## MINUTES of the CHARLESTOWN ASSOCIATION.

## CHARLESTOWN, FEB. 2, 1778.

T Ten o'Clock, A. M. Rev. Edmund Botsford, according to Appointment, opened the Association with a suitable Discourse from Heb. xiii. 1. Let brotherly Love continue.

2. Letters from five Churches were read. Rev. Oliver Hart

chosen Moderator, and Rev. Edmund Botsford Clerk.

3. A Church on Savannah River, in this State, made Application, by Letter and three Messengers, for Admission into this Association, and was received. This Church originated principally from that of Coosawhatchee; was constituted on the first Day of March 1775, and consisted of about Sixteen Members.

4. A Church at Jeffer's Creek applied for Admission into this Association, by Letter and one Messenger, which was also received. This Church was constituted on Jan. 19, 1778, by Rev. Messes. Evan Pugh and Richard Furman, consisting of Twenty-five Members; most of them lately converted and baptized.

5. The present State of the associated Churches. Note, Ministers with this \* Mark did not attend. Churches with this + Mark we had no Account from; but their Numbers stand as.

6. The Rev. Messes. Joseph Rees and John Cowan, and Mr. Joshua Howel being present, their Company and Assistance were desired,

7. A Letter from the Warren Association was read; by which it appears that the Baptists in some Parts of New England are still labouring under Religious Oppressions; which they justly deem doubly gauling at such a Period as this, when they are equally engaged, with their Eellow-Citizens, in procuring and definding the civil Rights of America.

8. Appointed Rev. Oliver Hart to prepare a Letter to the Warren Association; Rev. Joshua Lewis to prepare a Letter to the Ketoston Association, and Rev. Edmund Botsford to prepare

the Circular Letter to our Churches.

9. Inasmuch as the gloomy Prospect of our national Assairs, still calls aloud for perional Reformation; the Association advise our Churches to set apart the first Thursday in April, July and Ottober, for Fasting, Humiliation and Prayer; or Thanksgiving and Praise, according to the Direction of Providence. At the same Time they advise, that due Notice be taken of Orders of Government, for the kneeping of any particular Days, for the above Purposes, should any such Days be appointed.

queried, i Whether it might not be for the Glory of God, and the Interest of Religion, for a Minister to employ Part of his Time in visiting our Churches, especially destitute Congregations?" The Association were of Opinion, that such an Undertaking would be advantageous; and requested the Rev. Joshua Lewis to engage in this Service, for the present Year; to which he agreed. And they hope that the Churches will contribute to his Support, while thus employed.

"In The same Church, in like Manner, queried, "Whether it would not tend to promote the Cause of Christ, and the "Interest of the Churches, to hold the Association sometimes in the Country?" This Matter being calmly debated, it was unanimously concluded, that the Association shall, hereaster, be held alternately in Charlestown and the Country,---that it still retain the Name of THE CHARLESTOWN ASSOCIATION, ---that the Association-Book remain in the Care of the Charlestown Church; and that every Church inclining hereaster to join the Association and that every Church inclining hereaster to join the

Affociation, shall be acquainted with this Conclusion, to prevent Debates and Uneasiness.

12. Concluded to hold the next Association at the Reverence Richard Furman's Church, on the High Hills of Santee, on Monday after the third Sabbaib in October next; that the Rev. Elbanan Winchester preach the Sermon, and in Case of Failure, Rev. Joshua Lewis.

## 13. The CIRCULAR LETTER.

The Association of Ministers and Brethren, Delegates of several baptized Churches, held in Charlestown, Feb. 2d and 3d, 1778;

To the several Churches we are in Connexion with,

## SEND OUR CHRISTIAN SALUTATION.

Dearly beloved, in Christ Jesus, our Lord;

HIS will inform you, that through the Mercy of our God, we met and continued together in Love. We trust the Lord hath been with us, comforting our Hearts and strengthning our Hands, for his Service. What we have done our Minutes will shew. We have Reason to be thankful to the great Head of the Church, that although the Troubles of the Times have a natural Tendency to retard the Work of the Lord, he continues to smile upon us; as appears from Numbers being converted, and Churches being constituted, in sundry Places, both in this and the adioining States.

We esteem it as a signal Favour from the Lord, that but sew of our Brethren were considerable Sufferers, by the late dreadful Constagration in this Town; and that their Meeting House, although in imminent Danger, (having taken Fire three times) was preserved. O, that while the Judgments of God are abroad in the Land, the Inhabitants thereof would learn Righteousness.

Permit us, dear Brethren, to recommend to your Consideration, a few necessary Things. 1. Be careful to promote brotherly Love, by admonishing and stirring up each other to the several Duties of Religion. 2. Endeavour to maintain good Government in your Churches, agreeable to the Word of God. Rules for which, are clearly pointed out in our Summary of Church-Discipline. 3. Labour to maintain the Life and Power of Godliness in your Souls, lest ye become unfruitful in the Work and Worship of the living God.

It gives us Pleasure to find that God has stirred up our Brethren at Catfish, to return to good Order and Discipline; we hope they will persevere, and that we shall meet their Messengers the

next Session of the Association.

To conclude, we exhort you, Brethren, to be diligent in every good Word and Work, dying daily to Sin, and living unto Gcd; that so you may be prepared for every Dispensation of Providence, and at last received up into Glory. So prays,
