WEDNESDAY, JUNE 9, 1813.

1. AT ten o'clock, A. M. brother OTIS ROBINSON, delivered the Introductory Sermon, from Romans XIII. 12. *Let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light.*
