MINUTES.

WEDNESDAY, June 4, 1788.

AT two o'clock P. M. elder Nicholas Cox, preached the introductory fermon, from Remans viii, 17.

Elders Powars and Warren to the Woodstock Associacion, which is to be held at Marlow, on the first Wednesday in October, one o'Clock, P. M. Elder Hull brother Bates and brother John Andrews, to that of Vermont, which is to be held at Middlerown, on the first Wednesday in October, one o'Clock, P. M. Brother David Rathbun, and Deacon Robert Kannion, to the Stonington Association, which is to meet at Elder Abel Palmer's Meeting-House in Colchester, the third Tuesday in October at 10 o'clock, A. M.
