

IRCULAR LETTER.) The MINISTERS and MESSENGERS, of the Elkhorn Afficiation of BAPTILTI met at Bryan's, May 18th &c. 1793,

To the Churches with whom we are in connection fendeth our Christian love, withing you Grace, Mercy and Peace. I

DEAR BRETHREN.

E are now to address you on subjects of the greatest importance. The honor and glory of God, the peace and happiness of Zion, and the advancement of Chrisis causein the world. In order to effect these great things, how circumspest and conferentious ought all thise to be, that profess to be followers of the LAM3. The letters from the different Churches, convey this malancholy idea, that coldness and indifference have spread to baneful influence over the minds of too many; that the Divine presence, is in a great measure withdrawn from shote Church's does not call for mourning and lamentation on? We may be fure dear Brethren, that We are in a back fliding state and have need of examination. Let us therefore pul these serious and solemn questione to each of our confliences: Is the fear of God before my eyes? Do I I've in obedience to the Divine law? Do I discharge their duties I owe to God, to his Church and to the world? Do I live a life of felt-denial and

mortification? Is my house a house of prayer? Is my feat never empty in the House of Gop! Do I honor Gop with my substance, by imparting of it to the poor and the support of Charst's servants? Am I engaged in watching over my brethren in love; in reproving the wicked; comforting the tempted and withdrawing from the diforderly? These are serious and solemn matters. May Gon awaken you and us to a ferious confideration; And if we are faulty in these things, what can we expect without a reformation Suffer us to extort you to the faithful discharge of those duties above mentioned. The way to one tan our first love, is to do our first works. And nov dear Brethren, we com-

mit you to Gon, and the word of his grace, praying you may be made most to be partakers of the inheritance of the Saints in Light and Glory, and temain, Pear Brethren, yours in the Lord.
