MINUTES, &c.

AT an association holden at Mountaincreek Meeting-house, in Prince Edward county, the second Saturday in May, 1802.

Brother Richard Poindexter preached the introductory Sermon, from Revelation, vii. and 17, "For the Lamb, which is in the midst of the throne, shall feed them."

The following brethren invited to feats,—Henry Haily, Wm. Brame, Daniel Hudson, Wm. Walker, Jordan Martin, James Shelborne, jun. Wm. Baldry, Owen Smith, Zacheus Doss, Hezekiah Ellington, and Walthall Robertson.

Brethren the moderator, clerk, his affistant and James Saunders, be a committee to arrange the business of the association, and to make report on Monday morning 9 o'clock.

On motion, James Saunders, Abner Watkins, and Henry Haily, be a committee to write the circular letter, and report.

Agreed, that Wm. Goode, Stephen Woodfon and John Bass, be a committee to receive the churches bounty, and make report.

On motion, the following brethren chosen

Wm. Flowers, and Benjamin Watkins; worinip to begin at ten o'clock, A. M. Then adjourned to Monday morning nine o'clock.

The LORD's DAY was spent in public Worship, a large sudience attended thereon, and we trust there were evidences of the Lord's smiling countenance.

Monday Morning, May 10, 1802.

MET pursuant to adjournment, and after divine service proceeded to business.

Ordered that the messengers names be called over.

The scleet committee chosen to arrange the business of the association, do make report as sollows, viz:

1 The committee appointed to visit Chestersield church, to make report.

2. Query from Cubb creek Church, viz.— From the great extent of our district which renders it extremely inconvenient in many cases, would it not be well for the association to take into consideration a division of the same?

We pray you to take this matter under your notice.

3. The committee chosen to write the circular letter, to report. 4. The committee chosen to receive the churches bounty, to report.

5. The time and place of the next associa-

tion.

The report being read, was received, and

committee discharged.

Brethren, Abner Watkins, James Saunders Rane Chastain, Ben. Watkins and Bernard Todd, some of the committee appointed to visit Chestersield church, came forward and informed the association the reason of their not attending agreeable to appointment, which reasons to us were satisfactory.

Brother James Shelborne, sen. one of said committee informed us, that he attended the church agreeable to appointment, but could not proceed to business being alone:—Agreed

that the committee be discharged.

On motion—Agreed, that we take up the quere, sent to us at Union Meeting-House, from the Chestersield Church:—What are the steps you advise to be taken with an associati-

on, when any are grieved with one?

The following brethren appointed to form a folution to the faid quere, are James Saunders. Abner Watkins Bernard Todd, James Shelborne, sen Benjamin Watkins, William Richards, and Henry Haily, who after withdrawing a while returned and reported.

Answer, If it be a Church, let them dele-

gate some of their body to wait on the association, and state their grievance, &c. If an individual, to attend in person for the same purpose. The above report being received the committee were discharged.

With regard to the request from Cubb creek Church, answered thus: We do not think is expedient to divide this district, yet if it shall appear hereaster necessary, we shall have no objection.

The committee chosen to write the circular letter, reported and were discharged.

The committee chosen to receive the Churches bounty, reported, that they had received from the several churches the sun of

After Divine service were dismissed.
