

MINUTES

OF TEN

Elkhorn Association of Baptists,

Met at Bryan's, August 10, 1805.

ROTHER Carter Tarrent preached the introductory sermon, from Mark xiv. 15. 4 And he said unto them, go yeinto all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature."

Letters from 35 churches were read.

Brother Ambrose Dudley chosen maderator, and brother John Price clerk.

Squire Boone; Woth the Bracken affociation, by their mckengers, elder William Payne and elder Singleton; from the North Bend affociation, by their meffens gers elder Ifaac Rentfio and brother Christopher Wilson; from the South Diftrict affociation, by their messenger, elder John Rice; from the North District affociation, by their messengers, elder David Barrow and elder Robert Elkin; from the Long run association, by their messengers, elder John Penny and elder Philip Webber; from Green river affociation, by their messenger, elder Robert Stockton from Ruffell's creek affociation, by their meffenger, elder Elijah Sum-rs.

Brother Elijah Craig appointed to write to the Salemaffociation; brother Joseph Reding appointed to write to the Tate's creek affociation; brother George Evo appointed to write to the Bracken affociation; brother Abfalom Bainbridge appointed to write to the North Bend affociation; brother John Payne appointed to write to the South District affociation; brother Jacob Creath appointed to write to the North District affociation; brother Robert Johnson appointed to write to the Long run affociation; brother James Suggett appointed to write to the Ruffell's

creek affociation.

Brothers Garter Tarrent, George Eve, Lewis Corbin and John Price, appointed to arrange the business of the affociation --- Brothers Jeremiah Vardiman, David Barrow and Joseph Reding, chosen to preach on the Lord's day.

Adjourned till Monday 9 o'clock. Sunday brother Joseph Reding preached from 2 Cor. v. chap. 17. Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature; old things are past away, behold all things are become new--Brother Jeremiah Vardiman from 1 Cor. 16 chap 22. If any man love not the Lord Jesus Christ, let him be Anathema, Maranatha. Brother David Barrow prow proched from 2 Cor. v. 10. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, to a very large assembly.

MONDAY, August 126

Met pursuant to adjournment.

After prayer, proceeded to bulinels. The circular letter read and thought not proper to fend to the churches. Brothers Robert Johnson, George S. Smith with Abfalom Brinbridge, were appointed to prepare one.

Onerey from Boone's creek, What is a member to do who is in good standing, and applies for a letter of dismission, and is denied. Withdrawn.

Request from the church at the Crossing, Clear creek and Hillsborough, to revise the Confession of Faith and Church Discipline --- Agreed to appoint a committee of feven members, to confift of four ministers and three private brethren---accordinglv, elder Ambrole Dudley, elder Joseph Reding, elder John Price, elder Carter Tarrent, brother Robert Johnson, brother Bartlet Collins and brother John Payne, were appointed, who are to revise the Consession of Faith and Discipline; to meek as often as they deem it necessary, to prepare such amendments as they may judge proper, and report the same to the next affociation, and if approved, to be recommended to the churches and our brethren in union, for their inspection.

Querey, from Glenn's creek, Is it right for Baptifts to join in and affemble at

barbacues on the 4th of July. Answer---No.

A letter to the North Diffrict affociation read and approved; brother Ambrofe Bourn, brother Richard Cave and brother Jacob Creath, appointed to attend.

A letter to the Long run afficiation read, approved, and brother Joseph Reding nd brother Jacob Creath appointed our mellengers thereto.

A letter to the Green river affociation read and approved; brother Jacob Aeath, brother Win. Hickman and brother Carter Tarrant, to attend the fame.

A letter to Ruffell's creek read and approved; appointed brother Abfalom

Bambaidge to attend the fame.

To the churches composing the Elkhorn Association.

Beloved Brethren in the Lord,

WHAT we have done, you will fee by our minutes. When we consider the coldness and deadness of our churches, as expressed in their letters, together with the finall additions, and the spreading of error, it is matter of lamentation to us, and ought to be to all who love Jefus, and long for the prosperity of Zion. But, dear brethren, ought it not to be matter of joy and rejoicing unto us, that Juhovah Jesus still reigns; that he is the same yesterday, to-day and forever. His ear is not heavy that he cannot hear, nor his arm shortened that he cannot fave. His compation is as large now, as when he sweated, as it were, drops of blood in Gethlemena, or yielded to death for poor sinners on Calvary. Then, dear brethren, though we are weak and unable to give zeal and activity to our own fouls, or to our brethren, or to withstand our numerous and potent enemies, don't let us forget that Jefus is the head of divine influence and God of power; and thos our prospects are gloomy, tho' clouds of darkness hover around us, yet our Jesus is the fun of Righteoufnefs, his precious beams alone can disperse our gloom, and make all our clouds of darkness fly as the shades of night before the morning sun. Are there many new errors started in the world, or rather old ones new dressed, let' us remember that the religion of Jesus is still the same, and that it ever has had, and eternally will continue to have, a direct tendency to abase the pride of man, and crown the redeemer with all the honors of falvation. By religion we do not mean a bare profession of the name of Jesus, nor a place, nor a name among any particular sect of professing christians; but by the religion of Jesus, we mean the implantation of those divine graces of the holy spirit which leads all the children of God to discover the entire insufficiency of all created enjoyments, and human or creature righteoufness to make them happy or accepted with God, discovers unto, them the fuitableness and entire sufficiency of the dear redeemer, and enables them to believe and rejoice in him as their all in all. The implantation of divine grace in the foul never fails to inspire the subject in a greater or less degree, with a seal for the honor and glory of God---Hence it is, that Christians, not drawn altogether by the hopes of obtaining Heaven, nor driven by the flavish fears of hell, but sliinulated with an ever living principle of love, wish to obey all the commands of Jefus and run in his footsteps till they reach his throne, lay all their honors at his feet and join the everlasting chorus of Heaven in strains of everlasting joy, in ascribing falvation to God.
