churches — the CBA.

Since ecumenical evangelism is one of the most serious examples of such inclusivism, we will assume that the Seminary will not press for such an inclusivistic crusade in Denver, and will instruct their students and faculty in the evils of evangelistic inclusivism. Honesty will require that this announced policy, which is good to attract finances, will be implemented in practice as well.

The Berkeley Daily Gazette of Friday, May 27, 1960 carried this astounding letter from President Hubert M. Dukes, to the Gazette: "At the recent meeting of the Berkeley-Albany Council of Churches, it was unanimously voted to send you this letter of commendation on your agreement not to publish names of persons when they are first called before the Un-American Activities Committee. As you know, a number of people lost their jobs last summer simply because their names appeared in print as having been summoned before the committee. We sincerely appreciate your cooperation, and feel that your stand on this serious matter should be commended". We would like to know of a single non-communist or a single teacher who was in no way connected with this treasonable conspiracy of Communism who lost his job because he was called before the House Un-American Activities Committee. Such ecclesiastical stupidity is inexcusable in light of the current Communist drive among teachers and in teachers' colleges.

PROFESSOR BERNARD NORTHRUP'S CLASS

We were pleased with the large attendance at the Adult League last Sunday at 6 p.m. to hear the first of four studies in the Minor Prophets by the Professor of Old Testament at our San Francisco Baptist Seminary. Brother Northrup is a gifted Bible scholar and highly appreciated by our people. We hope the attendance will double for next Sunday evening. NCC RADIO VOICE OFFERS FALSE GOSPEL

Dr. Ralph Sockman, NCC National radio pulpit minister, was appointed as a member of the General Crusade Committee of the New York Crusade. In his 1960 Easter message which was printed he states: "Let us not torment ourselves with those old-fashioned fiery pictures of endless hell. God is a father; He is just. He punishes, but he always punishes with the purpose of redemption. Therefore, I just cannot reconcile endless punishment with the Heavenly Father revealed by Christ. On the other hand, we cannot just assume that when we die we go into eternal bliss".

ABC HONORS "FATHER" OF SOCIAL
GOSPEL

On Monday evening, June 6, 1960 the American Baptist Convention at War Memorial Auditorium of Rochester, N. Y. paid tribute to Rev. Walter Rauschenbusch with an address first by Howard R. Moody of New York and then an address by Rauschenbusch's personal secretary — the Rev. Dr. Edwin T. Dahlberg, president of the National Council of Churches. No single person is more historically responsible for the present Red penetration of the churches than this Baptist seminary professor at Rochester-Colgate at the turn of the century. In 1957, Dr. H. P. Van Dusen, president of Union Seminary, wrote of him: "the greatest single personal influence on the life and thought of the American church in the last fifty years". Fosdick, in an introduction to a collection of Rauschenbusch's writings states that he "was a socialist". He participated in the founding of the Federal Council of Churches in Philadelphia, Dec. 2-8, 1908. Dr. J. B. Matthews, noted anti-communist authority, wrote in the "American Mercury", July 1953: "A partial explanation of these thousands of clergymen who have collaborated in one way or another with the Communist-front apparatus may be found in the vogue of the 'social gospel' which infected the Protestant theological seminaries more than a generation ago. Many graduates of the 'liberalized' Protestant seminaries abandoned religion altogether in favor of the 'social gospel'. The Rev. Walter Rauschenbusch with his CHRISTIANIZING THE SOCIAL ORDER, and the Rev. Harry F. Ward with his THE NEW SOCIAL ORDER, pioneered the 'social gospel' in the years before World War I, the former a Baptist and the latter a Methodist. In the generation which followed, these two men recruited through their teachings and writings thousands of younger clergymen..." The Apostasy marches on!

...THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH through its subsidiary "order", the Christian Brothers distillery, has on file in federal court in Sacramento a suit to evade payment of \$1,351,193 taxes on huge profits from its wine and brandy distillery at Napa, according to Christian Century of June 8, 1960. The stakes are high in this attempted fraud on the US taxpayer and will mean millions of profits to the Church on such despicable enterprises.

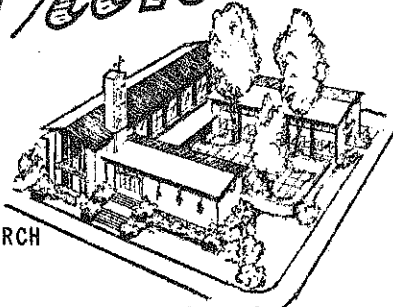

STRANGE BEHAVIOR AT SOUTHERN CONVENTION

The Southern Baptist Convention met in Miami, May 17-20, 1960. One of the main speakers at the Pastor's Conference was Dr. Herbert Gezork, president of the American Baptist Convention. Dr. R.G. Lee spoke at the same conference. Before the main Convention, Dr. Gezork was invited to speak again on Wednesday morning. This paragraph in the Christian Century of June 8, 1960 becomes interesting: "Heresy hunting in the seminaries and colleges of the Southern convention is not news. In 1932, for example, a number of Baptist colleges were tried for heresy. The astuteness and prestige of President William J. McGlothlin of Furman University — one of the oldest and most respected of the Southern Baptist colleges — were tried for heresy. The astuteness and the prestige of President William J. McGlothlin of Furman worked to gain them a temporary reprieve. After Dr. McGlothlin's death, the trial was reopened and a number of professors, including Herbert J. Gezork, now president of the American Baptist Convention and of Andover Newton Theological Seminary, were forced to leave". Andover Newton is not only one of the most liberal of ABC seminaries but considered a hot-bed for training of leftist ministers who help to make up the clergy list of communist front groups and activities. Strange that a SBC heretic of 1932 should become an honored SBC speaker in 1960!

CONGRESSMAN WALTER WRITES THE PASTOR

The Chairman of the House Un-American Activities Committee wrote on June 1 from Washington: "Dear Dr. Weniger, My attention was directed this morning to a copy of "The Blu-Print" which contains a statement attributed to yourself and other ministers respecting the recent hearings by this Committee in San Francisco. 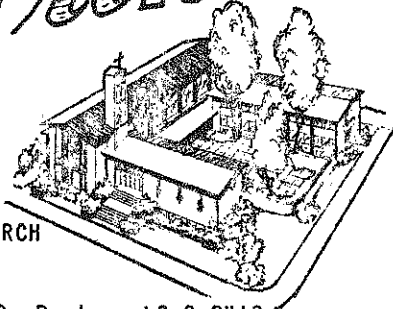

When they drop their offerings in God's offering plates, there is a song in their hearts. Let us not regard giving as a burden hard to bear. Let us give cheerfully, out of the joyous abundance of the heart. Giving can be a most happy experience. Let us remember God FIRST in apportioning our income. He will take care of everything else. — Rev. A. W. Hoogstrate.

..Why One Church's Conscience Spoke Against the National Council of Churches of Christ in the USA" is the pamphlet which may be secured by writing to the church at 325 N. Broadway, Wichita.

..Pope John XXIII formed a special 'advisory board' today to provide official Vatican contact with non-Catholic Christian religions for the first time in more than five centuries with an aim of unification with the Church of Rome" — Tribune, June 4, 1960.

..The blessings of Communist liberation in the US, if the conspiracy succeeds, according to an official publication of the HUAC Committee: If you belong to a church, you must prepare for persecution 2. The Communists would destroy every copy of the Bible they could find. 3. It would be illegal for your children to attend Sunday School. 4. The Communists would indoctrinate your children in atheism. 5. Church weddings, funerals and baptisms would be illegal. 6. Missionary work would be absolutely forbidden".

..ABC General Council strongly defends Dr. E. T. Dahlberg in a resolution adopted March 1, 1960 — "We join once more in our expression of complete confidence in the Christian integrity, the devoted commitment, the dedicated patriotism, and the consecrated leadership of our fellow American Baptist, Dr. Edwin T. Dahlberg, and the outstanding ecumenical colleagues who share with him in Christian purpose and in patience under the persecution brought upon them and American protestant churches". Dr. Dahlberg is under constant fire because of Communist Front support and following the Communist line in his left-wing activities.

..Youth for Christ.. has scheduled Walter Judd, former missionary to China, as one of the main speakers at Winona July 3-17, along with Bob Pierce. Judd is known in Minneapolis fundamentalist circles as a well-known modernist.

..M. G. Lowman of Cincinnati is in Tokyo at present studying the strategy of the Communists in the student riots. He will fly to Boston to give the CBA an eyewitness account of this serious situation.

..Pastor James Nelson of Calvary Baptist Church, Santa Barbara, received a DD from Denver Seminary recently. This honor was well placed.

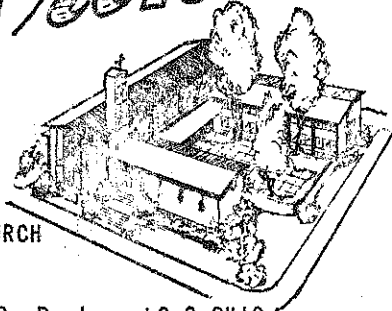

MY CONCEPTION OF PERSONAL VISITATION

With our weekly Visitation Program resuming on Thursday of next week, this note by Robert Lee is helpful: "My conception of this subject is that it does not mean visitation by telephone, by letter by mimeographed circular, or by proxy. These will do some good, but they are the enemies of the best visitation, which is face-to-face visitation. It is obligatory, not merely optional, for Christians to visit people — people not saved to win them to Christ, people saved but indifferent to stir them to activity, people in darkness of ignorance to instruct them, people in sorrow to comfort them, people in sin and shame to rescue them. Though many do not acknowledge the obligation, the obligation rests upon each church worker, deacon, teacher, and member to visit. Shame is it that many who profess to be His followers have never been moved to go in visitation for the welfare of many who are indifferent to spiritual values. My concept of personal visitation is that it should be definitely PERSONAL. And if it is that, it will add many members to our classes, and encourage many to take sweet counsel together and go to the house of God in company. (Psalm 55). Therefore visit — remembering that no matter WHERE you visit, WHEN you visit, no matter WHOM you visit, it is as a visit for Jesus."

those whom God has called to full-time service have a right to expect to be supported through the rest of the people of God (see I Cor. 9:7-14). Notice in this passage that Paul referred to the law of Moses for his authority. The law forbade the muzzling of the working ox, and Paul said that God did not confine His teaching to one people or one age. The Lord had in mind the harvesters of the gospel age and gave the law for our benefit as well as for Palestinian oxen.

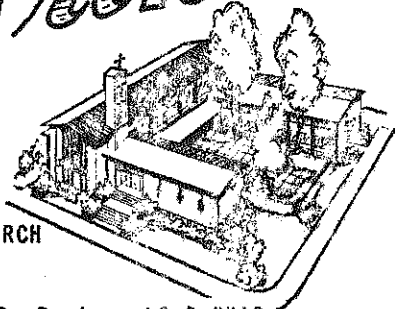

BISHOP TIPPETT APPOINTS ALLEGED RED TO GRACE METHODIST CHURCH IN STOCKTON

One of the biggest news stories of the past week was found in fine print on p. 9 of the Oakland Tribune for Monday, June 20, which told of the appointments for 70 ministers by Bishop Donald H. Tippett. One is Jack R. McMichael who was appointed to Grace Methodist Church in Stockton. In M. G. Lowman's book "2109 Methodist Ministers", Mr. McMichael's front records include 61 activities and connections of public record. We will predict that Stockton will have one of the biggest running battles imaginable between Godly patriotic Americans and front sympathizers over this brazen Red penetration of the churches. Liberal R. L. Roy's book "Apostles of Discord" states on p. 318, "McMichael's involvement in pro-communist activities began before World War II, when he was national chairman of the American Youth Congress — later listed by the United States Attorney General as a Communist-front organization . . . Ward and McMichael have sought to steer the Methodist Federation straight along the narrow Communist Party line. The mass of evidence supporting this fact is so overwhelming that it cannot be fully covered here. These two men have long records of past affiliation with communist fronts. This fact in itself is insufficient to indict them. But both Ward and McMichael continue to bolster communist causes, to address party-line meetings, to sign Kremlin-inspired petitions. Through their control of the Social Questions Bulletin, they seldom permit it to deviate from the Moscow version of "truth". All communist demands are fervently endorsed, from 'Free the Rosenbergs' to 'Stop Germ Warfare'. This may be the free expression of a genuine idealism. But its subtle and consistent pattern of part-truth and part error has involved its adherents in the communist cause". This is some admission by one of his leftist friends. You'll hear more about this Stockton story.

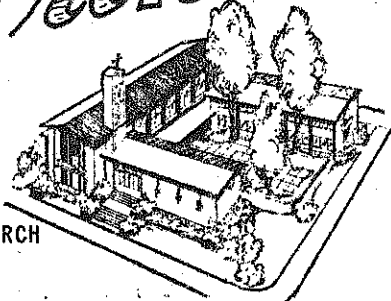

THE SAFETY OF OUR MISSIONARIES

The Pastor telephoned the Chicago-Wheaton headquarters of CEFMS late Sunday night to learn of late news of the welfare of William and Florence Hunter and their children who labor in Goma in the Congo. Dr. Milton Baker, foreign secretary, had tried for two hours Sunday afternoon to establish contact with our missionaries via a Wheaton short wave station but succeeded only in reaching Rhodesia and other nearby stations. He did not anticipate that the Hunters were in immediate danger, even though Sunday dispatches indicated that Goma had been besieged by wild mobs. Belgian paratroopers conducted 200 to safety after clearing the Goma airport runways of oil barrels. Dr. Baker said that the Hunters actually live across the border in Ruanda Urundi under Belgian protectorate. No direct cable communication is possible. Four of our stations have been evacuated. The Simmons had been isolated from the rest of the whites. Limited contact has been made through A.I.M. short wave radio. Dr. Baker promised a telegram in the event of any news. The situation for the other missionaries may be more serious. They are in God's hands.

METHODISM'S FAMOUS LADY THEOLOGIAN

Georgia Harkness, PhD, Litt.D, DD, Professor of Applied Theology at Pacific School of Religion in Berkeley, was announced in the Oakland Tribune of July 5, 1960 as a speaker at the Berkeley First Presbyterian Church (Robt.B. Munger, pastor) on the subject: "World Peace and Freedom". She is listed in M.G.Lowman's book, "2109 Methodist Ministers" with 19 Front connections. In her book, The Modern Revival of Christian Faith, she says on page 26, "About the divinity of Christ it is a prime necessity to have convictions without dogmatism. There is no way to conceive it, and I am not willing to rule Unitarians, or any others who 'profess and call themselves Christians', out of the Christian fold". In her book "Understanding the Christian Faith" she states page 75, "The pre-existence of Christ does not mean that Jesus as a human being lived before Jesus was born. Rather, it means that the divinity in Him is as eternal as God". So is the "divinity" of Miss Harkness. She writes on p. 28, "The authors who wrote the Bible ... were human beings like ourselves and as prone to make mistakes ... Many of their own erroneous ideas naturally got mixed in with the truth that came to them from God".

EX-RED TESTIFIES ON METHODIST MINISTER

Leonard Patterson testified concerning the Stockton Grace Methodist minister before the HUAC Committee, July 7, 1953 and found on p. 128 of U. S. News and World Report for Aug. 7, 1953, "Mr. Kunzig: When you were in the Young Communist League did you ever know one Jack McMichael? Mr. Patterson: Yes. Mr. Kunzig: What position did he hold in the Young Communist League? Mr. Patterson: He was a member of the New York District of the Young Communist League and was a member of the top fraction of the Young Communist League and the Communist Party in the League Against War and Fascism. Also he was a member of the top fraction of the American Youth Congress that was organized around 1934. Mr. Kunzig: You knew him then as one of the leading members of the Young Communist League? Mr. Patterson: Yes. . . . always had lesson prepared, always doing nice things for the class, always urged the class to stay for preaching.

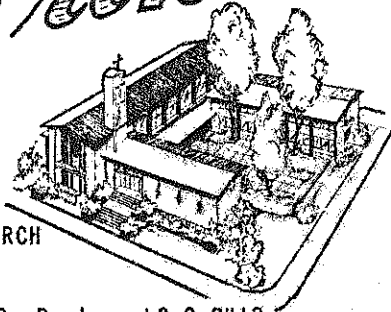

WORD FROM CONGO REPUBLIC

The Pastor again telephoned the Chicago-Wheaton headquarters of CBFMS following the service Sunday evening for late word about the welfare of our missionaries but Dr. Milton Baker, foreign secretary, indicated he had nothing new following his July 12 letter to parents of Congo personnel. No direct word had been received, though indirect contact was made through A.I.M. Mission shortwave radio. Nineteen adults and thirty-two children were safely evacuated from our Mission to Kampala, Uganda. The Simmonds, who were blockaded in Goma from the rest of the whites, are reported safe. Four stations have been evacuated: Kitsombiro, Ndoluma, Snga, and Katwa (with the exception of medical personnel). Dr. Baker felt that the situation would stabilize with riots subsiding and order being restored so that the missionaries could return to their stations. Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Hunter live in Kisenyi in Ruanda-Urundi, even though their work is in Goma, across the border in the Congo. Sunday's news indicated that the U.S. embassy ordered American missionaries out, but Dr. Clyde Taylor in Washington understood that this was only in the Leopoldville area, according to Dr. Baker. The political deterioration with Communists moving in could conceivably close the Congo to the gospel in short order.

BISHOP OXNAM REPUDIATED MCMICHAEL

Rev. Jack R. McMichael, whom Bishop Donald Tippet recently appointed to one of Methodism's influential pulpits in Stockton, was disowned by Bishop Oxnam in his own appearance before the House Committee on July 21, 1953 and reported in full in US News and World Report of August 7, 1953, p. 128 in which the Bishop leaves the distinct impression that McMichael was an organizational and ideological Communist: "REP. VELDE: Bishop, May I interrupt? Why did you attempt to get him out of the organization? (Methodist Federation for Social Action) BISHOP OXNAM: Because frankly I believed that Jack McMichael was so tied up with the Communist group that whether or not he were a Communist, I couldn't prove whether he was a member of the Communist Party or not, but I was sure that that organization ought not to be under that leadership any more, and I did everything I could. Others talked to Mr. McMichael. He denied this completely. Now that raises quite an issue, sir. REP. WALTER: Will you yield at that point? BISHOP OXNAM: Yes. REP. WALTER: What caused you to reach the conclusion that McMichael was a Communist? BISHOP OXNAM: Sir, I hope you will not press that question. I will be glad to state it to this committee if I could meet it in executive session. The source of that information was strictly confidential, and I think I would be betraying a trust if I said it in public. I would be glad to convey it to the chairman of this committee. I am not hedging here at all, but I think I have an obligation because the source was of such a nature — I think the chairman would be the first to recognize this. I will not refer to the source other than that. REP. WALTER: You couldn't make it much plainer.

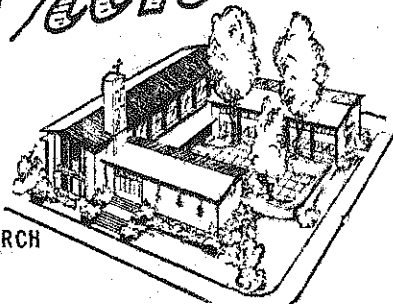

MISSIONARIES JAILED, THEN EVACUATED

While the report last week was that our CEFMS missionaries were safe in Kisenyi, the latest news is that Rev. and Mrs. Wm. F. Hunter and two daughters, Kirsten and Audrey, were jailed by the Congolese soldiers as suspected Belgians. At gun point they were imprisoned, but later released. They were then evacuated to the neighboring state of Uganda. Kirsten is still suffering from shock, according to direct word from Mrs. Hunter to her mother, Mrs. Art Haglund of Sandstone, Minnesota and relayed to the Pastor through Bill's parents in Oakland. A fifth CEFMS station has been evacuated — Kihindu. Of the 65 CEFMS missionaries, probably only eight are still in the Congo. The Hunter's temporary address: Silver Springs Hotel, Kampala, Uganda, c/o CEFMS. Let us write some cheerful letters. Use "Air-letters" — 10¢.

MORE ON THE CEFMS MISSIONARIES

According to a Friday cable the latest location of missionaries are as follows: Simmonds have been advised to leave Goma, probably for Kampala. E.J. Kiles are in Shangugu, Ruanda-Urundi. Bothwells are in Usumburu, Ruanda-Urundi. Kreutters, Handysides, Dr. Paul Hurlburt, Sr. are in Bukavu. All Ruanguba missionaries are in Kampala, Uganda: Burroughs, Beatrice Nelson, Kevorkian, Joann Kile, Donald Nelsons, Pelletiers, Patricia Person, Fresters, Salseths, Charles Trout, Jr. Dr. and Mrs. Trout are at their station a few miles from Ruanguba. Ruth Uhlinger and Marion Trout are out of Congo but no details on destination. Camps and Madsons will arrive New York July 27 on early furlough. Barbara and Marion Slater, Anna Best, and Geneva Burkland have been evacuated to A.I.M. station at Ruwenzori. Drs. Dwight and John Slater are remaining at hospital in Katwa. The Claars cabled last Wednesday "Safe Uganda". Dr. Milton Baker, CEFMS secretary in Wheaton, will telephone us at once of further developments.

EX-RED CITES MINISTER AS COMMUNIST

The sworn testimony of Manning Johnson before the House Un-American Activities Committee on July 8, 1953, in New York City, and available in Oakland Public Library in the thick book "Hearings Regarding Jack R. McMichael", p. 2656, puts the Red label on Bishop Donald Tippett's new minister at Stockton's influential Grace Methodist Church as follows: MR. SCHERER: Mr. Johnson, do you know of any other person who was an officer of the Methodist Federation at any time who was a member of the Communist Party? MR. JOHNSON: Yes, the Reverend Jack McMichael was a member of the Methodist Federation. MR. SCHERER: Did you say Reverend McMichael? MR. JOHNSON: I understand that he did attend and graduate from divinity school. MR. SCHERER: What was his connection with the Methodist Federation? MR. JOHNSON: He was executive secretary of the Methodist Federation for Social Action up until 1953. MR. KUNZIG: I note you say "Methodist Federation for Social Action", whereas a moment ago you were referring to it as the "Federation for Social Service". Could you clarify that point and explain just what those two organizations were? MR. JOHNSON: They are one and the same organization. It is just a change of names. It was first called the Methodist Federation for Social Service, and later changed its name to the Methodist Federation for Social Action. MR. SCHERER: How did you know that Reverend McMichael was a Communist? MR. JOHNSON: Well, during the period that I was member of the Communist Party, during the thirties, Jack McMichael was a member of the national committee of the Young Communist League, and he was also a member of the Communist Party, and from time to time he met with the now fugitive Communist, Gilbert Green, who was head of the Young Communist League at that time, and he attended occasionally meetings of the national committee of the Communist Party with Gilbert Green. MR. SCHERER: Was Reverend McMichael still a member of the Communist Party when you left the party? MR. JOHNSON: Yes, he was."

..The Regular Baptists received 54 churches into their fellowship at their 29th annual meeting at Long Beach June 20-25, making a total affiliation of 934.

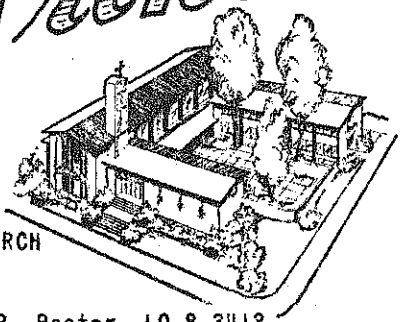

DIRECT REPORT FROM CONGO MISSIONARIES
TELL OF ARREST AND ESCAPE TO UGANDA

On Monday the Pastor received the first word from our own CBFMS missionaries in the Congo, William and Florence Hunter of Oakland. It was dated July 25 from Kampala, Uganda. The letter reads: "Dear Folks at Foothill: I will take this opportunity to write all of you at one time. I'm still a little dazed by the past days and events that I wonder if I can write a decent letter. We made two escapes since the night of the army revolt. On the 8th of July at 9:30 we "flew low" in the Peugeot station wagon across the border. Missed the black soldiers twice that night by the skin of our teeth. We stayed out of the city for three days then. On the 11th we went back to our home and found that we were one of a very few who were willing to stick around. The entire week was a tense time for us. We kept asking the Lord what to do — stay or go. On the 17th (Sunday) we had our sign to go. When the Belgian troopers landed to take over the town (Goma) we were at the Child Evangelism couple's home near the Police Department. We realized the terrible commotion the Belgian paratroopers caused and so decided to go back to our own home. When we got into the car a gang of Africans ran up to the Police Station and reported that two black soldiers had been killed. Life for a life you know. So we were the first whites they saw and they stopped us from going home. They ordered Bill out of the car and Bill said, "We are missionaries". They said, "What does that mean. Get out of the car, we want your car". So they pulled Bill out and then pulled the girls and me out, and we were told to march by about twelve soldiers and police, who by that time were acting like savages. Bill was shoved head first down the stairs and then the girls and I went down the same stairs and we were all locked up. Finally, Mr. Lee (Child Evangelism missionary) convinced the police that he was an American by getting his Identification Card out of his pocket. He also said that we were Americans too. That seemed to be the magic word and we were finally let out of jail unharmed. Our car was still in the street as we left it. The girls were hysterical — so was I. Bill looked like a ghost. (Cont'd p. 2)

THE WEATHER OVER IN STOCKTON

Pastor Edwin M. Conn, of 1135 Stockton Street, Stockton 3, California, is pastor of the Bible Methodist Church, a separatist body. We have before us a document by Brother Conn which was given to the press, but not printed. It points out that Bishop Tippet of San Francisco appointed Jack R. McMichael as Pastor of Grace Methodist Church on June 19. The next day the "Stockton Record" carried his picture and the information relative to his background. "In the same edition of the 'Stockton Record' appeared the action of the 112th Annual Northern California - Nevada Methodist Conference in adopting a resolution urging the 'Abolition of the House Un-American Activities Committee and the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee'. It appears that there is some reason for their action." Brother Conn reported that on Sunday, June 26, the Methodist District Supt. Charles Lord and Jack McMichael called on Mr. Conn because they were aroused by a factual statement sent throughout the city and also a statement made by him at the 11 a.m. service that a communist had been appointed to the Grace Methodist Church. Mr. Conn states, "The people of Stockton, the churches of Stockton, and the pastors of Stockton have been placed in an embarrassing position by the Methodist Church in appointing this communist of long standing to a pulpit in the city. As a communist in the pulpit, a man is a 'wolf in sheep's clothing' according to the Bible, and has come to divide and scatter the sheep — in the church and in the city of Stockton". IF THE PRESSURE OF PUBLIC OPINION cannot force Bishop Tippet to retire this minister from the pulpit, then we believe that not only will our grandchildren live under Communism, as Mr. K. said, but we'll go one better and say our own children will live under it. The Stockton Record has suppressed all public information to this point. We understand that the editor is a leading official of this church.

BISHOP PARSONS DEAD AT 92 YEARS

Often referred to as the "Red Dean of the West Coast", Edward L. Parsons, retired episcopal bishop of California, died July 18 in San Francisco. Bishop James Pike had his funeral on Thursday at Grace Cathedral on Nob Hill. Ten pages are required to list his Communist Front connections in M.G. Lowman's book "1411 Protestant Episcopal Rectors". His known front activities totalled more than 110 up to 1955. The same book lists 22 articles in the Communist "Daily Worker" in which he figured prominently. One could not exactly describe him as a follower of left-wing activities, since he was a sponsor of no less than 36 front activities, according to Mr. Lowman's book. The press described him as a "champion of civil rights", but actually these front connections seem to make him a champion of a Red conspiracy which would deprive Americans of every civil right.

DIRECT REPORT FROM CONGO (CONT'D)

Then we were put under house arrest by a Political party secretary. Sounds like the political parties are pulling the police strings. He only let us out of prison because he couldn't stand to see the girls crying. We had been told time after time by our African Christian friends: "Don't run; the army and police and civilians will never touch a missionary, so we trusted them". What's the future? Do we go back to play missionaries. Or do we go back to the States and start all over again? Right now, I still feel I can't go back and force the girls into an unstable situation. We covet your prayers for the Lord's will in our lives and also for the field. Oh, some of the things that have happened all over Congo and the more evacuation it is unbelievable. Excitement — we have had it. We are now in Kampala Uganda, waiting. I have a lot more to say but no room and it's time for bed".

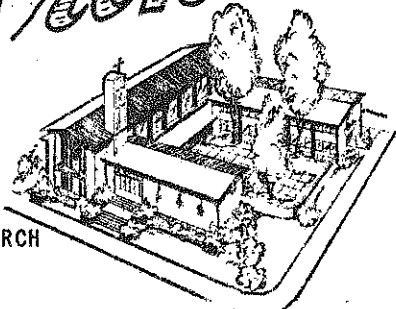

GITLOW'S TESTIMONY OF STOCKTON MINISTER

Benjamin Gitlow, charter member of the Communist Party in the US in 1919 and its candidate for the vice-presidency of the US in 1924, stated that Jack R. McMichael was a Communist in sworn testimony in New York in July 1953 and contained in the House Un-American Activities Committee book, "Investigation of Communist Activities in the New York City Area". His testimony under oath is contained on pages 2084-85: "The inner hard core of the Methodist Federation consisted, up to the time Jack R. McMichael, a member and leader of the Young Communist League, was elected its executive secretary, after Dr. Ward had relinquished his post, of a communist cell headed by Ward, which functioned under the direction of the Communist Party ...

Mr. Kunzig: What were the connections between the Methodist Federation for Social Action and the two-communist front organizations you mentioned that played such an important role in the Communist infiltration of religion? Mr. Gitlow: In the first place the Methodist Federation for Social Action was affiliated with and collaborated closely with the American League Against War and Fascism, and the American League for Peace and Democracy, and the American Youth Congress. Mr. Gitlow: "The principal individuals involved in the Communist conspiracy to subvert the Methodist Church for Communist purposes are: Dr. Harry F. Ward, Rev. Jack R. McMichael, Rev. Charles C. Webber, Rev. Alson J. Smith, Dr. Willard Uphaus, Margareth Forsyth, Rev. Lee H. Ball ... Mr. Kunzig: What organization, in your opinion, played a most important part in the Communist infiltration of religion?" Mr. Gitlow: In my opinion the Methodist Federation for Social Action . . ."

NEAR RIOT IN FILM-SHOWING IN CHURCH

The San Francisco Sunday Examiner carried this front page news — "Pandemonium broke loose at a preview of a House Un-American Activities Committee film of the City Hall riot last night at the First Baptist Church at Market and Octavia Sts. Jeers, hisses, and catcalls threatened to drown the film's commentary half way through the 45 minute showing". Monday's Examiner said, "The minister said the audience contained 20 or 30 of the actual participants in last May's demonstration during the committee's hearings ... Doctor Nims said most of the jeering and booing came from persons who came to see films of themselves being hauled away by police at City Hall ... Nims said he plans to show the film again and added that it will be open to all. The minister said the movie supports the statement of FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover that the rioting was Communist led and inspired". The audience consisted of about 400 persons equally divided in sympathies between the Red rioters and the Un-American Activities Committee.

NEW BAPTIST FAITH MISSION SOCIETY

The South Carolina "Bible Trumpet" for August stated, "New Baptist Faith Mission organization launched ... Many Baptist people are becoming weary with supporting stocks and bonds for mission work. This is proven by the recent organization of Baptist International Missions, Inc., in the city of Chattanooga, Tennessee on this last June 28th. The offices of the mission will be established in Chattanooga, Tennessee". They are taking over the work of the Congo Gospel Mission at once and enlarging it to a world-wide ministry". 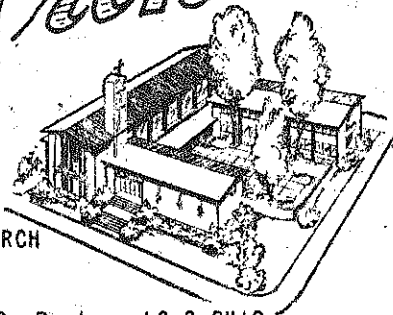

THE EVIDENCE CONTINUES TO MOUNT

I Peter 4:17 states: "For the time is come that judgment must begin at the house of God". Dr. J. B. Matthews, who has been executive director of the Senate Internal Sub-committee for years, wrote in the American Mercury, July 1953: "Outside the known leadership of the Communist Party of the United States, the five top pro-Soviet propogandists in this country are all Protestant clergymen. Their names and positions are as follows — the Rev. Harry F. Ward, Professor Emeritus of Union Theological Seminary ... the Rev. Jack R. McMichael, Executive Secretary of the Methodist Federation for Social Action". The others — Kenneth Ripley Forbes, Willard Uphaus, and Joseph P. Fletcher. Matthew further states: "It would be hard to find two more effective pro-Soviet propogandists in the United States than Ward and McMichael". We wonder how long it will take the Methodists to get around to retiring an identified Communist from the ministry, as the Presbyterians unfrocked Claude C. Williams, McMichael's Communist friend, who was director of the People's Institute of Applied Religion. Bishop Tippet of San Francisco appointed McMichael on June 20 as pastor of Stockton's Grace Methodist Church while in possession of all this mounting evidence.

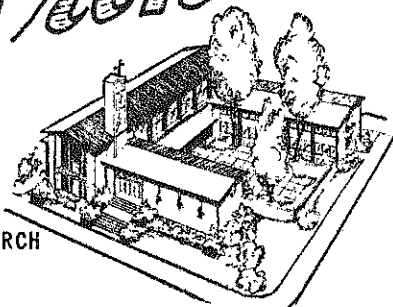

FOOTHILL MEMBER BECOMES COLLEGE PRESIDENT

Dr. Fred C. Zarfes wrote the Pastor on August 16 that the Board of Directors of Winnipeg Bible Institute and College of Theology were unanimous in extending a call to him to become president. He has accepted and will be in Winnipeg for school opening on Sept. 25. "It is the only Bible College in Western Canada that holds a government charter giving them legal status to confer the degree of Bachelor of Theology and honorary degrees". Equipped with splendid buildings the school can now accommodate 125 students in dormitories. Mrs. Zarfes will head the department of music. This looks like the crowning achievement of an outstanding ministry. Our Church congratulates Dr. Zarfes and trusts that very close relations will exist between this school and our Seminary.

CATHOLIC PAPER'S SAD ANNOUNCEMENT

The "Lone Star Catholic" for Aug. 7, 1960 had a two-column article with the headline — "Library Transfer to End Church State Difficulty", stating that "The \$2.5 million Sutro Library will be moved to new quarters on the University of San Francisco campus next month, ending a controversy in which the Church - State issue was raised". Judge Gerald M. Desmond ruled in Sacramento last month that the transfer is entirely legal. "The University will provide 13,000 square feet of space in its Gleason Library. It will pay the \$100,000 cost of fitting out the space, sealing it off from the rest of the building and providing a separate entrance. The state will pay one dollar per year on a 20-year lease. A board of professional librarians, appointed in May 1959 by Gov. Edmund G. (Pat) Brown of California, to evaluate proposed sites for the Sutro Library, agreed unanimously that the University of San Francisco's offer was the most suitable". This is a clear violation of the doctrine of separation of church and state, in the minds of nearly every thinking Baptist. The Pastor is expected to be among a delegation of Baptist ministers who will visit this Jesuit University in protest.

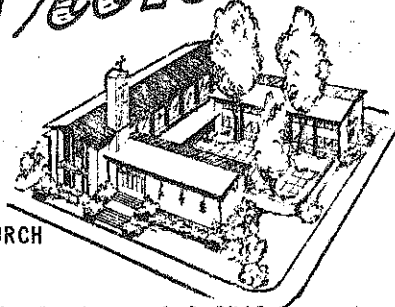

CBA AFFIRMATION OF SEPARATIST POSITION

On June 28, 1960 in Boston the messengers of the Conservative Baptist Association unanimously passed the following resolution, evidently to the chagrine of some of our separatist friends in other groups: "Whereas, The growth and development of the Conservative Baptist movement has evidenced the blessing of God; and Whereas, This development was initially based upon the God-directed position of Biblical separation unmixed with liberalism, unbelief, and inclusivism; and Whereas, We are aware that initial desires and purposes may become obscure in time or influenced by trends of theological change; therefore, 1. Resolved, That we, Conservative Baptists in annual session in Boston, June 23-28, 1960, acknowledge with grateful hearts our avowed position as outlined by the founding fathers of our movement, with relation to liberalism, unbelief, and inclusivism 2. Resolved, That we reaffirm these basic historical principles and the separatistic position thus emphasized and announced by our historical documents, such as the Preamble to the Constitution of the Conservative Baptist Association of America. (Adopted Unanimously)

THE TEST OF A GENUINE CONVERSION

The pastor in this instance asked the Lord for a sign that would give assurance to the father's Christian son. Twenty-four hours after the deathbed conversion, the pastor returned to the bedside. Before the young Christian had received a verse of Scripture, a word of prayer, or five minutes of visitation from the pastor, he pulled from his pajama pocket paper→

ANOTHER BISHOP TURNS HIS BACK ON JACK

Bishop Donald Tippet appointed Jack R. McMichael as pastor of Stockton Grace Methodist on June 20, 1960. Bishop Oxnam repudiated him publicly in 1953 before the House Un-American Activities Committee. Bishop Edgar A. Love, an able leader among Negro Methodists, announced his resignation on May 7, 1953 as President of the Methodist Federation for Social Action (of which McMichael was executive secretary) with these words: "I have felt for a long time that the Federation could not regain its prestige and power as a militant and aggressive organization for social justice under the leadership of Jack McMichael." "Apostles of Discord", Roy, Deacon Press, p. 323. McMichael has been identified as a Communist by several Ex-Red national Communist party leaders. Bishop Tippet laughs at the mountains of evidence.

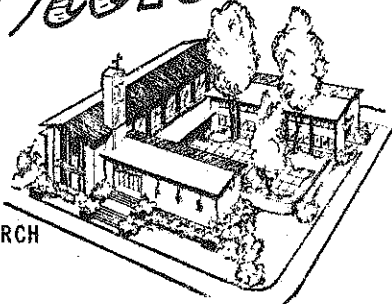

..Hume Lake Conference speaker for next year is Dr. Fred Brown, which insures another top program.

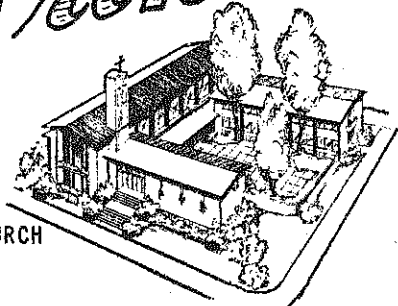

The Pastor, who was one of a score of ministers as eye-witnesses at the May 12-14 hearings, will introduce the film and also bring a brief message. It is a 40-minute documentary which you will never forget.

HOW KENNEDY ACTED UNDER R. C. PRESSURE

Dr. J. Harold Smith in radio address "Big John and Little John" (Box 13033, Dallas 20, Texas) — "During World War II, the USS Dorchester went down at sea under enemy attack! On that ship were four chaplains. As the ship went down these four men joined arms in prayer and although either one could have saved himself at the expense of others, they chose to die that others might live. Two were Protestants, one Jewish, and one a Catholic. Clark Poling, son of Dr. Daniel A. Poling, was one of the Protestant Chaplains. Dr. Poling began a campaign to build a memorial in Philadelphia called the Chapel of Four Chaplains. The campaign was a success and a banquet was to be held marking the end of the drive for the needed funds. The banquet was held in the Bellvue-Stratford Hotel in Philadelphia. United States Senator Herbert H. Lehman spoke for his own Jewish faith; the mayor of Cincinnati, Charles P. Taft, spoke for the Protestants; and Congressman John Kennedy of Massachusetts was invited to speak for the Roman Catholics. Mr. Kennedy accepted the invitation. DEVELOPMENTS OVER IN THE VALLEY

On Aug. 26 a thick envelope was mailed from Cincinnati by Circuit Riders, Inc. to 77 officers of Grace Methodist Church in Stockton, containing along with many enclosures, a letter with this paragraph: "The appointment of Jack R. McMichael to Grace Methodist Church, Stockton, California by Bishop Tippet, shocked security investigators in federal and state governments, as well as many private experts on pro-communist and communist records". This past week the Circuit Riders sent a large printed sheet containing a list of 61 Front activities connected with McMichael, together with the citations of 21 of these organizations from the U.S. Attorney General's office, together with a reproduction of a Communist Daily Worker sheet favorably reporting Mr. McMichael. This mailing went to 97 Grace Methodist Church leaders in addition to all priests, ministers, rabbis, and other civic leaders of Stockton. If Stockton has any Americans there is bound to be some action.

He served very acceptably for one year on the visiting lecturership of the San Francisco Seminary at the invitation of Dr. John R. Dunkin.

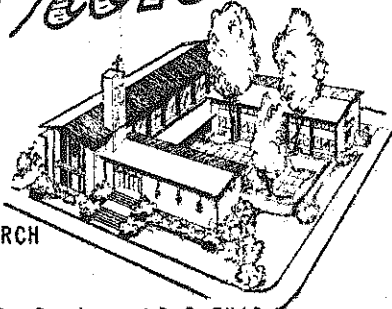

MR. KENNEDY OFFERS TO RESIGN

The San Francisco News Call-Bulletin of Sept. 13, 1960 quoted Mr. Kennedy from Houston to 600 protestant ministers: "But if the time should ever come — and I do not concede any conflict to be even remotely possible — when my office would require me to either violate my conscience or violate the national interest, then I would resign my office". We propose that Mr. Kennedy resign his candidacy if he thinks that no "conflict to be even remotely possible" between one committed to the support of the U.S. Constitution under oath and one who is at the same time committed totally, completely, and unreservedly to the Pope of Rome. In the Manual of Christian Doctrine, published by the Brothers of the Christian Schools, we read on p. 8, "What then is the principle obligation of heads of states? Their principal obligation is to practice the Catholic religion themselves, and, as they are in power, to protect and defend it". Jesuit leader J. C. Sasia, in Christian Apologetics, II, 517, "In cases of conflict, that is to say, when in mixed questions, the two authorities impose upon their subjects, who are the same persons, contradictory obligations, the power of the Church should prevail over that of the state". The Vatican daily "L'Osservatore Romano" of May 18, 1960 said, "A Catholic can never depart from the teachings and directives of the Church. In every sector of his activity, his conduct, both private and public, must be motivated by the laws, orientation, and instructions of the hierarchy". Dan Poling states in his biography, "Mine Eyes Have Seen" — "Mr. Kennedy telephoned me from Washington and said he would have to cancel his appearance. His Eminence Dennis Cardinal Dougherty of Philadelphia had requested him not to speak at the banquet and not to appear. The congressman's distress was evident as he relayed this information ... His speech was prepared, he said, and he would gladly forward it to me, but AS A LOYAL SON OF THE CHURCH, he had no alternative but not to come". HOW CAN A BAPTIST VOTE FOR A LOYAL SON OF THE ROMAN CHURCH who has already demonstrated that he is controlled by the hierarchy? Jesus said, "No man can serve two masters". Matt. 6:24. ..It is idle to commend the truth we do not obey.

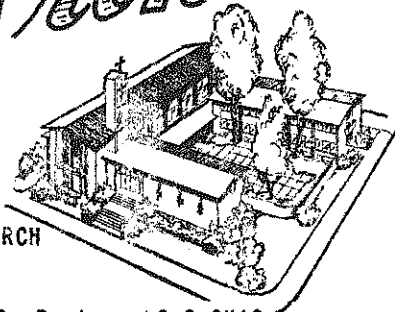

THE SAD DRIFT IN ANOTHER INSTITUTION

We are astounded to learn that Bethel College and Seminary in St. Paul, the sole educational institution of the Baptist General Conference (Swedish), would schedule Dr. Martin Luther King on Dec. 1 and then Dr. Luther A. Weigle as speaker on Jan. 12, 1961. Dr. Weigle was chairman of the RSV translation committee as well as a former president of the liberal Federal Council of Churches in 1942. Dr. King, a brilliant Negro, is not only regarded as one of the most liberal graduates of Crozer Seminary, but one who has lent his name and influence to Communist front causes. Dr. Weigle is identified with the following pro-Communist fronts, according to the ACCC folder "How Red is the NCC?"; Committee on Militarism in Education; Coordinating Committee to Lift the Spanish Embargo; National Religion and Labor Foundation; North American Committee to Aid Spanish Democracy; Signer of "World Tomorrow" poll; War Resister's League. The pledge for enrollment in the Resister's League: "I declare it to be my intention never to take part in war, offensive or defensive, international or civil, whether it be by bearing arms, making or handling munitions, voluntarily subscribing to war loans, or using my labor for the purpose of setting others free for war service". We wonder how the fundamentalists in the General Conference will take this evidence of penetration of pacifism, socialism, modernism, and subversion in their cherished institution. Here is brazen open evidence of a drift in Bethel which many Christian leaders have been privately lamenting. Pray for a cancellation of these two speakers.

"WHERE THIEVES BREAK THROUGH AND STEAL"

Jewels worth \$500,000 are reported to have been stolen from Sophia Loren, an Italian actress. They were taken from her rented chalet near London, England, during the first week of June. The loss of the jewels meant more to Sophia than the cash involved. They served as a symbol of her rise to success and a guarantee that she would never again return to the poverty of the Puzzuoli slum from which she came. Time magazine for June 13 reports her as wailing: "It is so unjust. My jewels meant so much to me. They were a diary of my success, each one a milestone. TRUE PICTURE OF THE CHURCH IN RUSSIA

When we saw the cover picture of Dr. Oswald Hoffman of the Lutheran Hour with Jakov Zhidkov, defending and promoting the Baptist communist agent as a flame of fire behind the iron curtain, we were reminded of Dr. R. G. Lee's true statement in the Baptist Journal, "Christ for the World", June 1960 describing what the Communists had done to the Christians in Russia: "The churches in Russia were burned or turned into amusement centers or museums, and hundreds of thousands of churches liquidated until Russia was literally turned into a human slaughter house. There, Christians were dragged from their beds and sliced to pieces bit by bit or branded with hot irons, even poking out their eyes to produce untold pain. 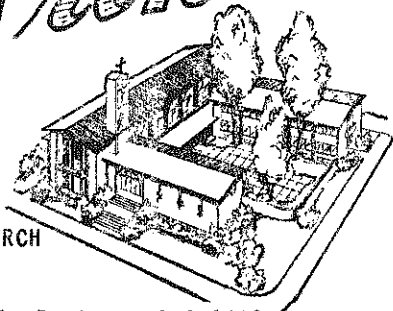

One owes ten thousand times as much to God as to any man. If giving be put on the basis of debt, God gets the first and largest portion of every man's income. Our debt to God comes first, not last.

LET'S BELIEVE THE OFFICIAL CATHOLIC WORD

DONALD GREY BARNHOUSE ON REDS IN NCC

The September issue of Eternity features an extensive article by the editor on "Communism and the National Council of Churches" which is an unbelievable white-wash by the NCC TV preacher. It is called "An impartial investigation of charges made by the controversial Air Force manual". He concludes: "If we are asked what is our attitude personally towards the National Council of churches, we would say that we are willing to work towards common goals for the proclamation of the gospel and the total witness of the church. We will work with anyone in or out of any denomination who confesses Jesus Christ as God and Savior and accepts His vicarious atonement and bodily resurrection. This we hold to be the irreducible minimum of historic Christian doctrine". In answer to this incredible article, we produce the testimony of a tremendous opponent of theological subversion of other days — Donald Grey Barnhouse, who stated in the Bible Expositor and Illuminator (4-49, p. 252): "The modernist-controlled Federal Council of Churches will continue to cry peace, peace, when there is no peace, and is thereby the most subtly dangerous force in America. We do not say the most dangerous, but the most subtly dangerous ... If either of the more dangerous forces takes over in this country, it will be because of this psychological vernol which is being administered from so many pulpits". on Page 452 he states "Again the writer would be totally opposed to the Federal Council of Churches because of their known affiliation with those who deny the great fundamentals of the Christian faith. He opposes them primarily on doctrinal grounds. He also opposes them because some of their most outstanding leaders have been fellow-travelers with the Communists". Dr. Barnhouse's penetrating analysis of every aspect of the Council continues in Revelation, Feb. 1933 in an editorial, "Tens of thousands of dollars are thus spent in directions which are far more communistic than Christian ... Its past presidents include men noted for positions radical in politics and anti-Christian in faith. Of this we have documentary proof". He calls for action in an editorial in Revelation, January 1949, "We have long held that it is necessary for (Cont'd p.2)

STUDENT RIOT FILM CONTINUES LOCAL STIR

The frightening film "Operation Abolition", which can be secured from the San Francisco Seminary (PR 6-8082) at \$20.00 a showing, is still one of the hottest issues in California. A friend gave the Seminary a second copy of the film. Producers of the film told the Pastor via long distance from Washington, D.C. on Friday that over 356 copies had been sold throughout the United States and that it was one of the hottest issues back there. The film, which continues to be shown to packed audiences, has become one of the most strategic hammer blows ever struck against the Communist conspiracy in this country. Friday's Tribune revealed that one of the arrested student rioters, Jane O'Grady, lost her \$2,250 Core Foundation scholarship, which was training her for a public service career. Last Wednesday the Berkeley Elks Club had a jammed crowd of 200 see the film, bringing sharp criticism of the riots from prominent citizens, in sharp contrast to UC Campus showing of the film the previous Friday night when 800 students jeered and booed at mention of J. Edgar Hoover's and Congressman Francis E. Walter's name. The Berkeley Gazette of Oct. 6 said, "Strongest criticism of the student demonstrations came from Gen. William Dean, who was a prisoner of the Communists in Korea for about three years. He told the audience it was fortunate that the thousands of American men who died in Korea and were buried on foreign soil did not have to see the student demonstrations". Co. Supervisor Kent Pursell said, "To me it is inconceivable that any real American justly proud of his heritage or as justly proud of his decision to become a naturalized American citizen can feel anything but the deepest concern after viewing these pictures. Words, regardless of their source, cannot express as do these pictures, the mockery these rioters would make of patriotism or any denunciation of communism. It is true that some participants in the San Francisco riots are to be pitied for being so uninformed as to follow the mobs. However, the leaders, visible and otherwise, are a real menace and should be so exposed".

Christians to be out of the Federal Council because of their doctrinal modernism of that body. We now believe that it is necessary for Americans to be out of it because of its political radicalism...the Federal Council is as leftist as Henry Wallace and much more dangerous. The only way to hit them is in the pocketbook". We think he shows rare perception in the Revelation of Jan. 1931, when speaking of the Council, "When an official of the latter organization will come out and say, as happened recently, that the church of Jesus Christ should not insult other races by taking the message of the Cross to them, we cannot characterize it by any other name than ecclesiastical harlotry". Practically every statement by Dr. Barnhouse in defense of the NCC against charges of red penetration and radical modernism can be answered by a certain Dr. Barnhouse in the days when he had spiritual discernment. Was he right then or now? Did he tell the truth then or now? The FCC simply changed its name to the NCC, but it has essentially the same character. Will these conflicting statements by the NCC - TV preacher cause Bible-believing people in America to conclude that Dr. Barnhouse is, in his own words, "the most subtly dangerous force in America" in his defense of the false prophets?

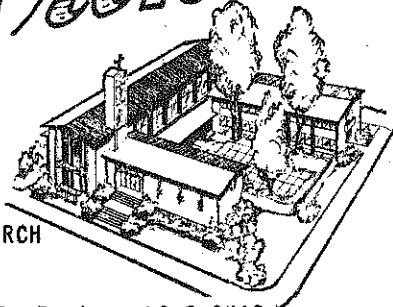

FULLER SEMINARY PROFESSOR SPEAKS ON PROTESTANT - ROMAN CATHOLIC UNITY

Edward John Carnell, professor of Apologetics at Fuller Seminary, in Christianity Today, Oct. 10, 1960 states on page 30: "The Roman claim to infallibility precludes the possibility of unity through gestures of mutual repentance. But this grim fact should not prejudice the value of sincere exploratory conversation. A more perfect understanding of the issues will bring sweeter attitudes into what is and will remain a tragic division in the body of Christ". We do not know whether this incredible statement is a reflection more on Fuller Seminary or on their distinguished professor. Baptist eyebrows will certainly be raised by this declaration which suggests several questions: Are we to conclude that the professor regards Roman Catholicism as a part of "the body of Christ"? Are we to regard those Reformers as wicked men because they broke away from Rome? How do those despised Baptists who were separate from both Rome and the Reformation fare in the Church history courses at Fuller Seminary? Is there any difference between suggesting "conversation" with Rome in the light of "this grim fact", and the cowardly neutral clamor for another summit conference with the Soviet Butcher in the light of multiplied grim cold war facts? In the light of this professed abandonment of Fundamentalism and his pilgrimage through neo-evangelicalism into liberalism, is it reasonable to expect that this scholar is getting ready for unilateral repentance, to wind up in the same place as Cardinal Newman — in the comforting refuge of totalitarian ecclesiasticism? Is this statement the logical extension of the New Evangelicalist determination to continue the dialogue with liberals on doctrine, with Pentecostals on the Holy Spirit and with the cults on a view to a wider fellowship? Is this a sample of the views which can be expected as a part of the "academic freedom" which is imposed as a result of Fuller's AATS accreditation? Surely he has read his Presbyterian Westminster Confession which reads: "There is no other head of the Church but the Lord Jesus Christ. Neither can the Pope of Rome in any sense be the head thereof; but is that anti-Christ, (Cont'd p. 2)

LOCAL POLICE NOT EXPECTED TO INTERFERE WITH BELIEVER'S BAPTISM SUNDAY EVENING

Several believers in Christ will voluntarily express their obedience to the Lordship of Christ this Sunday evening at 7 p.m. when our Pastor will administer the Ordinance of Baptism by burial in the water. These believers have responded with an open confession signifying a desire for baptism. We do not anticipate persecution from civil authorities as we baptize them. It was not always that way and may not be again, but when Henry VIII became supreme head of the English Church, he issued a proclamation against the Baptists. Those who rebaptized themselves were warned that they must depart from England within twelve days, or if caught, to suffer the pains of death. J. C. Carlile in "Story of the English Baptists" (Clark, London, 1905) states: "Before him (The King's Chancellor) was brought a barrister, James Bainham. He was charged with heresy. He denied that water could save the soul of a little child. His poor body was stretched on the rack until every limb was loose. In stocks by day and damp cell by night, his courage did not fail. He was whipped until the blood flowed, but no word of recantation came from him. On an April morning in 1511 a crowd gathered at Smithfield and saw faggots laid and lit around James Bainham, but they did not see the martyr spirit ascend in a chariot of flame".

BILLY GRAHAM COMING TO S.F. DEC. 4

The noted evangelist announced recently in his new paper that his schedule included an address on Dec. 4 in San Francisco. We checked with the Council of Churches office there and found that Dr. Graham will address the National Council of Churches Division of "United Church Men" at Bishop Pike's Grace Cathedral at 3 p.m. This will be the "kick off" for the triennial General Assembly of the NCC Dec. 4-9. Bible-believing groups will be grieved to know that he is lending an evangelical respectability to a group which has betrayed every major doctrine of the Christian Faith and which constitutes one of the most serious movements of subversion in the U.S. Other speakers for the NCC include Bishop Oxnam, Dr. Edwin T. Dahlberg, Luther Youngdal, with Bishop Pike, Pres. H. P. Van Dusen of Union Seminary and others on the program. Dr. Graham addressed the World Council of Churches recently in Switzerland.

"IT IS TOO MUCH FOR THE POOR TO GIVE"

Are we to deny the blessing of Christian stewardship to those who have little money? Jesus did not. He commended Mary of Bethany (Jn. 12:7,8) and the poor widow (Mk. 12:42-44) who gave what men thought to be far beyond their abilities. Who complains about the tithe being too hard on the poor? Usually it is not the poor themselves but some other person who is trying to build a smoke screen behind which to hide his own covetousness. The poor who have tried the tithe testify "It does not cost, it pays!" No poor man ever complained of the tithe, except he had covetousness in his heart. No man of moderate or larger means ever complained of the tithe if he had the right understanding of the grace of giving and a willingness to do his part. God does not want his kingdom supported by the rich alone or the poor alone, but by all his children, rich and poor alike. And to them he promises his blessings for faithfulness. Someone has said, "Only the poor should tithe." Both rich and poor should begin with the tithe and go beyond it. The tithe is an appeal to faith "Prove me now...", and "Seek ye first the kingdom..." When things are hard, what shall one do? (Cont'd p. 2.)

SHOCKING AND TRAGIC DEVELOPMENT

The Pastor has a soft spot in his heart for the Minneapolis First Baptist Church because this was the church of his ordination as well as the church he attended during the 44-year ministry of Dr. W. B. Riley. The Crusader for October of the American Baptist Convention features this great church as the scene for the "Convocation on the Mission of the Church" of the ABC for Jan. 24-26, 1961. The speakers are a list of some of the most dangerous modernists in the American churches: Dr. Robt. J. McCracken of the Fosdick Riverside Church of New York, Dr. Gene E. Bartlett, well-known Roger Williams fellowship leader, formerly of Los Angeles First Baptist and now President of liberal Rochester-Colgate Seminary, and others. Also, as a speaker is Hon. Edith Green, Portland Congresswoman whose major contribution has been a full dress speech on the floor of the House of Representatives recently in defense of the National Council of Churches. The Pastor is Dr. Curtis Akenson, who is also president of Northwestern College. The reverberations of this will be wide throughout the country.

BISHOP OXNAM COMING TO S.F. DEC. 4-9

The last time Bishop G. Bromley Oxnam was billed in this area as a Reformation Day speaker he was greeted by a protest signed by 60 ministers who repudiated him as a spokesman for the Christian Faith since he has long since rejected it. He returns as a main speaker for the General Assembly of the National Council of Churches meeting in S. F. Dec. 4-9. To refresh ourselves, we will give his broad plans for the ecumenical movement of which he has been a vigorous leader. From the House Un-American Activities Committee hearing with Oxnam on July 21, 1953, p. 3633: "Protestant churches must continue the present brotherly and inspiring cooperation with the Eastern Orthodox Churches until such time as Protestantism is itself reunited. They may then consider union with Eastern Orthodoxy which it is prayerfully hoped may be consummated. When the full union of Protestantism and of Eastern Orthodoxy is accomplished and the Christians of the world belong to but two great churches, the leadership of that day may be Christian (Cont'd p. 2)

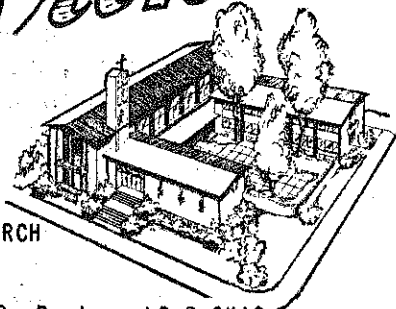

We had just passed through Nazareth and Cana of Galilee ... In the car with us was a special guest, a dear sister, a refugee from Europe, who had told me a few months before of her experiences with the Lord in Europe. We rejoiced in her deep and genuine love for God, for the Savior, and for the Scriptures. As she came to our Bible studies and received added light on the Scriptures, she began to wonder if she should not follow the Lord in baptism ... I pointed out several verses from Acts and from the Gospels concerning baptism, and she was fully convinced that she should experience water baptism It was about half past ten when we started the service, we sang some wonderful hymns of the faith, and then Mrs. Haimoff sang a solo. I gave a short message which a dear brother from Haiffa translated into German, and then our sister gave her testimony of how the Lord had saved her ... Our sister confessed her faith in the midst of the water and I baptized her in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost. This was my first experience of baptism in the River Jordan and indeed it thrilled my heart". Let the whole membership be present for this blessed event on Sunday at 7 p.m.

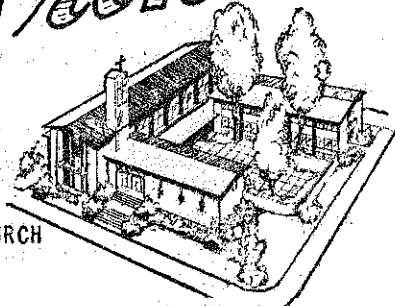

..Dr. Ralph Kraft has resigned from Watsonville First to accept Los Altos First on Feb. 1.

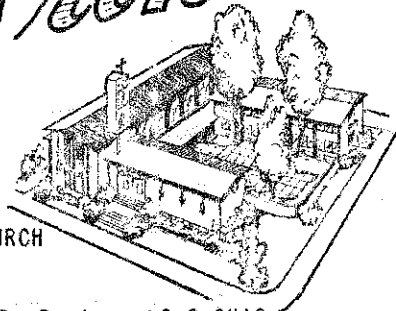
..South Western Baptist School, a Bible institute founded by our Arizona Baptist Convention friends in Phoenix, opened with ten students. We commend our brethren.

Dr. McIntire will also speak at a luncheon for men and women on Monday, Dec. 5 at noon at the Foothill Blvd. Baptist Church in Oakland. Reservations at \$1.25 MUST BE MADE in advance through Rev. George Moore, Walnut Creek First Baptist Church, 2336 Buena Vista Ave., Yellowstone 4-2139 or Yellowstone 4-8714. We anticipate a couple of hundred at this meeting.

BAPTIST CHURCH STONED IN ILLINOIS

This did not happen in the Middle Ages nor in Columbia, Spain or Portugal, but in Springfield, Ill. On Oct. 2, 1960 Pastor Ilah Claycomb preached at the Berean Baptist Church on the subject, "If a Catholic Becomes Our President". Two Jesuit priests were present. Four thousand copies of the taped address were placed in the mails. On Oct. 11, Don Forsyth, downstate chm. for Citizens for Kennedy-Johnson, prepared an article for press, radio, and TV on this "hate" literature. That same night the Berean Baptist Church was stoned. Five large tinted windows were broken and the floor and seats were damaged. This was followed by threats on telephone. Claycomb reports that his mail has been opened. The papers, radio, and TV ignored the news of this event and refused to print it as news.

THE PASTOR HAS NOT RETRACTED STATEMENT

While the Communists were crowing with delight about their greatest success of 1960 the San Francisco Red Riots of May, they had no idea that a film was being processed exposing their treasonable activity which would be shown to millions in the U.S. under the title — "Operation Abolition". Probably 500 copies of this film are now booked solidly for six months over the nation and constitute the greatest blow the Communist Party has suffered here. 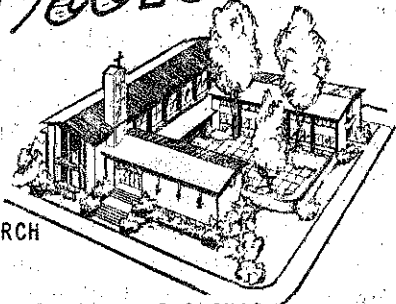

THE WORLD COUNCIL AND ANTI-CHRIST

BISHOPS OXNAM AND LOVE SHARE PLATFORM WITH CONVICTED COMMUNIST AGENT BRADEN

The NCC main speaker Tuesday evening is Bishop Oxnam. Listen to Calif. Congressman Donald Jackson in March 3, 1960 House address, "On January 31, 1960 in the city of Washington, D.C., a meeting was held at the Asbury Methodist Church. The rally, sponsored by an organization called the Volunteer Civil Rights Commission, attracted a crowd of 1,500 persons to hear the experiences of a number of colored citizens from the South who had been denied the right to vote in elections in their own States. The program was titled "The Voteless Speak", a "Report from the South", and on the surface, at least, the meeting had a high moral purpose and held a great appeal for those interested in the plight of the southern Negro. I wonder how many of those in attendance would have gone had they known that a convicted Communist agent would be on the platform, and that the president of a Communist-front organization, named as such by the Internal Security Subcommittee of the United States Senate, would deliver the closing statement. I wish it were possible to say in any honesty that the eight clergymen listed on the program as participants in the affair, had no knowledge of the extent to which the Communists had interested themselves in the meeting. However, the local press had reported some days in advance of the meeting protests regarding the rally, and had so alerted Washington generally that the pastor of the Vermont Avenue Baptist Church refused to grant permission to hold the rally in his church. What were eight Christian ministers doing on the same platform with longtime spokesmen for Communist causes? Were these clergymen, including two bishops, one a former head of the National Council of Churches, unaware that it was their participation in the rally that served to draw 1,500 persons to the meeting? It is this sort of performance by men who are presumed to be responsible that causes a collective shaking of millions of American heads when the facts are made known." 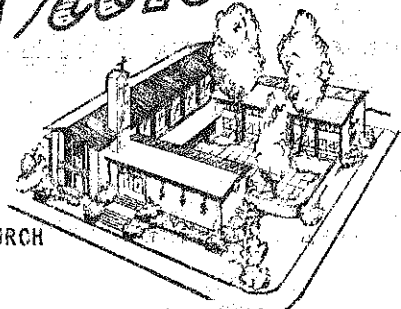

"As a graduate of Bethel I beg you to cancel the Martin Luther King and Luther Weigle appearances. King is Crozer Seminary liberal, a social gospel proponent a leftwing supporter of pro- Communist causes, a race agitator whose program is of enormous aid and comfort to the Communist Party, and a religious leader who is unworthy of Bethel's platform. His disregard of law, his record of arrests, and his open advocacy of social revolution will destroy confidence in Bethel with Bible-believing Baptists. King has figured prominently and favorably in 78 new stories in the Communist People's World since 1956. This shameful record will reflect adversely on Bethel when brought to light. His position on civil disobedience in nationwide television debate Saturday night disqualifies him to address students at Bethel. Nothing less than decisive action on the executive level will suffice for an institution committed to the New Testament. Prayerfully." G. Archer Weniger, DD.

NATIONAL COUNCIL DEVELOPMENTS

Bishop James Pike and Dr. Eugene Carson Blake joined in a dramatic proposal Sunday morning at Grace Cathedral for a merger of Episcopalians, Presbyterians, Methodists and United Church of Christ in to a vast ecclesiastical combine of 18, 300,000 church members. Pike was quoted in the Monday Chronicle: "the most significant, religious event 'since the Reformation'". He said, following Blake's sermon, "I can say that this prophetic proclamation is the most sound and inspiring proposal for unity of the church in this country which has ever been made in its history". The new name would be: "The Reformed and Catholic Church of the USA". "Catholic, he said, does not refer to Roman Catholic, but to 'those practices and to those understandings of faith and order, of church and sacraments, which are catholic in contrast to the Protestant or evangelical practices'. Pike said the reformed type of churches in his union would have to recognize catholic-type practices, such as 'the Lord's Supper and Holy Communion' as 'a true means of grace, not merely a symbolic memorial'". (Cont'd p.2)

THE ECUMENICAL EVANGELIST OPENS NCC

The San Francisco Examiner for Dec. 5 stated: "Graham spoke in a program sponsored by the Christian Men's Assembly, held in conjunction with the opening of the meetings of the National Council of Churches". Before 1800 men in Bishop Pike's Grace Cathedral Sunday afternoon he brought up the French movie star. "Graham offered movie star Brigitte Bardot as an example of a life without commitment. 'She has beauty, money and fame', he said, 'but she tries to commit suicide'". We recall his remarks a few years ago in Hollywood to the effect that Jane Russell was a lovely Christian girl, as well as his remarks in Hollywood Bowl with respect to Ingrid Bergman to the effect that "Let him that is without sin cast the first stone". Graham spoke last week before 1,000 film and personnel in Beverly Hills. The Chronicle of Dec. 5 quoted him, "I have never thought I would have this opportunity to speak in this great Cathedral". His former Fundamentalist friends never thought he would either, especially under NCC auspices. Bishop Pike, who despised his crusade in New York, might have had similar thoughts. "Then he launched a 45-minute sermon on the value of crowds to the Christian movement and the need to 'let Christ have your life'. 'We Protestants have missed something in not recognizing the value of great crowds'". We can't help but think of poor Jesus who said, as He saw His crowd disappearing, "Will ye also go away" (John 6:67), when He could just as well have had big crowds by joining forces with Annas, Caiaphas, in a mighty company with the Pharisees, Sadducees, and Herodians. Think of the prestige if he had had Pilate and Herod on the platform with him. You can imagine how this would have pleased Judas. He was altogether too negative and Biblical for the religious leaders.

..The Christian Century of Dec. 7, 1960 paid high editorial tribute to Dr. Donald Grey Barnhouse. They frankly admitted that the National Council of Churches has reprinted Barnhouse's article in Eternity magazine whitewashing the NCC Red penetration and have sent it widely throughout the nation.

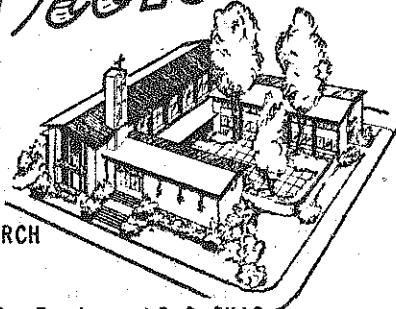

NATIONAL COUNCIL DEVELOPMENTS

..The recent San Francisco triennial General Assembly of the National Council of Churches was of such enormous significance that we are including several quotes to indicate the present course of the apostasy. The Pastor is compiling a complete fundamentalist criticism of the NCC which will be exceeded probably by Dr. Carl McIntire only. It will undoubtedly be published.

..The NCC prays for the dead..On Wednesday, Dec. 7, before Bishop Pike spoke to the NCC, the crowd was led in an orthodox catholic worship service by Father Altounian, Father Sempadian and Bishop Varjebedian, in which the Only-Begotten Son "who didst design to become incarnate through the Holy Mother-Of-God and every virgin" was recognized. While the Bishop was making the sign of the cross over the people, the Deacon prayed "For the souls of them that are at rest and fallen asleep in Christ in the true and orthodox faith, let us beseech the Lord".

..Robert W. Moon, Fresno First Methodist, who has 11 leftwing listings in Lowman's "Recognize Red China?" publicly attacked the House Committee on Un-American Activities Committee on Dec. 8 of "gross distortion, deceitfulness and lying" in the preparation of a movie 'Operation Abolition' ... 'I have seen how this film stirs innate fascism', the Rev. Moon said. 'I have watched it shown at men's luncheon clubs, and seen how the viewers left raging to cram the truth down the students throats'. He asked the assembly to condemn the movie, but since all the members had not seen it, the matter was referred to a committee for study". Examiner, Dec. 9.

..Super church plan fails..Throwing all caution to the winds, NCC leader Van Dusen, whom Graham refers to as the "classic example of mass evangelism conversion" and chairman of the 42 member Message Committee, "failed in a proposal that the National Council of Churches should be permitted to ordain ministers, administer sacraments, and to accept congregations into membership without denominational ties". It was not opposed so much on principle as on timing. The laymen is not quite ready for it.

..Revolution was one of big topics.. Bishop Leslie Newbigin of South India was quoted in Oakland Tribune for Dec. 9, "Christians should not try to hold back the revolution of our time but bear witness within to its true meaning — a frontal attack on injustice, tyranny and misery". Herman Ressig said on Dec. 8, "Revolutions always move too fast when those in control of unjust systems move too slowly. Justice thwarted turns to wrath. The people who see, the people who care, have now an awsome great opportunity". Bishop Oxnam spoke on Revolution Dec. 6.

..Senator Wm. F. Knowland in an editorial struck back at the NCC United Nations policy on Dec. 8, "...when they turn their weight toward dictating foreign policies of the US Government, they lay themselves open to criticism. The resolution ... which declares that the US may soon have to subordinate its will to that of the United Nations, seems scarcely in keeping with an assembly whose ecumenical interest revolves around the pulpit ... It surely is not the will of the people of the United States that they waive their sovereign rights at the whim or will of a majority of the UN. The American people are not about to surrender our constitutional system or our Bill of Rights guarantees to a world government wherein international communism has substantial power". Thank God for a courageous word from the Senator. The good Senator has much to learn about the subversive character of the NCC — that it intends to take over in every aspect of life — domestic, political and international affairs. The NCC constitutes one of the great menaces to our freedom in America today.

..Dr. Theo. Gill, President of San Anselmo Presbyterian Seminary, who said publicly that he could not give allegiance to the Virgin Birth, stated in an NCC address on Dec. 7, "The gun is at the Church's head. We can never forget that the Church is in retreat, that we minister in a situation in which we are already losing".

.."Materialism No Enemy Of Faith" is headline of Palo Alto Times, Dec. 6 on Dr. Truman Douglass' NCC address. The Communists who want the "reinterpretation" of the Christian Faith from spiritual to materialistic terms would be delighted. "Materialism, often called a weapon of the devil, was claimed today as an instrument of the Lord. Christianity is 'the most materialistic of all religions', said a noted church leader. It begins with an act of materialization, of embodiment, in the incarnation. It is concerned about the life of a body' ... said the widespread notion that materialism is an enemy of the faith is mostly 'falsehood and distortion' ... This is heresy ... You can't do these things (reduce hunger, disease, ignorance) with 'narrowly religious methods'—like prayer and Bible reading, he said, no matter how good these things are ... 'In ancient times, Dr. Douglass said, 'the church peddled pardons and fake relics. Today it hucksters spiritual values, spiritual mobilization, spirituality. And the latter end is worse than the former'".

..Mrs. James A. Pike in an NCC address shows how social action is accomplished. "Many charges can be brought about and wrongs righted through consultations with public officials preferably in the name of a council of churches and often with no attendant publicity".

..The work of the devil..Her chain-smoking husband shows how this is done in the Pacific Churchman, Dec. 1960, "The work of the devil (see the Collect for Epiphany V) brought out a charge from Senator McCarthy's chief research assistant that there were 7,000 Communist Protestant ministers. In a week we disposed of him — and not too long thereafter, of Senator McCarthy." There is no doubt about it, the Bishop is a big time operator!

..Bishop James A. Pike said in an NCC address on Dec. 5, "Second, because many of our clergy operate in a real atmosphere of fear. Whether we like to admit it or not, the phenomenon of McCarthyism is on the upsurge, and many prophetic voices are stilled because they have not learned to cope with the implied charge of 'disloyalty'. Still others are stilled by the hands of a few wealthy members in the congregations who put their threats on a purely economic basis". The Bishop names their two most fear enemies — Anti-Communists in the church and the laymen who can't stomach their socialism, pacifism, and unbelief.

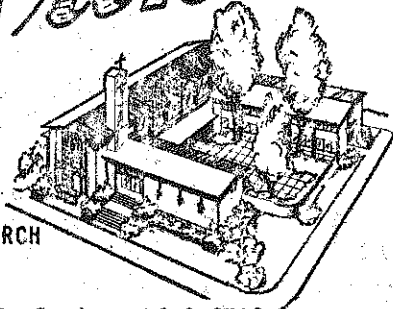

BISHOP PIKE DROPS A BOMBSHELL

A theological bombshell was dropped on the Christian world by Bishop James A. Pike of San Francisco's Grace Cathedral in the Dec. 21 issue of Christian Century in a leading article concluding a series on "How My Mind Has Changed", in which he boldly rejects the historic Faith. He confesses he is on the move and doesn't seem to know where he will be in another ten years. He scoffs at the Trinity — "I see nothing in the Bible, as critically viewed, which supports this particularly weak and unintelligible philosophical organization of the nature of God". On the Virgin Birth — "... the biblical evidence and the theological implications seem to be in favor of assuming that Joseph was the human father of Jesus". Concerning Salvation — "The Bible seems to indicate that no one is saved except through Christ ... To say no one is saved except through the earthly Jesus Christ would be impossible". He freely confesses that he does not believe much of the creed which he recites every Sunday, "There are several phrases in the creed which I cannot affirm as literal prose sentences, but I can certainly sing them ...". "Stated in plain prose, I certainly do not believe that 'Christ sitteth on the right hand of the Father'". On the Bible — "But the church is not under the judgment of the Bible finally, because the Bible is the work of the members of the church, and didn't get gathered except as members of the church finally gathered it ... the Bible came along as a sort of Reader's Digest anthology. If the Bible is not important as a primary test, it is to use a lawyer's phrase 'the best evidence'". On the uniqueness of the Christian revelation — "But I no longer regard grace, or the work of the Holy Spirit as limited explicitly to the Christian revelation". He then praises Buddha, Socrates, and Freud. Perhaps the most shocking — "But the kind of a god I first believed in, who would limit salvation to a select group of people who happen to have heard the news and heard it well ... is an impossible god. As to this god, I am now an atheist. (Underlines BP). He continues this incredible line by saying, "I have preached more and more in the past decade on the values of atheism and agnosticism. PASTOR SAYS BAPTISTS AND EPISCOPALIANS SHOULD PRAY FOR PIKE'S CONVERSION

The hour has come for Baptists to join together with Episcopalians to pray for the conversion of Bishop Pike. He has made it clear from his Christian Century article (Dec. 21, 1960) that he does not hold to the historic Faith. By no stretch of the theological imagination could he be considered a Christian in the Bible sense. It may well be that historians will refer to the eminent gentleman from Nob Hill as — "Bishop Pike, the Apostate". It looks as though the center of radical liberal religion has shifted from New York's Riverside Church to Grace Cathedral. I have not seen anything to compare with this unbelief since the early days of Harry Emerson Fosdick. His article raises some interesting ethical questions on how he can recite a creed each Sunday which he no longer believes. It is a puzzle to me how he could rise so high in American religion and yet believe so little. Inasmuch as the Bishop has so much in common with the atheists and agnostics, it would seem that the best thing might be to form a new church with them. He would have a ready-made trinity in Buddha, Socrates and Freud, and they probably would have more reality in the Bishop's mind than the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It might be that the Episcopalians would consider giving him Grace Cathedral as a part of his severance pay, otherwise Harry Bridges might open the Longshoreman's Hall for his services.
