A contribution for the support of a Gospel Mission from a number of our Churches in the association, and some individuals, was received, amounting to thirty eight dollars and forty one cents.

It being thought beneficial to our Churches and individual members. Voted to print in our minutes a summary of our articles of Fairb and Church Covenant, which are as follow:

We believe that the scriptures of the old and new Testaments are the word of God: We believe there is but one living and true Gad: We believe the important doctines of three equal perfore in the Godhead; etc. nil and perforal election; original fin; particular redemption; free justification by the imputed righteousnels of Christ; efficacious grace in segeneration; the final perfeverance of real believers; the refniredion of the dead; the luture judgment; the eternal hanpinels of the righteous; and everlasting m serv of the finally impenitent. We also believe that baptilm and the Lord's supper are ordinances of Christ, to be continued until his second coming, and the tormer is requifice to the latter (that is to fay) that those are to be admitted into the communion of the Church and so partake of its ordinances, who upon profession of their faith, have been baptized by immersion, in the name of the Yather, of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

The Covenant.

WE do now, in the presence of the all seeing and most gracious God, and before angels and una, give up ourselves to the Lord J hovah, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and avouch him this day, to be our Father, Saviour, Leader, 2 d Teacher, and receive him as our only portion forever. Also we receive the Christ as the supreme head of the Church; and Mediator of the New Coverant; and our Prophet Priest and King to govern and teach us in the way to, and appear as our advocate with the Father for our admittance. We seknowledge it is our indiffernible duty to glorify our Covenant God, by ilving holy lives in this prefere world, in all our feveral places and relations.— And we engage by divine all tance to improve our time, frength, talents, and advantages for the glory of God and the good of our fellow men. Promising that by diving help, we will walk in our houses in the fear of God; training up thefe committee! to our charge in the nurture and admonition of the Ford. We also alver pourfelves to one another, covenanting and promifthe to ad towards each other as Brethren in Christ, Watching not only as sinft those that are silled more groß evils, but also against all foolish talkand jetting which is not convenient; also disputing about words and things that lead to firste, or difregarding promises and not suffilling engagements, suttling and backbiting, spending time ldly at taverns or elsewhere, and all vain and unsuitable conversation on the Lord's days; or whatsever is contrary to to God's word. Promiting to hald communion together in the worthip of God, ordinances of Christ, and discipling of his Church, according as we are or that be builded hereto by the word and spirit of God: Believing that he will turther and more girefoully open his word and the mytteries of his kingdom. Meanwhile flying to the blood of the everlatting covenant for the pardon of our many creese, and praying that the Almighty would prepare and firengthen us for every good work; working in us that which is well pleating !n his fight, through Jelus Christ our Lord. To whom be given for ever and ever. Amen.
