Gallup our Messenger to the Shaftsbury.



CIRCULAR LETTER.

THE Brethren from the several Churches that compose the Stonington Association; to the Churches whom they represent, Send GREETING.

BELOVED BRETHREN,

CCORDING to our former practice in our annual meetings, we now address you by Letter, which we Earnestly wish may be for your Edification, Strengthening and Furtherance in the Gospel of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, in which are contained great and precious Promises, solid Joy and Comfort, and strong Consolation, to all that love his appearing, and endure unto the End, for the same shall be Saved.

And as we live in a day wherein Iniquity is abounding & the love of Many waxing cold, many delusive Doctrines propagated, some crying lo here and others lo there; and the Enemy of Souls and of the Cause and Kingdom of the dear Redeemer, going about seeking whom he may devour; while we see Sin and Abominations increasing in the Earth; while many grow bold in their Iniquities, likewise it appears to be a day of great National struggles in the world which is predicted in Scripture that should take place in the last days; previous to the second coming of the Son of MAR. As distress of Nations, with perplexity, men's Hearts faiting them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the Earth.

Bur Dear Brethren, be not discouraged or dismayed


since we have such great precious and faithful promises, ensuring our perseverence through all adverse providences until the Judgement day, "when he shall send his Angels with "a great sound of a Trumpet, & they shall gather together, "his Elect from the four winds, from one end of Heaven to "the other."

- And "blessed is that servant, whom his lord, when he cometh, finds faithful," let us therefore be careful and take heed that we let none of these things slip. And be not too much engaged (as we fear, too many are) in Political disputes, and State politics: but let us earnestly commit the affairs of all things both Spiritual and Temporal to him with whom we have to do, who sees and knows all things in Heaven & Earth; and doth his pleasure and none can hinder: who hath the hearts of all men in his hand, and can turn them, as the Rivers of water are turned; and while others are perplexing themselves in those disputes, let us retire to our closets and with earnest and unfeigned desires wrestle with Gop for his Divine interposition for our good, and his Glory; that he would gratiously turn the hearts of the children of men to himself, and purify a peculiar People, zealous of good works; and dispose the hearts of Kings, lers and all men to peace, and that he would purge our land from the many growing and gross Evils and Abominations, which call aloud for Judgements on the sinful inhabitants of the Earth. O Brethren can we not do more in a few moments with God through Jesus Christ than all the vain disputes:—all the laborious Assembles of States and Empires without him, in bringing about those great and desirable objects; that our land may become Emanuel's; and the wilderness blossom like a Rose.

Dear Brethren notwithstanding it is a day of great adversity in many places, and on many accounts; yet we have reason to rejoice at the good News from many parts, where new Churches are creeted, old ones enlarged, and large accessions made to the Redeemer's Kingdom, notwithstanding all the efforts of Satan to overthrow.

Finally, brethren, suffer the word of exhortation of the Apostle Peter, give all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge Temperance; and to Temperance patience; and to patience Godliness; and to Godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness

Charity: For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see far off, and hathforgotten that he was purged from his old Sins. Wherefore the rather, Brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things ye shall never fall: for so an entrance shall be ministered unto you abundantly into the Everlasting Kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.—Amen.



CORRESPONDING LETTER.

THE Elders & Brethren of the Stonington Association, convened at Montville, October 15 & 16, 1805, to the Associations with whom they correspond, send Christian Salutation.

DEAR BRETHREN,

T is with joy that we receive information from you by your Minutes, & messengers, our souls rejoice to hear of the prosperity of Zion, by the out pouring of the divine Spirit, on the inhabitants of a number of our Atlantic Towns; as well as on the interior settlements; vet the Church of Christ is in a State of warfare, her foes are many, and their modes of warfare are various; yet all are aiming to rob God of his glory, and saints of their happiness. we perceive the necessity, of putting on the whole armour Whilst on one hand the painted hypocrite marked of God. with the veil of State Religion, attempts to wrest the gov. ernment of the Church from the hand of Christ. Insidel, the licentious and profane on the other: are despising the Laws of God, and the faith of the Gospel. the saints of God, believing the Church to be founded on JESUS CHRIST, redeemed by his own blood, and conquered by grace divine, have reason to rejoice, even in tribulation, believing, that our warfare will terminate in the glory of God and the best good of his people. Wherefore, dear brothren, let us stand with our loins girt with truth, and

our lamps trimmed and burning, and we as men waiting for the coming of our Lord Desus Christ. Amen.
