#### (CIRCULAR LETTER.)

The Elders and Messengers of the several Churches met in Groton, the 16th and 17th of October, 1792.

To the Churches whom they represent, fend Christian Salutation.

DEAR BRETHREN,

VE are happy in the close of this meeting, to inform you, we have enjoyed an agreeable interview: By Letters from the Churches, we rejoice to hear, that to some of them large additions have been made, and that peace is enjoyed so generally. But our joys abate, while we restect on the prevalence of iniquity in our land. Suffer us, Brethren, in this day of prevailing error, to remind you, that true Religion is distinguished from salse, by love to GOD, through JESUS CHRIST; which is evidenced, by love to our Brethren,—our Neighbour, and to our Enemies.

They, who Love GOD fincerely, Love HIS Laws, and Ordinances,—the Holy Scriptures are their rule of Faith and Practice. Love to our Brethren inclines us to unite with them in Solemn Covenant, to walk together in Gospel Fellowship,—loving one another with a pure Heart fervently, not only in prosperity, but in the sorest adversity,—having special regard to the rules of discipline in the Church of CHRIST, that if a Brother be overtaken in a fault, they will be disposed to restore him in the spirit of mockness, with sincere desires for the honor of GOD, and the welfare of the Soul.—If a Brother is qualified with gifts to the edifying of the Church, he is encouraged in the improvement of thems.
